Introduction

The research project supports the full implementation of Open Access in discipline fields of arts, design and music.

Challenges

Research in Switzerland must be Open Access by 2024. Yet, the arts, design and music disciplinary fields present a series of challenges that makes its implementation particularly complex.

- The distribution and the reuse of artworks and of third parties content under copyright, not accessible in public domain and subject to a series of restrictions;
- The production of a wide range of multimedia outputs that are in themselves meaningful artifacts and whose materiality becomes problematic within the realms of the open and the digital.

Relevance

Strategies related to copyright management, multimedia formats and practice-based research respond to the specific challenges art, design and music disciplinary field, but they also offer practical tools and methodologies to contribute to Open Science in all disciplines.

01 - Guidelines

- Production of guidelines and solutions for a selection of case studies submitted by the project partners.
- The guidelines are process-oriented and show how Open Access impacts on everyday research practice.
- The guidelines deliver solutions and suggest best practices in the form of charts, decision trees, templates and checklists.

02 - Training

- Organisation of webinars and workshops related to Open Science.
- Inclusion of Open Access in the students' curricula.
