On Tuesday the 18th ult. the foundation stone of a bridge of five arches, erected across to river Clyde, at Glasgow, was laid with grand masonic honours, by Mr. Dalglissh, Esq. preceptor of Hutcheson's Hospital.

EXPRESS OF BRAZIL.—On Thursday morning the steam boat conveying the Empress of Brazil and Suite arrived at Spithead, where her Majesty was received by a royal salute from the Brazilian squadron in the harbour of Portsmouth.

Don A. De Mello, Aid-de-camp of the Conde de Villa Flor, has arrived with despatches for the young Queen of Portugal, bearing the important intelligence of the complete defeat of the Miguelite expedition against Terceira.

The blockading fleet off Terceira having been joined by the Don John IV. and the other vessels carrying troops, preparations were made on the 15th inst. for effecting a landing.

London, September 1st. An immense failure has taken place in the city in the woollen trade, said to be from to three hundred thousand pounds, which will involve from twenty to thirty other houses; more failures are also in circulation.

Some of the letters ascribe the defeat of the first part of the expedition to the peasantry, who, after the Miguelites had landed, and advanced towards the ambushed troops in the interior, passed between the enemy and the sea, seized the boats, and thus prevented their escape.

ERZERUM.—Erzerum, or Arzerum, which has lately been captured, by the victorious Russians, is a City of Asiatic Turkey, and capital of a Pachalic, to which it gives its name, and is a part of Armenia, situated near the head of the Euphrates, at the foot of a chain of mountains which are usually covered with snow, till the latter end of spring.
