This Vocabularius ex quo is the fifth edition of the work; but is valuable as being the first Latino-Teutonic Glossary printed in the Netherlands, and the explanation being in the Plattdeutsch, having a strong resemblance to some of our old English Vocabularies. It is designated as the Vocabularius "Ex Quo," from the first words of the preface, from which it appears to have been intended for the use of poor scholars; "Ut eo facilius sacram scripturam litteraliter intelligere possent," etc. It is of more importance to the English philologer than any other old Vocabulary except the Teuthonista of Van Schueren, and affords elucidations of some old English Words which are not to be found in that valuable work."

This volume, which came from the Dering Collection, is probably circa 1636.

Some measurements of standing timber, some estate accounts and translations from the Chroniclers occupy the first part of the book.

A handsome manuscript upon vellum, probably of French execution, circa 1400.

A manuscript of about 1665, apparently in the writing of John Blackburn, and bound up with sermons and other treatises.

An interesting manuscript of the time and throwing light upon the controversy between the Bishops and the Puritans.

- 2700 COLLECTION of the Alterations in and Variations between the Common Prayer Bookes of Edw. VI., Elizabeth, and the Scottish Liturgy of 1637, with observations and notes. A.D. 1650. Manuscript, black morocco, gilt edges.
- 2701 Graduale. A Gradual, upon vellum, of gigantic size, intended doubtless for use where a large number at a distance of several feet could stand around and use it. Although, doubtless, specially executed for some Continental use, it corresponds closely to the English use of Sarum.

The volume measures $15\frac{1}{2} \times 22$ in., and is in excellent preservation, in the original binding, and *copiously illuminated throughout*. Executed probably in the latter part of the 14th century.

- 2702 GRADUALE. A small 4° volume with the Musical Services for some special occasions and Saints' days. Apparently of the 15th century, and with some of the marginal directions in old German. Vellum, with brass clasps.
- 2703 Homiliarium. A volume of Homilies and Sermons, containing a large number written by Bede, the Anglo-Saxon Church Historian. A massive book in probably Visigothic characters of the Ninth century. The pages are about 13 × 18 The Initial letters are principally in the Anglo-Saxon Monkish Style of the period; and the writing is, throughout, beautiful, exact, and uniform. One of the pages was copied in fac-simile for Libri's "Inedited Monuments."

In a modern brown morocco binding, elaborately blind tooled in antique style.

Early manuscript copies of Bede's Homilies, as testified by Dr. Giles, are remarkably rare; and when to this fact are added the age of the manuscript, its size and beauty, the volume is seen to be one of exceeding interest.

Former owners have considered it as Merovingian, Carlovingian and Anglo-Irish; but a careful comparison of early specimens of Palæography make it pretty certain that it is in its general features Visigothic.

- 2704 Hor. A small volume. 16° size, upon vellum, with thirteen large and numerous small illuminations; being evidently a volume for private devotional use, by an English Scribe. Some of the prayers in Old French are characteristic of the freedom with which matters were spoken of, that in these supposed more refined days would be omitted from conversation, and looked upon as entirely out of place in a book of devotions. Bound in old purple morocco, in excellent condition, and of the early part of the 15th century.
- 2705 HYMNALE, cum Precibus. Thick 12°. MS. on paper, wanting one or more leaves at the beginning. It contains a large number of Hymns and monkish rhymes, and, from some notes in the book, it was probably written in a Carthusian monastery near Erfurt, 1387 to 1390. Old boards, one cover wanting.
- 2706 KALENDARIUM. Manuscript on Vellum, by an Anglo-Saxon Scribe, written prior to the Canonization of St. Thomas à Becket, whose name is inserted in a much later handwriting. Circa 1100. 8°. in velvet covers.

It has 24 illuminated drawings representing the signs of the Zodiac and the occupations of the months with a large drawing on last page representing the Annuncia-

LECTIONARIUM. A Lectionary and Lives of Saints, on 360 leaves, by an English Scribe, "Johannes de Salesburi," dated 1269, in perfect preservation and fine condition. The ornamentation is fine and beautiful; and on pages 107 and 108 is a French Poem, in the language of the period, and furnishing a

- duplicate date for the execution of the volume. Folio, old oak binding. 1269.
- 2708 Missale Lincolniense. A manuscript, probably of the 14th century, by an English scribe, and unquestionably for monastic use in the Diocese of Lincoln. Besides the special use for St. Hugh of Lincoln, found only in English Missals, there is a special use for St. Hugh of Grenoble, the friend of St. Bruno, the founder of the Carthusians, near Grenoble. St. Bruno himself was not canonized until early in the 16th century. It is worthy of note in connection with this volume that the Feast of Relics is set down for the 8th Nov.; the day of the death, according to the Lanercost Chronicle, of Robert Grosteste, whose conflict with the Pope would necessarily exclude him from Canonization, but whose memory would be thus preserved in his own diocese. As authorities differ as to the time of Grosteste's death, the date for the Feast named seems to give support to the Lanercost Chronicle. Folio. In the old binding, stamped and secured with brass corners and bosses. The motto on the corners is, "Ave Maria plena," etc., the same as used on the signet of Grosteste.
- 2709 PRECUM Liber. A neat manuscript of Prayers and Hymns of the 15th century; the prayers being largely to the Virgin and female saints. 12°, green morocco, neat.
- 2710 Prayers. A manuscript volume upon paper, containing prayers in German by a Monk, and written presumably towards the middle of the 15th century. The more special interest of the volume consists in a leaf of coarse, early wood engraving, and which Mr. Otley, a former owner, copied in facsimile in his "History of Wood-engraving." 4°, in a green morocco case.
- 2711 PROCESSIONALE, cum Musica. Manuscript, partly on vellum, partly on paper, having some additional prayers, and two old wood-cuts, apparently of the 15th century. In the old stamped binding, and for use in the Diocese of Canterbury. Small 4°, Sæc. MD.
- 2712 PSALMORUM Liber. MS. by an English scribe of the 13th century, with caricatures and illuminations, having also the Canticles, Athanasian Creed, Collects, etc. A very interesting volume. 8°, red morocco.
- 2713 Ratio eorum quæ fuerunt in ecclesia per circulum anni. 8°, old boards. MS. on vellum, said to be of the end of the 13th century. Very neatly written, but with very numerous abbreviations.

2714 Lydgate. A manuscript on paper written by John Shirley, who died in 1456, and to whose carefulness we are indebted for the preservation of many of the smaller pieces of Chaucer and Lydgate. The volume has been examined by Henry Bradshaw, of Cambridge, England, whose letter as to its authenticity and the value of its contents is inserted. They are—

An abstract owte of the Cronycles in Latyn translated into Englishe be Dan Johan Lydgate.

The three holy and worshipfull Kynges of Coleyne. A prose treatise, "The good government of a Prince."

The Serpent of Division.

A truwe and brief Abstracte of the Cronycles of this Reaume of England. In antique brown morocco, and a particularly interesting volume.

From evidence connected with some of the rubrics to the Chronicles, Mr. Bradshaw limits the age of the MS. to the period between 1442 and the time of Shirley's death.

2715 — Fall of Nobles, translated into English verse. A manuscript on vellum, with the initial letters illuminated; hand-somely bound in red morocco.

This was originally a very fine copy of Lydgate's translation, and written probably in his lifetime, but it was defaced by the fire at Sotheby's in 1865.

2716 Manipulus Vocabulorum. A Dictionarie of English and Latin wordes set forthe in such order as none heretofore hath ben, the *Englishe* going before the *Latine*, necessary not onely for Scholers that want varietie of words, but also for such as use to write in English Metre. Gathered and set forth by P. Levins. Anno 1570. Henry Bynneman for John Waley.

A MS. copy made apparently for M. J. O. Halliwell. The dictionary was edited and published in 1867 at the joint expense of the Camden, E. Eng. Text and Philological Societies, by Henry B. Wheatley.

2717 MATTHÉOLUS. Le Livre des Lamentations de Matthéolus. (In verse.) A manuscript on paper of the latter part of the 15th century. Large 4°, old vellum wrapper.

A notice of the Author and of the printed editions will be found in Brunet, 5th ed. Vol. 3 and Cols. 1,526, 1,527 and 1,528. The printed editions are very rare.

2718 MAYSTERE of Game, The. Transcript of the Cottonian MS. Vespasian B. XII, by Dr. Black, copied out page for page, and line for line, clearly and beautifully written. 4°, light brown morocco, stamped.

The first part consists of "the Arte of Venerye, or Huntyng according to Jhon Gifford and Wyllyam Twety, that were with Kynge Edward II." The second is "The Book of Huntyng, the which is clepyd Maystere of the Game," the latter written

by Edmund de Langley, Earl of Cambridge, fifth son of Edward III., who appears in those early days to have been a perfect type of an English country gentleman, less mindful of politics than of the more congenial pleasures of the chase. See his character beautifully drawn by Hardyng in his Chronicle.

From Mr. Dansey's collection, with autograph letters from Mr. Cayley and Dr. Black.

- 2719 Milles, Dean. Historical Account of the Anglo-Saxon and Anglo-Danish Money, wherein Mr. Clarke's opinions are examined and corrected; with Observations on the Coins, etc., of Franks and other nations, and a Dissertation on the Aurei of the Emperor Maurice, struck in Gaul. An unpublished MS., neatly written for the press, with some corrections, and loose memoranda in the Dean's handwriting. Folio, boards. 18th century.
- 2720 Miracles de Notre Dame. (Pièces de théâtre du XV^e Siècle.) 5 vols. Small 4°, red morocco, uncut.

These volumes comprise manuscript copies of old productions existing in MS. in the National Library of Paris, made by August Veinant, neatly written and carefully collated with the originals. There are thirty-two articles in all, comprising Miracles and Sermons. These latter are discourses preceding the performance of certain miracles, etc. A list is prefixed to vol. I.

2721 Mysteries Transcribed from the "Digby MS.," No. 133 in the Bodleian Library, Oxford, viz.; Candlemas Day; Conversion of Saul; Mary Magdalen; a Morality; with an elaborate Introduction concerning Mysteries in general, and these in particular, and a Glossary. 4°, half bound.

These Mysteries, copied verbatim et literatim, are prepared for publication. See also Abbotsford Club Publications, No. 1.

- 2722 NICE Wanton. A Preaty Interlude. Printed by John King, London, 1560. Only 2 copies known. An Old Manuscript copy of this Interlude, which had never been reprinted until the late edition of Dodsley, edited by W. Carew Hazlitt. 4°, old red calf, gilt.
- 2723 Ottonis III., Imperatoris, Diploma; cujus auctoritate Bona, Jura, et Immunitates Monasterii SS. Bonifacii et Alexii confirmat. The original charter on Parchment, with Leaden Seal and Official Signature, dated at Rome, Pridie Kal., Jun. 996. This, for its better preservation, has been mounted and placed in morocco covers.

This charter, printed at length in the Appendix to Nerini's "De Templo et Cœnobio SS. Bonifacii et Alexii," Rome, 1752, ignores the Pope, and proves to a certainty that at the date named the temporal supremacy of Rome was vested in the Emperor.

It is claimed that this was written by a Mendicant Friar; not by Wielif.
