Plants of Murry's Extra Early set this season in my trial grounds, May 10th, began ripening fruit June 20th, and continued bearing until killed by frost in Oct. There is no tomato on earth (early or late) that will bear as heavy a crop throughout the entire season as this tomato will. In size, it runs much larger than other first earlies and is always perfectly smooth, no matter what the weather may be (wet or dry). All the fruit is solid and smooth at all times. As to flavor, it has no equal. Once a grower of this wonderful tomato, always a grower, has become a truism. Plant Murry's Extra Early this year and you will not be disappointed.
