Port operations incident to the loading of ships, scheduled to lift reparations cargo, such as loading of lighters, will not commence until notification is received, by telephone from this headquarters, as to the exact time of arrival of the scheduled vessel. It is the responsibility of the local Civil Affairs Team to notify the Japanese authorities when to commence loading operations.

3. In the event ships are scheduled to lift reparations cargo at more than one port, it is requested that the Civil Affairs Team notify the Civil Affairs Team at the next port to be visited when the ship can be expected to arrive. Notification should be made as soon as possible and not later than 48 hours before arrival at next scheduled port.

4. Each recipient nation has been informed that it is the desire of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, that the shipping agent and the ship's master consult with the local Civil Affairs Team regarding all matters pertaining to the loading of reparations cargo.

5. It is believed that such coordination will expedite loading operations in the future and eliminate unnecessary expenses.

1. The policy on which to base the release of dependent housing in the Shizuoka area must reflect the need for quarters by the Occupation Forces, the type of families to be quartered and the most economical operation in view of the announced drive for the reduction in expense.

2. It is to be expected that a maximum of 7 officers would be assigned to duty in this immediate area. (5 from 441st C.I.C. Detachment and 2 from the Yaizu Air Force Base). In addition, 2 NCO could be reasonably expected to require family quarters. It may be pointed out that the greatest number of officers from CIC Detachment requiring quarters has been 3, and that the senior officers at both installations are Captains. Any additional families would be quartered on a temporary basis for a period of 90 days as the duty station of the principal is outside the housing area.

3. No schools are available for dependent children which limits families to those with children under school age or with no children. Based on existing rules for assignment of quarters, on number of bedrooms per family, this indicates the release of the larger quarters.

4. The operating cost for utilities is also a guidance in this matter as it is readily evident that the larger houses are usually more expensive to operate. During the six month period (March to August 1949) which does not reflect the heavier costs for heating of the winter months, the cost of utilities for the single and two family houses are tabulated below.

From this tabulation it is obvious that houses 8, 2 and 5 can be most readily released to produce the greatest economy of direct expense for utilities. In addition to this cost, the labor cost for these 3 houses is high as each has at present two maids and a separate gardener. In all but the case of house #1, one gardener serves two houses. Prior to the rationalization of maintenance personnel each of these houses were staffed by 3 inside and 1 outside employee with the direct labor cost approximating ¥ 33,000 monthly (\$ 91.50) each.

5. With the release of these 3 houses (in order 8, 2, 5) there will still be quarters for 7 officers in single houses, one duplex for 2 NCOs, a 4 family apartment and a BOQ for 6 men who might visit on official business and 8 single rooms (2 with connecting bath and 2 with private bath) in the present Officers Club which is expected to be converted to CIO headquarters. If this is completely renovated, suitable space must be provided for Miss Iijima (SWAP librarian) probably by conversion of space adjacent to present library in the Public Hall.

6. It is recommended that House #8 be released as early as possible as a) it is the home of the president of the Tomogawa Paper Co. who are engaged in the mill across the road in the production of paper for the ¥ 100 notes and b) to provide the basis for a suit by the prefecture to collect the expenditure made for improvements still existing from the owner as a precedent for other similar actions. Other releases can be made later.

7. If upon study it is found that other houses can be released the order should be #1, 12 and 9.

8. Verbal requests have been made by Capt Steele and Lt Demick for reassignment of quarters. These requests were disapproved for the following reasons:

a. The quarters presently occupied by Lt Demick were selected by him and remodeled to meet the peculiar operational needs of his unit. The space available and arrangement of the quarters requested, Dependent House No. 7, does not permit such alterations to be made.

I beg to ask you about the application for sale of ex-Japanese army barracks in Fuji Maneuver Area, will be used as new middle school houses in Izumi Mura, made application on 12 January 1949, at that time Capt.Carrihan and Sgt.Kawahara came up there, did check and inspection of these barracks, they said "They are too old and breakage, being after the elapse of 40 years since build, we won't reuse these old buildings, so if you want to use them as middle school houses, you'd better submit a application form to Military Government Team, we'll take care of it".

According to their verbal instruction, we did forwarded first application to be sold us these old barracks in February 1949, continuously submitted several petitions to get your approval, but in spite of several petitions repeated, we didn't receive any approval and reply concerning above subject yet, in our situation, we heartily desire that you would authorize us to reuse these barracks by all means.

Last year, we made aplan to build middle school houses, but caused by typhoon "Aeon" happened last September, damaged our village about more 35,000,000.Yen, compelled us to give up our plan in enforcement of new middle school houses, in all neighbour villages in Sunto Gun, accomplished new middle school houses except us, having regard to this circumstances, we should make a plan again. but it isn't easy way to enforce our plan in our poor finance.

We all desire that you would give us a special favour to approve our application considering above circumstances

1. Subject plant is in authorized production of textile equipment. Present production is largely for export. June production amounted to ¥ 43,821,437.
2. There are many class III machines on this plants inventory, and a large portion of them are suitable only for scrap. The installation is in the peculiar position of finding necessary to sacrifice space required for production to shelter reparations equipment that is suitable only for salvage, while at the same time encountering difficulty in purchasing and transporting to the plant scrap metal for current production requirements.
3. If authorization could be given without delay to scrap this equipment it could be melted down in an electric furnace (cupola) presently in full operation. Operation of the furnace is curtailed during winter months due to electrical shortages.
4. There are 669 class III machines on inventories 37-28, and 37-29. It is proposed to scrap 326 items and retain 343 on inventory as bonafide class III equipment.
5. The inclosure lists the inventory numbers of the salvage equipment and enumerates the parts remaining on each machine.

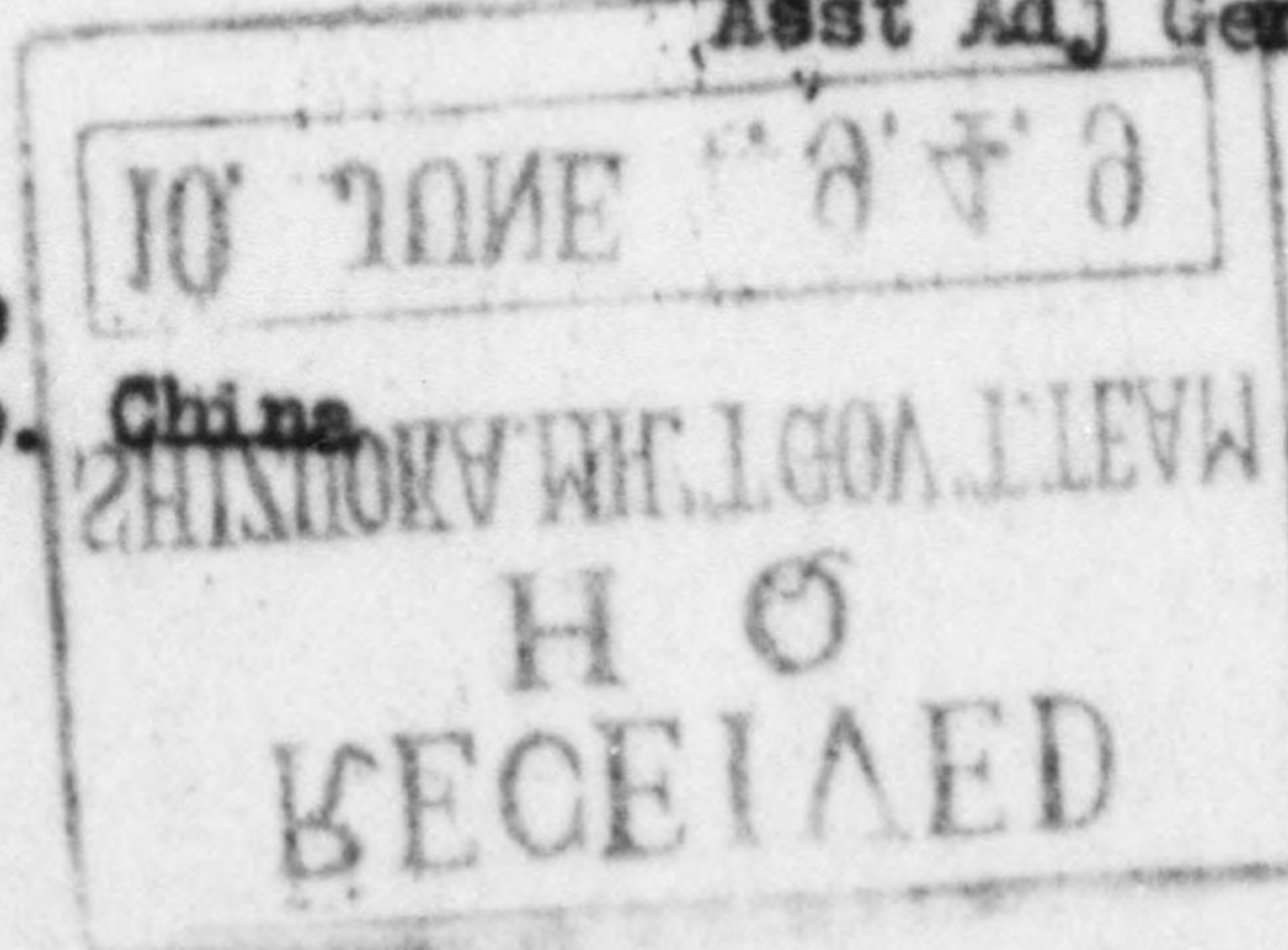

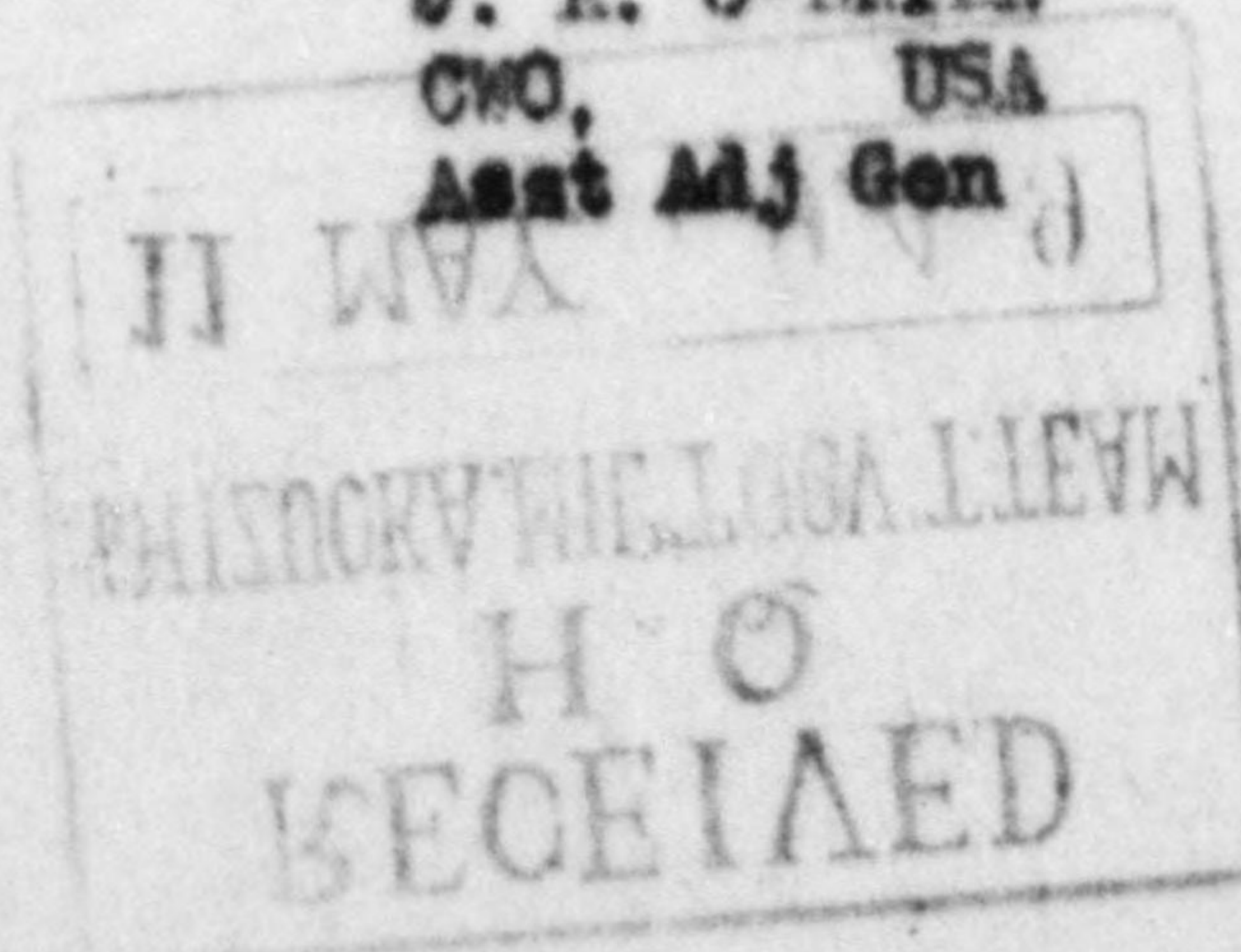

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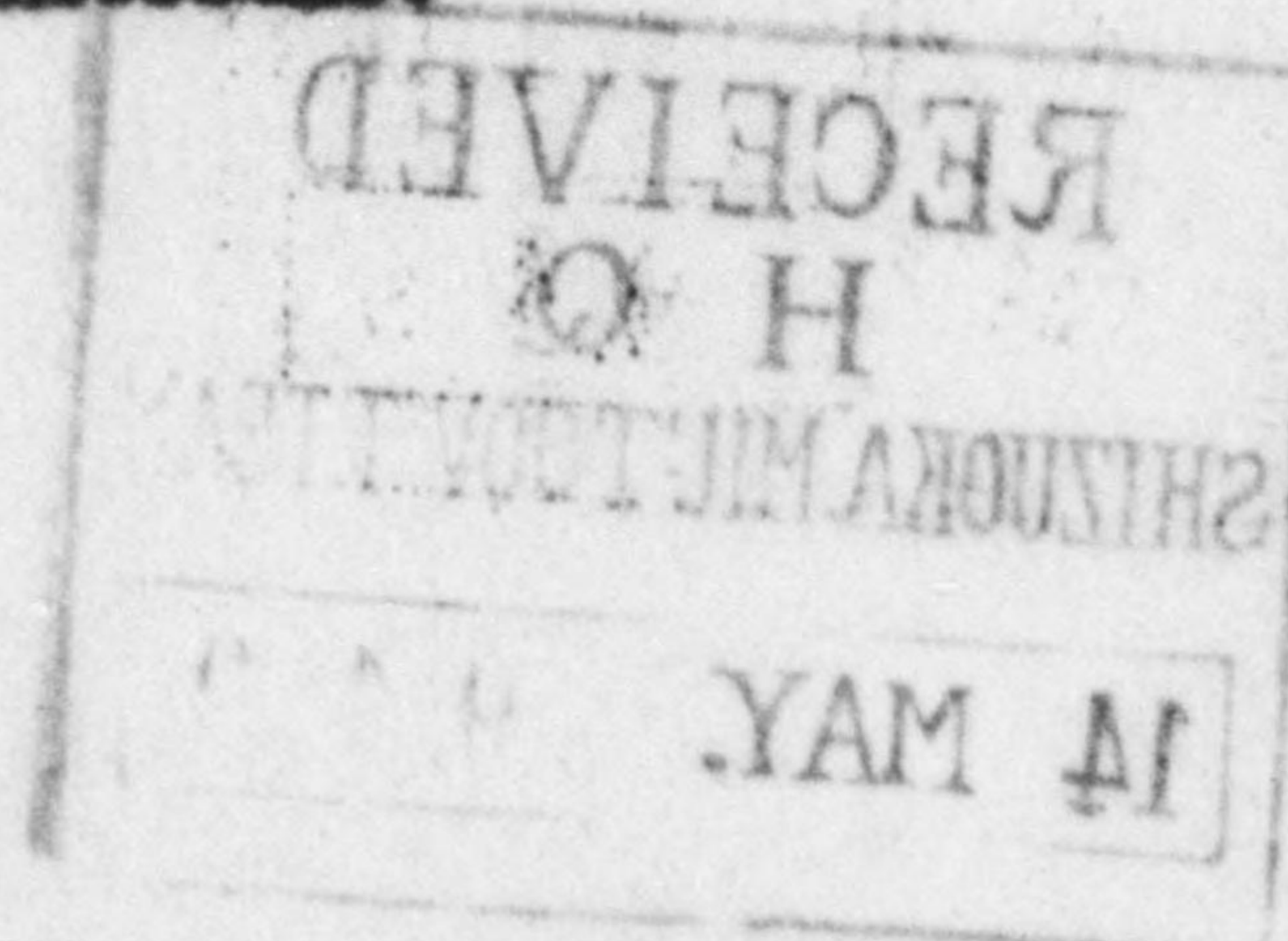
