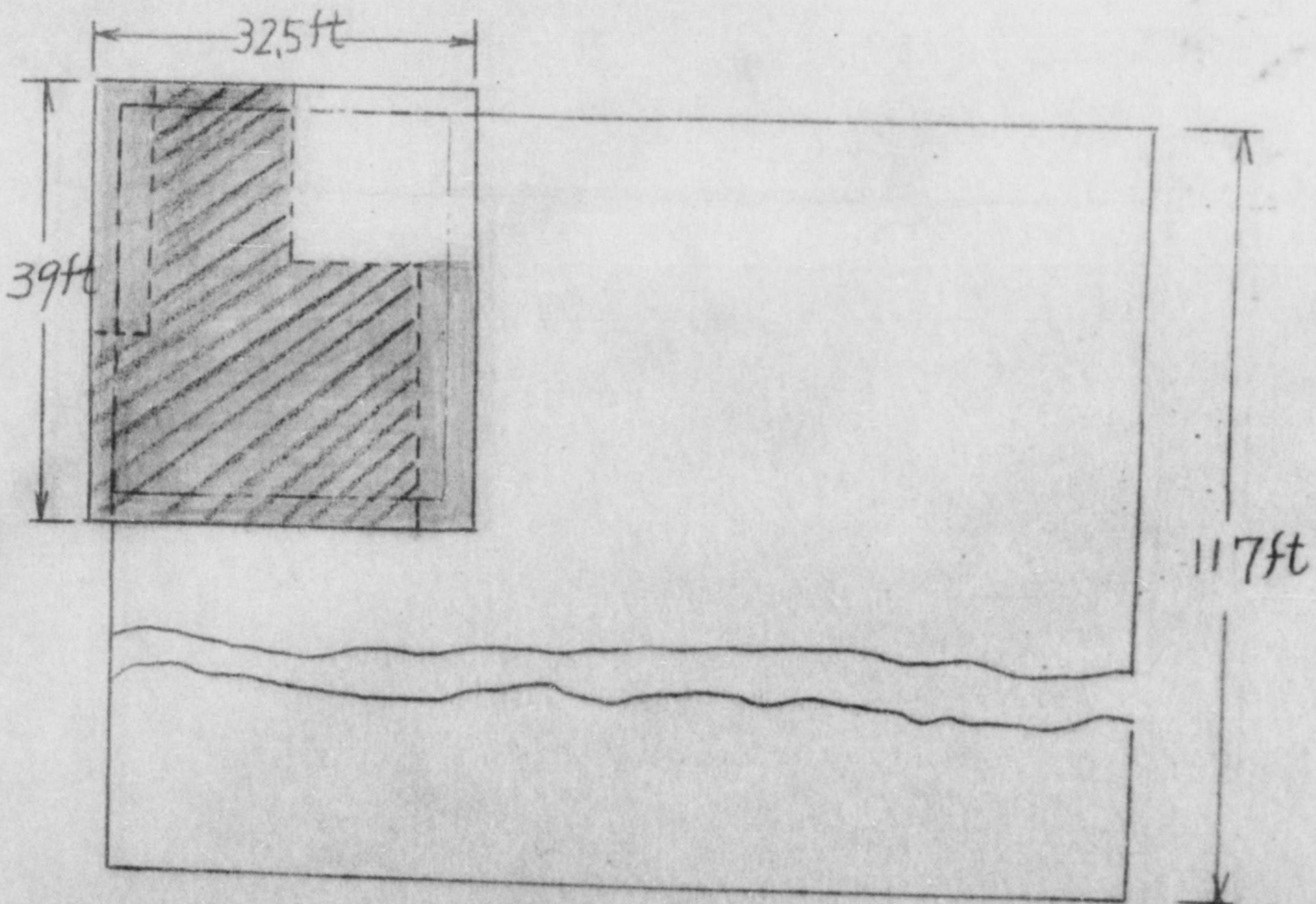
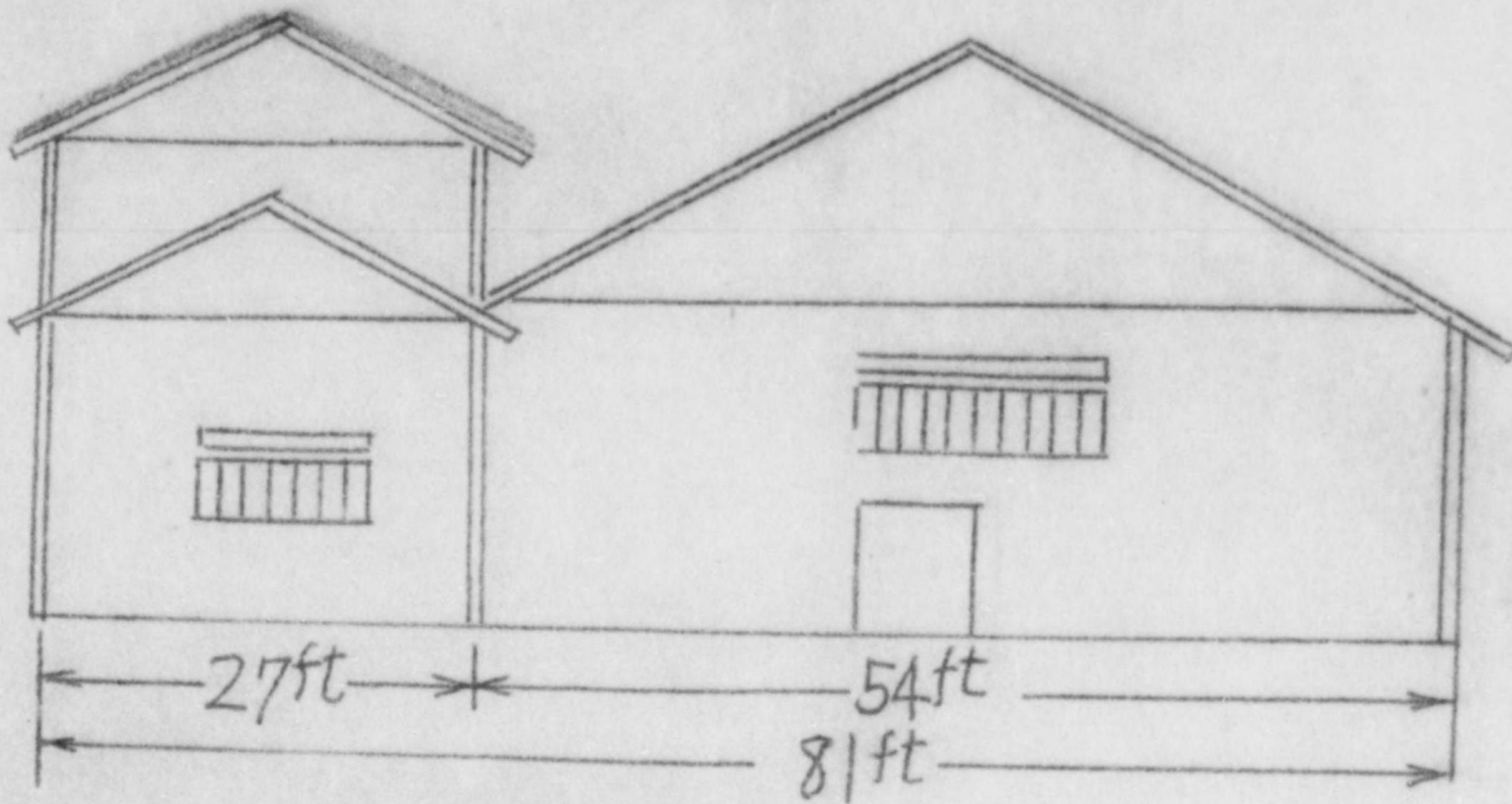

Dear Sir:

Our Hiroshima Factory of the Kurashiki Cotton Spinning Co., Ltd. was damaged for the most part by the bomb on August 6, 1945, but the plant being designated as a reparations plant on January 20, 1946, we hurriedly collected necessary tiles for (A) building from all quarters to protect it from rain-leak temporarily, although it was imperfect, and thus, we could keep the reparations machines from their probable deterioration to some extent.

Since then, we took temporary repairing measures for several times, but the tiles we provided on the roof of the building were different in size, so that they moved to a noticeable extent and recently the rain-leak has gradually been intensified. This certainly will have a bad effect upon the machines, and they will easily get rusty. We tried so many times to repair the defect, but our efforts often came to nothing.

The circumstances being as such, it is necessary to tile the roof again at the earliest possible date, we believe. Therefore, we hereby humble entreat you to make an inspection of the actual state of affairs and give permission to the necessitated repair work.

Besides, the inside of the building is ill-lit even in the broad daylight, and we feel it very difficult to take care of the machines. So we should like to install lighting windows newly in the coara wall of the building with an

intention to protect and take good care of the machines in the future.

For that purpose, we have it in contemplation to take the following steps:

- (1) To take away the existing tiles on the roof and renew the broken rafters,

To repair inside board, on which chips will be put, and

To fix fasteners on the chips and tile the roof with the removed tiles.

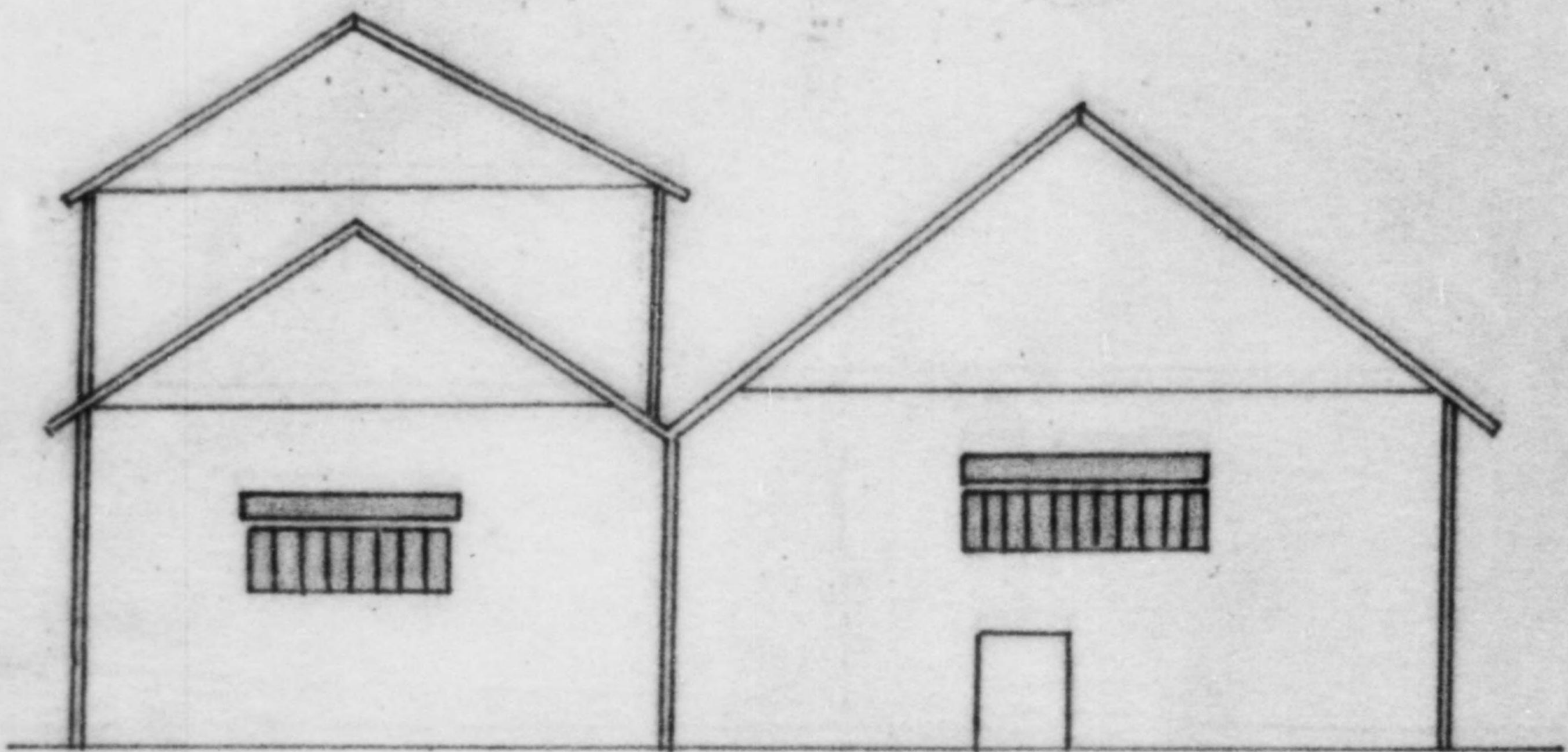

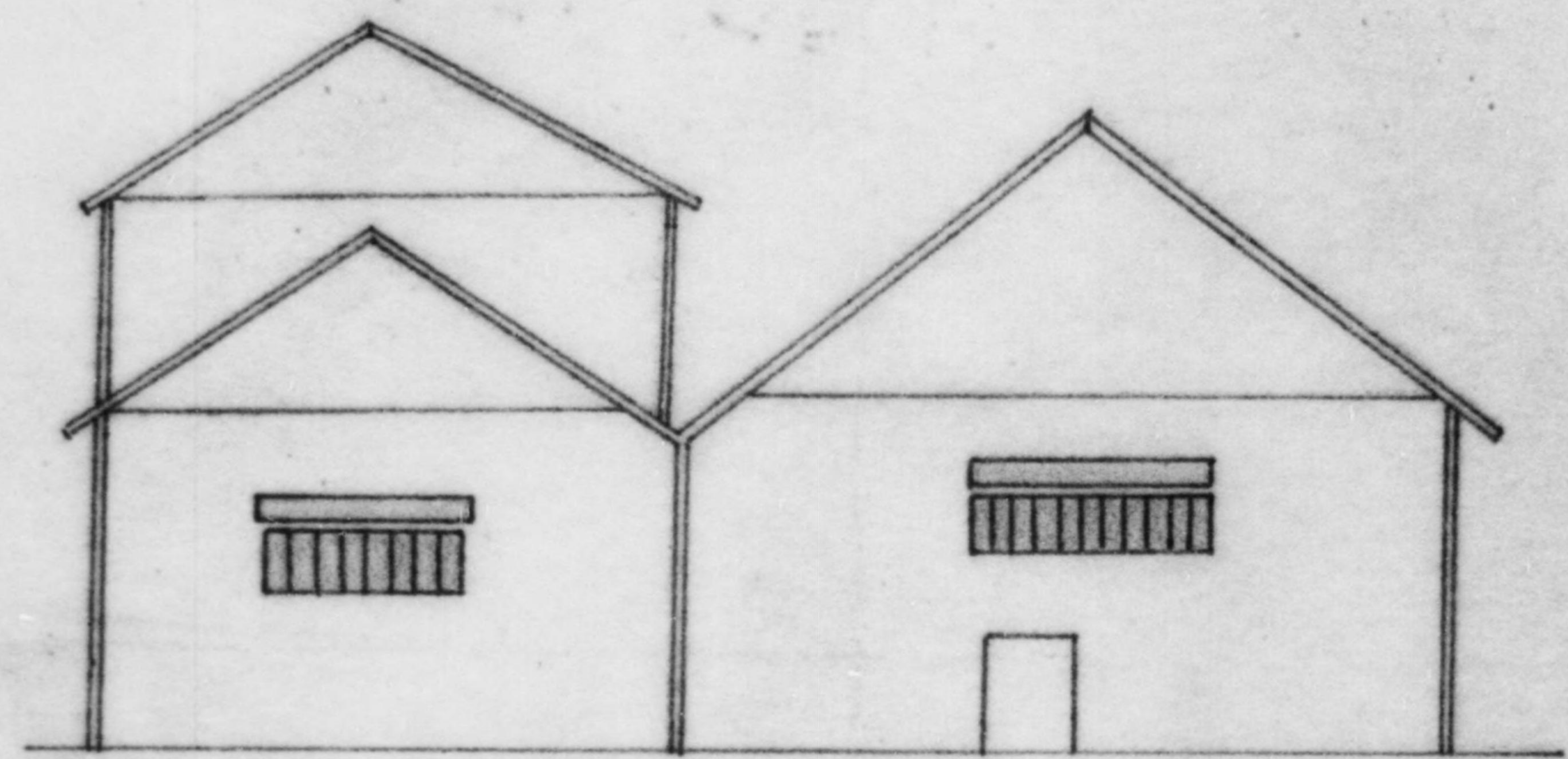

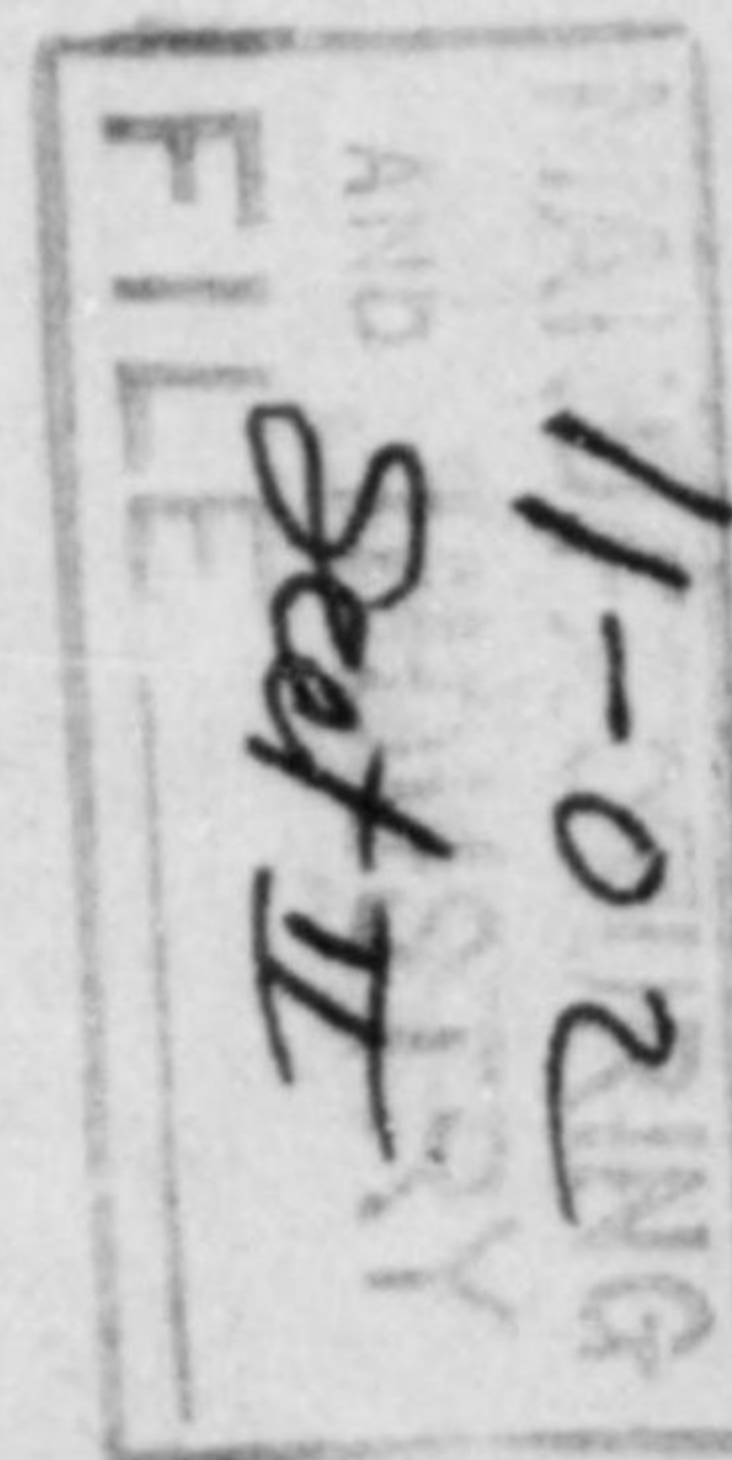

Repairing shop of Hayashima Mill installed 10 machine tools, (Lathe--3, Shaper--1, Milling machine--1, Drilling machines--2, Tool grinder --3), and these machine tools are used for repairing of many kinds of parts of spinning machines and equipments in this mill.

But, because these machines were installed about 30 years ago, they are very old, decayed and non-efficient. Therefore we intend to replace them by efficient machines.

As for lathes, drilling machines and some others we can replace them by non-reparation machines, but for milling machine and shaping machine, we are obliged to transfer the reparation machines from Hiroshima Mill for use.

D) Effect when this application are permitted.

We shall be able to raise the level of efficiency about by 50%, when we use these reparation machines.

We cordially request you to grant permission to the application made by the Hiroshima Factory, Kurashiki Cotton Spinning Co., Ltd., because the result of our survey of it revealed:

1. That factory has the same lineage of capital as the Tamashima Factory, Kurashiki Cotton Spinning Co., Ltd. and is now stopping its operation. But it applied for a permit for conversion into the manufacture of essential civilian commodities through Japanese Government in April, this year.
2. The Tamashima Factory is released from reparations and is now manufacturing the parts of cotton spinning and weaving machines. But to the inconvenience of its production, it is impossible to make bevel-gears for lack of bevel-gear shapers, so the use of such shapers stored in its Hiroshima Factory is favourable. 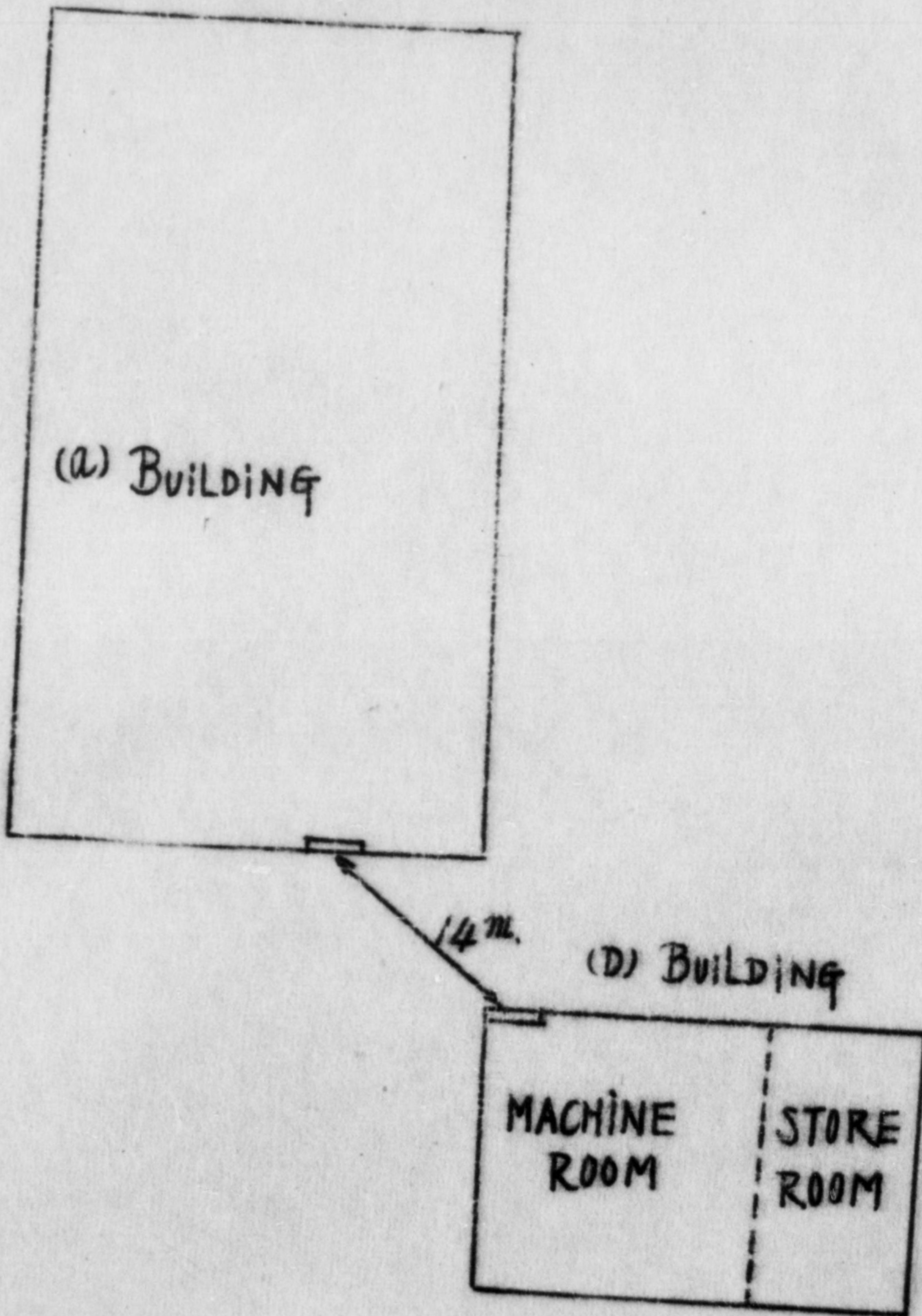

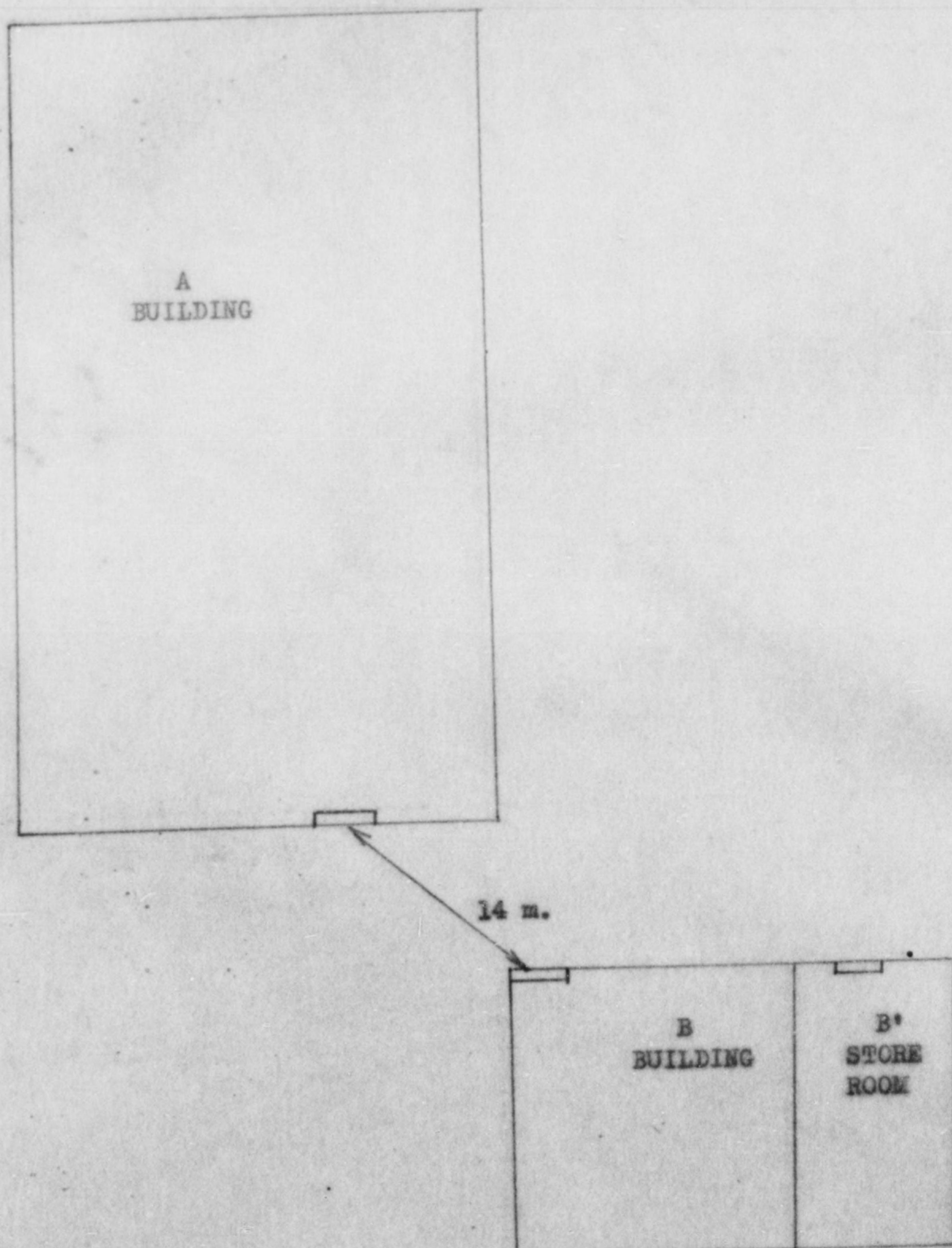

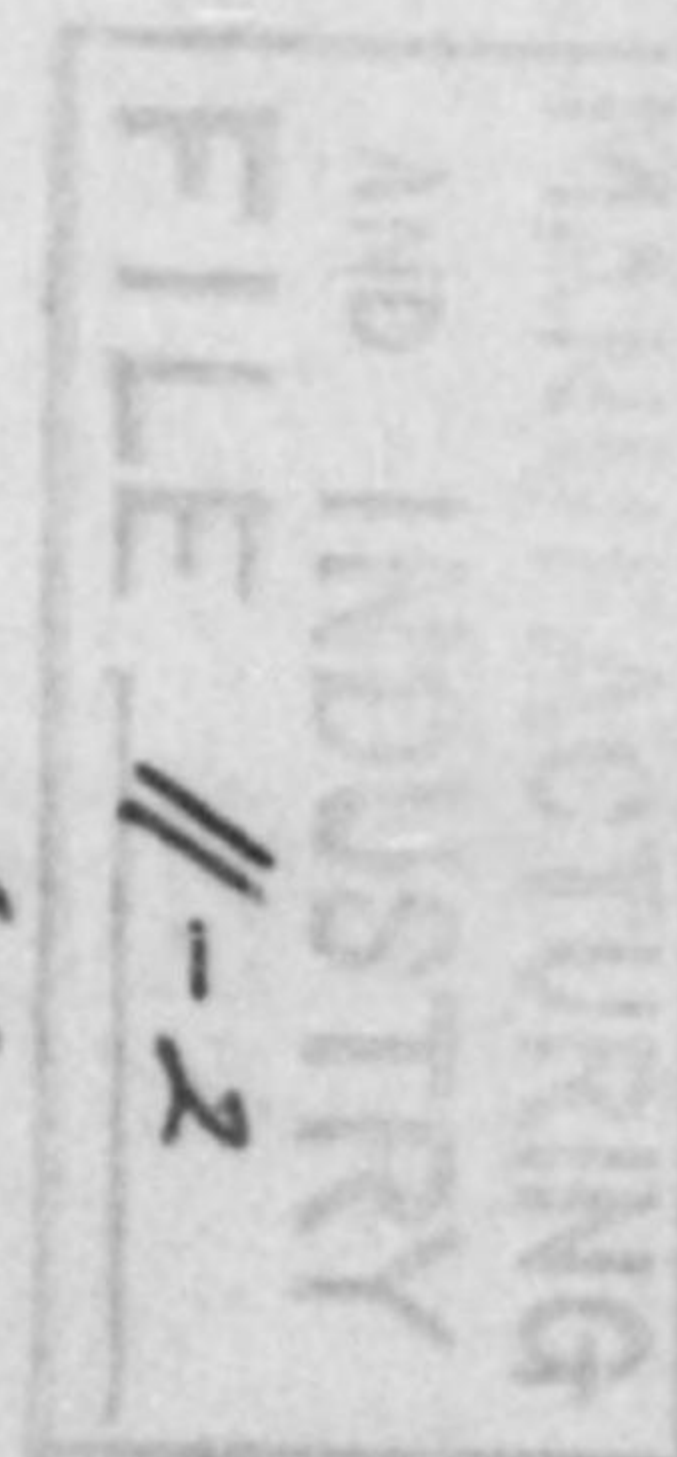
