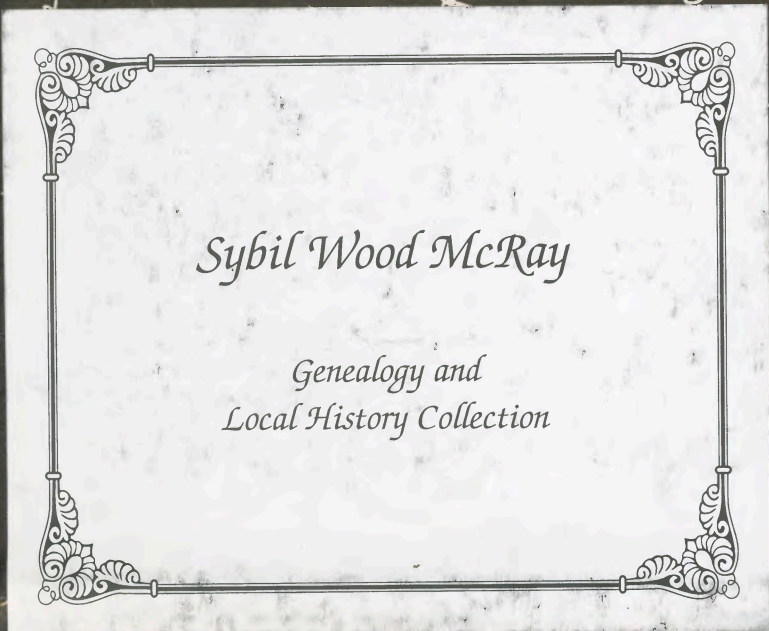

the story of the ring . . .

We, the class of 1953, being the first to wear a ring designed especially for Gainesville High School, wish to acquaint all with the story of this ring.

LEFT SHANK . . .

Gainesville is called the "Queen City of the Mountains"—appropriately depicted by the graceful foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains in the distance, and below, on the historical Gainesville High School standard seal, is the jeweled crown of the queen.

(a) The "Crown" depicts *queenly qualities*. It means high in rank, power, and attractions. It signifies stateliness and fine calibre.

(b) The "Twisted Rope" below the crown is a symbol of the "tie—that binds" the people of the community together.

(c) 1892 is the founding date of the school.

(d) The open book has a dual significance in that the people of Gainesville are interested in greater spiritual and educational advancement.

(e) The Torch is a symbol of leadership.

(f) The lions, guarding these symbols, denote protection, strength, and courage.

RIGHT SHANK . . .

The polished "G" is placed opposite the polished date for balance.

(2) The building entrance nicely balances the school seal.

(3) The elephants, the school mascot, signify strength, and endurance.

(4) Ribbons are in perfect balance and logically read "Gainesville" in the left ribbon and "Georgia" in the right.

(5) The "rays" emanating from the building denote the school's splendid influence in the development of good citizenship.

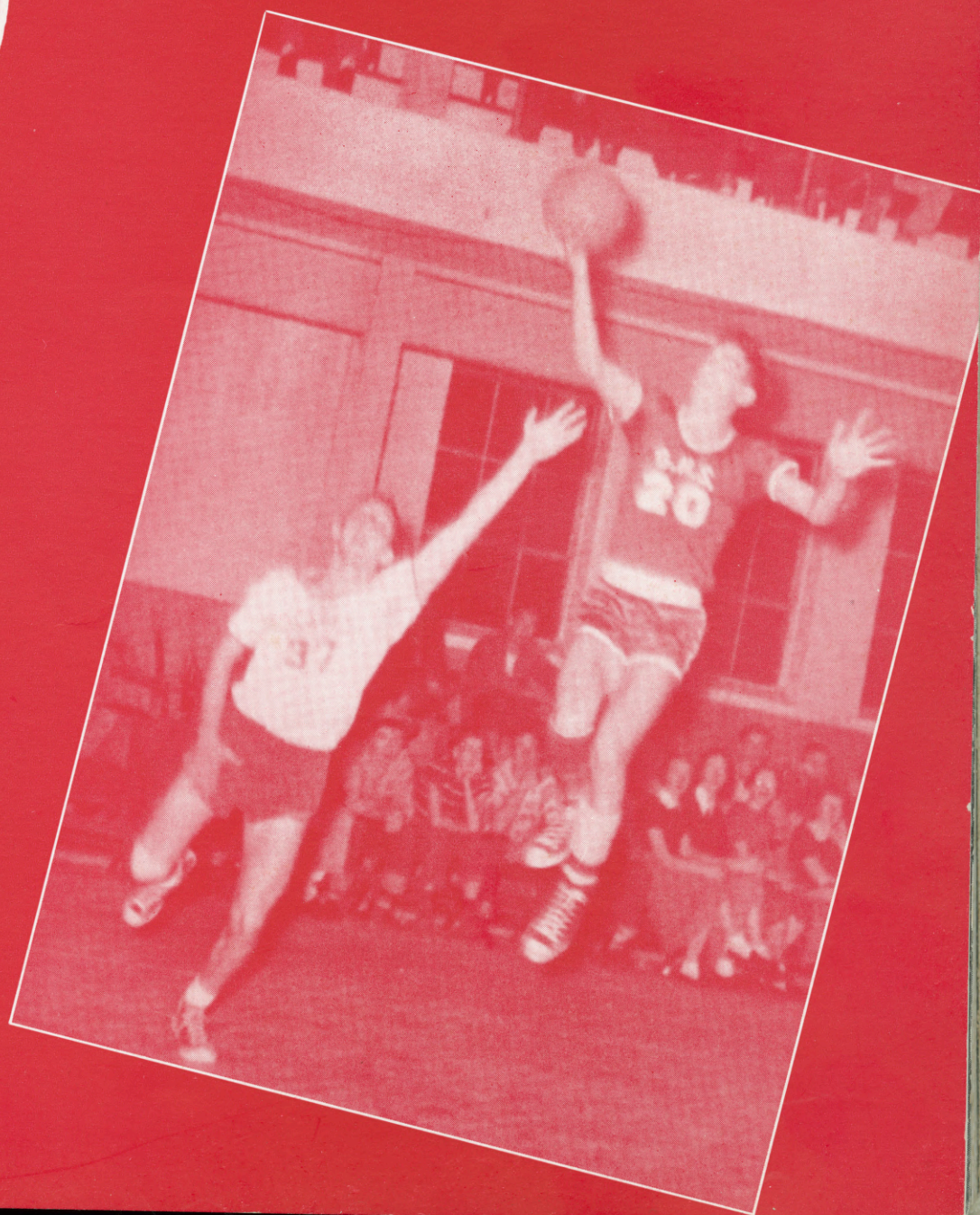
