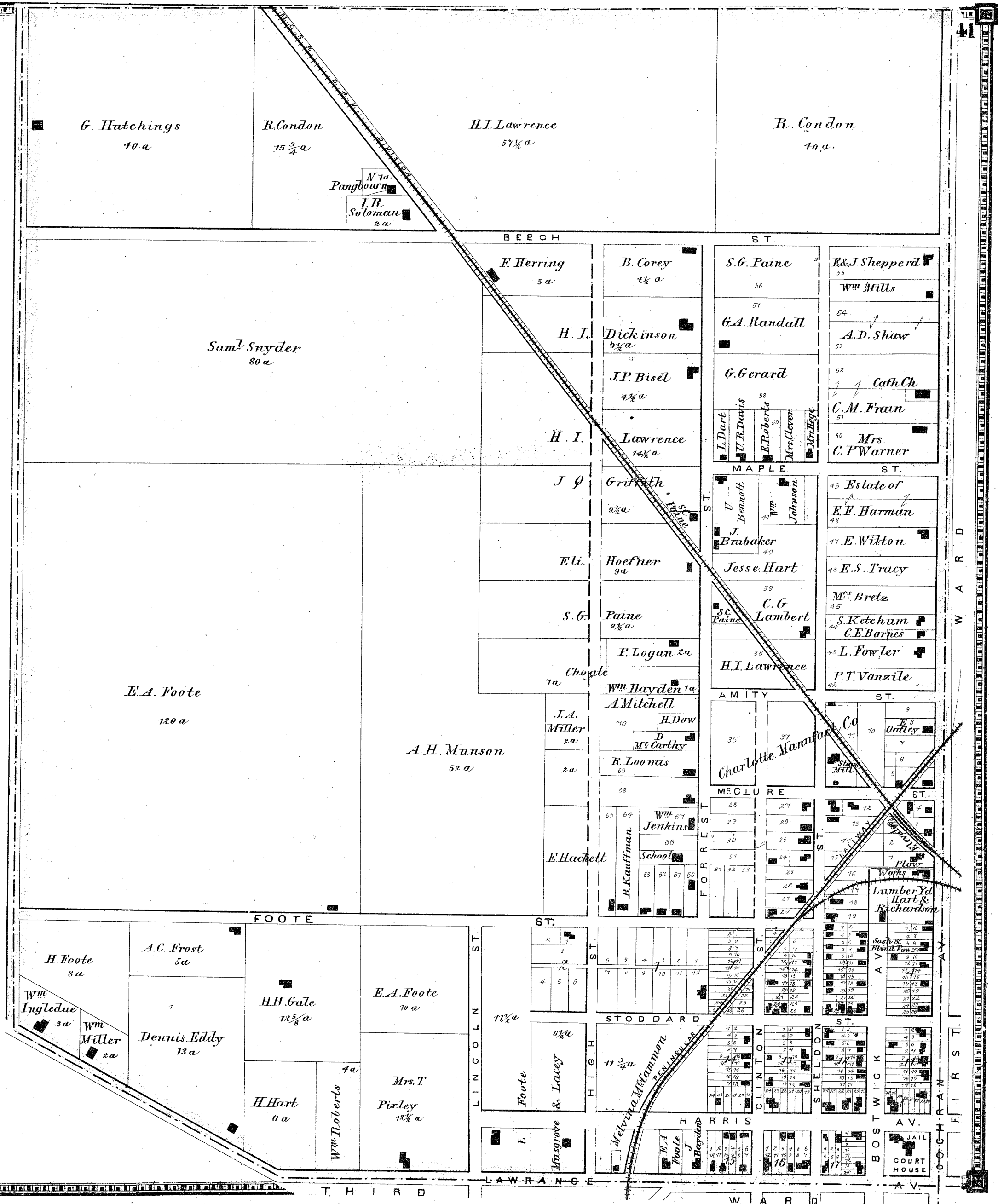


# FIRST WARD OF CHARLOTTE

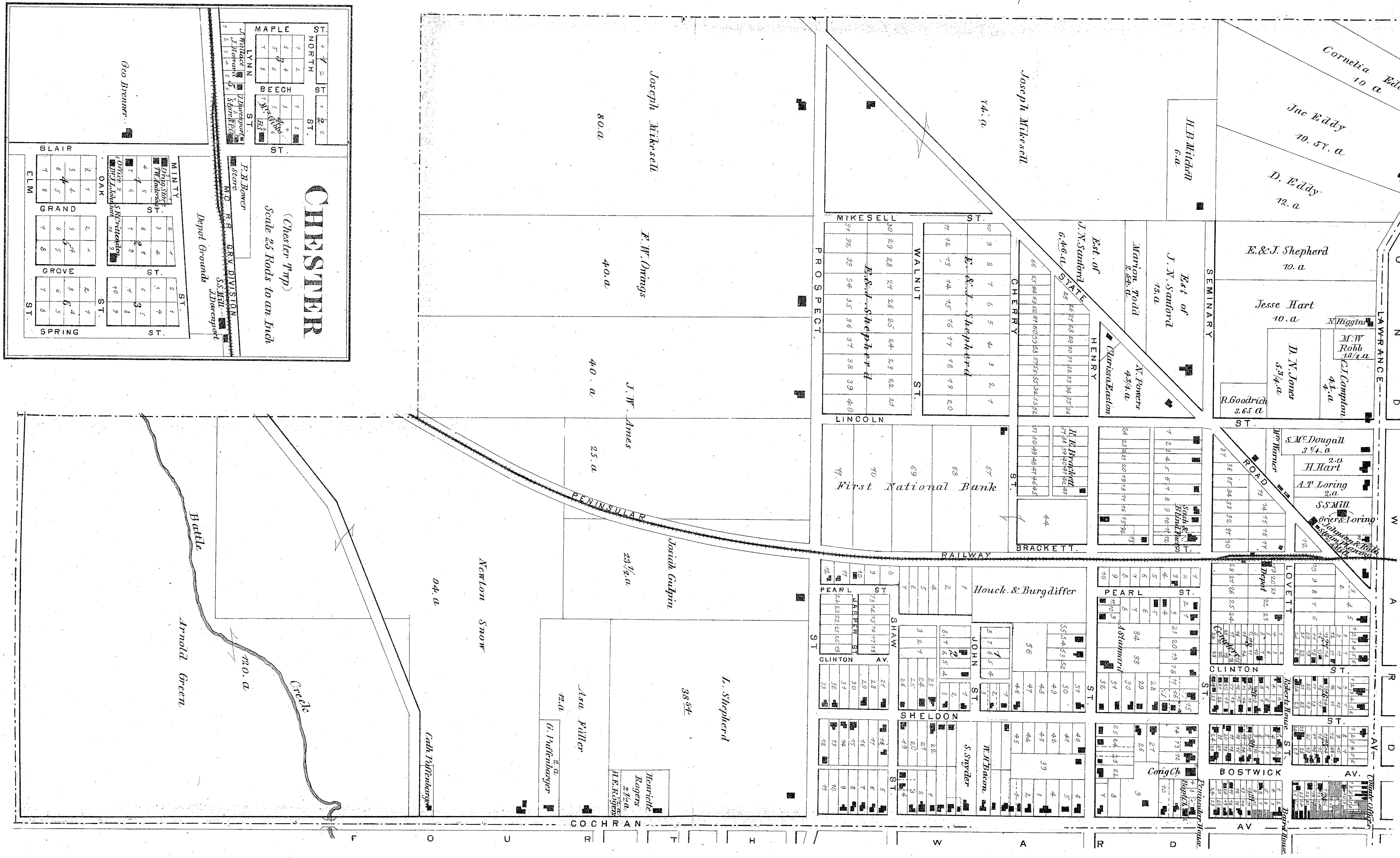






# THIRD WARD OF CHARLOTTE

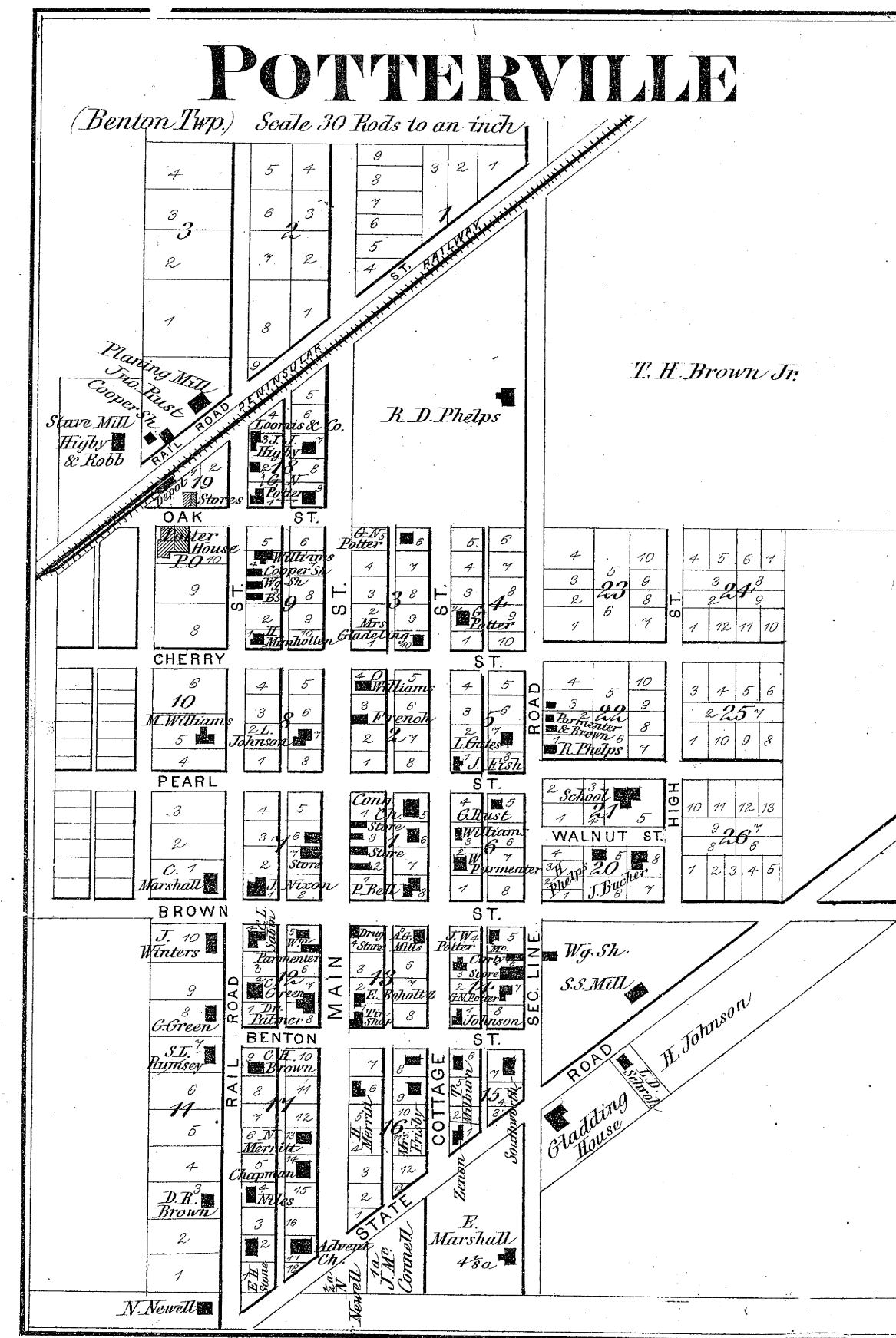
# SOUTH PART OF EATON RAPIDS

RECEIVED: 1/4 leather binding with cloth sides. Leather tight to spine. Leather and cloth very worn--leather on spine powdery. Back cover free. Book was sewn through the side with liner thread. Sewing is sound. Paper of body is in fairly good condition. Large folded map (p.71) has been mended along a fold with gummed Holland.

TREATMENT: Disbind, discard front endsheet (there is none for the back). Number unnumbered pages. Remove gummed Holland repair. Past wash spine. Pick to pieces, wash, dry, press, deacidify, laminate. Separate large folded map along folds and laminate leaving gaps between sections so it will fold easily. Guard folded pages. Add endsheets, stub for thickness. Bind in scrapbook style binding.

MATERIALS: Wei T'o deacidification solution. Ehlermann's PVA LAL 215. Swift's ZF 295 glue. Gane Bros. HKOC PVA adhesive. PROMATCO endsheet paper, reinforcing paper, nylon laminating tissue. Ademco unsupported Blamatec. Davey "Red Label" binder's board. Acid-free conservation mounting board. Library buckram. 23K gold. McBee sawtooth lockpins.
