We have sincere gratification in being able to congratulate our subscribers on the receipt of most glorious intelligence received this-day, by a Vessel from the Isle of France, which place she left in the end of November.

The Master reports that when he was on the point of sailing from Port Louis, a Transport Vessel arrived from the Cape of Good Hope, having on board News-papers, from one of which he copied the following extract.

“ The allied Army were attacked on the 22d July near Salamanca, by General Marmont. After a general engagement the French were defeated with the loss of 16,000 killed, wounded, and prisoners; 200 Officers, 22 pieces of cannon, 3 eagles. General Marmont, and four General Officers wounded. This account is official in the Cadiz Gazette, brought to the Cape by a Spanish Vessel bound to Bengal. A subsequent account dated the 24th July, states, that the French Army were in retreat, and had lost 1500 more Prisoners.”

It will be sufficient to remark in addition, that Salamanca is only 200 miles from Madrid.
