Bell" article, which he expects to
complete to-day. - He knows
nothing whatever concerning those recent
Slave Insurrections in Tennessee and
Kentucky, and can afford no information.

I shall be happy to aid in
sending forward the barrel of apples.
It had better not come here before Thursday
144 or Friday of next week; ~~and~~ no steamer

goes again from here until week
after next. If the barrel can
be sent here, on Thursday next
October 29th, I can engage to
forward it without loss of time to
the Steamship, and the apples will
not be exposed to harm by lying in
this warm room.

Your idea of not using Mrs.
Martineau's name, on the pamphlet,
is I think perfectly correct. - The
article is to appear in 3 successive nos.
of Liberator, and will then re-appear
in a near pamphlet soon as maybe.

We shall hope to visit the
Weymouth Fair.

You speak of an expected paper
from Mr. Gibbons. Such a paper,
sent to Mr. Garrison's care at this office,
I re-mailed to you at Weymouth
yesterday ^{early,} or day before, - I forget which,
- pre-paying it, so there's no excuse for its

failure to reach you, - if failed, ₊
it has, in these failing times.

In reply to your inquiry about
pledges, I would say - that your
only unpaid pledge to the Mass^{ts}
Anti-Slavery Society is that made at the
Annual Meeting last January, ^{which} ~~was~~ was
for Ten dollars. - That made
in May, at N. Eng^d. Convention, (\$20.)
is paid. - If you have any pledges
made direct to the American A.S. Socy,
I am unable to say what it is. - The
receipt of your \$20. was acknowledged
in a recent Liberator. Mr. Phillbrick
does not make regular reports of
receipts, as I think he should, but
allows them to run along sometimes for
2 and 3 months.
