1. Details: Osaka CIC Area received the following information from Osaka Metropolitan Police concerning the Cultural Festival in Commemoration of International Youth's Day to be held from 1700 to 2200, 14 Nov 50, at the Osaka Central Public Hall, Nakanoshima, Kita-ku, Osaka-shi, Osaka-fu:

a. Festival started as scheduled at 1700, 14 Nov 50. At approximately 2000, 14 Nov 50, persons identified only as purges of various companies, attempted to make speeches which had not been authorized by the Osaka Metropolitan Police Department. Police, in attempting to disperse the persons attending the festival, were forced to mobilize the entire of the Osaka Metropolitan Police Department.

b. At 2125, 14 Nov 50, those in attendance had been dispersed. Six Japanese, as yet unidentified, have been arrested. Osaka Metropolitan Police Department is expecting further trouble.

Tokyo

TO : Chief, CI Div

1. Details:

a. Tokyo CIC Area learned from Kojimachi Police and personal observation that, at 1700, 14 Nov 50, representatives of various labor unions began to gather at the official residence of Prime Minister Yoshida, #1, 2-chome, Nagata-cho, Chiyoda-ku, Tokyo-to, to present a petition demanding a basic wage increase to 9,700 yen monthly and a year-end allowance equivalent to three months wages. The gathering was sponsored by the Japan Council of Government and Public Office Workers' Unions (Kankoro).

b. At approximately 1815, 14 Nov 50, the crowd numbered approximately 1,000 persons. From 1815 to 1930, 14 Nov 50, the crowd pushed and shoved toward the compound, but approximately 350 police succeeded in holding them back.

c. At 1945, 14 Nov 50, Koikawa, Goro, Kankoro Vice-chairman announced to the crowd that an aide to the Chief Secretary had promised to meet 33 union representatives under the leadership of Oka, Saburo of the Japan Teachers' Union.

d. After Koikawa's announcement the crowd began to disperse and was completely dispersed by 2000, 14 Nov 50. The meeting with the union representatives is to take place at 2300, 14 Nov 50. The following organizations participated in the gathering:

- (2) All Communications Employees Union (Zentei Jukumi)
- (3) National Railway Workers Union (Kokutetsu)

a. Kyoto CIC Area learned from National Rural Police that at 1630, 13 Nov 50, the number of persons arrested in connection with the Inoue Electric Company disturbance, has increased to 51 among those arrested are a number of well known communists, most of whom refuse to identify themselves when questioned. Approximately 15 persons, including five students from the Kyoto University, are presently gathered in front of the Mukomachi Police Station making speeches to any one who will listen.

b. Kyoto CIC Area learned from confidential source that the Kyoto Prefectural Committee of JCP has called an emergency meeting for night of 13 Nov 50 to discuss the Inoue Electric Appliance Company incident and it is alleged that they will attempt to mobilize a small force to create a disturbance at the Mukomachi Police Station.

1. Details:

a. Kyoto CIC Area learned from National Rural Police that at 0800, 13 Nov 50, 60 persons, including 15 leftists former employees of the Inoue Electric Appliance Co and 45 sympathizers, forcibly entered the Inoue Electric Appliance Company Plant, Otokuni-gun, Mukomachi, Kyoto-fu, in protest of the dismissal of the leftist from the plant. The NRP were called and 32 persons were arrested and are presently being held at the Mukomachi Police Station for questioning.

b. Disturbance is believed to have been inspired by the Kyoto Prefectural Committee of the JCP. Three members of the group: Kuriki, Haruo; Imashiro, Kentaro; and Takenura, Hiroshi, all known members of JCP, were among the 32 persons arrested.

c. As of 1445, 13 Nov 50, 15 persons have gathered in front of the Mukomachi Police Station, demanding the release of the arrested persons.

d. According to police trouble is expected and local police stations have been alerted.

b. At 0800 hours Suita Municipal Police arrived on the scene and arrested Tsuchiya, Kazuhine, reported member of JCP, #1119, Sakae-machi, Suita-shi, Osaka-fu, for unlawful entry. Remaining twenty persons evaded arrest but police believe that several were former employees of Japan National Railway.

Kushiro CIC Area learned from National Rural Police that the Ichi Go Hokuyo-maru, fishing vessel which was seized by a Soviet Patrol Boat at about 0500, 21 Oct 50, approximately three and one half miles off the tip of Nokke Peninsula, Hokkaido, 43° 34' North - 145° 20' East, returned to Nemuro Port, Nemuro-machi, Nemuro-gun, Nemuro-shicho, Hokkaido, at 1320, 12 Nov 50, after having been released by the Soviets at Tomari, Kunashiri Island, Kuril Islands, 43° 44' North - 145° 30' East, at 0800, 12 Nov 50.

b. The following crew members were aboard at time of seizure and returned to Nemuro with the vessel:

Sapporo CIC Area learned from observation and Sapporo Municipal Police that leftist representatives of Hokkaido University Self-Government Association requested permission from University officials to hold "National Youth Day" rally at Hokkaido University campus, Sapporo-shi, Hokkaido at 1300, 10 Nov 50; this request was refused and University officials notified local police to take action if a rally was attempted.

b. At approximately 1350, 10 Nov 50, approximately 30 students assembled in Hokkaido University gym; no action was taken by University officials and no action was requested from police.

c. At 1530, 10 Nov 50, 11 students marched from University grounds to Kokeku Printing Shop (north-three, west-one) Sapporo-shi. Police apprehended this group on charge of holding a demonstration without permission; results of questioning these individuals is unknown at this time.

d. At approximately 1800, 10 Nov 50, from 20 to 30 students of Hokkaido University, who earlier attempted to hold "National Youth Day" rally at Hokkaido University, went to Sapporo-shi Central Police Station and demanded release of 11 arrested students. Release was refused and students were ordered to disperse; they then returned to Kokeku Printing Shop, where the arrest of the 11 students had occurred. The 20-30 students sang and again shouted requests for release of these arrested; they dispersed at approximately 2000, 10 Nov 50. The leaders of this group were:

a. Kanagawa CIC Area learned from Yokohama Municipal Police and confidential source that applications for permission to hold three rallies celebrating International Youth Day were submitted to Yokohama Public Safety Commission on 7 Nov 50. Particulars of applications are as follows:

- (1) 1730 to 1900, 10 Nov 50; responsible person: Nishikaw, Takamune, known member JCP, #1-84, Kodogaya-cho, Hodogaya-ku, Yokohama-shi; participants: 1,000 persons of Keihin Youth Fatherland Front; demonstration parade from open lot in front of Keihin Shinkoyasu Station, Kanagawa-ku, Yokohama-shi to open lot in front of Yokohama Line Oguchi Station, Kanagawa-ku, Yokohama-shi.
- (2) 1700 to 1900, 10 Nov 50; responsible person: Uematsu, Katsuyoshi, known member JCP, #710, Namamigi-cho, Tsurumi-ku, Yokohama-shi; participants: 2,000 persons of Youth and Women's Section, Kanto Branch, All Japan Shipbuilding Workers' Union (Zen Zosen); mass meeting at Kamonyama Park, Nishi-ku, Yokohama-shi, followed by demonstration parade to Chinatown, Yokohama City.
- (3) 1630 to 1900, 10 Nov 50; responsible persons: Kokubun, Masaji, probable member JCP, #1412, Namamigi-cho, Tsurumi-ku, Yokohama-shi; participants: 1,000 persons of youth and women's sections of labor unions affiliated with Tsurumi District Labor Union Council; mass meeting at Asano Grounds, Ushioda-cho, Tsurumi-ku, Yokohama-shi.

b. On 8 Nov 50, Yokohama Public Safety Commission decided to ban the meetings under provisions of Yokohama Public Peace Ordinance and have notified responsible persons of the decisions. Sponsors had probably expected not to receive permission for the rallies.

c. It is believed, however, that an attempt will be made to carry out the rallies in spite of prohibition. Inasmuch as the three rallies were scheduled for the same purpose, to celebrate International Youth Day, and were scheduled at approximately the same time, it is believed that sponsors had intended to split police force and make it more difficult for them to quell any disturbances. Yokohama police will be alerted to cope with any situation that may arise.

d. Source stated that the three rallies scheduled to be held in Yokohama City on 10 Nov 50, and the rally to be held in Kawasaki City on 12 Nov 50, are feints for the purpose of carrying out an "illegal" rally elsewhere in Keihin district. Applications were submitted for rallies in Yokohama City in order to keep Yokohama police force split in trying to maintain order in Yokohama City. With day laborers as the main body of participants, the rally is purportedly planned to be held in front of Kawasaki Railway Station, Kawasaki City, on 10 Nov 50. Upon orders to disperse, participants will simulate dispersement and by traveling in small groups, gather in Rinko area of Kawasaki City and carry out a demonstration in spite of official restraint. On the morning of 10 Nov 50, responsible representatives will be notified of exact time and location of rally. The Tokyo-to Students Federation and National Students Self-Government Federation (Zen Gakuren) are reportedly among the participating organizations. Kanagawa Prefectural Students Federation has not decided whether or not to participate. It is reported, Korean youths also are planning to participate. The total number of youths who are expected to attend is unknown but approximately 900 persons from different labor unions in Tsurumi-ku, Yokohama City are planning to participate.

1. Details: Hiroshima CIC Area received the following information from National Rural Police, and Kure Municipal Police:

a. At 0820, 4 Nov 50, members of the National Rural Police discovered 25, 25 centimeter artillery shells; 3, 13 centimeter artillery shells; 11 anti-aircraft shells; 3, 8 centimeter trench mortar shells; and one, stick land mine, approximately 40 inches long and 1½ inches in diameter in the fishing harbor of Jigozen-mura, Saeki-gun, Hiroshima-ken. All items are heavily corroded. Explosives are presently in the custody of the Saeki District National Rural Police Station.

b. At 1200, 4 Nov 50, Shinnaka, Sentaro (Japanese, political affiliation unknown) a farmer, discovered an unexploded incendiary shell, 50 centimeters long and seven centimeters in diameter at #128, 4-chome, Washo-dori, Kure-shi, Hiroshima-ken. Explosive is presently in the custody of the Kure Municipal Police.

c. At 0900, 5 Nov 50, Takechi, Hiroshi (Japanese, political affiliation unknown) employee in charge of the security detail at the Harima Shipyards, Kure-shi, Hiroshima-ken, discovered an unexploded bomb, 20 centimeters long and 12 centimeters in diameter while patrolling the shipyard.

d. At 1030, 5 Nov 50, Kitagawa, Kumataro (Japanese, political affiliation unknown) a farmer, discovered an unexploded incendiary bomb, 120 centimeters long and 18 centimeters in diameter at 8-chome, Miyahara-dori, Kure-shi, Hiroshima-ken. Bomb is in the custody of the Kure Municipal Police.

Hiroshima CIC Area learned from National Rural Police that at 1230, 3 Nov 50, Kosaka, Kametaro (Japanese) (political affiliation unknown), 1113-1 Yoshiwa-cho, Onomichi-shi, Hiroshima-ken, a fisherman, age 23, accidentally dropped some gunpowder into a charcoal burner (hibachi) and caused an explosion which resulted in his receiving burns that will take three weeks to heal. Investigation revealed that he had approximately 291 Japanese type cannon shells which were 6.5 cm in length and 20 mm in diameter. Kosaka also possessed 1,400 Japanese type rifle shells with percussion caps. These explosives were taken from the sea approximately five miles off the shore of Uojima-machi, Ochi-gun, Hyogo-ken. The explosives are presently in the custody of the Onomichi Municipal Police.

At 1030, 6 Nov 50, the Onomichi Municipal Police arrested Osaka, Asataro (Japanese) (political affiliation unknown), a fisherman, 150 banchi, Yoshiwa-cho, Onomichi-shi, Hiroshima-ken, while he was in the process of taking powder out of gun shells. Investigation revealed that Osaka possessed approximately 184 Japanese type anti-aircraft shells and 17 fuses for the same type shell. The explosives are presently in the custody of the Onomichi Municipal Police.

a. Tokyo CIC Area learned from confidential source that the text of handbills entitled "Student and Korean Activities Toward the Russian Revolution Anniversary" distributed at Tokyo College, Meguro-ku, Tokyo-to, by a group calling themselves the Tokyo University C (possibly cell) Reconstruction Group of Tokyo University is as follows:

"The Red Purge is coming already. The Eastern Heavy Industry Company (Big 5 Ordnance Plant) workers will carry out their historical general strike, starting 7 Nov 50. This company is the largest procurement demand plant in Tokyo. Workers, civilians, and students in Tokyo area will back this workers' general strike. We hope you will join it also. The assembly place will be at 0600 hours at Churyo-mae (place unknown, but believed to be a student dormitory). From which we will depart to be in front of the Shino-maruko Railway Station of the Mikama Line by 0800, 7 Nov 50."

b. Police estimate that only from 10 to 20 students will take part in the activity.

c. It was also learned from sources available to the police that the Korean Youth and Women's League have given the following instructions to their members:

"The Kawasaki Machine Manufacturing Company (branch of the Japan Heavy Industry Company) at Shin-maruko, Kawasaki-shi, Kanagawa-ken, will announce their purge on 7 Nov 50. This company is our future activities. All members must join this anti-red purge activities on 7 Nov 50. It is scheduled for 0800 hours in front of the plant.

d. The police stated that there is a Korean village in front of the Kawasaki Machine Mfg Co plant. It is quite possible that if the demonstrations are suppressed by the police, they may go to the Tokyo plant to demonstrate.

c. At 1600, 5 Nov 50, maintenance crews discovered that five steel plates connecting track sections were missing from the Government Railway Line in the Western section of Akashi-shi, Hyogo-ken. No damage resulted.

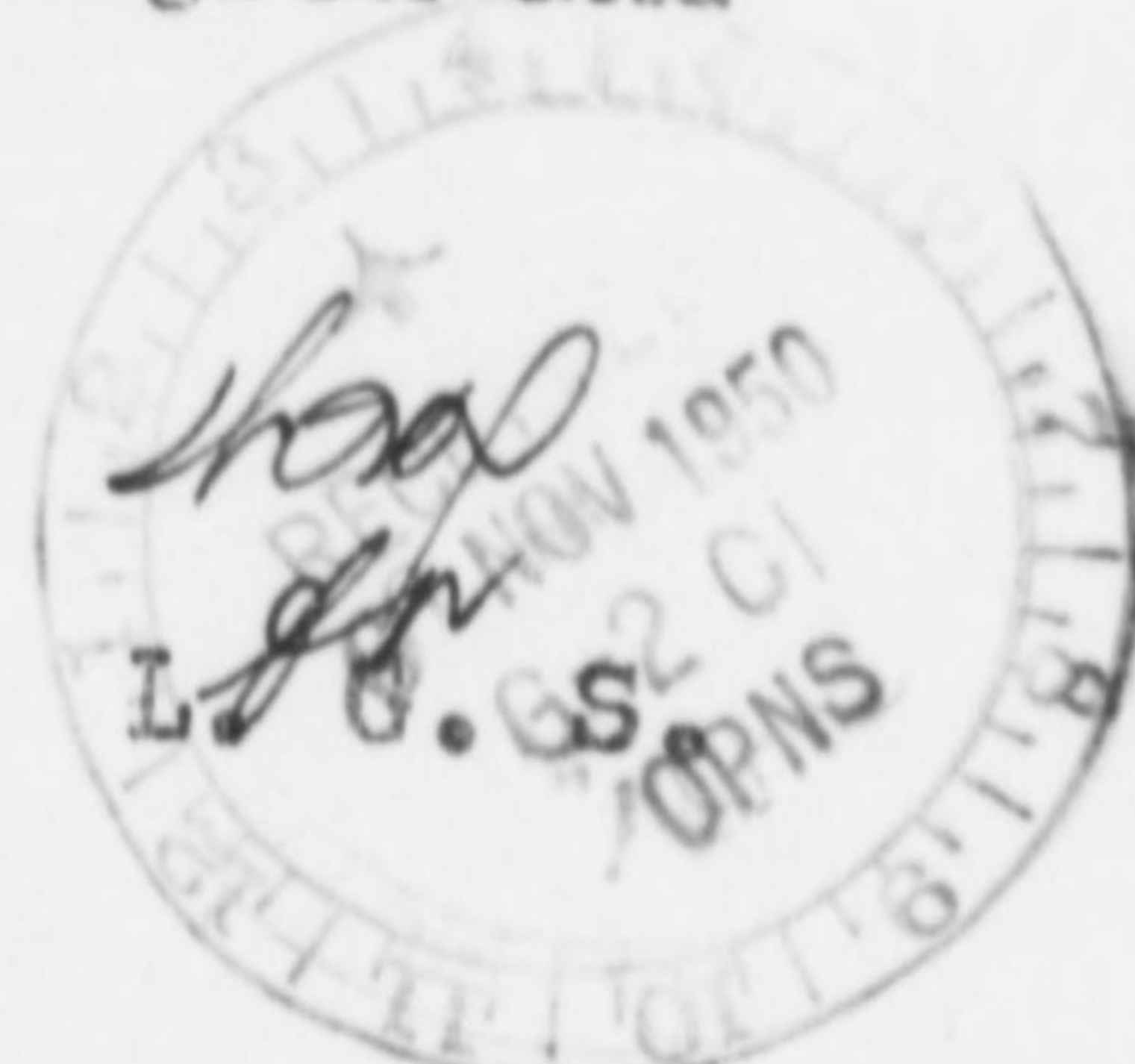
