
Friendly Space Policy


Strategic Direction

Drafting the Recommendations

2018 - 2020

- 9 working groups brought together 100 Wikimedians
- The first rough draft of the recommendations released online and in-person at Wikimania
- Second draft, 89 recommendations!
- 89 recommendations consolidated to 13 by writers, connectors and reviewers
- 13 recommendations refined to 10, published in May 2020




Community Conversations
