It nullifies most of the reduction in bulb prices abroad which has taken place since spring. It is a burden which should not have been placed upon our industry at this time and we urge that at every opportunity a protest be registered against it.

Do Not Delay Your Bulb Order

PRICES would have been much higher this year than last, had not the market abroad fallen since advance orders were placed in Holland last spring. Our own orders were held to the last minute to take advantage of the reductions. We shall have as usual, by the first boat, a liberal supply of the best quality bulbs and can fill in full and promptly all orders which reach us early. Many advance orders placed in Holland at early prices were cancelled, and these buyers will expect to fill their needs in this country. We strongly advise against delay.
