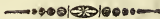

- 14 *Bassano* ----St. Jerome-----An excellent specimen of the Venetian colouring, and a choice cabinet picture of this great master, from the Orleans collection. 33 *Bayonne*
- 15 *Terburg* ----Portrait of a Lady with a Servant -----The works of this artist are increasing in reputation, and are very rare. 48 *Paris*
- 16 *Murillo* ----Christ sleeping on the Cross -----The works of this artist are also daily gaining ground in the estimation of the connoisseur. 49 *Paris*
- 17 *Berghem* --Landscape, Cattle and Figures -----A pleasing scene, in a warm tone of colouring. 35 *Dinner*
- 18 *B. West* ----Daniel -----In the best manner of this intelligent artist. 25 *Paris*
- 19 *Ruysdael* --Landscape and Water-Mill -----From the fine collection of Mons. Fiseau, of Amsterdam; it is one of those simple scenes, true to Nature, in which this charming artist excelled. 35 *Worcester*
- 20 *N. Poussin*--Nymph and Satyr passing a Brook -----This finely composed group exhibits all the gusto and knowledge of the antique, for which Poussin is so eminent; it was formerly in the possession of the Duke of St. Albans. 100 *Bayonne*
- 21 *Backhuysen* Storm on the Coast of Holland-----He has treated this subject in a very masterly style; the noble effect of light and shade, the sublime agitation of the water, destruction of the wreck, and distress of the sailors, form a combination most powerfully interesting to the spectator. 240 *Paris*
- 22 *Mignon* ----Fruit -----A chef d'œuvre of the master. 25 *Shark*
- 23 *C. du Jardin* Landscape, Cattle and Figures -----A warm and beautiful picture. 49 70
- 24 *A. Ostade* --Dutch Peasants regaling -----A charming cabinet picture in his best manner. 100 *Shark*
- 25 *L. Caracci*--Christ crowned with Thorns -----A picture of the finest expression, and worthy of the great School of the Caracci. 34 *Dinner*

- 26 *C. Bega* --- Conversation ----- From Le Brun's Cabinet, and figured in that work ; a more pleasing specimen of this artist does not exist. 59 *Portrait*
- 27 *Mola* --- Marriage of St. Catherine ----- An elegant composition. 90 *Portrait*
- 28 *W. Vanderveelde* A Calm ----- From the collection of Mons. Lys, of Brussels ; of equal merit with that which follows. 73 *Portrait*
- Ditto* --- A moderate Sea ----- Companion to the above, and equally fine ; the connoisseur will see the great master in every touch of these excellent pictures. 106 *Portrait*
- 29 *Wilson* --- Landscape ----- An elegant scene on the banks of the Tiber. 125 *Portrait*
- 31 *A. Cuypp* --- Landscape and Cattle ----- A masterly study for the celebrated picture of this great master, now in the gallery of his Duke of Bridgewater. 52 *Portrait*
- 32 *Rembrandt* -- Tobit anointing his Father's Eyes ----- A rare and precious cabinet picture, perfectly preserved, from the cabinet of Le Brun, and engraved in his work. 12 *Portrait*
- 33 *Le Nain* --- Landscape with Figures ----- This striking representation of Nature was highly esteemed by the late Mr. Gainsborough, and was long in his possession. 7 *Portrait*
- 34 *Vandyke* -- Govartius ----- A very good copy of the famous portrait now in Mr. Angerstein's collection. 57 *Portrait*
- 35 *D. Teniers* -- Landscape with Figures ----- Boors playing at bowls ; a beautiful cabinet picture ; in colour, composition, and facility of execution not easily matched. 100 *Portrait*
- 36 *Berghem* -- A Halt of Travellers ----- The composition and execution are in his happiest style. It was formerly in the collection of the Count de Vence, at Paris. 100 *Portrait*
- 37 *J. Steen* --- A Conversation ----- Humorous and expressive, as all his good pictures are. 100 *Portrait*
- 38 *Hobbima* -- Landscape—Scene on the Bank of a River An admirable cabinet specimen of Hobbima ; rich, and glowing in effect as Rembrandt. 100 *Portrait*
- 39 *J. Lievens* -- Portrait of an old Man with a large Beard. Lievens was a distinguished scholar of Rembrandt, and in this picture has nearly approached the excellence of his master. 41 *Portrait*
- 40 *Tintoretto* -- Marriage of Canaan ----- A cabinet picture is not easily to be found more truly characteristic of this great colourist. 72 *Portrait*

- 41 *A. Vandevelde* -- Landscape ----- A most beautiful cabinet picture of this admirable painter. The cattle are drawn with an accuracy equal to Potter; it is in perfect preservation, and was in the famous collection of Mr. Gildemester. *140 Bygone*
- 42 *Rubens* ---- Hunting -- A sketch ----- This and the following were in the choice cabinet of Mr. Delmé, and possess all the vivacity and spirited touch of this inimitable master. *44 Deschamps*
- 43 *Ditto* ----- Ditto ----- Companion to the foregoing, and of equal merit. Many connoisseurs prefer the genius displayed by Rubens in his spirited sketches, to that which appears in his more laboured performances, not always finished by his hand. *44 Parker*
- 44 *Raphael* ---- Christ bearing the Cross ----- An early picture of this great master, soon after he left the school of Perugino. This was admired in the Orleans collection, and is indisputably genuine. *81 Woodhouse*
- 45 *G.N. Poussin* Landscape, with the Story of Antiope ---- The landscape grand and beautiful, and the figures elegant; the whole perfectly preserved, and of the first class. *140*
- 46 *W. Micris* -- Conversation ----- Has all the delicacy and high finish of this ingenious artist. *130 Land*
- 47 *Guercino* -- Mater Dolorosa ----- The expression of grief in this beautiful head is admirable; it is from the Orleans collection. *60 Dever*
- 48 *Guido* ---- Christ crowned with Thorns ----- Framed as a companion to the foregoing, and also from the Orleans collection; it is in Guido's best time, and the expression is truly divine. *180 D*
- 49 *Titian* ---- A Concert ----- A curious and spirited production of Titian; from the Orleans collection. *73 Parker*
- 50 *Weenix* ---- Italian Seaport, with Figures ----- Very fine. *30 Bygone*
- 51 *Berghem* -- Landscape, with Cattle and Figures ----- A capital picture. It is a beautiful scene, and painted with all that spirit and lightness of pencil for which this great artist is so celebrated. *310 Dever*

52 *Rottenhamer*--Ascension of the Virgin ----- Painted after he had studied in the Venetian School, by which he improved both in colour and composition. This picture, one of his best, was Mr. Barnard's. 67

53 *P. Feronese*--Baptism of Christ ----- This also was Mr. Barnard's, and hung as companion to the last. Paul's cabinet pictures are rare; in this he seems to have outdone himself, and equalled the most admired works of Titian. The composition is extremely grand, and it is coloured in the most exquisite style of the Venetian School. 280

54 *J. Ostade* --Landscape, with Travellers ----- This charming picture was formerly in the choice collection of the Abbé Sozay. 80

55 *Pynacher* --Landscape, with Cattle and Figures ----- Companion to the foregoing, both being selected by Mr. Woodhouse as happy specimens of the respective masters. 85

56 *Dominicheno*--Landscape, with Isaac and his Son----- A beautiful and rare cabinet picture of this excellent painter. 125

57 *Wouwermans*--A Horse Fair----- This extraordinary production evinces the perfect knowledge Wouwermans possessed of the drawing of horses; he has introduced into this composition every species of that animal, designed with a correctness that must astonish the beholder. One of his most masterly works. 190

58 *M. Angelo*--Holy Family ----- This curious cabinet picture was one of the most interesting objects in the celebrated Orleans collection; it is grandly designed and coloured, and in no respect unworthy the great artist whose name it bears. 95

59 *Ruysdael* --Winter Scene----- A picture of more natural and striking effect than this cannot be conceived: the dreary season of winter is here represented with a truth and nature which Ruysdael so well knew how to produce. It was highly esteemed in Mr. Gildemester's collection. 70

- 60 *Cuyp* -----Landscape, with Travellers-----A clear, beautiful, and spirited picture, possessing all the tender tints of air, and brilliancy of sunshine, for which *Cuyp* is so much admired. From Mr. Barnard's collection. 180 *L*
- 61 *Schalken* --Family Concert-----This admirable cabinet picture is rendered still more celebrated by the fine engraving made after it by George Wille, of Paris. *Schalken*, who is much esteemed for his candlelight pieces, foars, in this his *chef d'œuvre*, greatly above his common height. It is a glowing rich cabinet jewel, executed at once with delicacy and force. 175 *Bryan*
- 62 *Bassano* -----Angel appearing to the Shepherds-----This fine cabinet specimen of *Bassano*, and beautiful sample of Venetian colouring, was lately brought from the Aldobrandine Palace at Rome. 90 *Bassano*
- 63 *Wouvermans* --Landscape—Figures -----This capital picture is one of the most admired compositions of *Wouvermans*; the figures and horses, which are painted in his finest manner, are placed with infinite art against a clear brilliant sky, and produce the most charming effect. It is from the collection of Mr. Gildemester. 200 *Wouvermans*
- 64 *Guido*-----A Sybil-----The celebrated rank this picture held in the Orleans collection, renders any eulogium unnecessary. 330 *Guido*
- 65 *C. de Lorraine* --Landscape -----A most charming scene, painted with all the warmth and tenderness of tone that are so much admired in the best works of that favourite master; formerly in the collection of Prince Charles of Lorraine. 480 *Lorraine*
- 66 *D. Teniers* --Conversation—Exterior -----An assemblage of Flemish peasants before the door of a country alehouse, regaling and amusing themselves. *Teniers* excelled to a surprising degree in representing these rural festivals with the most interesting fidelity. This distinguished picture of him, displays his finest silvery tone, and was the best specimen of this master in the Orleans collection. 290 *Bryan*

- 67 D. Teniers--Conversation--Interior-----This truly celebrated *chef d'œuvre* (a most desirable companion to the foregoing) was one of the most admired and popular ornaments in the collection of Monf. de Calonne. It is a masterly and surprising performance, uniting all the wonderful qualities of Teniers's composition, character, and colouring, executed with the most animated pencil. 360 *Beauvais*
- 68 Rubens ---- Crucifixion ----- A most sublime and excellent production of this admirable artist. 150 *Bonn*
- 69 Wouvermans--Soldiers and their Baggage embarking --A view on the banks of a river; a capital, clear, high-finished picture, enriched with the greatest variety of picturesque groups of figures, horses, and shipping; the whole executed with that surprising correctness for which he stands unrivalled. 300 *Beauvais*
- 70 P.deCortona--Flight of Jacob -----Of this artist there does not exist a picture more elegantly composed, or more illustrative of the *Vaghezza*, which the connoisseurs admire in Cortona. It held, as such, a distinguished rank in the Orleans Italian collection, and may be considered as the *chef d'œuvre* of the last great master of the Roman School. 320 *Paris*

- 11 *T. Gainsbro*--Landscape—View in Suffolk -----In perfect preservation, in his best manner, the scene and sky altogether beautiful. 24 *Parker*
- 12 *Polembourg*--Landscape—Story of Tobit -----This was Mr. Woodhouse's, and he chose it as being one of the most pleasing morceaux Polembourg ever painted. 18/2

mester's collection, and are among the
finest works of Weenix in Still Life. 52 *Painting*
- 14 *Ditto* ----Ditto -----Companion to the foregoing. 54 *Painting*
- 15 *Teniers* ----Landscape -----A Sunny Evening—Dutch Peasants driving
home Cattle; possessing all the excel-
lence of this great painter of Nature. 700 *Original*
- 16 *Furini* ----The Magdalen -----A bold and spirited picture, not unworthy of
L. Caracci. 65 *Painting*
- 17 *Mola* ----Landscape and Figures-----This charming landscape is in Mola's finest
manner, and no way inferior to the best
works of Sal. Rosa. 33 *Painting*
- 18 *Backhuysen*--A brisk Gale-----In the clearest and most transparent manner
of this very great painter, whose best
works are justly esteemed equal to those
of the admired W. Vandeyelde. 40 *Painting*
- 19 *Wouvermans* Horses in a Stable -----A spirited picture. Wouvermans delighted
in delineating that noble animal, the
Horse, in all situations. 47 *Painting*
- 20 *Titian*-----Portrait, called L'Esclave-----From the Orleans collection, and there highly
esteemed;—the Boy is painted with all
the force of Titian. 22 *Painting*
- 21 *Lucatelli* --Landscape -----One of his happiest productions. 3 *Painting*
- 22 *A. Elsheimer* Christ and the Disciples at Emaus -----The works of this artist are curious and
rare; this choice specimen was in the
collection of Mr. Barnard, and is in the
most esteemed manner of Elsheimer. 4 *Painting*
- 23 *Rembrandt* Simeon in the Temple -----From the collection of Sir Joshua Reynolds. 4 *Painting*
- 24 *Giorgione* --Portrait of a Poet -----A very fine picture, full of character; and
also from the valuable collection of
Sir J. Reynolds. 4 *Painting*
- 25 *Guercino* --St. Jerome and the Angel -----Painted in a very grand style, and display
ing all the energy and character of Guer-
cino. 20 *Painting*
- 26 *D. Teniers*--Landscape-----This cabinet jewel is in the fine silvery
tone, so much admired in the best works
of this painter. 40 *Painting*

- 27 *D. Teniers* --Landscape ----- Companion to the foregoing, and of equal merit ; indeed these small specimens fully illustrate the various merits of the master. *44 Peckle*
- 28 *Schalken* --A Soldier -----A spirited, yet finely finished specimen. *20 65 Peckle*
- 29 *V. Bergen* --A Landscape and Cattle -----Unquestionably one of his best works. *48 Peckle*
- 30 *Berghem* --An Italian Seaport-----In the most spirited and best manner of Berghem, and the choicest *morceau* of that artist possessed by the late Mr. Gildemester. It is well known by the fine print from it, engraved by Aliamet. *190 Teniers*
- 31 *A. Ostade* --Tabagie-----This charming little picture is in the finest and most transparent manner of A. Ostade ; it is admirably engraved by Suyderoef, and known, by collectors of prints, under the title of *san de Moff*. *125 Peckle*
- 32 *Snyders* ----Boar Hunt-----Capital. *96 Deschamps*
- 33 *Fyft* ----Dead Game -----In his best manner. *31 White*
- 34 *J. Steen* --The Milk Man -----From the celebrated collection of Mr. Vanderpot, of Rotterdam ; an admirable delineation of Nature. *68 Buisson*
- 35 *A. Vandevelde* --Landscape and Cattle -----This charming group of cattle and figures is painted in the most precious manner of this pleasing artist, whose choice works daily rise in the estimation of connoisseurs. *110 Caronde*
- 36 *Ditto* ----Ditto -----Companion to the preceding, and of equal merit. *150 Buisson*
- 37 *Vernet* ----Sea Piece -----A fire in an Italian seaport ; this and the following may be reckoned amongst his most masterly productions. *76 Deschamps*
- 38 *Ditto* ----Ditto -----A storm ; companion to, and of equal merit with, the preceding. *67 D^r*
- 39 *D. Teniers* --Merry-making in a Farm Yard -----A numerous assemblage of Flemish boors dancing and regaling. This capital picture is in the best time of Teniers ; it is engraved by Le Bas. *320 Buisson*
- 40 *W. Vandevelde* --A Calm -----A most exquisite cabinet jewel, and desirable specimen of this much-admired painter. *125 Deschamps*

- 41 *Lingleback*--A Turkish Seaport ----- Unquestionably one of the best productions of this master. *160 Orleans*
- 42 *Giorgione* --Cupid stung by a Bee,complaining to Venus. The scarcity and merit of the genuine works of Giorgione recommend them to the connoisseur. This was the most favourite picture by him in the Duke of Orleans's collection. *Walton coll. 90 L. Siffels*
- 43 *C. de Lorraine*--A Landscape-----A landscape, evening scene, with setting sun;—has all that peculiar warmth and richness so justly admired in his fine pictures; from Mr. Barnard's collection. *Sm. 368 90 Barnard*
- 44 *Ditto* -----Ditto----- Companion to the above, and of equal merit; it is indeed a charming specimen of this much-admired painter. *Sm. 369 100 P. de*
- 45 *A. Cuyp*----Landscape and Figures-----A clear and brilliant picture, representing the morning of a fine summer's day, with peasants going to market; the haze that hangs on the distance, but gradually gives way to the rising sun, is charmingly represented;—it was in the cabinet of Le Brun, and is engraved in that work. *240*
- 46 *Rembrandt*--Landscape and Figures-----A most beautiful and forcible landscape, possessing all the magical effect of light and shadow, for which the works of this great painter are so much admired. *240*
- 47 *A. Caracci*--Christ and the Samaritan Woman ----- This sublime production, and which was one of the most distinguished cabinet pictures in the Orleans Italian collection, unites all that we admire in the best works of Annibal Caracci—correctness of design, dignity of character, and masterly execution. *250 T. Agnes*
- 48 *Baroccio* --Holy Family ----- This fine specimen of Baroccio, highly characteristic of his sentiment and composition, is from the Orleans Italian collection. *44 Baroccio*

- 49 *A. Brower*--Landscape -----This is a rare and choice specimen of a master, whose merit perhaps is hardly yet known in England. The great Rubens highly esteemed his genius, and pronounced him capable of the highest attainments of the art; and, had his good conduct, equalled his ability, he would have justified the prediction. 60 *Emile*
- 50 *G. Poussin*--A Landscape -----In the best manner of this great Paysagist. 120 *Emile*
- 51 *F. Mieris* --A Conversation -----This very rare cabinet picture was an ornament of the Orleans Collection; it is mentioned with distinction by Descamps in his Life of F. Mieris, who has given us his own portrait in this excellent production of his pencil. 110
- 52 *J. Both* -----Landscape and Figures -----A rich, warm, and harmonious cabinet picture of this admired painter, the figures by himself. 110 *Emile*
- 53 *Parmeggiano*--Virgin, Christ, and St. John -----This picture is a faithful exhibition of the peculiar excellencies of Parmeggiano, his graceful air and beautiful expression; it is painted in his best manner, and was highly esteemed in the Orleans collection.
- 54 *J. Ostade* --Winter Scene in Holland -----A beautiful high-finished picture of this esteemed painter; it was one of the most admired objects in Baron Nagel's Cabinet. 155 *Emile*
- 55 *V. Heyden & A. Vanderveelde* } Buildings -----A valuable and high-finished picture, from the collection of Mr. De Calonne, painted with all the minute delicacy for which Vander Heyden was so famous. 71 *Emile*
- 56 *Rubens* ---Assumption of the Virgin -----This first-rate production of Rubens, well known by the fine engraving after it by Bolswert, was last purchased out of the late Mr. Purling's collection. 110 *Emile*
- 57 *Schidone*----Holy Family -----From the Borghese collection. A charming specimen of this divine master. 8 *Emile*
- 58 *M. Hobbima* Landscape -----A view from Nature in Holland: a silent, woody, rural scene, with water; one of the happiest productions of Hobbima, exemplifying that chaste and unaffected manner of representing the simple scenes of Nature, for which he stands unrivalled. 210 *Emile*

- 59 *Vanderwerf* - Hercules betwixt Virtue and Pleasure ---- One of the most celebrated pictures of this elegant artist, purchased by the late Mr. Gildemester, in Paris, at a very high price; the figure of Hercules is perfect in drawing, and the expression of all the figures admirable. 175 *L. Prud'homme*
- 60 *Backhuysen* - Embarkation of King William for England -- King William is embarking on board the Dutch Admiral's ship, the Princess Mary, for England; she carries an ensign, with the motto, *Pro Religione et Libertate*. It is one of the most interesting and capital pictures of Backhuysen. 255 *W.*
- 61 *Berghem* -- Landscape and Figures ----- A most beautiful cabinet specimen of Berghem, painted in his finest time, and in the most perfect preservation. 170 *Bark*
- 62 *W. Mieris* -- Conversation with the Cat ----- This celebrated picture has always been distinguished by the name of Mieris's Cat. It is certainly one of the most capital and most exquisitely finished pictures of this precious painter. 350 *Styger*
- 63 *Cuyp* ----- Landscape, with Cows in Water ----- Painted in his broad style, and vigorously coloured. From Mr. Barnard's collection. 120 *Bark*
- 64 *K. du Jardyn* Landscape, with a Group passing a Brook -- This beautiful cabinet picture has ever been considered a *chef d'œuvre* of Du Jardyn. It was a principal ornament of the choicé cabinet of Mr. De Calonne. 295 *W.*
- 65 *Murello* ---- Descent from the Cross ----- A first-rate production from the hand of this highly esteemed master, recently well known and admired in the collection of Mr. Purling. 280 *Styger*
- 66 *A. Ostade* -- Interior of a Dutch Cabaret ----- The art of the painter is conspicuous in every part of this wonderful performance; it is one of the most exquisite works of Ostade, and must raise his merit in the estimation of every connoisseur who observes it. 240 *W.*
- 67 *Raphael* ---- Virgin and Child ----- This rare and inestimable jewel was one of the choicest cabinet pictures in the Orleans collection. It is in the most perfect preservation, and has ever been considered as one of the most desirable easel pictures of this divine painter. 280 *W.*

- 68 *Wouermans* -Landscape, with the Coach and grey Horses - Last from the collection of Mr. Gildemes-
ter, but well known by the admirers of
Wouermans, having been engraved by
Moyreau, and mentioned in the Life of
Wouermans, by Descamps. It is one
of those happy productions where the ta-
lents of this great master are displayed in
the minutest part, while the whole forms
an admirable and harmonious picture.
- 69 *S. Rosa* ----Pythagoras discovered by his Fellow-
Citizens-----} The group of figures on the left is finely
composed, and characterized with the ut-
most science ; the landscape is grand and
romantic. In chastity of design, this pic-
ture does not yield to N. Poussin, whilst
it possesses a sublimity peculiar to Sal-
vator himself. This capital picture was
brought from Rome by Mr. Hamilton.
- 70 *Titian* ----Holy Family and Saints-----This first-rate production from the hand of
Titian, was lately brought from the
Aldobrandini Palace at Rome, of which
it formed a distinguished ornament.
- 71 *Rubens* ----Diana returning from the Chase-----This capital picture is presented to the at-
tention of the connoisseurs, as one of the
most admirable productions of this great
painter. The composition is truly beau-
tiful, and the colouring has all the splen-
did richness peculiar to Rubens. It was
painted for the family of Walkenier, of
Amsterdam, and was brought to this
country by Mr. Bryan, since which Sharp
has made an excellent engraving from it.
The whole of this noble performance is
the undoubted work of Rubens, and is in
the most perfect state of preservation.
