

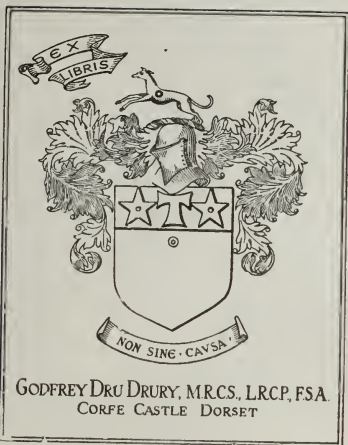

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## PREFACE.

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THE contents of this, the second and concluding volume of my Work on "KENTISH BRASSES," speak for themselves, and need but few words of commendation to the public interested in such ancient memorials of the departed.

Seventeen years have elapsed since I published my first volume, and a large part of the intervening time has been occupied in the painstaking and laborious task of making rubbings of the remaining Brasses in Kent, in which I have been greatly assisted by my brother, Mr. H. T. BELCHER.

It is my belief that in these two volumes a complete record of the extant brasses of the county has been secured, including even solitary inscriptions, and thus a work has been completed of lasting value to the genealogist, to the antiquary, and to all interested in the topography of the county, besides the large and growing class of brass-rubbers.

Kent is peculiarly rich in Brasses. It has, perhaps, a larger number and a more representative collection than any other county, although individually finer examples may be found elsewhere. No church in the world possesses such a splendid series as the nineteen brasses in Cobham Church, ranging in date between 1298\* and 1529 (see Vol. I. of this work).

For the most part the examples illustrated in the present volume belong to the fifteenth and two following centuries, but there are noteworthy exceptions, such as the fine canopied brass of a priest in Eucharistic vestments at Horsmonden, 1330;

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\* It is open to doubt whether this or the brass of Margaret de Camoys, in Trotton Church, Sussex, is the earlier. The latter is supposed to date from 1310, but that of Lady Joan de Cobham, if not as old as the year of her decease (1298), is quite probably not many years later. If this be so, the Kentish brass takes precedence of the Sussex as the oldest extant to the memory of a lady.

Robert Dodde and two nameless demi-figures at Graveney (pp. 53, 55); Sir John de Mereworth, at Mereworth, 1365 (p. 93), a fine knightly effigy closely resembling that of Sir Thomas de Cobham, at Cobham (see Vol. I., p. 33), the date of which is 1367\*; a demi-figure of a priest at Saltwood (p. 118), evidently by the same hand as the fine full-length effigy of Peter de Lacy, rector of Northfleet, 1375 (Vol. I., p. 88); the double-canopied brass at Sheldwich, 1394; and the remarkably beautiful foliated cross enclosing diminutive demi-effigies at East Wickham, the date of which is somewhat doubtful†.

The details of the costumes in the double brass at Sheldwich are full of interest. The wire caul or net enclosing the lady's hair, and the similar wire balls into which the ends of her pendant curls are passed, are worthy of attentive notice. This head-dress should be compared with that of the lady at Ashford (Vol. I., p. 8).

Among the many interesting brasses of ecclesiastics in the county, none is so original in treatment as that to Master John Strete, rector, in Upper Hardres Church (died 1405), where he is shown in cassock, tippet, and skull-cap, kneeling before his patrons, SS. Peter and Paul, who are mounted on a shaft or pedestal (p. 63). St. Peter carries his key, and St. Paul his sword, and a precatory inscription issues from the hands of the suppliant, addressed to the "Key-bearer of Heaven, and Paul, Doctor of the Gentiles," asking for their powerful intercession with the "King of Angels." From the use of the title "Magister" in the inscription at the foot, and from his academical dress, we may infer that the rector was Master of a college of priests attached to the church. There is another fine brass to a Master of a collegiate foundation at Lydd (p. 83)‡. It is interesting to compare with these the title on the inscription to the "Vicker" of Yalding (p. 148), where he is described as "Mr." George Amherst: here the "Master" is evidently used in a non-technical sense.

\* The likeness is so close, both in figure and canopy, that it is impossible to doubt that the same artist executed both brasses. Note the high-arched helm, the gorget of mail, the close-fitting silk cyclas, sleeveless and with scalloped border, and the rich baldrick. With these should be compared the knight's figure at Sheldwich.

† The modern figures, 1325, at the base are not reliable. Compare the very similar, but later, cross at Stone (Vol. I., p. 99).

‡ Another instance of this costume occurs at Cheriton (p. 27). See also a later example, with several peculiarities of detail, under Bredgar, p. 20.



Ash, near Wrotham, Chislehurst, Hoo, Mersham, and West Wickham, are good fifteenth century examples of priests in the more usual Eucharistic vestments, and there a few instances of the same habit belonging to the early part of the sixteenth century. Some of these show the chalice and wafer held by the two hands against the breast, a late detail in brasses of ecclesiastics (see under Brookland, p. 15). The demi-effigy of a priest in a cope at St. Margaret's, Rochester (p. 114), is noteworthy also as being a palimpsest.

But there is another brass of a priest specially deserving of notice, that of "Syr Wylliam Ore, prest, sometyme parson of Tattisfylde," dated 1567, in Westerham Church (p. 141). This is almost unique in its way, from the blending of old and new. The figure is habited in the cassock, surplice, and narrow scarf of the Reformed Church, but the hair is cut in the stiff, square fashion of the earlier effigies, and the old style of "Sir" is retained in the title; also the common pre-Reformation commendation of the soul, "of whose soule Iesu have mercy," concludes the inscription.

Of knights in armour of the first half of the fifteenth century we have good examples on p. 103 (Otterden), belonging in style rather to the previous century: p. 14 (Brabourne), p. 18 (Bobbing), p. 58 (Goudhurst), p. 82 (Luddesdown), p. 108 (Pluckley), p. 119 (Saltwood), p. 122 (Sheldwich), p. 132 (Sundridge), p. 136 (Teynham),\* and pp. 139, 140 (Ulcombe), all illustrating the interesting changes in armour constantly going on. There are also many brasses of knights belonging to the latter part of the century, of which one at Otterden (p. 102) may serve as a typical example; but there is a marked falling-off in both the design and engraving after the Wars of the Roses.

There is no improvement in these respects when we come to the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries. Good examples of the armour of these periods will be found on pp. 5, 39, 81, 99, 109, and 133. In that on p. 109 the ungainly trunk hose are shown in conjunction with the "peascod" pattern breast-plate, the attenuated taces, and other characteristic features. On the same sheet is shown an armed figure, kneeling, in an heraldic tabard. An excellent example of the armour worn on the verge of the Civil War (1638) is illustrated on p. 133, where the laced ruff, the pantaloons and jack-boots appear in odd contrast.

Besides the fourteenth century examples already enumerated, there are many good brasses of citizens, children, merchants, &c., of the fifteenth and following centuries, many of them accompanied by their wives. Of these, the two brasses at Down, each in the fifteenth century (p. 45), those at Hoo (pp. 69 and 74), Lydd (p. 85), Sundridge (p. 131), and that at Wye (p. 148), are interesting for the peculiarities of costume which they exhibit.

Trottescliffe (p. 138), Mereworth (p. 94), and Birling (p. 21), are good illustrations of costume in the latter part of the century; while for the first half of the sixteenth century we have a number of examples, such as those at Westerham and Teynham (pp. 135, 142). Of the latter part of this century, and of the early half of the seventeenth, there are also numerous and excellent examples in this volume, notably those at Lydd (p. 88), Lynsted (p. 89), Cliffe (pp. 36, 37), Dover (pp. 42, 43), and Biddenden (pp. 11, 12).

There are a few good brasses of women, singly or with their husbands, belonging to the fifteenth century. Of these, a lady at Brabourne (p. 15), and another at Bobbing (p. 17), are shown with long hair flowing down their backs, in token of their having died virgins. Many of the peculiar head-dresses and other distinguishing characteristics of the costume of this century are well represented. The broad wimple and high waist, as at Sheldwich (p. 122), Wye (p. 148), and Lydd (p. 85). Hoo (p. 72) furnishes an example of the widow's dress, and the reversion to the long waist then (1465) fashionable. At Mereworth (p. 94) is shown the horned head-dress; while at Ulcombe (p. 139) we have a presentment of the butterfly head-dress, tight sleeves, low neck and pinched waist that had come in by 1470. The pedimental head-dress, which had so long a reign, is well represented by the brasses at St. Mary-in-Marsh (p. 117), Birchington (p. 7), Brabourne (p. 13), and Boughton Malherbe (p. 16); and the same examples show the belt and pendant chain, from which the ladies of those days used to hang their pomanders, or little bells and such like knick-knacks.

Some of the later styles in ladies' costumes are fully illustrated. The "Marie Stuart" head-dress, or "Paris hood" as it is called in contemporary writings, which appeared about the middle of the sixteenth century continued in favour, with various modifications, until well on into the next century. It is seen in conjunction with the ruff, the stiff stomacher, the monstrous fardingale, and embroidered petticoat, in many of the Elizabethan ladies, as at Tilmanstone and Tunstall

(pp. 136, 137). The latest development of this head-dress is well illustrated by the curious brass at East Sutton to Sir Edward Filmer and family, 1638 (p. 133). The steeple hat (see Lydd, p. 87) seems also to have been a favourite headgear for women during the latter years of the sixteenth century.

Of the many curiosities in such a collection as this there is no space to speak in detail, but attention may be briefly directed to the plain crosses at Hever (p. 68), East Peckham (p. 106), to the graceful figures in the Crucifixion at Chelsfield (p. 22); the representation of the Trinity in the canopy of the Faversham brass (p. 50); the graceful Angel bearing a heart, at Saltwood (p. 120); the "Chrisom" children (p. 39), &c.; to the unique figure of a Yeoman-of-the-Guard at East Wickham (p. 145); and to the many curiosities of heraldry, which would require a whole preface to themselves if adequately treated. Of these, the shields at Boughton-under-Blean (p. 22), St. Alphage, Canterbury (p. 23)—where three otters are represented fish-in-mouth—Little Chart (p. 28), Denton (p. 41), Herne (p. 67), Lullingstone (p. 82), Lynsted (p. 90), Mereworth (p. 92), Mersham (p. 95), Penshurst (pp. 106a, 107), Ripple (p. 113), Stone (p. 128), Stoke (p. 129), and Tunstall (p. 137), may be instanced. Besides these several merchants' marks will be found.

Even with the heraldry the interest of such a collection as the present is not exhausted; for there is a wealth of genealogical and *human* interest in the inscriptions in Norman-French, Latin, and English, throughout the book. Finally, one must draw attention to the many beautiful canopies, such as those at Bobbin (p. 18), Graveney (p. 56), Goudhurst (p. 58), Horsmonden (p. 75), Lydd (p. 85), Mereworth (p. 93), and Sheldwich (p. 121), perhaps the most beautiful and perfect of all.
