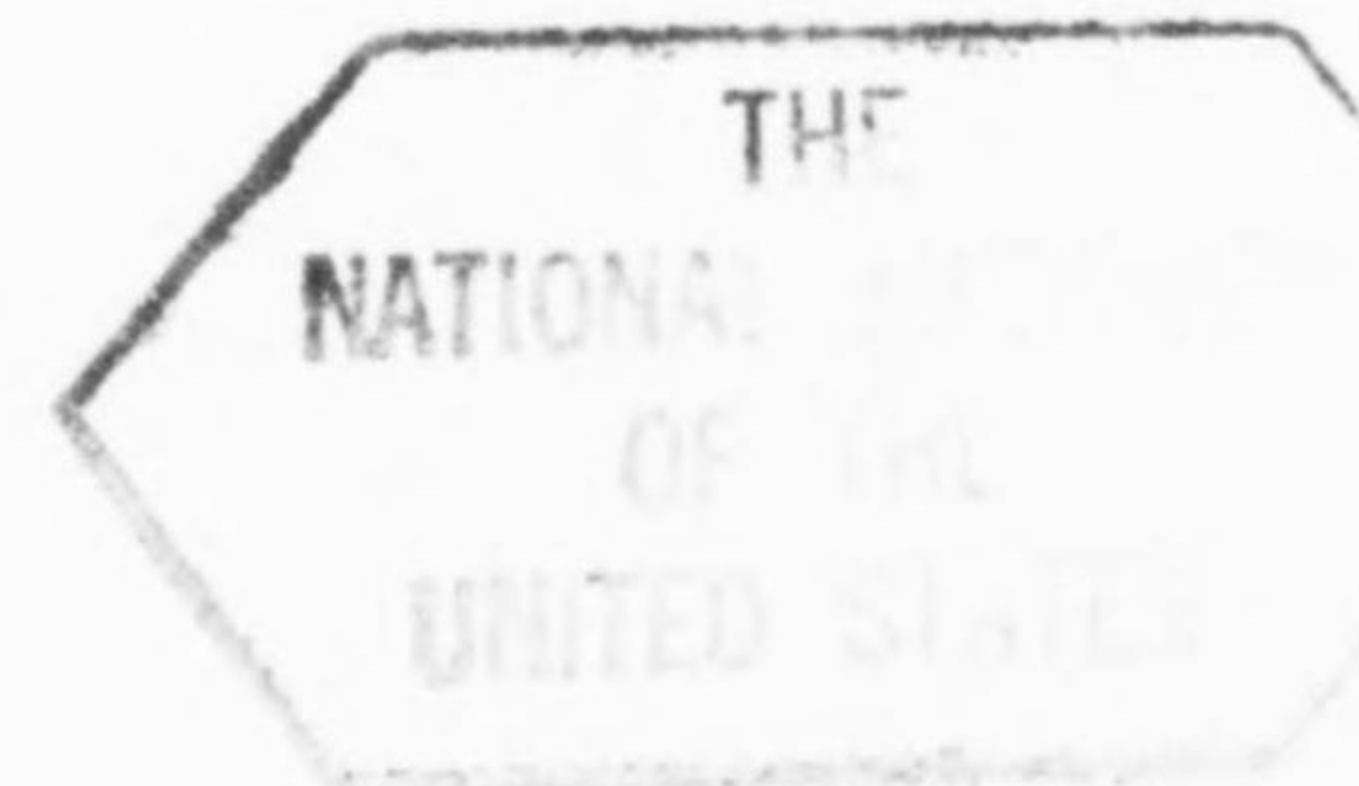



Bismuth and mapharzen, for 10 syphilis patients.
4. Boric acid ointment, 5 pounds.
5. Sulfathiazole, 1,000 tablets, for treatment of dysentery, pneumonia, and so on.
6. Vermifuge, "Santonin", because the substitute drug now in use does not work well.
7. Water-containers and stove-pipes.
8. Rat's poison.

My Impressions of the Toryo
Gakuen Reformatory

By S. Nemoto, chairman of
the Iwate Prefecture Child
Welfare Board

1. I was impressed by the effective use of the old building and poor equipments.
2. It seems very difficult by deficient hands to take good care of these children whose training is much more troublesome than ordinary children. But the officials of this reformatory do this well. I think they must try hard.
3. Teachers of the reformatory seem to be strained and eager in their work, but they seem very tired.
4. The name of "Gakuen" gave me an impressior of being "Gakko" (school), ordinary school. I think that "Gakuen" must have a tinge of children's home in addition to meaning of school. I think the reformatory should have such a tinge. Ordinary school is an institute where children attending from their homes are educated, so it can be merely a school. But such a reformatory should not be so.
5. Children are apt to be bored when they don't have anything to do. Therefore, many good works for them should be provided for. However, such works must not be given to them compulsorily, and they should be given such good works as they feel interest in the works, ignoring advantages and disadvantages.
6. Repairs of broken walls, cleaning dirty yar'ds and repapering "Shoji" (paper sliding-door) are good works. Children feel nterest in such works. They must be interested in making their house better by themself. It is desirable that teachers, clerks and cooks make their efforts to form a homelike "Gakuen" in co-operation.

7. For the purpose of it, much more household furnishings must be added.

8. Although Children in this reformatory have done ill, their true characters are good. They often can not tell evil from good.

I think they must be guided properly by means of giving good works to them.

Therefore, I think that many good works should be given to them.

We express our hearty thanks for your full instructions at your inspection of public welfare status of our Station on July 30, 1948.

Of your specific instructions for improvements, the report is submitted on the improvements we made as follows.

*Penal*Chief of Ichinoseki
Regional Police Station

1. Improvements of lavatory for the detained:
 - a. Improvement of window:
A new glass window of about 1.2 shaku square was installed.
 - b. Installation of a new toilet bowl over cess-pool:
A strong porcelain bowl, blue in color, was used.
 - c. Operation of the removal of human waste, cleaning and disinfection:
The removal of human waste, cleaning by water, and disinfection by creosote solution were made on August 1, 1948.
2. Lock for the house of detention:
The lock-up of this station has three cells. The locks for the cells, No.1 and 2, are the same and their colours have been left as they were. The lock for the cell, No.3, has been enamelled in red and has been distinguished from the others for the convenience of use.

3. Repainting of inner board wall of the lock-up:

The inner board wall has been repainted in white. It was painted in May, 1947, but the paint fell off by the flood in September of the same year. It was repainted anew.

4. Others:

Your instructions concerning the keeping of lock-up hygiene and the handling of the detained were communicated to the personnel of the Ichinoseki Regional and Ichinoseki City Police Stations for a strict observance.

The above remodelling and others were completed on August 1, two days later of your instruction.


