My dear Colonel Scott:

Reference is made to your memorandum of March 19, 1948 requesting additional information with respect to the application of Mr. Americo Guerra for permission to travel to Japan.

The Department has been informed that Mr. Guerra wishes to travel to Japan for the purpose of reestablishing commercial intercourse between the Japanese firm Iida y Compania Limitada Takashimaya and Mr. Guerra's own Argentine firm, American Commercial Interchange Company Guerra Jara y Compania. These two firms dealt with each other over a period of twenty-four years until commercial relations were interrupted by the war.

If Theater clearance can be obtained for Mr. Guerra, you are requested to issue a military permit in his name, since Mr. Guerra intends to travel to Japan via the United States and arrangements will be made by his company's agent in New York to deliver the permit to him.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE FILES

Following the receipt of the underlying memorandum of April 27, 1948 from the Military Permit Section indicating that Robert Liewer may enter Japan during May, Mr. Corkran called Miss Curran in the office of Mr. Theodore Granik for additional information. Miss Curran said that Mr. Liewer was unable to complete his arrangements for travel to Japan during April, and a new application was made on his behalf through the Commerce Department. The underlying memorandum represents, therefore, confirmation of the postponement of his Theater clearance until May.

Miss Curran asked that the Consulate at Saigon be informed again of Mr. Liewer's clearance, and, as before, she said that the bill for the cable could be sent to Mr. Granik.

Miss Curran called again in a few minutes and said she has learned that Mr. Liewer is no longer at Saigon but is in Hong Kong. She asked therefore that the cable be sent to Hong Kong instead of to Saigon. Mr. Liewer's address in Hong Kong is the Repulse Bay Hotel.
