

Whiteside The Secretary of State Dear Mr. Secretary: The War and Mavy Departments have reached the decision to continue the Army and Navy Staff College, in a modified and expanded form, as the highest educational institution of the armed forces. Consideration is now being given to a change in name of the College. It is planned that the initial course, approximately ten months in duration, will begin in September 1946. We both feel that the recent war has demonstrated a necessity for close coordination between the State Department and the armed forces. Accordingly, we have included in the curriculum, in addition to the military aspects of joint operations, a study of the integration of our foreign policy with the capabilities of our armed forces. We consider it highly desirable that the State Department participate in the new college by having selected personnel attend as students, and by furnishing members of the Department for the faculty. It is realized that it may be difficult for you to spare personnel for the ten months' course. For that reason a tentative curriculum has been prepared in which those subjects of probable interest to the State Department have been grouped together. These will be completed in a period estimated between three and four months' duration. They are listed in Units I to VII, inclusive, in the outline curriculum enclosed herewith. If you agree in principle to State Department participation it is suggested that a representative be designated to confer with Vice Admiral Harry W. Hill, U.S. Havy, the Commandant of the College, concerning further details. Admiral Hill will also be pleased to discuss the tentative curriculum, and to receive suggestions from your Department for any changes which may be considered desirable. 

TRAINING PLANS

The Division of Foreign Service Planning is preparing a series of studies in post-war education, "in-service" training of Foreign Service officers, and of cooperation with the Army and Navy in joint training projects. A number of informal conferences are already under way, and as a result of these I am anxious to obtain through you:

The Joint Chief of Staff series of papers no. 962;

The "Holloway Report" of September 17, 1945, rendered by a special board of the Navy Department, concerned with post-war education of naval officers;

The draft report of the special board of the War Department headed by General Gerow on educational plans of the Army. I understand that this report is not in final form but that mimeographed copies may be available.

We have received letters from the Secretaries of War and Navy designating officers to consult with us on personnel administration plans and methods. This might be interpreted to include training; but, in order to be thoroughly covered, we have drafted a letter from the Secretary to the War and Navy Departments asking them to designate

designate officers for liaison on joint training. We have good reason to believe that the armed forces are very receptive to the idea of this consultation.
