CINCPAC Z 18008, 27 September, advised RYCOM Military Government that the Japanese Customs Service can accommodate 20 Ryukyuan trainees; 10 each at Yokohama and Kobe for a three months period of training in operational phases of customs work. Also, that ¥500 per day each was required for support while here. Mr. Lassiter (26-6137)ESS coordinated subject arrangements with Ministry of Finance and customs officials.

2. RYCOM R 16500, 28 November, forwarded names of the 20 individuals and gave ETA aboard Hakuun Maru as 10 December 1950. Japanese Customs people have been advised of ETA and are preparing to meet trainees on arrival and arrange for billets.

3. It is requested that individuals named in RYCOM R 16500 be cleared for entry for purposes and period stated. Request further that entry clearance be granted 1st Lt. James Reed as requested.

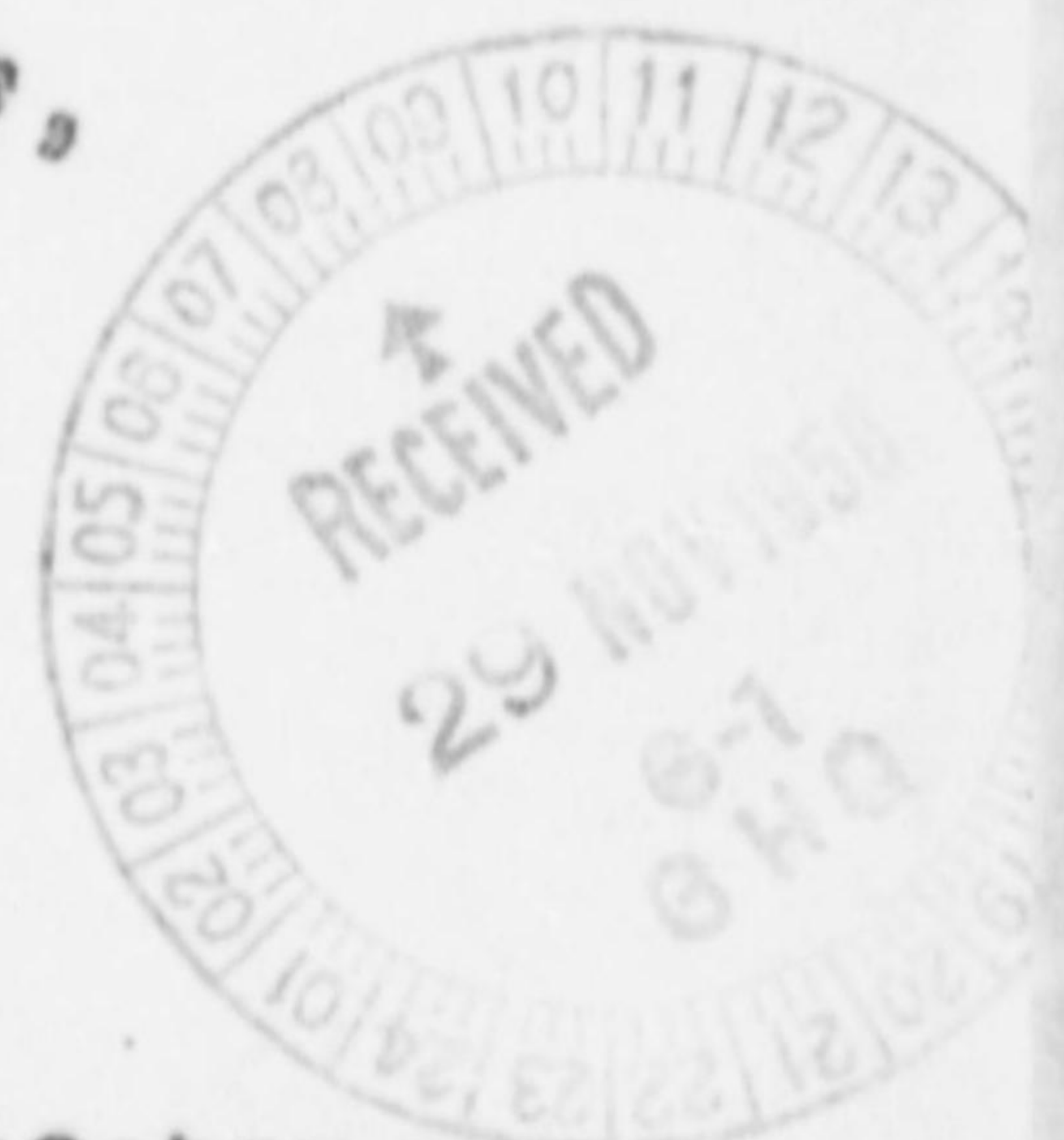

SUBJECT: Expert -- Training Within Industry

From: G-1 To: Chief of Staff Miss Roddekuhr/ek 26-7915 Date: 14 April 1950

2 1. The program for Training Within Industry was approved by the Chief of Staff on 26 March 1950. Radio Z41285 from GHQ, SCAP to DA, 27 March 1950, (Tab A) requested DA to initiate action required to recruit four experts to come to Japan for three months to implement the program.

2. DA radio WCL 46100 (Tab B) suggests slight modifications of the original program requested by this headquarters and advises that Training Within Industry Foundation suggests 2 men for three months.

3. ESS prepared draft reply to WCL 46100, Tab C, stating that the modified proposal is satisfactory provided that two men will be available for 12 man months (six months per man). G-1 concurs in the ESS proposed radio as amended to add "for two men".

MEMORANDUM TO: Chief of Staff

SUBJECT: Training Within Industry Personnel

1. Attached proposal of DA is much more reasonable than that proposed by ESS:

a. ESS originally proposed 4 men for 90 days at total cost upwards of \$30,000, on contractual basis with TWI Foundation.

b. DA proposal is for 2 men for 90 days on direct hire basis - cost should approximate \$12,500.

2. G-1's position on the original proposal of ESS is contained in Tab B. Since the alternate proposal by the DA represents a major reduction in cost of the program, it appears much more acceptable. As indicated in the DA radio, adequate funds are available.

Comment: This would further implant the Japanese Government in the business of private industry. The successful pattern of free enterprise in democratic countries has not included industry's dependence upon government for improvement of industrial techniques, except under the pressure of war. Even under wartime conditions, the specialists who worked with the U. S. Government in improving industrial methods and techniques were drawn from private industry, and with the termination of the war have returned to private industry.

b. The various SCAP sections employ specialists and technicians who are continually assisting industries in improvement of operations and management. This is particularly true of Industry Division, ESS, and of units in NRS, CTS, and CCS.

c. An important factor guiding the necessity for additional industrial efficiency is the relative impact of labor cost on the end product. The labor cost for manufactured items is considered relatively low on a world wide basis.

3. G-1 considers that the TWI program, to be effective, must have the support of private industry. Consideration should be given to allowing private industry to pay for the services of experts (either through conversion of yen into dollars through appropriate account or by deposit of yen into the counterpart fund), thereby assuring that the training was desired by, and not imposed on, industry.

4. In view of the above, G-1 does not concur in the program as proposed.

5. Although the Fiscal Code indicates funds appropriated under Project 172, GARICA, includes funds under Object 07, Other Contractual Services, the availability of funds for the remainder of Fiscal Year 1950 under this project is not known to G-1. This matter is referred to COM for comment.

2 1. ESS proposes, in Checknote 1, to obtain the services of four (4) Training-Within-Industry (TWI) experts, through contractual arrangement with one of two private organizations in the United States. ESS indicated informally a cost upwards of \$30,000 for the four (4) experts for three months.

2. G-1 concurs that training within industry is desirable, but invites attention to the following:

- a. The ESS proposal is for a group of consultants to work with the Japanese Government (the Labor Ministry) in implementing the TWI program.

1. Since 1948 the Japanese Government, with the guidance of this Headquarters, has undertaken study and initiation of a Training-within-Industry (TWI) program which has as its primary purpose improvement of industrial training techniques within separate industries. Programs of this nature were adopted by the United States and England during the war and achieved remarkably successful results in increasing production for then war-time industries. These programs were so successful that post war organizations have been established to continue provision of this type of facilities.
 2. Specific phases of training which included within the over-all program are as follows:
 - a. Job Instruction Training (JIT), which is designed to train foremen in methods of instructing new employees in proper job performance.
 - b. Job Methods Training (JMT), which is designed to guide supervisors and workers to analyze work processes and reorganize them for greater efficiency.
 - c. Job Relations Training (JRT), which is designed to train foremen and shop stewards in methods of handling interior grievances and maintaining sound morale and working relations within the shop.
 3. The Japanese Labor Ministry has provided funds for and established a staff of TWI instructors which during the past year have concentrated on the JIT phase of the overall program. Test courses, which were conducted with 20 foremen at the OI shops of the National Railway, were sufficiently impressive for the Labor Ministry to warrant extension of TWI to all phases of the National Railway operation. The Labor Ministry however is most anxious to obtain qualified experts in this field in order to insure expansion of the program and coverage of large segments of Japanese industry in the shortest possible time.
 4. Since July 1949 efforts have been made to recruit for this work, however, three potential candidates have declined the position after demonstrating initial interest, as evidenced by our messages Z-19097, Z-24316, Z-24953, Z-27206, Z-27842, Z-31862, Z-32703 of 1949 and Z-34833, Z-35726 of 1950, and DA messages WCL-41941, WCL-20462, WCL-28791, WCL-29344 of 1949 and WCL-32663, WCL-33965 of 1950 (Incls.).
 5. In view of the importance of the program and the loss of time already occasioned by the inability to obtain the services of a qualified
