What should a Wikipedia article be?

A representation of summaries of dominant opinions on a subject

A hand curated annotated bibliography

A starting point for further research

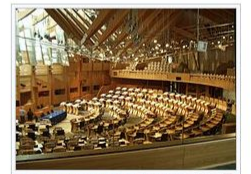

About you, someone you know, or somewhere you work

Personal conjecture, or written like an essay

Unsourced, or copied word for word from another source

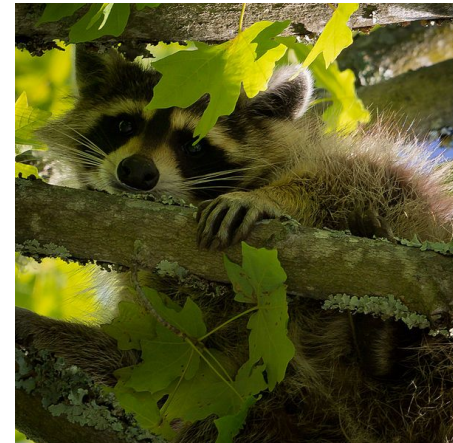

Wikipedia articles should be based on **reliable, published sources**, making sure that **all majority and significant minority views** that have appeared in those sources are covered. If no reliable sources can be found on a topic, **Wikipedia should not have an article on it.**

All encyclopedic content on Wikipedia must be written from a **neutral point of view (NPOV)**, which means representing fairly, proportionately, and, as far as possible, without editorial bias, all of the significant [views](#) that have been [published by reliable sources](#) on a topic.

The phrase "original research" (OR) is used on Wikipedia to refer to material—such as facts, allegations, and ideas—for which no [reliable, published sources](#) exist.

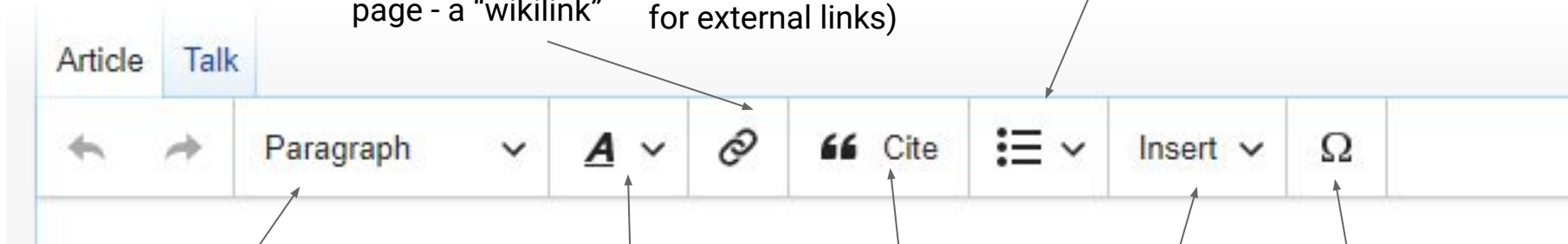
