





If a topic has received **significant coverage** in <u>reliable sources</u> that are <u>independent</u> of the subject, it is presumed to be suitable for a stand-alone article or list.

**Conflict of interest** (**COI**) **editing** involves contributing to Wikipedia about yourself, family, friends, clients, employers, or your financial and other relationships.

COI editing is strongly discouraged on Wikipedia.

Editors with a COI, including <u>paid editors</u>, are expected to <u>disclose it</u> whenever they seek to influence an affected article's content.

#### The Reliable Sources Racoon



Wikipedia articles should be based on <u>reliable, published</u> <u>sources</u>, making sure that **all majority and significant minority views** that have appeared in those sources are covered. If no reliable sources can be found on a topic, <u>Wikipedia should not have</u> <u>an article on it</u>.

All encyclopedic content on Wikipedia must be written from a **neutral point of view** (**NPOV**), which means representing fairly, proportionately, and, as far as possible, without editorial bias, all of the significant <u>views</u> that have been <u>published by reliable sources</u> on a topic.

The phrase "original research" (OR) is used on Wikipedia to refer to material—such as facts, allegations, and ideas—for which no reliable, published sources exist.








