glove for mild weather is made with capeskin palms and lisle or silk backs. They may have reefing straps at the wrist for greater security.

By the by, pat and "coax" a glove on finger by finger. Do not press down hard between the finger spaces, as the best glove cannot resist "brute force."

Pulling a glove off by the finger-tips stretches the leather, spoils the shape and gives a "hangdog" look. When not in use, it is well to keep your gloves between folds of tissue paper, with fingers flattened out, not crumpled up.

A little talcum powder shaken into your

glove before putting on makes it slip more freely and prevents undue perspiration. Once a week, turn your gloves inside out and let them air in the open or beside a window.

The double-breasted plaid waistcoat, illustrated here, exemplifies the drift, already traced, toward more elaborateness in the details of one's morning dress.

Rubber - soled Oxfords are in step with that spirt of "lounginess" in men's dress,

The toe is full and round, and the sole and heel are rubber, "saddle-stitched" clear back to the heel to a leather welt. Such Oxfords are often lined with water-proof brown duck. The heel is cemented the shoe, thus avoiding jarring or scratching.






