1. ANNOUNCER: Uncle Sam's Forest Rangers.


2. mUSIC. QUARTET, Rangers' Song.

ANNOUNCER: When a forest fire breaks out on one of our National Forests 4. the attack is organized much in the same way a nation's 5. forces would be mobilized for war, And one of the greatest ε. problems in fighting forest fires, as in war, is to furnish 7. the front-line forces with food and ecuipment as quickly 8. and efficiently as possible. When aforest fire must be 9. fought in rugged back country where no roads exist, where 10. trails are the only means of getting in, the Forest Service 11. generally uses pack trains made up of several pack nules and a 12. lead saddle horse to transport supplies to the fire-fighters. 13. To save precious time in getting pack animals to a base camp 14. where they load for the trails, and in order for the animals 15. and their packer to arrive in good condition to start work, 16. a special Forest Service truck has been designed to transport 17. a complete pack train, and carry it to its destination in 18. the shortest possible time --- Up on the Pine Cone National 19. Forest today, fire fighters are battling a troublesome fire 20. in the remote back country. When we arrive at the Ranger 21. Station it is mid-afternoon and Ranger Jim Robbins is just 22. entering the office of Ben, the fire dispatcher - -








- SLIM: (FADING IN) Hello, Jim, I been lookin' for you. How






