- The Esperantists (Esperanto-speakers), despite not having a country of their own, are a big community with a culture and identity of their own. Since Zamenhof began Esperanto, Esperantists scattered throughout the world created monuments, named streets and square or simply somehow left some of *Esperantujo* in those places where they lived.
- Several of these objects don't have freely licensed photos yet.
- Esperanto heritage around the world isn't well documented still


