MARS will be the *Morning Star* until 2nd March; after which it will be the *Evening Star* until the close of the year.

JUPITER will be the *Morning Star* until 16th July, after which it will be the *Evening Star* until the end of the year.

SATURN will be the *Evening Star* until 25th May; thence the *Morning Star* until 18th November; after which it will be the *Evening Star* to the end of the year.

THE PLANETS—The hour of *meridian passage*, *right ascension*, and *declination* of each of the principal planets, is given for the 1st and 15th of each month—to which is added the *mean time* transit ϕ , or the mean time of transit of the first point of a Arieties, being the meantime corresponding to 0h 0m 0s of Sideral time on each of those days. By the aid of this table the time of the meridian passage of any heavenly body may be readily found. From the right ascension of the body subtract the *retardation*, which is at the rate of 9 53s for each hour, or 0 16s for each minute of its R. A.; add the remainder to the meantime transit ϕ ; the sum, divide if necessary, by 24h. will be the meantime of the meridian passage of the body in question. For any other day than the 1st and 15th of the month, apply a correction at the rate of 3m 55.91s per day, reckoned from the nearest given day, to be added if for an earlier day, subtracted if for a later day.

"February is a hard month for Stock." This has almost passed into an adage. It is usually the coldest month of the year, and as cattle are frequently fed in such a way that they grow poor from the time they come to the barn till they go out to grass again, their ability to stand the weather is less at this time than earlier in the season. No more Stock should be kept than can be kept well. If you have more than you can winter well, sell off until you are sure that you have no more than you can winter, so as to have them in good condition in the Spring. This will prove profitable to the farmer, and comfortable to his stock.

Green wood will last longer than dry ; and so will straw for cattle last longer than hay. But durability is one thing, and utility is another ; and who has not learned the comparative value of green and dry wood ? And yet how few lay up in store for an equinoctial rain, or a winter's snow ! And how many, otherwise good providers, perhaps, have put off the building of a wood-house for 10, 20, or 30 years, and many who have one, continue to simmer away their two barrels of water from nearly every cord they burn. All will admit these things ought not to be so ; but the most common objection to the timely preparation of wood, is the great amount of labour required at one time.

The same love of order which prompts the farmer to clear his yard of broken barrels, old hoops and boards, and sticks of wood, and whatever else defaces and defiles his premises,—also prompts him to have a place for everything and everything in its place, what is calculated to bear upon real and substantial profit. There are many other particulars where neatness may be attended to. Gate hinges and gate fastenings often need repair, that they may shut like clock work; boards become loose on old barns and board fences; tools become unfit for use, and need mending or renewing.

In the improvement of Sheep, as well as all other animals, the male is considered of more importance than the female, and more care is therefore necessary in selecting one; yet, for the production of perfect animals, it is absolutely essential that both male and female be well bred; and if not individually perfect in every point, the conformation of the two should be such as when combined would form a perfect creature. So that, in endeavouring to improve our common flocks of sheep, we should not only get good, first rate bucks, but should select out from the flock the ewes of the best age and make, to put with him. •

The farmer who has an abundance of swamp muck at his command, who understands how to manage it, and is willing to get at it resolutely, may be sure of making his land productive. To manage muck to the best advantage, the arrangements for draining the swamp should be so complete, that men and cattle need not work up to their knees in mud and water. This being done, a quantity of muck may be got out into heaps on dry ground, to be used when wanted. It pays well to keep two years stock beforehand in these heaps.

LIGHT HOUSES ON THE COAST OF NOVA SCOTIA,
AND ON THE COAST OF NEW BRUNSWICK IN THE BAY OF FUNDY.

Meagher's Beach—East side Halifax Harbour. A fixed light.

Sambro Island—Western entrance Halifax harbour. A fixed Light.

Devil's Island—An Octagonal Light Beacon on the S W point of Devil's Island, at the entrance of the Eastern passage to Halifax harbour, and exhibits a *red light* on the seaward sides to distinguish it from Sambro and Meagher's Beach Lights—stands 45 feet above high water. mark—rise and fall 6 feet. The Tower is painted dark brown, with a white belt between the Balcony and Lantern to distinguish it in day time.

Cross Island—Entrance to Lunenburg Harbour. Two lights—flash light above; fixed light below.

Liverpool—South end of Coffin's Island. A plain revolving light.

Port Medway—Beacon light on Admiralty Head, west side of the entrance to the Port. Building Square painted *white* with *black square* in the centre of the Seaward sides, *plain white* light 44 feet above sea level, and stands within 30 fathoms of the shore.

Shelburne—McNutt's Island. Two fixed lights one above the other.

Barrington—Baccaro Point, East side of the entrance to Barrington Bay. A flash light of 15 seconds.

Yarmouth—West side of the Harbour. A plain revolving light.

Cape Sable, Seal Island—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy is on the South Point of Seal Island. A plain white light, elevated about 80 feet above high-water mark, and may be seen on approaching the Island from any point of the compass. A very dangerous rock, under water, but upon which the sea always breaks, called *Blonde Rock*, lies $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles S by W by compass from the Light House. Between this rock and the Island there are some dangers; the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels, therefore, ought not to attempt passing between them.

Brier Island—A plain White light, situate about half a mile N E from the N W point of the Island.

Westport—Peter's Island, at the South entrance, on the East side of the Bay of Fundy, *Two White Lights*, placed horizontally (to distinguish it from Brier Island Light,) at an elevation of 40 feet above high-water mark. This Beacon is intended to lead vessels into Westport, or through Grand Passage, and will be seen on the approach from Seaward and St. Mary's Bay, until shut in by S W point of Brier Island, bearing from it S 54 deg. W, and Dartmouth point, on Long Island side, S 25 deg. E, and on the North side, (coming out of the Bay,) between N 11 $\frac{1}{4}$ deg. E. When in the Passage, or fair-way through, the light will be seen all round, and can be passed on either side, but the Eastern passage is the deepest and widest, and is recommended to strangers. The best anchorage is on the Brier Island or Western side of the Harbour.

Digby Gut Light—Placed on the West side of Digby Gut, from Brier Island North-Eastward. The Coast is very bold and not indented; the Light is, therefore, chiefly intended as a guide into Digby Basin. A fixed White light.

Black Rock Light—On the South Shore of the Bay of Fundy. A fixed light.

Horton Bluff Light—In the Basin of Mines, 95 feet above sea level high water—rise and fall 40 to 45 feet. Building Square painted White; stands 60 feet from the Bluff, and shows a White Light, which may be seen in clear weather over the greatest part of the Basin of Mines, (after passing Cape Blowmedon,) and above the Five Islands and up Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the Southward of it.

Apple River Light—North side of the entrance to Apple River, in Chignecto or Cumberland Bay. Two fixed Lights placed horizontally.

Partridge Island River—An Octagonal Light Beacon on the West side of the entrance to Partridge Island River, Parrsboro', on the North side of the Basin of Mines, and exhibits a plain white light, at an elevation of 30 feet above high-water—rise and fall about 45 feet—the Tower is white, and stands close to high-water mark on the beach. Vessels can enter the Harbour only at high water, and must lie aground on soft bottom when the tide is low.

Eastern Beaver, or Williams' Island—A Revolving Light.

Canseau, Cranberry Island—Two fixed Lights, one above the other. West side of the Gut of Canseau—A fixed Light.

Eddy or Sand Point Light—On Eddy or Sand Point on the West side of the South entrance to the Strait of Canseau, distinguished by two white lights placed horizontally, 25 feet above the sea level—Building Square painted white with a black diamond on the seaward side.

Guysborough Harbour Beacon—On the West side of the entrance to the Harbour, head of Chedabucto Bay. A fixed Light.

Pictou Light—On the South east side of the entrance to the harbour. A fixed Light.

Arichat Beacon—A Light on Point Marichi, on the East side of the Southern entrance to the harbour. Building Square painted white. A White Light 34 feet above the sea level.

Louisburg—On the East side of the entrance to the harbour. A fixed Light.

Low Point Light—East side of Sydney, Cape Breton, Harbour. A fixed Light.

Light Houses are intended to be built at *White Island, Pictou Island, Port Hood, and Ragged Islands.*

St. Paul's Island—A fixed Light on the North East end; and a Flash Light on the South West end.

Scattarie Island—A Revolving Light on the East end of the Island.

Gannet Rock Light—This Light is intended to warn vessels of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the Old Proprietor to the Seal Islands off Machias, a distance of about 20 miles. A white Flash Light, 20 seconds dark and 40 seconds light in each minute. Building painted in stripes, vertical, black and white.

Between the Northernmost and Southernmost of the Murr Ledges there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them always above water, and which extend westward from the Light House about

4 miles; from this range, further westerly, about 6 miles from the Gannet Light, lies a dangerous breaker, called the Bull. This may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands near the S W end of Grand Manan open. From Brier Island Light to the Old Proprietor, N and by W $\frac{1}{4}$ W 18 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles. The Blonde Rock from the Southernmost point of Cape Sable Seal Islands, S and by W $\frac{3}{4}$ miles distant.

Machias Seal Island Lights—Two Fixed White Lights upon the Machias Seal Islands, 45 feet above high water, and bearing from each other E S E and W N W distant about 200 feet, by which circumstance of two Light Houses at the same Station, they will be immediately distinguished from all other lights upon the coast, British or American. Both Buildings painted *white*. Vessels standing to the Northward, between these Lights and the Gannet Rock, should tack or haul off the moment they bring these Lights into one, as they will be then not more than three-fourths of a mile from the Murr Ledges, if more than 5 miles to the E of these Lights.

Head Harbour Light—next in order after passing Grand Manan, and the plain White Light (American) on West Quoddy Point, is Head Harbour Light, placed on the N E extremity of Campo Bello, and is a guide to vessels entering the main channel to West Isles, Moose Island, and the Inner Bay of Passamaquoddy; it enables vessels also, at all times, to enter Head Harbour. A fixed white Light. Building painted *white*, with a *red* cross on it.

Point Le Preau Lights—Upon this projecting head land Two Lights are placed, one above the other in the same house, and distant 25 feet. Both lights can be seen from every point of the compass where they may be useful—both are Fixed and White. Building painted *red* and *white*, in stripes, 5 feet broad each, horizontally.

Partridge Island Light—At the entrance of the River and Harbour of St. John, N. B., having been established above 50 years requires no particular notice, further than that it is a fixed White light, the building painted *red* and *white* in vertical stripes.

Beacon Light—Within Partridge Island, and upon a spit or bar which extends about half a mile S S E off Sand Point, and which dries at two-thirds ebb, stands the Beacon Tower. Upon this tower is a light eminently useful to the coasting trade of St. John, and to all other vessels having pilots on board, as it enables them to enter the harbour at all hours of the night, a fixed white light. Building painted *white* and *red* in horizontal stripes.

Quaco Light—A Revolving White Light, placed on a small rock off Quaco Head, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute. The light can be seen from any quarter where a vessel can approach.—Building painted *white* and *red* in horizontal stripes.

Cape Enrage Light—On the Point of that name in Westmoreland, nearly opposite Apple River Harbour, N. S. Building painted *white*, about 120 feet above the tide. A plain white light.

Letters 5d—when posted in the interior, 3d additional, this must be pre-paid.

Letters are forwarded *via* Bermuda for Chagres and the Pacific, Chili and Peru, Havanna, Honduras, Laguyra, Mexico, Venezuela, and the British and Foreign West India Islands.

Postage to Foreign West Indies, 1s 3d when posted at Halifax; 1s 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. when posted in the interior—*must be pre-paid.* Newspapers 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ d each to be pre-paid *also.*

The Mails for Newfoundland, (and Cape-Breton during the Summer months), are made up at Halifax *once a month* during the months of Decr., Jany., Feby., and March; and *once a fortnight* during the months of April, May, June, July, August, Sept., Octr. and Novr., closing on the arrival of the Mail Steamer from Boston. Postage 5d when posted in the interior. 3d additional.

The Mails for St. Pierre and Miquelon, are forwarded to Sydney, C. B., from whence they are despatched by the French Packet during the Summer months, and from Halifax direct in the Winter months. Letters 5d. packet rate, and 3d inland, *pre-payment optional.*

When the English Mails arrive *before* 9 o'clock, P. M., they are delivered the same Evening—*after* that hour at 7 o'clock the next morning.

All other Mails arriving before 7 P. M., will be delivered the same evening—*after* that hour and *before* 8, at 6 o'clock—and if after 8, the following morning at 7 o'clock.

All letters are charged by weight, and a uniform rate of postage of 3d on a letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight has been established throughout British North America. To any part of the United States, 6d; to Oregon and California, 9d, *pre-payment optional.*

Newspapers *pass free* to any part of the Province, British North America and the United States, when sent by *land mail.* Pamphlets, Books, and Periodicals, 2d per oz. up to 6 oz's., and 3d for every additional oz. up to 16 oz's.—beyond that weight will not be received.

Books, Magazines, Reviews, and Pamphlets, whether British, Foreign or Colonial, can be sent from the United Kingdom to Nova Scotia, or *vice versa*, at the following rates—net exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ d over $\frac{1}{2}$ lb.
