Why might you want to stay away from Wikipedia?

Complicated (the rules, the software etc.)

Mistrust and suspicion (biting the newbies)

It will not say what I want to say about my company!

Curse that neutral point of view!

Magnifying glass: anything bad will look "badder"

Why can't you stay away from Wikipedia?



Wikipedia comes up often and first in search results
People use Wikipedia as a directory of businesses
People trust Wikipedia to say all there is to say
What do you mean, you don't have an article on
Wikipedia? What kind of company are you?
