Summary:

In the Matsushita organization (incorporated in 1935) there were five companies producing electrical equipment with varying members of factories under each of them. They are listed below:

(1) Kedoma Wireless Co. - OSAKA.

(2) Kadoma Electric Co. - OSAKA.

(3) Vacuum Tube Co. Ebisu Bashi, Osaka

- No. of other plants - 8 (all small)
- No. of employees - 800
- Air raid damage - 30% completely destroyed.
- Main products - Electric bulbs, vacuum tubes, fuses, small lamps.

(4) Dry Battery Company, Tsururu Bashi - Osaka

- No. of other plants - 8
- No. of employees - 1500
- Air raid damage - 20% completely destroyed.
- Main Products - Dry batteries, storage batteries, flashlight gages.

(5) Carbon Co. - Osaka

- No. of other plants - 2 (small)
- No. of employees - 200
- Air raid damage - 20% completely damaged
- Main products - Carbon rods, graphite rods, grounding poles for batteries.

In addition of the above five plants Matsushita had an Electric Refining Company at Suzoki, Shikoku, which manufactured electrolytic manganese. Conduit tubes were also made by Matsushita at a plant in Kadoma (Osaka area).

Prior to the war Matsushita manufactured ordinary electrical appliances such as flat irons, radio, lamps, etc. They did not become engaged in war work until the end of 42, and then only to a small degree. Their first large scale conversion to wartime manufacture took place in 1943. Matsushita was also engaged in the manufacture of wooden ships, bombs, etc.

This Company also has another division devoted to the manufacture of machine tools, lathes, grinders, drill presses and the like.

They will prepare statistics and answers to the Electrical questionnaire for each of their five electrical equipment products, and will prepare the machine tool questionnaire for the other plant. These questionnaires will be completed and brought to our office on 5th Nov. 1945.
