Memorandum For: **Brigadier General Courtney Whitney, Chief, Government  
Section, SCAP**

1. The Secretary of the Army has directed that an Army-wide cross-sectional survey be made by The Inspector General of the Troop Information and Education Program to determine its essentiality and the adequacy, efficiency, and economy of its functions and operations as currently performed.

2. Instructions received request that all general officers of the Army and other selected senior officers complete the attached questionnaire. In the case of many staff officers of General Headquarters, Far East Command, it is realized that current duties may not permit first-hand knowledge concerning some of the points in question. However it is believed that all officers have sufficient basis on which to express an opinion on some of the subjects; and it is suggested that a brief explanation be made concerning any inability to deal with the others.

3. This form should be completed and returned to the Inspector General, GHQ, FEC, not later than 10 August 1948. It is suggested that your current assignment and title be included with your signature.
