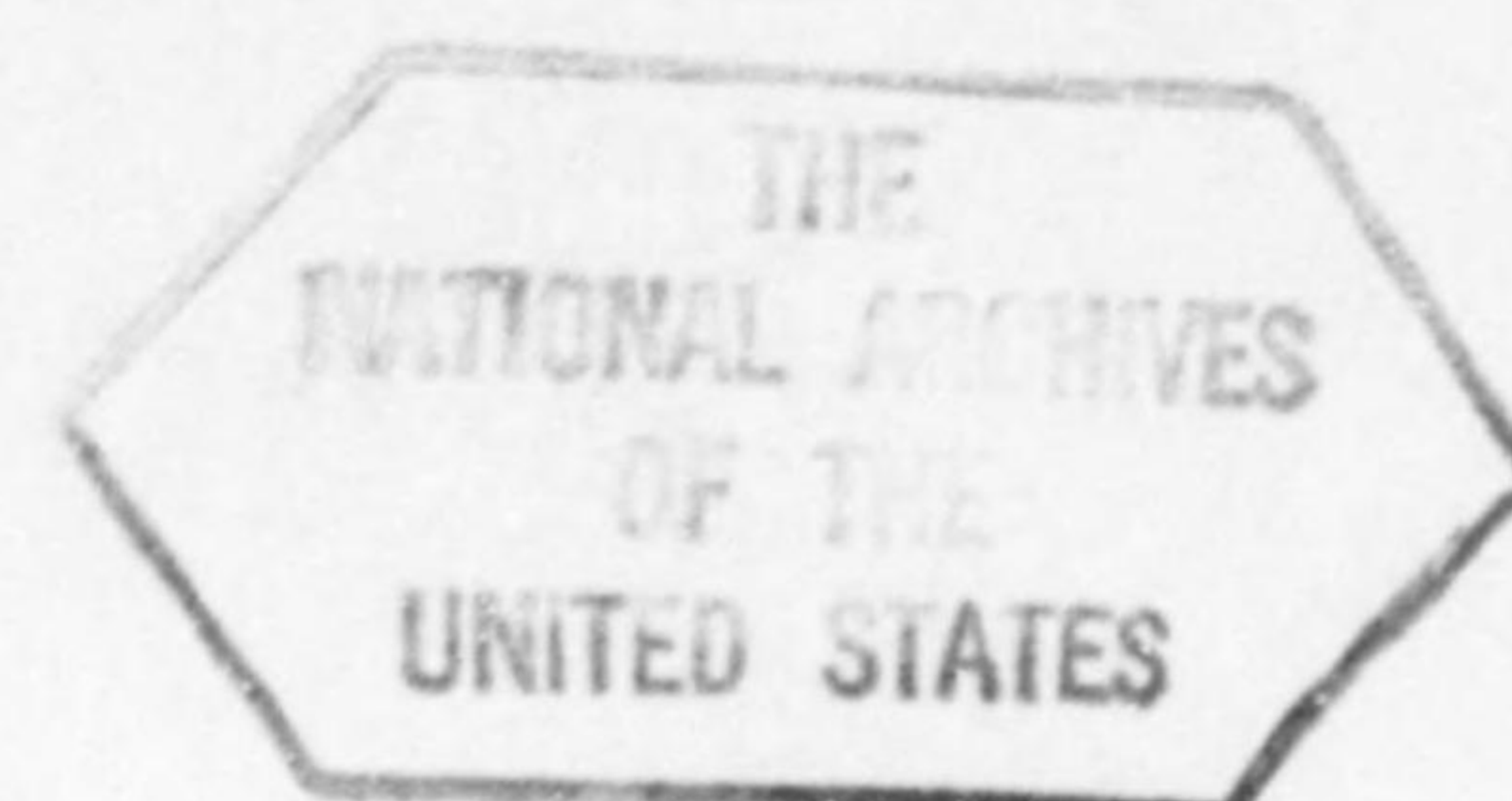

Concerning the Thought of a part of Right-wing
and General Aspect.

KAWAHARA Shinichiro, leading staff of KOKURYU-KAI (the Amur Society), leader of the Upheaval Disposition Research Society and committee of the National Character Protection Federation, stated his opinion on the local election, the peace treaty and release of purged persons at the office in Tamura-cho on May 1, as follows:

- A.
1. In the local election many independent candidates were returned. This is a characteristics of the local election, that is, they voted to the able candidates.
 2. Also many actual governors were returned in the election for governors, because they had been near by voters, most of them were from bureaucrats, and, they were so moderate and experienced to the local self-government.

3. Many candidates of conservative line were elected because the nation is aspiring for the earliest peace treaty.

4. The defeat of the Socialists will be caused from the reason of the Three-Principles for Peace, the Neutrality problem and their joint front under the same red-flags in campaign.

B. 1. It is very delightful that the assertion of Gen. MacArthur has been realized in the draft of peace treaty more completely after his dismissal.

2. The United States has already made up their mind on the Third World War which would be inevitable.

3. The allied countries are anyhow supporting the Asia Policy of US.

4. Japan is to strengthen rapidly her inner structure for peace, at the same time, she should force the reorganization of her political world.

C. 1. The release of purge should be woven into the structure for peace through the all-out release as early as possible.

2. The purged, such as ourselves, owing to the Organizations Control Order will probably be excluded from the release, but as there remains an only way of setup of such an investigation machinery as the Petition Committee, we are to concentrate our movement upon it.

3. As we will be able to find many opportunities to have a connection with our comrades and others owing to the coming release, there are possibility for the movement through them.

KAWAKAMI Shuji stated the following on 2nd yesterday.

"What we are thinking of is not that whether or not our movement can be carried out but that where our country should go about in future. We think that the international movement will be needed on the domestic problems after the peace conclusion, Accordingly, we are to publish 'the diplomatic informations' and to set up 'the diplomomatic association' for the opportunity of meeting with youngmen and men of intelligence of countries in Asia. For the purpose, Dr. KANAMORI Tokujiro, a great authority

on Constitution, should be appointed to the highest responsible person of the association, who is to guide people to such a structure as to protect the nation from Communism through his lecture meetings held everywhere in our country. In a word, the international movement of anti-Communism should be deployed in the name of so-called National Diplomacy."

Besides all the purged members and those of right-wing are generally holding the similar opinion as mentioned above. On the conclusion of peace treaty, the connection among their comrades has become more closely and more in active. Particularly, the Formation Grand Meeting of SHINSEI-NIHON-KOKUMIN-DOMEI (The New-Born Japan National League) which will be held on 5th and 6th is considerably hoped for and actually they are making a connection with one another covering a wide range. Among the purged some persons have already affiliated to the League and many others likely have affiliated to it in their pen-names or the names of their daughter, son and other family members. Such being the condition, the future movement of the league is worth watching.

Some persons are considering the movement be in the understanding of the authorities to play a role opposite to the Japan Communist Party.

Since the time of establishment of the SAKURA KAI (Cherry Society) in 1930, the brain members of UGAKI have been consisting of not only the persons in the Army but also those influential and notable in political, financial, governmental, press

and labor farmer circles. Although he is being purged at present, his influence is rather great, particularly in the relation with the Nationalist Government. The manoeuvres of AJIA REMMEI (Asia League) are the good example of it. This manoeuvres are aiming to get investment into the important key industries in Japan from the over-sea Chinese affiliating with the Nationalist Government in connection with the reestablishment of the army.

This manoeuvres are planned by such influential members as KUHARA Fusanosuke, YAMADA, OKAMURA and TSUDA. Ideologically, this movement is based on the thought of the former HAKKO ICHUIU (universal benevolence) in a shape of putting the cart before the horse, that is the line of Asia League is strongly mapped out according to the "Three Principles of the People" of Sun Yat-sen. What they are insisting is to gather all the eastern Asian races into a body so as to create the new Asia League.

At the side of China, with General HO Ying-chin at its center, such influential persons in Army, political and financial circles as SHANG Chen, the former head of the party, HO Shih-Li, the present

head, General YEN Hsi-shan and a certain LIN, former president of Bank of Formosa are participating in this movement. The total sum of investment is expected to be 2 billion yen for the purpose of the establishment of a Chino-Japanese collaboration bank and a syndicate.

The Japanese who are supporting this manuevres are those mentioned above, and they are systematically active according to their own technical role as follows:

1. Peace treaty problem.
2. Public peace.
3. Finance.
4. Culture.
5. Education.
6. Information and propaganda.
7. Fund.
8. Military problem.
9. and 10. Relation with the Nationalist Government.

Words of Former Rightists on Current
Problems.

I. By KAWAHARA Shin-ichi, a staff-member of the
former KOKURYU KAI (Depurged) :

(1) After ratification of the peace treaty the
government should immediately release war criminals
and purged persons, expand and strengthen public en-
terprises, intensify the control of labour and
social movements and especially expand counter-
measures to be taken against leftists' attacks.

(2) The recent rise in prices of commodities
as well as the raise of wages is detrimental to
Japanese reconstruction.

(3) The prevailing scandals of government officials
and the bold demand for political donations by the
government itself are suggesting that the life of
the Yoshida Cabinet will not be long.

2. By SATSUMA Yuji, former member of the TOHO KAI
and present member of the Democratic Party (formerly
Diet member belonging to the Democratic Party) (depurged):

Now that the majority of the people are desiring the retirement of the Yoshida Cabinet, the Democratic Party, in response to the people's demand, is hurriedly strengthening its own composition.

3. By TAKASE Michiyoshi, a standing committeeman of the former DAI NIHON SEISAN TO (Purged) :

(1) It is to be congratulated that the peace and security treaties have been concluded, but the future way of Japan is not easy.

(2) Now that a number of important problems, domestic and foreign, are facing the Japanese nation, the government authorities are required to advance people's patriotism.

(3) With the recent awakening of our local comrades, our future movements are expected to start in local areas.

4. By SENYA Shin, president of the former KODO SHINRI KAI (purged) :

The violence of the Yoshida Cabinet has been growing more and more of late and now is the time when oppositions, especially the Democratic Party, should

fight out against it with solid combination among
their members.

Doings and sayings of former rightists,

- A. Speech on the present situation by INOUE Shiro, former Head of the Nanshin Branch of the TOARENMEI (East Asia League) and Director of the DAINIPPON SEISANTO (Great Japan Production Party)

He expressed his opinion as follows on Jul. 29, at his office at Kanda, Tokyo.

1. "We doubt on what ground the examinations of the depurgees, particularly of right-wing depurgees were carried out. Newspaper interpretations differed as for this matter. I have neither grudge nor complaint against the fact I still remain undepurged. But the examinations are apparently impartial. There is a room for doubt whether personal examinations were made based on personal character and career, or based on organization. It seems to us that the present depurge is just like waking-up of a sleeping child into a cry"
2. "The peace treaty must be signed under the name of the whole nation. It deserves a sincere delight of our people. But the Government and the Liberal Party appealed to other political parties in order to proceed with the plan by the Liberal Party. As its result, there was

caused an unfavorable situation that national cooperation could not be expected at all. This stiffened the activities of political parties, and the nation lost confidence in the Government or parties. Moreover it would disappoint all signatory powers. Now the Yoshida Cabinet became apparently self-righteous to the eyes of anybody. Taking into consideration the more complicated situation after the conclusion of the peace treaty, we must deplore the present attitudes of the Government. Probably it would fall a prey to the reaction of the Japan Communist Party or other parties. Thus the maintenance of the public peace might not be expected. And there seems a seed of grief also on the side of the right-wing young men."

3. "It is predicted that the nation will have to stand on her feet from the economic point of view and tide over various difficulties after the conclusion of peace treaty. Particularly we must be cautious strictly against the activities of the Japan Communist Party. Each political party does not show any cooperative attitude toward the Cabinet because it cannot manage business skillfully. Also we do not expect any reactionary government. But we are aware of the danger of socialism or any leftist government in a transition period. This is the reason why we

expect in earnest a solid collaboration of all the conservative parties."

4. "The armistice talks in Korea, in my opinion, would be a gain to the Chinese Communist in the long run. In the course of negotiations they seem to be contemplating anything behind their back. Since the end of the war, the United Nations have been anticipated by the Soviet Union and the Chinese Communists. It is feared that they will take the aggressive immediately toward Japan, Formosa or other places before and after the conclusion of peace treaty."

B. Speech on the present situation by TAKASE Michiyoshi, former Director of the Headquarters of the DAINIPPON ISSHIN KAI (Great Japan Renovation Party and Director of the DAI NIPPON SEISANTO (Great Japan Production Party):

He expressed his opinion as follows on Aug. 1, at his office at Nihonbashi, Tokyo.

1. "I asked my old comrades and seniors in Tokyo to state their opinions on the depurge issue. I was once announced to be depurged in newspapers, but this was withdrawn afterwards. In my opinion, all the rightists should be depurged in view of the fact that the leftists are left alone at present. Government controls must be fair and just. And all illegal measures must not be admitted in

a constitutional state. To tell the truth, the purge is a heavy shackle. I can't express my own opinion at my will under these circumstances. It is also a blow to my own business. Let everyone speak what he thinks. To shut his mouth is an improper step."

2. "The peace treaty will be arranged as contemplated by the Government. But it will be a problem to the Government how to take the final measure for the complete arrangement of the treaty. Now the nation lost confidence in the Yoshida Cabinet. This indicates us that our nation has always a strong power unconditioned by any adversity and is apparently reluctant to show any compromising attitude toward the Cabinet. In emergency, as a nation can't be protected only by soldiers, so a nation can't be overthrown only by terrorism of "ronins" (men who have no occupation). Nowadays the people who are infected with lofty ideas will approve this fact. We desire that the Yoshida Cabinet also must be aware of this fact for coping with the situation after the conclusion of the peace treaty."

C. Speech by ETANI Shin:

He expressed his opinion as follows at 7 p.m. last night at Ueno, Tokyo.

"I was in the Hibiya Library yesterday. And I wrote a manuscript at one place near the bank of the River Edo today. At present, there is a way I can get an income. But I need more money."

While ETANI was talking as stated above, he seemed to be serious somehow. He is likely to print a poster or pamphlet in the near future. He is now to be interviewed by us every night. We are now giving him a warning against his activities.

Late Movement of Nationalists.

NAKAMURA Yoshitoshi, the person had a connection with the former
TAIKA-KAI (Great Renovation Society) and the actual president of
the Cosmopolitan Press and of the World League Club as well as the
director of the Japan-US Club, returned of late from his long tour
through Europe and America since last winter. He states as the
followings:

Plan of Emigration into Brazil.

The greatest game during the recent tour is the settlement of
contract on Japanese emigration with the President of Brazil.
The president expressed his strong welcome on the new Japanese
emigrant into the country and promised his support.

Although I am not yet started any regular drive, I intend to make
a campaign tour for raising emigrants throughout the country from
the middle of July to around November, and then to start the
regular movement centering around Tokyo. I am aiming at a million
emigrant to send out.

- (2) 船主利重
FUNAO Toshishige, former director of the DAINIHON-SEISAN*TO
(Great Japan Production Party) states about the movement of persons
belonging to the rightwing line, as

- (A) Future of the SHINSEI-NIHON-KOKUMIN-DOMEI (Newly Born
Japanese Nations League).

It is presumed that the fund raised up to now is about
two million yen. However it has been monopolized by a part of

leaders and the network of movement was broken out, so that the supporters ~~has~~ parted away, to lose the future prospect at all.

(B) Antipathy against the former rightwing leaders.

The senior responsible persons of the old rightwing's line are amidst the distress of purge; not a little number of them are really helping or expressing their sympathy with the old comrades. I'm sure that such a mutual aid will play an important role on the movement in the probable opportunity.

The attitude of ^{吉田 益三} YOSHIDA Masuzo, president of the ^{一新} DAINIHON-ISSHIN-KAI (Great Japan Renovation Society), is extremely disagreeable, because he has hardly been affected financially with his own purge, by means of his holding on the party's fund which a lot of party members throughout the country secured through their campaign, as his private means, on the other hand, he is quite indifferent to the old comrades. There raised up a voice of censure among the comrades.

(3) Movement of the group headed by ^{皆川 三六 三陸} MINAGAWA Sanroku (Sanriku), executive committee of the former SENJI-TAISEI-KYOKA-REMMEI (Wartime Structure Strengthening League).

Because of his illness, he has been hospitalizing in the Tokyo University Hospital for medical treatment. When ^{高畑 正} TAKAHATA Tadashi, committee of the former ^{口体擁護連合会} KOKUTAI-YOGO-RENGOKAI (National Character Maintenance Federation), called him for comfort on July 18, it is said, TAKAHATA conferred with him on the future movement's fund and promised to secure ten million yen for the objective.

MINAGAWA seems to have ever designing the plan for his recovery, adding to it, his physical condition has become better, so he is likely to have had a confidence for his recovery. Persons recognized to be his comrades are ^{狩野 敏 船主 利 重 千 榮 友 次 郎} KANO Bin, FUNAO Toshishige, CHIBA Tomojiro and some others, whose combination is very tight. We can forecast his activity after recovery of his health.

- (4) Condition of ^{天野 辰夫} AMANO Tatsuo, head of the former KOKUSUI-DOMEI-TO (Patriotic Alliance Party).

AMANO Tatsuo had his son ^{天野 正 勝 藤 深 内} AMANO Masakatsu met SAITO Gennai to negotiate with him on his cherished political idea, the content of which is presumed to be the problem of HATOYAMA's returning back to the political world. However it is said that the result was very pessimistic.

On the Recent Peculiar Trends of Those
Concerned with Former Right-wing Groups.

I. Trend of Those Who Belonged to the Former
Theoretical Rightists' Group.

These people hold : "Notwithstanding the fact that the Korean problem apparently forms a first step to a World War III started by the Communist camps, measures being taken by the Japanese Government are too mild both internally and outwardly. To Japan no time has ever been more important than the present through all its history. Although we are purged men we should never be idly waiting for some measure to be taken by the Government, but should rather step forward and request the Government to depurge ourselves. It is certain that the Occupation Forces will give up Japan if the situation turns unfavourable, and it would be too late in whatever way we might struggle when the time has actually arrived. Those who defend this

country from the invasion of the Chinese Communists as well as the Soviet Union that can attack her in the course of a night across the Japan Sea are indeed ourselves who are nameless patriots, and not social democrats nor leaders of the present day.

Also with respect to the political field, there would be re-advancement of former political big figures through a general election of Diet members and a reorganization of the political circle that follows, if a depurge program be carried out this spring. After all, problems of peace treaty, revision of the Constitution as well as rearmament will emerge to the surface in the course of this year.

As to the problem of rearmament, it is being talked about in many ways ; and some are anxious about the expenditure needed for the formation of an army consisting of 3,000,000 men, the realization of which program is reported to be within this year."

2. Trend of Former Theoretical Rightists Working in the Intelligence Field.

These people, putting some degree of confidence in policies of the Government, maintain : " As to

the problem of peace treaty, we need not talk too much about it as people of Japan which is under occupation. America cannot but admit the rôle of Japan in the defence of Asia from various existing conditions. Japan's own rearmament is impossible from economic reason, and the Korean problem is rather favourable to this country. America will never withdraw its forces. Rearmament would raise no Constitutional question whether the intended forces might be of 3,000,000 men or more, if it is to be realized in the form of increase of the National Police Reserve. Loud crying for rearmament within Japan would work unfavourably in its international relation ; on the contrary, if Japan remains calm other nations will be naturally inclined to utilize its strength.

With respect to the problem of purgees, rightists will be the last to be depurged even if a considerable number of persons come to be released in the political and financial fields. The general election of House members will come only after January or February of next year if a peace treaty is concluded this autumn. Pending that time, such big figures as HATOYAMA Ichiro and ISHIBASHI Tanzan depurged cannot assume any portfolio

without holding a seat in the House ; and therefore Prime Minister YOSHIDA will continue to keep his present office for some time ahead.

What must be cried for loudly is the enhancement of merchant vessels. If they are increased from the present 1,500,000 tons to the extent of 5,000,000 tons, they may be directly utilized in any change of situation."

In this survey an optimistic attitude is observed.

3. Recently extraordinary sayings and doings among them there are some ones who make the following special sayings and doings.

"It is better for us not to be hurry up or to disturb the world. In case of conclusion of peace treaty, purge will be abolished unconditionally. After the peace treaty, we should struggle against democracy. We should throughout insist on advocacy and prevention of national character. Japan will become a first class country in the future 15 or 20 years. By that time, we cannot die by any means."

4. Movement of "active faction", former rightists.

As far as persons supposed "active faction" are concerned, they assume superficially tranquility and arrange their surroundings, waiting time of execution.

5. Movement of peculiar elements.

(1) SHIRAI Tameo, former principal of MITATE JUKU (Holy Shield Institute) came to Tokyo from Kyushu, in the middle of January, having an interview with KAGEYAMA Masaji, former principal of DAITO JUKU (Daito Institute) and other ten-odds comrades. He returned home after about ten day's stay.

(2) OKAMOTO Ko, former navy captain visited the office of INOUE Shiro, former adviser of DAINIPPON ISSHIN KAI (Dainippon Isshin Society) and revealed the speech to the effect.

"The Third World War will break out in about 1952. It is not adequate that Police Reserve is under the leadership of U.S. Army. Japanese armament will be completed in half a year."

(3) SAITO Gennai, former councillor of the Manchurian Imperial Household, visited MIURA Giichi, at the Mitsui Main Building, on January 20 and said as follows.

"MIURA's influence is splendid. Several dietmen and 10-odds rightist enterprisers were seen to have thronged in his office. It seems that there will happen something extraordinary, as he said that he saw a person come from Kyushu".

(4) SAITO Gennai visited ABE Genki, former Minister of Home Affairs, in the latter part of January and told as follows.

"I have been now doing business of ZENKOKU PAN KYOKAI (Nation Bread Association). Lieutenant General WACHI is in difficulties to a great degree. The general borrowed an office

room, by assistance of a certain principal of a company, visiting the office at Akibahara about three times every week. The General has been enjoying reliance of President Quirino, Philippine. The President advised the General to carry out an enterprise, from national viewpoint as the former would assist him in economic fields. However the General has been suspending inauguration of the enterprise".

(5) MINAKAWA Sanriku, FUNAO Toshikazu and KAWAHARA Shin-ichiro, under the lineage of KOKURYU KAI (Black Dragon Society) made recently conference at their office at Ginza and revealed their opinion.

"Japan has been confronting with an unexampled vital crisis. We cannot stay in a situation without any doings and sayings, because of purge. We should launch depurge movement by all means."

(6) KAWAHARA, JIMBO, OGURO and others held a banquet at the basement of Saiwai Building, Uchisaiwai Cho, in the upper part of February. In the course of the banquet, they discussed peace treaty problem, rearmament, constitution issue, formation of Police Reserve and depurge matter.

A. The this time step of depurge once may be a joyfulness for Japanese. But it is too unfair to bear that the contents of it is haphazard for us who are well acquainted with the circumstances at that time. If the persons, like FUJIYAMA Aiichiro and KANEMITSU Yasuo are pardonable to be depurged, almost of other purgees must be reasonable to be depurged. But judging from the present situation of the world, being depurged in a wholesale way in near future by American side, I believe that a time in which they must be required to be cooperated by us will come sooner or later.

B. Although YOSHIDA, acquiring once a political power, is a splendid person, he has not yet united with the nation and not yet determined. Two or three politicians like YOSHIDA can be seen also in Japan but HATOYAMA at any late is the most splendid politician in Japan.. In my view, the YOSHIDA's

reign will not last so long and Japan will come under the HATOYAMA's reign in near future.

C. The poor Asiatic policy of America is at present bringing about tremendous confusion in Asia. What did America bring about substantially in Asia. Except that American policy which does not make out the reality of Asia has only given a bait for the invasion of the Communism, it has not nearly brought about a happiness for us Asian. At present, it has come already to a step at which we Asian after all must do ourselves the winding-up of the Asiatic policy of America.

D. As the ISHIWARA's principle of the TOA REMMEI, after researching the Communist doctrine from all the angles, by him established to be an idea transcend above those thoughts and is a theory of regulationism, it is an only principle which, preventing the invasion of Communism, has the strength to break down it.

E. Those who are really understanding from the bosom his Excellency's thought, in my view, are only two persons ex-colonel TSUJI Masanobu and SO Keichu, 曾基桂 a former Korean Marxist (present leader of Seika Society and around thirty four years old). a. The route of the Unlawful entry into Japan
and smuggling in Kagoshima Prefecture.

Those who entered into this Prefecture unlawfully
amounts to considerable number owing to the condi-
tions that this Prefecture faces the South-West Islands
in south and the South Korea over the Goto Islands

in north geographically. The smuggling has been done not only with the economical aim but with those of political and ideological. It was done exclusively between Korea and North Kyushu direct after the termination of the war. But since around the latter half of 1948, it has become to be done between the north part of the South-West Islands and North Kyushu gradually. And the smuggling with Formosa and the South-West Islands is being done along the islands making the Okinawa Islands the relay place.

As the principal routes of the unlawful entry into Kagoshima Prefecture, the following three ones are mentionable.

- (1) From the South Korea via the Goto Islands and Koshikijima Islands to the coast of Kagoshima Prefecture.
- (2) To stow away from the South*West Islands south of 30 degrees north latitude, directly to main land.
- (3) To stow away from Formosa via Okinawa to Kuchinoshima Island and Kuchinagara Island and again from these islands via Iwo Islands to main land.

b. Cause of unlawful entry into Japan.

As the cause and motive of the unlawful entry into Japan and smuggling, the schemes to acquire the unlawful profit at a time, dreaming millions at a grasp are principal ones. But the prime cause of the frequent traffic between Korea and those of Kagoshima and the South-West Islands is attributable to the considerable difference yielded by the prohibition of trade since February, 1946 while there had been no such status between Korea and the main land of Japan till the outbreak of the Korean upheaval. Also there are those who enter into Japan in order to avoid the recent disturbance in their country, to meet their families or relations in Japan and to arrange their household affairs.

c. Concerning the vessels which are used.

Till around 1948, fishing boats or steam-and-sail-driven-boats around ten or 5 tons had been largely used and straight sailing to Japan was able at that time but recently using small fishing boats around four or five tons making the detached small islands the rely places, they are contrabanding.

In the occasion of smuggling abroad, they use comparatively large boats. The large boats are generally those of the Inland Sea and small ones are those of Shikoku, Wakayama, Nagasaki and Kagoshima quarters.

d. Principal harbors used for smuggling.

Those principal harbors attracting our attentions in Kagoshima Prefecture used for smuggling are as follows,

1. The harbor for smuggling abroad.

e. Principal smuggled goods.

1. Articles imported by smuggling. Raw rubber. Black sugar. White sugar. Granulated sugar. Leather sole. Miscellaneous articles for Occupation Forces. American dollar. Milk. Streptomycin. Tobacco and clothes for Occupation Forces. KAIJIN SO(a kind of seaweeds used for roundworm extermination) and others.

2. Articles exported by smuggling.

Sewing machine. Bicycle. Daily necessities made in Japan. Clothes. Soy-bean sauce. Tea. Edible oil. Dried stripes of radishes. Miscellaneous electric machinery. Stationary. Chinaware. Tangle. Building materials. Agricultural implements and others.

f. Defence status of the regulation authorities.

As the coast line inconvenient for traffic is long and the many detached islands are scattered in this Prefecture, we are much suffering from the regulation of it due to the extensiveness of the sphere. The police authorities had been stationing five watchers per observation posts establishing twenty one posts. Since 1949, requesting the personnel of the every Fishery Associations for the observation, we are now securing the result tolerably. We are now striving in regulation collecting and exchanging

the informations each other keeping close connection with the nine observation stations of the Custom-house. Equipped with four observation boats and being cooperated with Kagoshima Custom-house Branch, Kagoshima Municipal Police Station and Notional Rural Police Kagoshima Police Station, although Kagoshima Maritime Safety Division is continuously striving on watch, it cannot expect the sufficient regulation on account of the extensiveness of the sphere compared with the shortage of watchman and is now making every efforts to perfect it.

A. YUKOKU DOSHIKAI (Patriots' Association).

This association had been promoting its anti-
Communist movements rather vigorously since August
last year when it was first established; and es-
pecially, when the Communist group of the district

struggled with its utmost efforts in relation to the recent problems relating to the "recall of chairman of the village assembly of Yoshida-mura Kiyoshi YAMAGATA (Communist)" and the "disclosure of dishonest conducts of police officials belonging to police stations of Kagoshima City and Ijiki Village", it had to ~~suffer~~ ^{鹿児島市 伊敷村} a miserable defeat notwithstanding all its endeavours owing to the counter-activity of this association. Particularly, in consequence of the overwhelming victory of the conservative in connection with the recall problem of Yoshida Village, the Patriots' Association came to obtain at a single stroke one hundred and tens of affiliates within the village and organized a branch body (unregistered) in the area. Besides this, it has established another branch (registered) in Makurazaki City; and thus it has been developing the only active anti-Communist system within the prefecture.

The Makurazaki branch of this association has decided the following items as its immediate policies of movement :

- (1) To develop a "new life movement" for the promotion of morality founded on genuine democracy.

- (2) To promote national reconstruction under the sun-flag by excluding all national factors which hinder economic rehabilitation.
- (3) To make democratic types of education be satisfactorily enforced.

Upon these principles the branch has put an emphasis on the intensification of its policies toward fishing people, whose importance is due to its geographical circumstance; however, unfavourable conditions in its personal structure and in funds have restricted its activities within a low tone.

B. TOMOSHIBI KAKAI (Tomoshihi Poetic Society).

Owing to its financial difficulty internal conflicts have recently been caused among its members, although the condition does not seem to show any further development. Hiroyuki HAMADA, 浜田 博之 the central figure of this society, living in Miyazaki-machi, Sendai City, Kagoshima Prefecture 鹿児島県川内市若崎町 has lately observed as follows :

"Since the recent Communist declaration was made, the trend of the Communist Party has become considerably acute; under which circumstance we are also making our utmost to meet the situation. Especially now when the problem

of Formosa has been brought to the front by the overwhelming advancement of the Chinese Communists, it is impossible for ourselves to sit vainly without doing anything.

After our most trusted comrades KIRA and MIZOGAMI left us for town, the number of active comrades within the prefecture has become comparatively small and now the reconstruction of our group is rather hopeless. Under the circumstances, it is my desire to sail to Formosa as early as possible in order to exert myself for the settlement of Formosan problem."

Such view as this seems to have been shared also by some other members of this group.

- C. On the Activity of Otomatsu MATSUKI (38),
Person Who Belonged to the Former KEIAI DOJUN
REMMEI (The Keiai Dojun League).

According to his own remark, Otomatsu MATSUKI has been engaging in the fishing trade in near waters with a chartered ship which he rent from his uncle (name unknown) living in Mizumata City in Kumamoto Prefecture; however, a suspicion exists that, as a matter of fact, he has shared a role

in the program of the League members' sailing to Formosa. Particularly, it has been told that MATSUKI was lately invited by the Chinese Nationalist Army in connection with Lt. General NEMOTO's sailing over to Formosa. Besides, he has held a close relation with former gendarmerie Lt.

colonel Isao YOSHINAGA (purged person) living in Mukoda-machi, Sendai City, Kagoshima Prefecture and former captain Gisuke TABATA (purged person) living in Takashiro Village, Satsuma County, Kagoshima Prefecture.

D. On the Activity of Shuhei UCHIMIYA (35), Person who Belonged to the Former SHICHISHO KAI Connected with the Former KETSUMEI DAN (Blood Brotherhood).

It seems that in recent days a group of some 20 young men (including students of the Seventh High School) has from time to time discussed on current problems at the house of Shuhei UCHIMIYA, but no systematic feature has been recognized about this group. However, UCHIMIYA appears to have kept communication with former army officers and rightist elements; and he has had an interview with Yoshitake YOTSUMOTO, a person concerned with

the former KETSUMEI DAN (Blood Brotherhood), on the occasion of the later person's returning to the prefecture.

E. On the Activity of Kotora MATSUDA (47), Person
Connected with the former ^{松田 小虎} MEIRINKAI and Now
in the Positions of Central Executive Commit-
teeman of ZENNO (National Farmers' Union) and
Chief Editor of the "ZENNO Shimbun" (ZENNO's
Organ Paper). ^{明倫会}

From about October last year MATSUDA has been vigorously working upon the farming population in the areas of Kawabe, Hioki and Satsuma Counties in Kagoshima Prefecture saying that to secure the independence of Japan the movement for the relief and maintenance of farmers' life is one of the most essential conditions. Further, it seems that through such means as the selling of an organ paper issued by the DOKURITSU SEINEN DOMEI (Independence Youth League) ^{独立青年同盟} which is closely connected with Sada-chika NABEYAMA, ^{鍋山 貞親} he is exerting himself for establishing the combination of all classes of youthful men.

At his louse named "Ten-ya Wan-ya so" which is
located at 106, Nishisengoku-cho, Kagoshima City,

MATSUDA has been devotedly absorbed in educating ten and several young men who are to become central characters of his group.

III. The recent trend of anti-Communist camps in Kagoshima Prefecture has been showing gradually active features getting out of the calm and watchful atmosphere so far observed.

As to the Yoshida-mura branch of the YUKOKU DOSHI-KAI (Patriots' Association), this office has advised it to take the procedure for official registration under the Organizations Control Order.

Expose "Village of Violence" in Ehime Ken: Town assemblymen of Chikanaga Machi, Ehime Ken, assault a member of the Livelihood Protection League and strike an AKAHATA correspondent. Following the 27 March tax demonstration against the town office, LPL representatives call on the revenue section to attempt negotiations. Assembly chairman YAMAMOTO and two others gang up on petitioner TAKEDA for "meddling with the affairs of town headmen." The next day AKAHATA reporter MATSUSHITA is beaten while trying to interview Yamamoto. Unable to secure police action on the cases, Nanyo District Communist Committee is preparing to bring suit against Yamamoto and his cohorts. The committee will also appeal to the townsmen at large to stamp out violence in the community. (Akahata, 5 April)

According to his complaint, Yokoyama offered on May 12, 1948, to help Mr. Saito sell to China the ball bearings which Mr. Saito was going to buy from the Bearing Disposition Congress. Later around the 25th of the same month Yokoyama asked the complainant to lend him money. The latter accepted the request and loaned him a total of 175,000 yen. But the defendant has shown no intention since then to pay off his debts.
