# CAMPBELL HAL





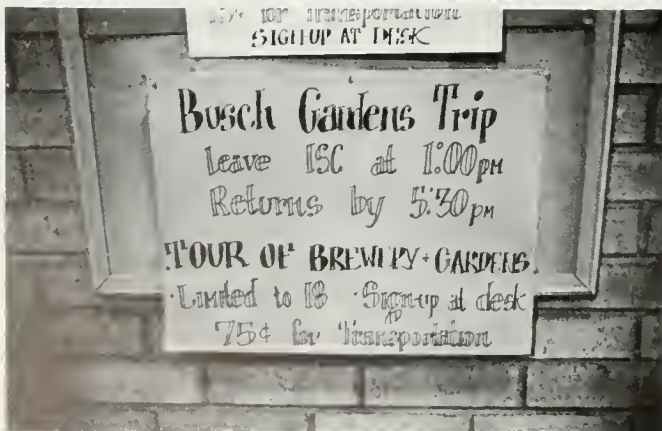

# INTERNATIONAL STUDENT CENTER

At a school where even the most 'at-home' student often finds himself secluded, the dilemma of the foreign student population is especially acute. Scattered around the West Los Angeles area and meeting other students almost solely through the poor social medium of formal classes, the foreign student often finds himself isolated in a strange culture and thrust back upon those few fellow students with whom he can readily identify, his countrymen.

This problem has been overcome to a considerable extent by the facilities and opportunities offered by the International Student Center. The ISC serves as a meeting ground where the foreign student can make contact with students of all nationalities, and through which he can become involved with the activities and problems of the campus and the Los Angeles area. However, the isolation of the ISC building from central campus, and the tendency of the administration and even the student body to view the foreign student as a guest rather than as an integral part of the UCLA community, often conspire to make these students feel an alien and forgotten adjunct to the university.

# NO MINORS ALLOWED







UCLA POLICY RELATING TO DOGS ON CAMPUS  
ADOPTED FEBRUARY 17, 1977

1. Dogs may not be brought onto Campus except when:
  - A. Secured to a leash or chain no more than six feet long, the other end of which is retained by a person, or
  - B. Securely confined in a vehicle.
2. Dogs may not be tethered on Campus.
3. Dogs are not permitted in any Campus Building even though leashed except for:
  - A. Seeing-eye dogs serving their owners,
  - B. Animals involved in authorized research, and
  - C. Special circumstances (if such circumstances exist, special approval must be obtained through the Environmental Health and Safety Officer).
4. Dogs must have valid dog licenses as evidence of current rabies vaccinations.
5. Dogs on Campus in violation of this policy are subject to being picked up and turned over to the City Pound. Owners of such impounded dogs may make arrangements directly with the Pound for recovery of their dogs.

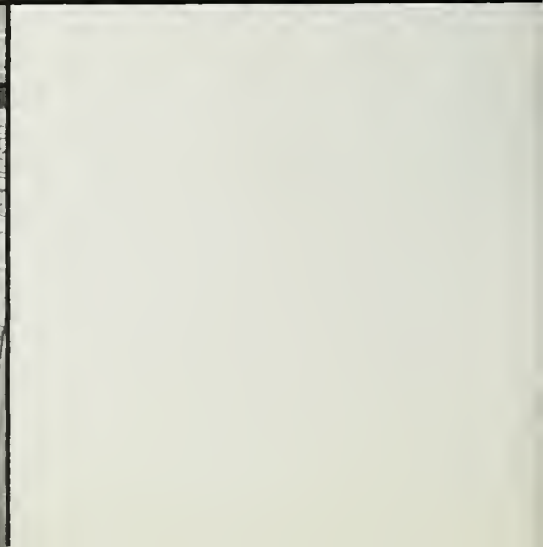

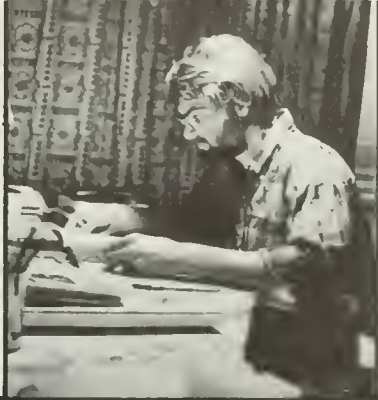

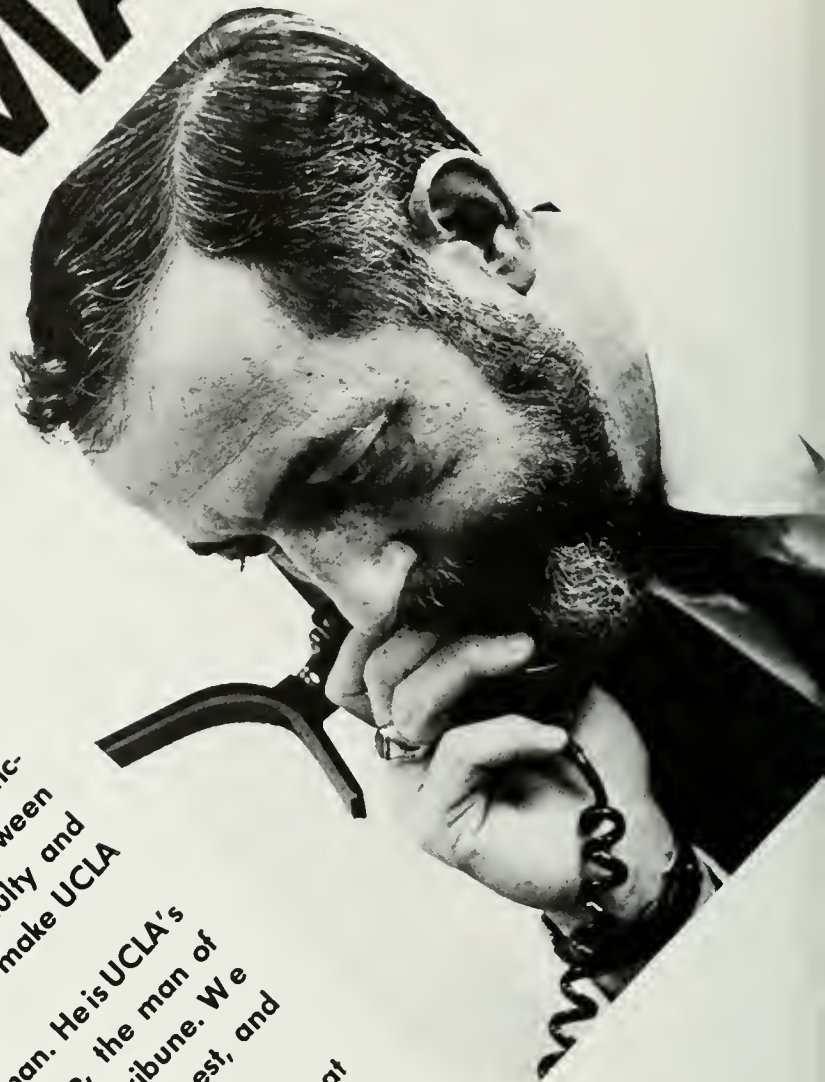
# OMBUDSMAN

Frustration. The measure of increasing complexity. The gap between decisions and those affected. UCLA is growing. What about the almost 50,000 people that make up us? Are we victims of the institution, or participants in a meaningful event?

The secret is that when we turn our eyes on ourselves we don't see an inviolable sanctuary. There are enough people between Dickson and the Med Center — faculty and employees, men and women — to make UCLA its own urban center.

Don Hartsock is an urban man. He is UCLA's first Ombudsman: the advocate, the man of the people, the twentieth century tribune. We have asked him to observe, to suggest, and to be one of our symbols for change. What threatens us is the momentum that tries to streamline for progress, and loses touch with that quality which is an individual touch with his situation.

Everyman. Student, administrator, employee — each has felt the need to see himself somewhere involved in change. The question is, can change be creative? Not just a big school, but an imagination and sensitivity that offers life in the university rather than existence.



# DONALD E. HARTSOCK

Refusing to be cast on any one side of our polar environment, Hartsock's office is in Kinsey Hall, in the center of the event — overlooking the Royce Quad where people have reacted to computers by walking bare-foot on the grass. And throwing frisbees. There are no records-by-number in his office. No files to make talking people don't petition to see him. Just a man, a pipe, an ear to listen — and the courage to give advice.

His only power is suggestion. But Murphy Hall has agreed to listen. He is leading change, and helping to pick up the pieces. Success or failure doesn't seem to be the way to judge the Ombudsman. The goal is for each man to be heard. With individual sensitivity and justice the prime commodities. That decisions will be made to serve people — not people to serve decisions.

Is this a place for humanity? We feel challenged in our frustration with new, hopeful, exhilarating. Some men are exciting our will to change. This too is the Ombudsman. A man to help give us a start. A good man.

# STUDENT EDUCATIONAL POLICY COMMISSION



Liasion Corps

For the modern students, a dilettantish interest in changing the university is a social necessity. *Relevant, meaningful, and viable* are terms as vital to the "concerned student" as *23 skidoo* and *the cat's pajamas* were to the sheiks and shebas of the '20's. This concerned interest rarely amounts to anything beyond contributing the appropriate cliches at "rap sessions". The university is left to struggle by itself through an embrangled morass of ideas, traditions, theories, and opinions.

Amid this plethora of superficiality there are some serious efforts being made. The members of the Student Educational Policy Commission are working as volunteers in a program of hard, often unglamorous, and nearly always unpublicized work. The alteration of the breadth requirements in the College of Letters and Sciences is an example of the committee's efforts.

SEPC is organized to work for reform and improvement at three levels: class, department, and campus. On the class level there are two reform organs: the Creative Teaching Information center and the Lecture Task Force. The Creative Teaching Information Center is just that; a repository of information on teaching innovations, available to any student or faculty member. If the information at hand is insufficient, more will be supplied by library research and/or inter campus correspondence. Any professor wishing to improve his courses can seek help from the Lecture Task Force. Among the services it provides are course evaluation, researching appropriate innovations, and assisting in instituting these innovations.

The University Action Council works for reform at the departmental level by developing departmental student organizations. Its basic methods are idea sharing and limited funding. Group activities range from suggestions on curricula reform to arrangement of faculty-student gatherings.

The campus-wide reforms are undertaken by a two-part program. After careful research, proposals are formulated by the Academic Research Council. The Liaison Corps works with appropriate administrators to secure its passage. Currently the subjects of much discussion are four broad proposals for changes in the undergraduate education at UCLA. These proposals were submitted to the Academic Senate last spring and were rejected, except part of #2. Undaunted, the members of SEPC are still working for their acceptance.

The first proposal is a course-load reduction, from four to three classes per quarter, to be linked with the establishment of many undergraduate seminars. Reaction to this proposal has been quite favorable. Proponents state that fewer courses would result in a sharper focus of student energy and interest with less fragmentation. The seminars, it is argued, would lead to better student-faculty relations and encourage critical and responsible thought in the student during his earlier years at the university.

The second proposal has already been partially incorporated into the university. Students in the College of Letters and Sciences now have some options in fulfilling their breadth requirements. In the three areas

outside of their major, students may take three courses in each, or seven courses in one areas and one course in each of the others, or seven in one and two in one other. This program offers an opportunity for something more than a superficial introduction to matters outside the major field of interest.

Another part of this proposal, still under discussion,

proposal's future is uncertain.

The final proposal concerns the establishment of a three-quarter freshman program focusing around a discussion of higher education. This program would be run experimentally for 150 freshmen and, if successful, would later be open to all freshmen. The first quarter would be devoted to discussions of the interrelation-

is the reduction of the foreign language requirement from five quarter courses to three. There are three basic reasons given for this reduction: (1) that foreign languages are best learned at the primary level, (2) that a foreign language is rarely used by those not going on to graduate school, and (3) that the foreign language program fails in its purpose of promoting intercultural understanding. Opponents argue that this reduction would de-emphasize language to the point of " 'high school' proficiency". UCLA, they state, would then have "the weakest foreign language requirement . . . of any major university on the west coast."

The third proposal, extension of the pass/not pass option to all courses except upper division courses in the student's major, has met with mixed reactions. Proponents argue that grades are arbitrary and inaccurate, and that they tend to become the student's objectives rather than learning and understanding. Opposition centers around the question of admission to graduate school. Supporters of the proposal counter with the facts that only about one half of the students go on to graduate school, and that some graduate schools have expressed approval of this plan. At this writing this

ships of the students, the university, and society, and the significance of various campus groups. The second quarter would center around the nature of the educational process and the student-university relationship. This quarter would also include an examination of the areas of the College of Letters and Sciences, both their natures and the opportunities therein. During the third, optional, quarter the student would prepare a paper on something pertaining to some aspect or role of the university, e.g. an in-depth analysis of the affects an on-campus cyclotron has on the nature and development of the physics department, or an extensive research study into the factors that have kept UCLA comparatively riot-free.

If the university is to survive it must change with the times. From all sides we are told that it cannot remain a static institution. But change is difficult to effect in the world of bureaucracy. If change is to be meaningful and lasting it must also be responsible and brought about by responsible means. Amidst the tangle of dilettantism and occasional violence, SEPC is working for intelligent change by rational means. Theirs is not an easy task but it is a vital one.

# TEEN OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAM



In the two years since its inception, the Teen Opportunities Program has provided a direct link between UCLA and the youth in the Mexican American community. It has become the avenue for hundreds of Chicano youths from throughout Los Angeles County and Southern California to enter both UCLA and other state colleges and universities.

The mission of the Teen Opportunities Program has been to make known to underprivileged barrio youth the numerous opportunities which are open to them in higher education, while simultaneously attempting to raise the aspirations and motivational level of these youth toward the University.

The role of TOP in bringing the Chicano student into the mainstream of our University educative process has been vital not only in that it has served as a vehicle for recruitment, but also as it has become a model for the recruitment and selection phases of the Special Education Programs for minority students at UCLA.

Chicano Leadership Conferences aim at bringing together Chicano high school students from throughout the county, away from the inhibiting pressures and tensions of the barrios, so as to provide a forum where community issues of importance to the youth may be examined and discussed by them. It has been found by minority college recruitment programs that barrio youth must first gain a higher degree of self-esteem and confidence before attempting to try for college special education programs. Through the camp program and the work being done in the barrio, that needed confidence is being instilled and cultivated.

The camp program has also significantly aided in bringing about better





into one of the most vital and important projects dealing with barrio youth in East Los Angeles. Although the program's basic mission was to recruit and counsel candidates for university minority programs, the community broadened the scope and dimension of the program by relating to the University those problem areas needing attention in order to regenerate the interest of barrio youth in all levels of education.

The establishment of the barrio house has provided the catalyst for a new educational experiment through the use of Chicano history, art, music, and cultural classes.

The work that has been done by this project is being acknowledged by community leaders as one of the most important endeavors conceived by concerned students, who have responded to the needs of their community by implementing their academic training and channeling student idealism into instruments of positive change.

INTERNATIONAL CAMPUS NEWS AND SATYR PROFESS

The Associated Students of the University of California at Los Angeles, through its Communications Board, finances and oversees five publications—*The Daily Bruin* (newspaper), *Southern Campus* (yearbook), *Satyr* (humor magazine), *Nommo* (black student newspaper) and *Westwind* (literary magazine). While the quality of these publications waxes and wanes as interest and talent shift, the questioning process over the role, functioning and necessity of the various publications is constant. Recently, this questioning has taken on a new tone, as institutions outside the University have sought to exert influence or restrictions on these essentially internal publications. The extent to which they are successful will determine the extent to which the University's student publications are no longer valid—or student.

# REVALUATION WESTWIND DAILY BRUIN



The University is under attack. Politics in America in 1970 decrees that for both ideological and practical reasons the University become a focal point for the vituperation of both left and right; their easy-to-hit-at symbol of "what's wrong with America." As the University's most obvious and public voice, student publications have attracted a heavy share of this criticism. On one side, there have been calls to 'radicalize' student publications, to make them integral and effective parts of the 'Movement'—whatever that movement happens to be at that part of time. On the other, editors have been fired or forced out, publications suspended and calls for official censorship raised at levels ranging from the community to the federal government.

The University of California has been no exception. Though its publications have managed to maintain their independence up to this time, pressure has been applied and threats openly made in attempts to guide editorial policy in one favored direction or another.

In 1968 Regent John Canady requested an investigation by the Special Commission on the Campus Press to assess what he and other members of the Board of Regents considered to be "obscene" and "pornographic" content, and "leftist" editorial control of campus publications. These allegations received no support in the report returned by the Commission, and Canady subsequently attacked the report on the grounds that it "deals in generalities, and does not go to the heart of the questions raised in the resolution which brought its appointment."

Political pressure is only one part of the problem confronting student publications. Student apathy, financial cuts, and the desire of radical groups to turn these publications

into house organs for their own organizations, or to at least be immune from criticism, all play their part.

Those who see history in terms of a pendulum, predict that the United States, recovering from a swing to the political left during the sixties, will swing sharply to the right in this next decade. In these terms, the men of the left hope to arrest, even reverse, this swing. When political and ideological battles arise, one of the first mediums to be attacked is the uncontrolled press.

There are many good arguments for a free student press; so many, in fact, that attempts to stifle this institution generally pay lip service to those arguments, using self-defined words like "responsibility" and "truth" to explain away attempts at censorship or takeover. Real words used as euphemisms quickly lose all semblance of reality.

It is a very real possibility that the free University press will fall victim to the tense political climate which now prevails in the state of California. Its enemies are many, powerful and loud. Its advocates are vilified as "liberals," the dirtiest word among political activists of all persuasions. If this should happen; if the now independent University publications are closed down or forced to become propaganda sheets or non-offensive trivia broadcasters, by the currents of political warfare being carried to the campuses; the University will have lost one of its most effective means of education to the real world, and one of the benchmarks of its integrity. The fate of student publications at the University over the next few years will serve as an accurate index of the ultimate fate of the University itself.

"Hot Zeno Cools Stanford" read the five-column headline over the Daily Bruin's lead front-page story of October 5, 1964; and stuck over in the left-hand corner of the page was a much smaller wire service story with the headline: "Students End Sit-ins, Okay Six Point Pact." The story told how 400 Berkeley students, led by a 21-year-old philosophy major named Mario Savio, surrounded a university police car for eight hours to prevent the arrest of a non-student political activist.

Neither the Daily Bruin editors, nor anyone else for that matter, could have realized the real significance of that story. For the next two months the Daily Bruin's

editors would put a much greater deal of emphasis on such traditional college fare as homecoming, football games and Greek news than they would on the birth of the student revolt of the '60's.

Two months later over 800 students were arrested for refusing to leave Berkeley's Sproul Hall and gradually homecoming, football games and Greek news would have to relinquish priority to the more complex and more explosive issues which were beginning to affect the nations' campuses.

It has been more than five years since the Free Speech Movement rocked the Berkeley campus, and what we have seen

since then makes the whole affair seem simple and almost innocent by comparison. The long and fruitless war in Vietnam, the Chicago convention, SDS and the SDS Weathermen, People's Park, and the shooting deaths of two black students at UCLA last year have forced the college press to play a different role from the one it performed during the Eisenhower era. The campus press today cannot merely serve as a bulletin board of social activities; it cannot merely editorialize on bookstore discounts or the quality of cheerleaders as it usually did in 1964.

It is a lot to ask of students who are essentially amateur journalists, and in the past year we have often fallen short of what we should have expected of ourselves. There were times when we analyzed situations incorrectly; there were times when

we misinterpreted facts or failed to present all of the facts; and there were times when we judged situations without sufficient evidence. In other words, there were times last year when we could have done better.

The Daily Bruin has to serve a number of functions. It still must serve the bulletin board function of announcing various events, however, it must also attempt to educate the students to those issues which the editors consider significant; it must fulfill its role as a political institution by commenting on those issues of significance and by attempting to force change in the University where change is deemed necessary; and it must serve as a forum for the entire University community, barring no faction from its pages.

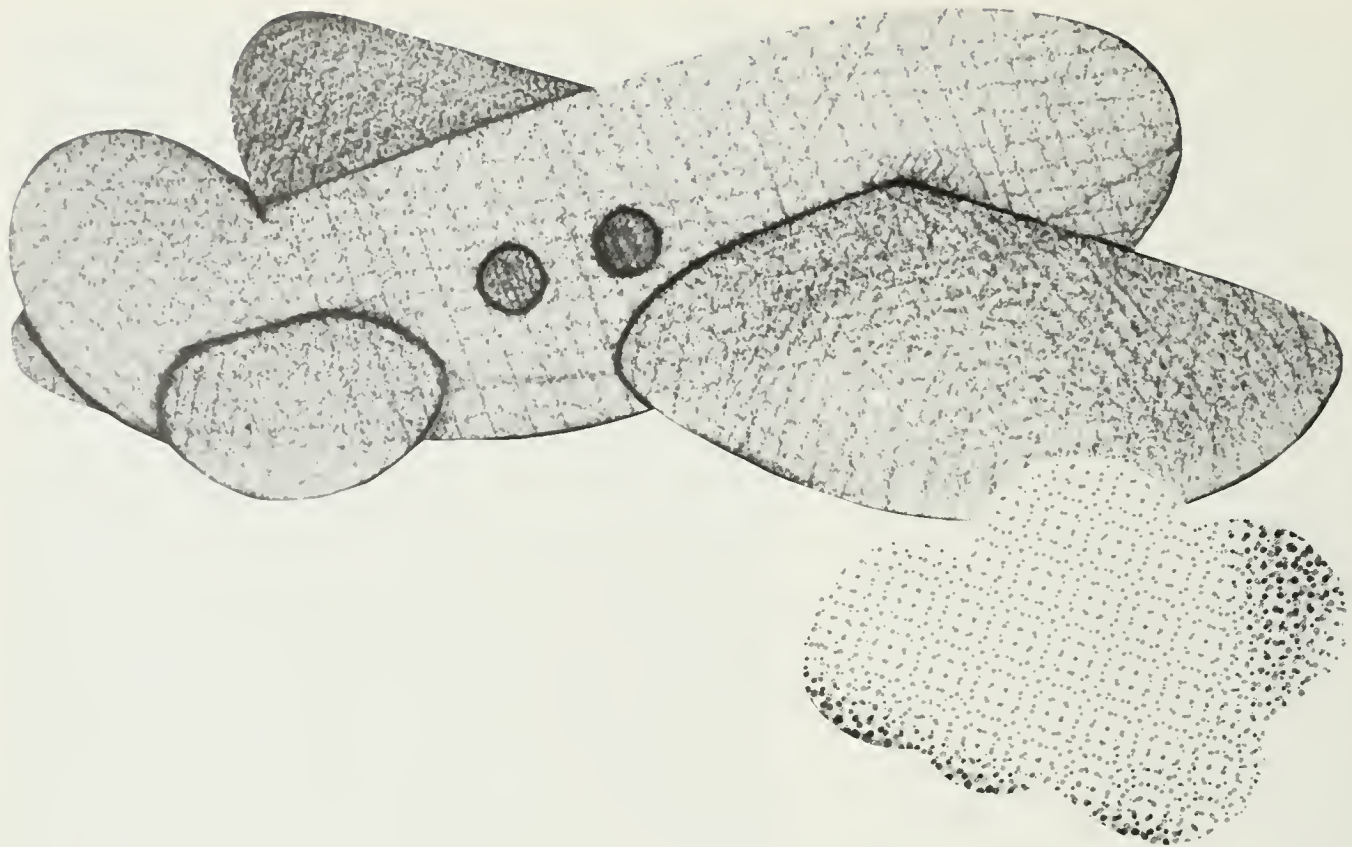

# FIGHT!

Back in 1962, when I was a freshman at Greenhills High School in Ohio, I clipped a picture of UCLA's song girls from a national magazine. It was about the time UCLA's football team had upset number one ranked Ohio State 9-7, in the Coliseum.

The Bruins only won three more games in 1962, and finished fifth in the old AAWU conference, but they and the pretty song girls had won my sports-crazy heart.

On July 1, 1963, J.D. Morgan became UCLA's Athletic Director. During the seven years since then, the Bruins have won nine NCAA team championships—in basketball (1965-65-67-68-69-70), tennis (1965), track (1966), and water polo (1969)—and two National Collegiate titles in volleyball.

The song girls are still pretty, but the Bruins, in any sport, are rarely underdogs.

In the fall of 1969, the UCLA water polo team was undefeated and won the Pacific-8 and NCAA Championships. The football team lost only one game and was ranked throughout the season in the nation's top ten. Coach Dennis Storer's soccer team lost a



single match, by a single goal, in the NCAA Regional Tournament.

As the winter quarter ended, the UCLA basketball team won the Pacific-8 title and another NCAA Championship. The ruggers won the World Cup Trophy, lost only two games and were nationally ranked number two. Coach Bob Horn's swimming team won the Pacific-8 Championships and finished fourth in the NCAA Championship meet.

During the spring quarter, the Bruin tennis team was undefeated after eleven matches, the track team was undefeated and averaging over 90 points after three dual meets, and the volleyball team, winners of 37 of 40 games and ranked number one in the nation, qualified for the NCAA Championship Tournament.

Thanks for the memory.

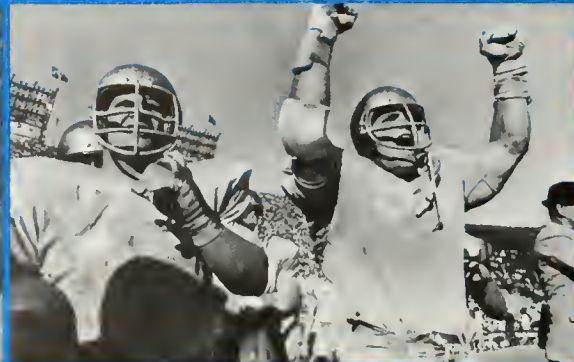
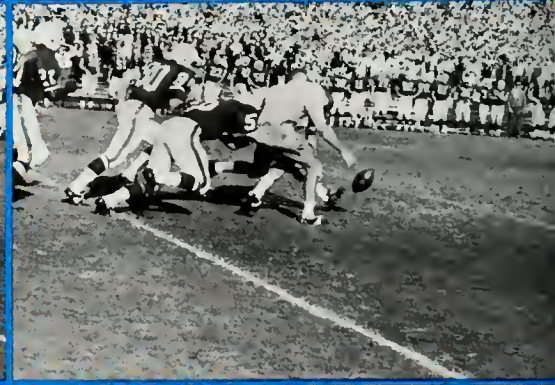
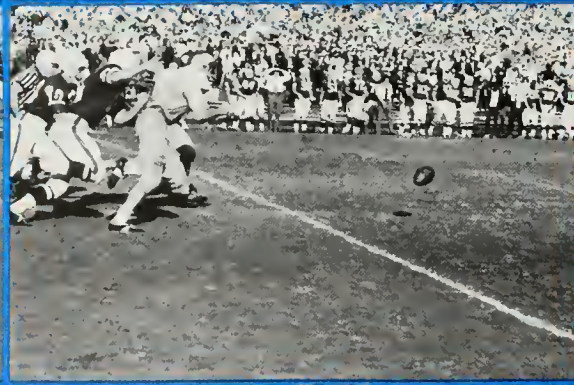
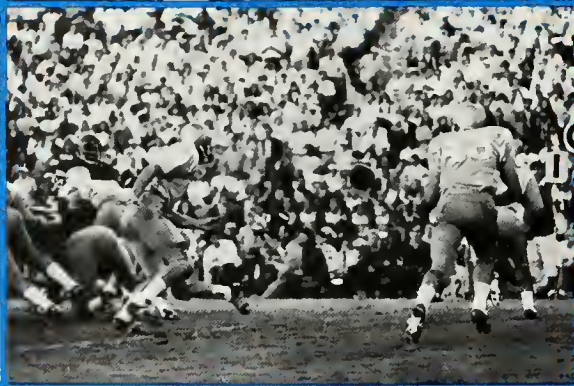
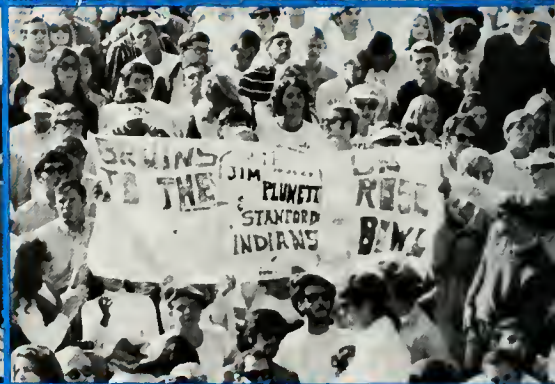
At 8:05 p.m. on Saturday, September 13, 1969, Bruin quarterback Dennis Dummit, a transfer from Long Beach City College, was faced with a passing situation—third and six on the UCLA 40. He threw sharply into the left flat to split end Gwen Cooper, who caught the ball, sidestepped Oregon State defender Don Whitney and raced down the Coliseum's north sideline to score. Just 1:27 had been played in the first quarter—it was Dummit's first pass as a Bruin. Ten weeks thereafter, on November 23, with about a minute to play, the Bruins, behind 12-14, had maneuvered down to the USC 39-yard line. Dummit threw into the left flat for split end Rick Wilkes, but the Trojans' Ty Hudson intercepted, insuring USC's record fourth-straight New Year's visit in Pasadena. Sandwiched between those two memorable plays were regained national prominence, eight wins, one loss, and one tie.

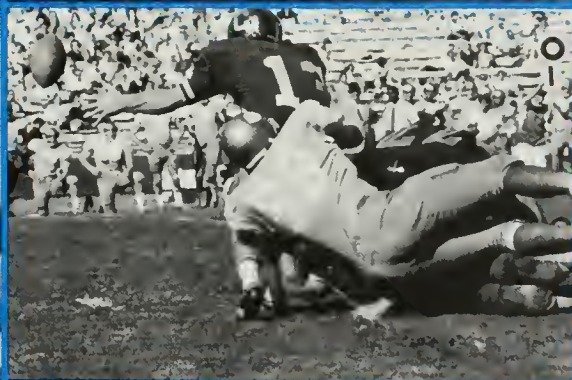
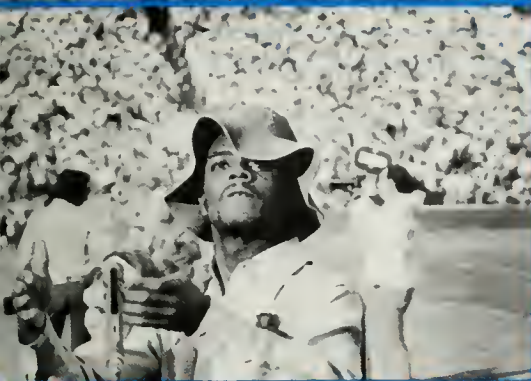














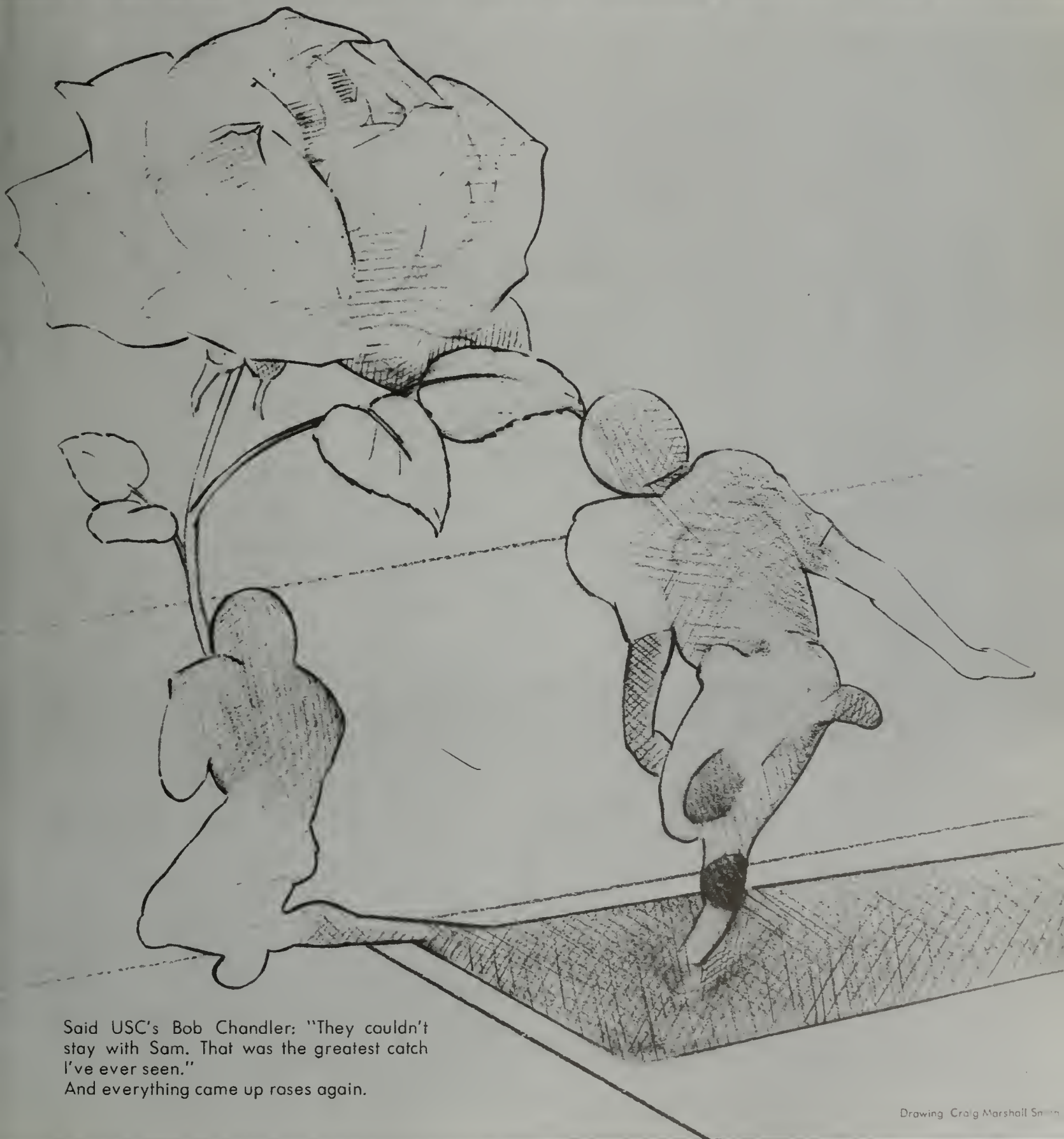




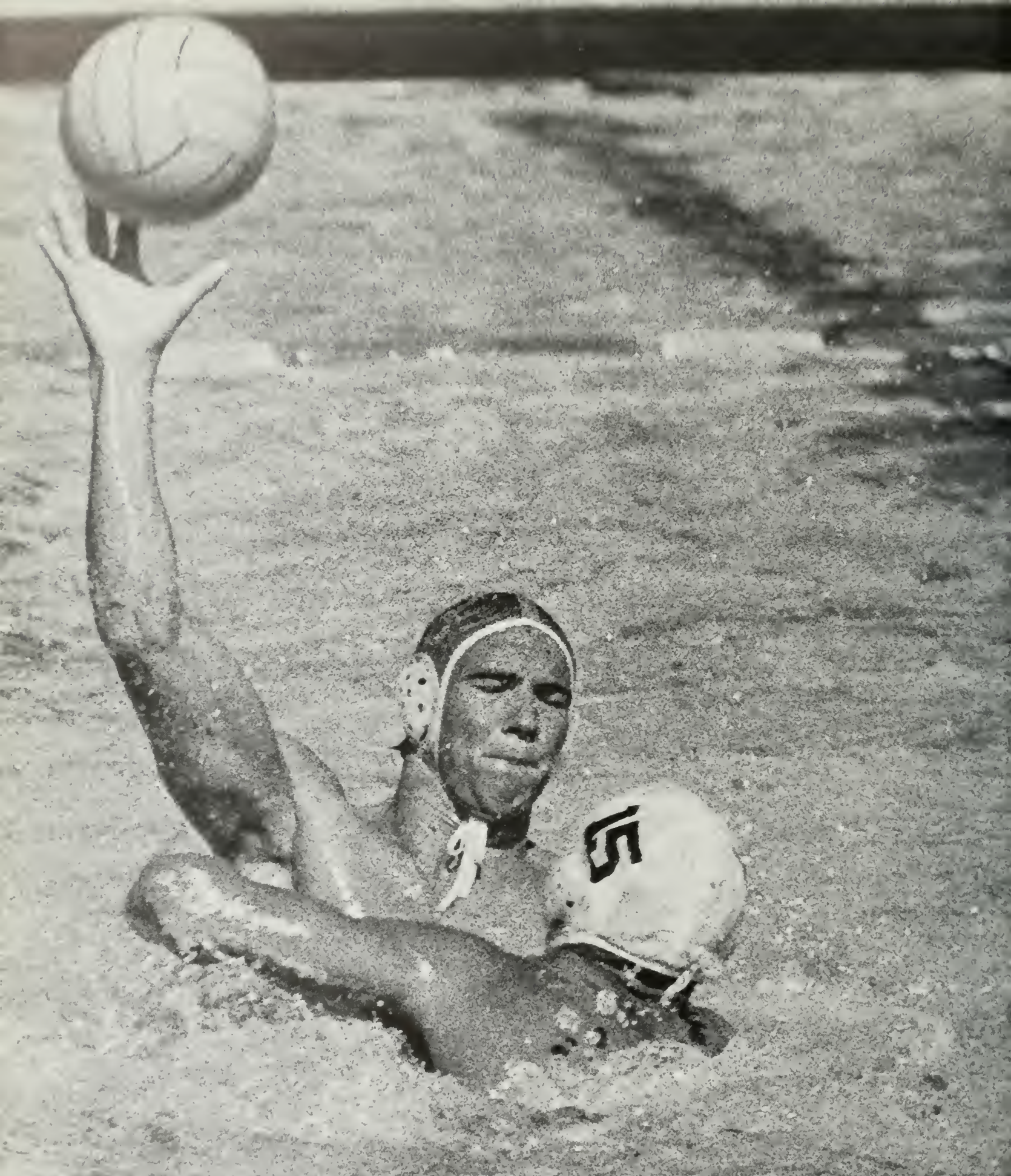

Over the past seven years UCLA Varsity basketball teams have won 192 of 206 games, six Pacific-8 Conference championships, twenty-four consecutive NCAA tournament games, and six NCAA Championships. Coach John R. Wooden was voted "Coach of the Year" by the Associated Press, United Press International, and the National Association of Basketball Coaches in 1964, 1967, 1969, and 1970. And there have been six All-Americans: Walt Hazzard, Gail Goodrich, Lew Alcindor, Lucius Allen, and Sidney Wicks. In short, there has been no better era in the history of collegiate basketball.



At International Airport on March 22, 1970, at 2:25 p.m. a crowd of over 2,000 pleased Bruin fans met TWA flight 99 from Washington, D.C., at gate 36. Arriving were Wooden, Crum, Cunningham, Drake, Vallely, Patterson, Rowe, Wicks, Hill, Betchley, Booker, Schofield, Ecker, Chapman, and Seibert (Bibby had stayed with his family in Franklinton, North Carolina). Twenty-four hours earlier, the Bruins had claimed the nets after drowning the Jacksonville Dolphins 80-69, in the NCAA Basketball Championship game at College Park, Maryland.

The delicate shell is showered, far right, at the end of every rowing day, and carefully stored in the boathouse.





"Ready all, hands on, out and away." Out of the boathouse, the Bruin varsity carried their shell, the Bradford A. Booth, waist high and swung it parallel to the creek.

"Up and away." They flipped the shell over their heads and lowered it into the water. Coach Johnson shook nine hands; the blue-tipped oars were set; Rigger Brown pushed them off; they tied in and began working up the creek toward the starting line.

"Touch it up, two." California's two took a short stroke to swing the bow.

"Ready all, ready to row, rrrrow!" and they rowed their digits off.

From the observation deck at 1000 meters, the two shells looked like eight-legged water bugs coming down the course. As the crews passed the boathouse, the coxswains' calls were covered by a rousing eight-clap from the UCLA junior varsity, and 2,500 different cheers from the crowd.

At 1500 meters the boats were almost even: California was ahead by a seat. But who wants to lose after seven months of daily runs on La Ballona Creek?

Six seats, 1.8 seconds, separated the boats as they crossed the finish.

After docking, everyone shook hands and hugged. And soon half-naked Bears walked out of the boathouse and gave their jerseys to the Bruins.



# TRACK





Coming through with seven lifetime bests, the Bruins scored an excellent 99-55 victory over a Kansas Jayhawk team that had won the last two meetings, 102-42 and 91-63, and was coming off its second straight conquest in the NCAA Indoor Championships.

"After two years of being humiliated," said UCLA's Wayne Collett, "we didn't need a pep talk."

Collett himself won the 440 in 46 flat, the 220 in 20.8, and anchored the 440 relay team to a 39.9 victory.

"When we got 1-2 in the mile that killed them," said UCLA coach Jim Bush. Senior Mike Mullins came home in 4:03.3, only one-tenth off his lifetime best, and Bruin Scott Chisam half off Kansas' Mike Solomon for second with a personal record of 4:05.9.

Other lifetime bests included 6-11 by Hal Greenwood in the high jump, 51-4 by Denny Rogers in the triple jump, 46.1 by John Smith for second in the 440, and 178-11 by Mark Ostoich for second in the discus.

Non-scoring lifetime bests by the Bruins were 47.9 by footballer Brad Lyman in the 440 and 4:07.0 by Joe Balasco in the mile.

"This was a great win," said Collett. "This is the kind of win that gives a team the confidence to go all the way."

All the way to the NCAA Championships at Des Moines, Iowa, June 18-20. Bush, in his sixth year as UCLA head track and field coach, and his Bruins have not only been the National Collegiate team champions once (1966) and the Pacific-8 Conference Champions twice (1966 and 1969) but have been top contenders—fifth or better—in three of the other four NCAA title meets.







# RUGBY

This was a very good year . . . only those close to the team can realise how good.

It was a season full of big games—Church College—Stanford—Berkeley—British Columbia—New Zealand—Ponsonby—San Francisco—etc.

It's hard to follow a season when UCLA had been voted No. 1. In each game, it was always obvious first **how much** the desire existed to beat us.

Yet the 1970 team when at full strength, which was rare, was probably better than its predecessor. It was certainly the most explosive team that UCLA rugby has produced—nearly twenty-five points averaged for every game, and scored from deep running movements that delighted both spectators and players alike.

There were some great games and great moments. The Church College "baffle" instilled a discipline and a unity that served the team well throughout the season—beating Berkeley "up there"—winning the World Cup so comfortably—overrunning the "big" teams through speed and finesse—This was always so satisfying.

Rugby is always very much a team effort, but individuals were unforgettable. Randy Thaman's steadiness at fullback—Auerbach's brilliant, slashing runs at wing—Sugden's hands and footwork. The power and desire of Murphy at prop. Pasquerello's achievements, a reward for hard work. The swansong of Ron Nisbet—The efforts of Scott and Lepisto playing game after game despite pain and injury. The unselfishness of Thrussell and Desmond who never showed their disappointment as understudies after being the stars in previous teams.

These are the things that are best remembered—the success, the glory of being at the top, but most of all, **how** it was done, and **who** were the other guys who shared those moments.

Finally—the Greyhounds—the emerging "kie". This was their best ever, and there are many more to come.

Yes. It was a very good year. Well done the 1970 Bru ruggers!



"I don't believe us!" said Coach Art Reichle during the ninth inning of the first game of a doubleheader with Utah. The Bruins' seven-run lead had dwindled to three. Two Redskins were on the base paths and, after some misjudgment, both were clinging to second base. One stayed there, while the Bruins chased the other back to first. He made it safely. The Bruins eventually won 12-9, but then lost the second game 5-7. They also lost to the College of Sequoias, Fresno State (twice), UC Irvine, Westmont, Loyola, and UC Santa Barbara (twice) in pre-conference action.

The defending Pacific-8 Champions opened their conference schedule against number one ranked USC, and lost 2-0.

Grim as the season seemed, the Bruins' greatest fans, the aged warriors from the nearby Veterans Hospital, didn't miss a game at Sawtelle Field. And they were probably happier than anyone when the plans for an on-campus baseball park were temporarily dropped.

UCLA scored 466 points at the Pacific-8 meet, whipping USC by 61 points, Stanford by 90, and fourth place Washington by 270.

Bruin Steve Genter won both the 500-yard freestyle and the 1,650-yard freestyle, and broke Trajan Greg Fink's 16:28 Pacific-8 record in the 1,650 with a 16:19. Mike Burton finished second behind Genter in both races. Wayne Pugh was third in the 1,650, completing a 1-2-3 sweep for UCLA. Earlier in the meet, Pugh had won the 400-yard individual medley, setting a meet record of 4:13.9.

Dave O'Malley won the 200-yard freestyle with a new meet record of 1:42.9, took seventh in the 500-yard freestyle, and anchored UCLA's 800-yard freestyle relay team (Genter, Bob Ramsey, Burton, O'Malley) that set another new meet record of 6:54.9.

Other individual stars for UCLA were Fray Heath, second in both the 50 and 100-yard freestyle races; Bob Ramsey, third in the 100-yard freestyle, fifth in the 200-yard freestyle, and a member of the 800-yard freestyle relay team; Chuch Dragicevich, third in the 100-yard butterfly and third in the 200-yard individual medley; Carl Thomas, third in the 400-yard individual medley, and seventh in the 200-yard individual medley; Steve Gentes, second in the 200-yard backstroke and fourth in the 100-yard backstroke; and diver Gordon Creed, second in both the one-meter and three-meter diving.

"We pointed for this meet the whole year," said UCLA coach Bob Horn. "Our 4-3 record in the dual meets meant nothing. This is the one we wanted and we came through with some unbelievable times."

It added up to UCLA's first Pacific-8 swimming championship.

At Salt Lake City, Utah, the Bruins (185 points) fol-

lowed Indiana (322), USC (235), and Stanford (206) in the NCAA Championships.

Burton (please see pages 224-225) earned three gold medals by winning the 500-yard freestyle, 200-yard butterfly, and 1,650-yard freestyle.

Genter was third in the 1,650-yard freestyle, fourth in both the 200-yard backstroke and 500-yard freestyle, and ninth in the 200-yard freestyle. Thomas finished sixth in the 200-yard individual medley and seventh in the 400-yard individual medley; Gentes was eleventh in the 100-yard backstroke; Dragicevich was ninth in the 100-yard butterfly; Steve Doyle was ninth in the 200-yard backstroke; Pugh finished eleventh in the 1,650-yard freestyle; and the Bruins stroked to fifth in the 400 yard-medley relay and sixth in the 400-yard freestyle relay.

UCLA's Mike Burton, winner of the 500-yard freestyle and the 200-yard butterfly in the first two nights of the 1970 NCAA Swimming Championships at the University of Utah, ended his collegiate career with a victory in the 1,650-yard freestyle. Burton, a National AAU Champion, NCAA Champion, Pan-American games Champion, and Olympic Champion, and holder of NCAA, American, and world records, received a standing ovation from the spectators for a minute and a half after the 1,650.



Undefeated through non-conference dual match competition, including wins over Tennessee (8-1), Arizona (7-2), Arizona State (8-1), and New Mexico (9-0), Coach Glenn Bossett's UCLA tennis team promised to be one of the nation's best at the NCAA Championships at Salt Lake City, Utah, June 15-20.

The team was led by Haroon Rahim, a sophomore from Pakistan and junior Jeff Borowiak. In March, Rahim won the Southern California Intercollegiate singles championship, stopping Tom Leonard of USC in the finals. He and Borowiak also won the doubles competition by defeating Fernando Gentile and Mike Machette of USC in the finals.

# REGENTS

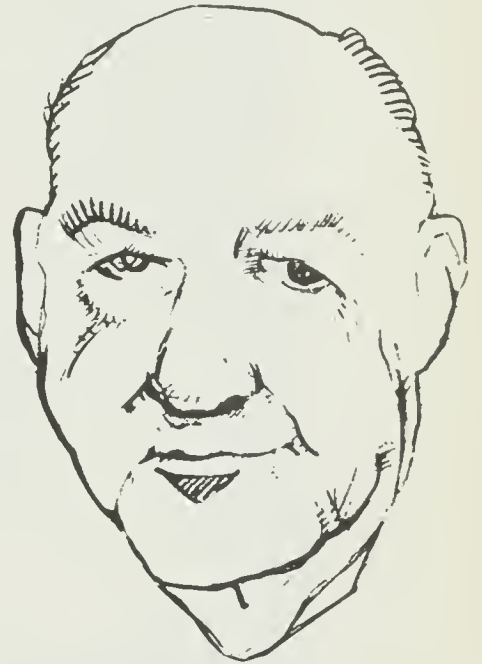
Once an anonymous body to whom you made your incidental fees payable each quarter, the Regents of the University of California have re-exerted their influence during the past year. People's Park, the vote to place decisions on the hiring and firing of faculty back in the hands of the Regents, and the Angela Davis controversy have all been part of the re-centralization of the University which this initiative of the Regents represents.

There have been those who criticized the policy-making and governing of a great university by a politically appointed board consisting of nineteen businessmen, four politicians and only one educator. As student disenchantment with the educational system reaches an all time high, the Regents must find more effective ways of administering their trust if the University is to continue to function as a creative and responsive institution.

In California, in 1970, the men who administer universities find themselves besieged. On one hand, the student activist desires to remake the university into an institution which he considers to be more relevant to the times and more able to cope with the needs of society as he sees them. On the other, the public and the state legislature are disturbed and alienated by the excesses of campus radicals and by the Uni-

versity's continued and emphatic support of the traditionally liberal academic concepts of free speech and free inquiry. They desire to exercise a more pervasive and restrictive control over the functions and attitudes of a community which they support financially while suffering the brunt of that community's criticism. At UCLA, Chancellor Charles E. Young is very much the man in the middle. Caught between the idealistic demands of youth and the financially and politically more conservative demands of the state legislature and the University's Board of Regents, Chancellor Young must seek to mediate some sort of course for the University which takes into consideration the essential role of an educational institution, as well as the imperatives of the conflict within which the University finds itself enmeshed. The difficult job of university administrator is made more difficult by the various societal and political demands and pressures now being directed at institutions of higher education. Groups like the Board of Regents, traditionally and constitutionally designed to protect the University of California from undue political pressure have found this an increasingly difficult role and as a result, the Chancellor's office is experiencing greater pressures from both sides of California's educational conflict.

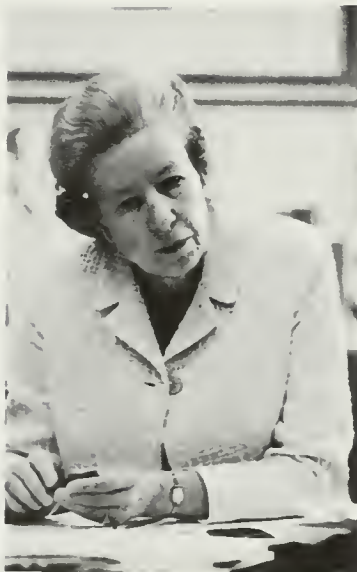
Chancellor Young feels that the hope of the University lies in a student activism which he believes has become less violent and more responsible; and that in response to this change, society at large and the governmental institutions that administer the people's desires and demands will come to view the educational process with a calmer, less political eye.

Chancellor Young is quick to admit that in California, in 1970, at UCLA, the university administrator must be, above all, an optimist, contending with the conflicts generated when individuals within a given system are being taught not what to think but simply to think.

# ROSEMARY PARK



Genuinely concerned with the turmoil and alienation which have become characteristic of the modern American university, Vice Chancellor Rosemary Park has set for her office the goal of re-defining its functions and usage. The Vice Chancellor's office has as its responsibilities students activities and services, and also acts as the liason between the administration and ASUCLA. Thus it occupies a crucial position in regard to student involvement with the university. Realizing that the average student spends only about fifteen per cent of his time in class, and that of the remainder a certain amount is likely to be spent in some sort of non-academic but school related activity, the Vice Chancellor is seeking ways in which the student and the administration can interact upon one another and the university.

The student striving to change his environment has traditionally met with the objection that he must "go through the proper channels;" yet he often finds that there are no such channels or, worse, that such channels as do exist are unresponsive or misdirecting. Vice Chancellor Park feels that a possible answer to the frustration which such experiences provoke is a twofold one of involving the student in the processes and decisions which affect him, and involving the university in those activities in which the student is involved. To this end, the Vice Chancellor is seeking to "recreate" her office along lines which will involve student inputs and participation in the creation of a process, rather than a plan, of action.

Vice Chancellor Park sees as the role of her office the positive creation of a process whereby the student community and the official university can become involved with one another to the enrichment of both. However, student participation at all levels is needed if this re-direction is to have the positive cast of creation, rather than being merely a negative reaction to student unrest.





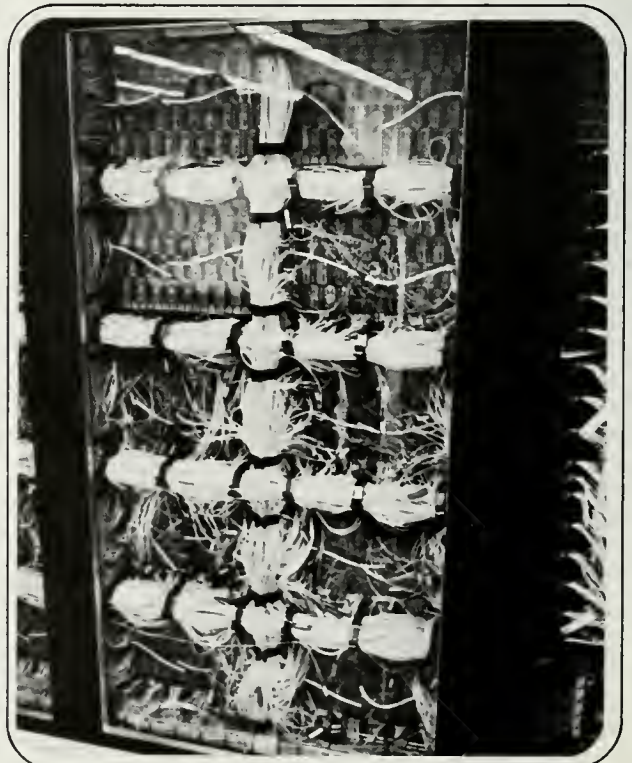


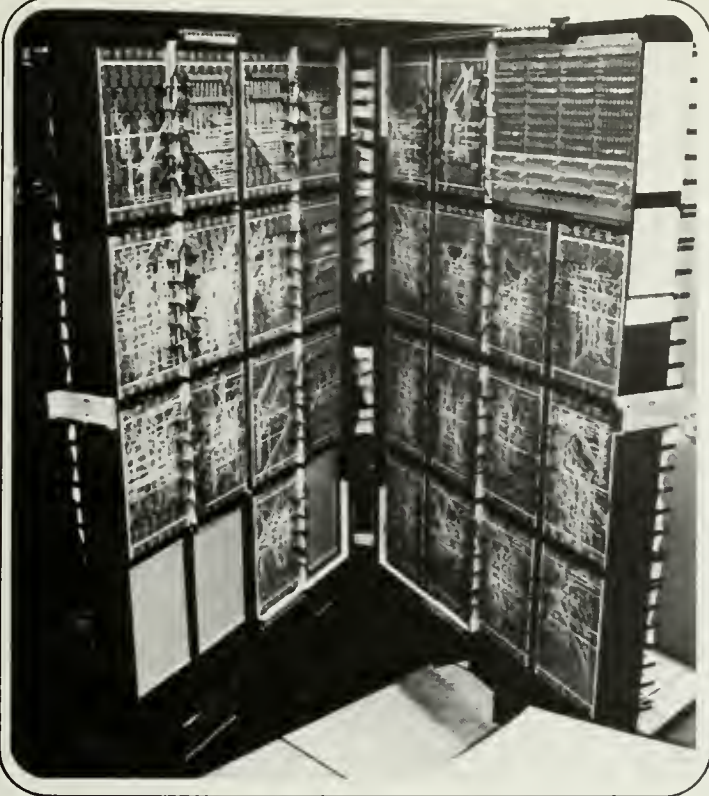

The fraternity system at UCLA has been in existence for almost 50 years. But it is only recently that the system has begun a serious self-examination. To be sure, much of the self-examination was prompted by criticism from university students and the challenge of the changing context in which they live. Membership in a fraternity neither excludes individuals from, nor binds them to this change. In trying to meet and answer the criticisms and satisfy their own needs for meaningful responses through personal experience, fraternities have begun to restructure their system.

Last November in affirmation of the policy of reexamination, a conclave was held which ultimately resulted in a radical revision of the IFC. The Fraternity Senate was created. It is designed to facilitate the organizational decision-making processes of the representatives of the fraternity system within a framework which allows for a greater amount of diversity among the different houses.

A fraternity which sustains the popular Hollywood stereotype, to which many students subscribe, no longer exists. This is not to say that certain individuals within houses would not fit such a stereotype; but one must recognize a stereotype as such, and realize that the vast majority of individuals do not fall within such a narrow concept. It is absurd to believe that members of houses do not engage in campus activities, as groups and as individuals, whether they be political, social, or cultural events. Fraternities offer varied activities for the student, from loud-band parties and sensitivity sessions to service projects and colloquiums. Some houses are revising their entire structure by going coeducational or in the direction of communal living. Moreover, they offer a companionship and brotherhood which is rarely found elsewhere on this campus.

The purpose here is not to defend the fraternity system or to ease the conscience through self-justification, so much as to properly introduce fraternities to the campus at large. The non-fraternity student should realize the value of investigation and examination before conclusions are drawn; conclusions based upon hearsay evidence lead to invalid and distorted results. The fraternity member must continue the process of self-examination, measuring not how much he has changed, but how far he has to go.

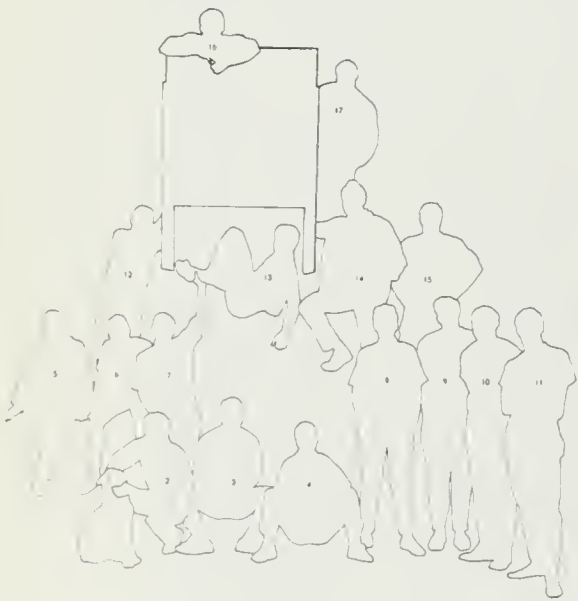

NOTICE the interior, decorated by 30 living, bottomless mirrors unendingly reflecting each other, refusing to live un-intensely.

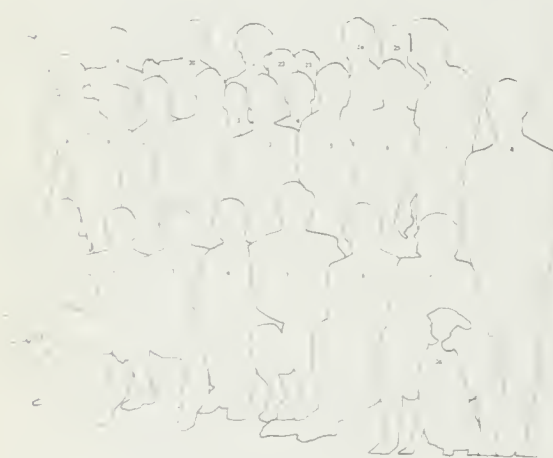
OBSERVE the newly padded halls – a playground for spontaneous games and sensitivity whose use is exclusively reserved for those who follow the first commandment – Know Thyself.

# alpha kappa psi

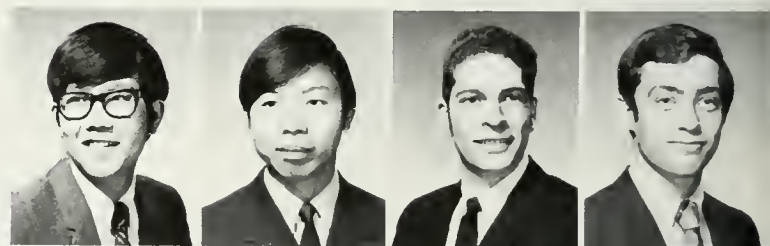

The spring quarter saw more informal parties and one formal occasion, the Military Ball, held in conjunction with the Air Force ROTC.

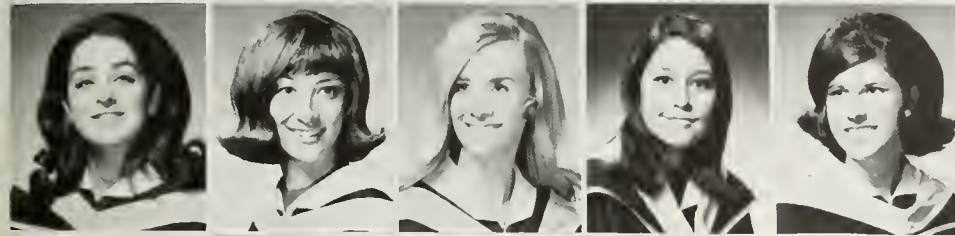
