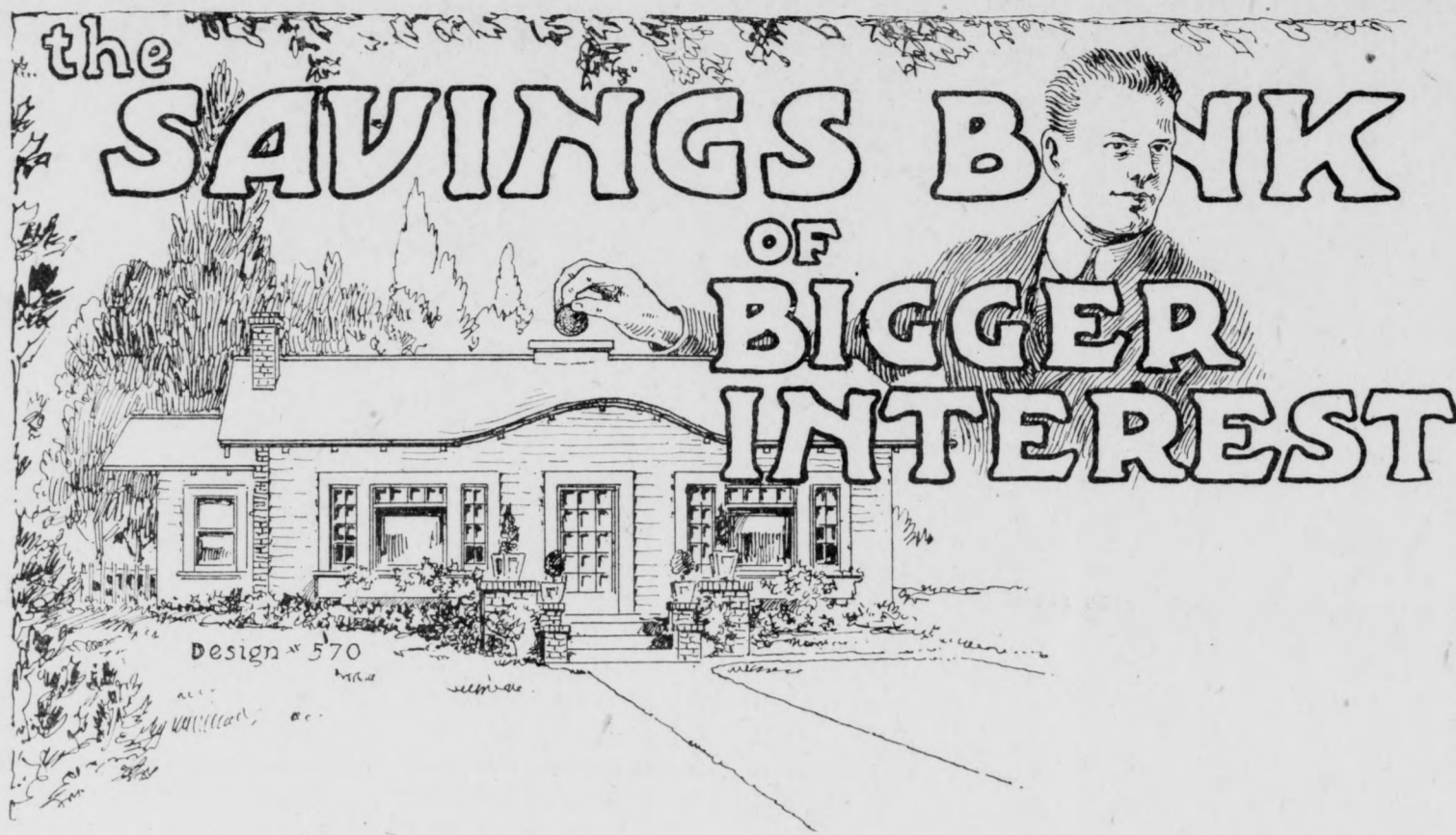

CALIFORNIA SHOWS THE WAY

The great state of Illinois begins this year a \$60,000,000 expansion of its good roads system, thus following California's lead. Among the notable highways to be paved as a whole or in part are the National road extending entirely across the state from the state line, seven miles west of Terre Haute, Ind., to East St. Louis; the Lincoln Old Trails Highway, extending across the northern part of the state as a part of the Lincoln Highway from ocean to ocean; the Dixie Highway from Chicago south to the Ohio River, and many other stretches of highway not named. In that state the counties crossed by the highways to be paved vote bonds for the amounts necessary to pay for the improvements, the sums to be returned in full as soon as the state fund of \$60,000,000 has been accumulated through taxation already provided for. So far no county has failed to vote the bonds.

AMERICAN SOLDIER AT OXFORD

STOCKTON, Cal., March 4.—Believed to be the first American soldier to take advantage of England's offer to allow American service men to attend the Oxford University, Sergeant Charles Bowen of this city is at present studying the entrance examinations to that university.

Bowen, who before enlisting in the army was a student of the University of Nevada, is acting first sergeant in his company with the 717th ordnance, at Tours, France.

The British government made it possible for American soldiers to attend the University at Oxford recently and Bowen is preparing to enter the world-famous institution.
