The pressure is highest on the Coast, but the western trough of low pressure has divided and formed two low areas, the southern remaining central in Arizona and the northern in Alberta and Saskatchewan.

For 48 hours forecast 5 p. m. Friday. Victoria and vicinity—To-night and Friday moderate or fresh southerly and westerly winds, generally fair, and not much change in temperature.

RICH FIND REPORTED. Prospector Reported to Have Discovered Valuable Deposits of Copper Ore.

A discovery of an immense copper gold deposit, which with development may eclipse the famous Britannia property, has just been made by Joseph Sauter, a prospector well known in Kootenay and Similkameen, who came down from Howe Sound last night.

According to statements made by Sauter, he has recently discovered and located two distinct ore bodies. One of these consists of a magnath deposit exposed in the form of a great bluff. This is three hundred feet in width, and one six-inch lense of ore in it has given assays of \$100 in copper, gold and silver.
