## THE KIND THAT CURES.

English Rheumatism, which will never cure on this side of the sea.

As but few Americans can know more of the elements of the English than those of "company manners," a few notes from a lady's experience, related in the New York Times, of their pleasing and polite conduct in their own homes may be of interest.

Take, for instance, table manners. They represent a different grade of civilization from our own. To English gentlemen would ever put his arms upon the table before a meal, and during the progress of a dinner would touch anything but his napkin until every one had been served, and a gentleman would as soon don a pinafore or bib as touch his "serviette" inside his shirt collar or apron if he crossed his shirt front.

A child who places his bread on the wrong side of his plate, breaks it off with both hands or litters it in monthlets is sharply reproved and watched until the habit is broken. No would be allowed to smear his mouth with mustard or arrange it as a sandwich, both of which offences may be witnessed any day at our first class hotels, committed by people otherwise well bred.

Children are promptly reprimanded if seen to cross their knives in raising soup to the mouth, and sampling tea or coffee with a spoon is something never done outside the servants' hall.

There is a rigid code for the manipulation of forks and spoons. It is a much disputed point in this country as to the transference of the fork to the right hand for any purpose, but in England it is almost uniformly the English method—that of never making such a transfer—and our American friends who are in the habit of doing so, the utmost precision is observed in leaving knife and fork upon the plate when the first course is finished. They must be laid to one side, the fork in the position in which it would be used—that is to say, with the tines down. It is a little hard to illustrate the careful attention paid by the English to table etiquette.

When knives or spoons are used, the shell is not picked off, much less is the egg turned in the shell. The top is cut by a blow from a sharp knife, and when one has done eating the shell is reversed in the egg so that it may be used for the second appearance.

Children are taught as a point of etiquette not to drink as little as possible while eating.

### THE WIFE'S IDIOT

**BUCKWHEAT CAKES.**

How to Make These Treacherous Yet Delightful Treats or Cakes.

Among all the winter's delicacies there is no cereal so toothsome to the masculine palate, so eagerly welcomed at the meal of the day, and none so ravenously dispatched as the buckwheat cakes.

You, my young housekeeper, do not despise the truth of this. But you are a novice in the art of cooking. You have only recently turned your attention to the chafing saucer or domestic fire to prepare the genuine article. The "remakes are sour," they "look queer," they "refuse to brown," they are as tough and thick as Indian-bread. Nevertheless, if your husband is a healthy, well regulated man, it is your bounden duty as a housewife to teach your "help" the preparation of this ideal of griddle cakes.

Opinions are diverse as to the wisdom of indulgence in the appetizing dish. There is one noted woman's contemplation. "The healthful, nutritious food; the cool and juicy raw fruit, that should Christianize our palate, and that good food, which is so healthy! But how we love the evil-satan's emulsion in the guise of the toothsome cereal! The griddle cakes, prepared in butter and loaded in sugar or manufactured syrup, that as the day wears on send up little clouds, crowd upon the disinclination to work all through our naughty being." But, since people with such views are at least fit the proper way to make them.

With the foregoing and other preliminary remarks, a writer in Good Housekeeping arrives at the important "how" to make the tempting treat.

Having previously soaked a cake of yeast, pour 4 cups of lukewarm water into a bowl or pitcher and add 2 1/2 cups of tepid water, a good handful of yellow cornmeal and the same of wheat-flour, a little salt, a little sugar, a little yeast, and a little butter. Beat well and put in a warm place to rise over night.

Use is sufficient for a family of six. Omit the cornmeal and wheat flour if preferred. Their addition makes the cakes just what you want. Measure your flour into a small bowlful of the batter for the next evening's "rising."

When ready to bake, add to the batter in the pitcher one or two tablespoons of New Orleans mustard or sweet milk, to make the cakes an inviting brown. To a teaspoon of tepid water add an even half teaspoon of bicarbonate of soda, and pour into the mixture a little at a time. It may be necessary to use but parts of the water and soda.
