1. Transmitted herewith are Plant Cover Sheets for 20 machines dispersed from the Mizuru Naval Arsenal.
2. Presence of these machines was first revealed to the Nara Branch of the Finance Ministry by the Osaka Branch in March, 1947.
3. Nara Branch of the Finance Ministry wrote to the Maizuru Naval Arsenal in April, 1947, requesting funds and equipment for maintaining the machines. There has been no answer.
4. In October 1947, the Osaka Branch of the Finance Ministry notified the Nara Branch that the Osaka Branch would assume responsibility for maintenance of the equipment.
4. This headquarters was first informed of the presence of the equipment through the 1st Indorsement, above.
6. One electric motor, listed as 22-24(D) 15 (Inventory Sheet attached as Incl 3) was removed some time in 1946 to the Dainichi-Jukogyo K.K. in Osaka City.
7. Showa Kiko K.K. has spent about ¥25,000 in maintaining this machinery, and has repeatedly asked the Mizuru Naval Arsenal for reimbursement, but received no answer.
8. Arc welder (22-24(D)-21) was received by Osaka Govt RR Bureau from Maizuru Naval Arsenal, and was sent by them to the Nara Yards after repeated requests to the Kyoto Tax Office for information on the status of the machine remained unanswered.
9. Nara Branch of Finance Ministry has been ordered to mark and maintain all 20 machines.
