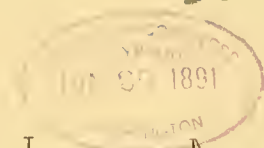

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## \* PERTLE SPRINGS \*

There is no summer resort in Missouri so beautiful, healthy and delightful in its summer associations as these springs. 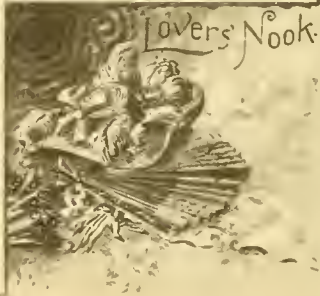

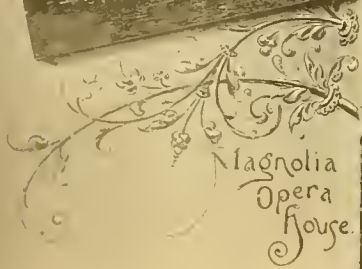
