ECLIPSES.

There will this year be neither eclipses of the moon nor of the sun, visible at Quebec. There will however, on the 5th May, be a remarkable passage of Mercury over the disk of the Sun, visible at Quebec from sun rise to about eleven o'clock in the morning.

MOON'S RISING AND SETTING.

At four days old it sets at, and shines till, about 10 at night. 5 - about - 11 6 - about - 12 7 at near 1 in the morning.		15, at full, it rises about 6 in the evening. 16 - at $\frac{1}{4}$ after - 7 17 - at $\frac{1}{2}$ after - 8 18 - about - 10 19 - about - 11 20 - about - 12
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Of the Changes of the Moon.

Many persons, understanding that the mean time between one new Moon and another is 29 days, 12 hours, 44 minutes and a fraction, imagine that, to find the full or quarters of the Moon, they have only to add a half or fourth part of that time; and when they do not find the changes marked in the Calendar to correspond with this method, they impute it to mistake in the calculation of these changes. It is therefore, necessary to put them in mind, that the great inequality of the Moon's motions renders the above rule extremely inaccurate, so that nineteen times in twenty, it must fail in giving the true conjunction or change.

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ECLIPSES.

Will shew a light every evening from sunset to sunrise, between the first of April and the thirty-first of Decr. inclusive.

The following Notice was published by the 'Trinity House, relating to this Light House :—

NOTICE to MARINERS.

That a Light House has been erected on **POINTE DES MONTS**, (or Cape Monts Pelés) on the north side of the River St. Lawrence, nearly opposite to Cap Chat, the Lantern standing one hundred feet above the water.

The Light House lays with the outermost part of **CARIBOU POINT**, N. 52° . East and S. 52° . West, by compass, and it can be seen over that point and to the Eastward of it.

Ships approaching the light from the Eastward, as they draw towards Caribou Point must bring it to bear W. by S.; they will then be in a good fair way, and if necessary they can near the land by their Lead.

After passing Caribou Point, and as they draw towards the Light House, they must come no nearer than 12 fathoms water to avoid two ledges of rocks, one of which lays E.S.E. from the Light, with only 12 feet water on it ; the other lays S. W. from the Light, and E. S. E. from the Western extremity of Pointe des Monts, with 16 feet water on it ; but these rocks do not lay farther from the shore than half a mile at low water.

The Light House lays with the western extremity of Pointe des Monts N. 64° . East and S. 64° . West, and distant about one mile ; and when ships are to the Westward of the Point; the Light

House is in one with the outermost Rocks off the Point; and in the day time it forms a bold distinct Land Mark; and on this line of bearing ships are in the best possible fair way for the general purposes of Navigation, whether bound up or down.

For any particular purposes of Navigation, Ships may safely stand to the Northward, until the Light bears E. by N. ; they will then be drawing near the North Land; and when it bears E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. it is time to tack; for when it bears East it will shut in with the High Land and cannot be seen to the *Southward* of *East*, and then they will be only one mile from the Land, and if they are off *Godbut* river, *Pointe des Monts* will bear from them E. by S. two leagues distant.

When ships are off *Saint Nicolas Harbor*, and the light bearing E. by N. they are in a good fair way from the North Land. The S. E. spitt of *Manicouagan* great Shoal, the Ship and the Light House are then all in one line of bearing.

LIGHT HOUSE on S. W. Point of ANTICOSTI.

Keeper—Lt. Harvey, h. p. Royal Navy.

A Light-House having been erected on the South West point of the Island of Anticosti, Notice is hereby given that a Grand Revolving Light, on the Argand principle, was shewn thereon for the first time, on the 25th of August 1831—and that the said Light will continue to be shewn every night from Sun-set to Sun rise, from the 25th day of March to the last day of December in each year.

When Ships are to the eastward of the Light-House, they may safely stand towards the Island until it bears N. N. W. by Compass—they will then be in a good fair way—and if they wish to make more free with the land they can do so by their lead. The land trends from the Light-House S. E. by S. or nearly so.

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PILOTAGE REGULATIONS.

When Ships are to the Westward of the Light-House, they may safely stand towards the Island until the Light bears S. S. E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., they will then be in a good fair way from the Land, and as before mentioned they can make more free by their lead.

Nearly East and West with the Light House, and about three-fourths of a mile from it, is the outermost part of a *Reef of Rocks*, which joins the S. W. point. These are dry at low water and are the only dangers near the Light-House; therefore a berth of a mile from the point is a good fair way.

Sixteen leagues to the eastward of the Light-House, at Shallop Creek, and sixteen leagues to the westward of the Light-House, at Grand Bay, and at the Light-House itself are Depôts of provisions for the use of Mariners in distress or other ship-wrecked persons.

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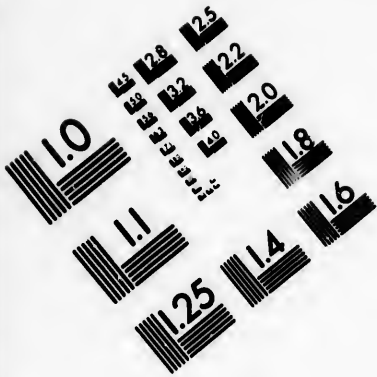
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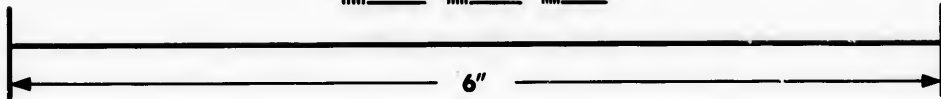
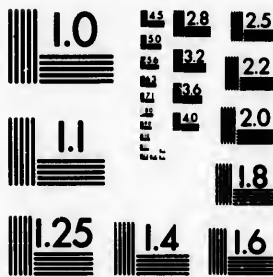

These several duties are payable under the acts of the Imperial Parliament of 4, Geo. 3, c. 15, sec. 1; 6 Geo. 3. c. 52, sec. 4 14 Geo. 3d, cap. 88, sec. 1; 3d Geo. 4, cap. 119, sec. 8 6. Geo. 4 cap. 114, sec. 9; 7 Geo. 4, cap. 48, sec. 44, and 7 & 8: Geo 4. cap 56, sec. 29, and under the acts of the Provincial Legislature of 33 Geo. 3, cap. 8, 35 Geo. 3d, cap. 9, 41 Geo. 3d, cap. 14, 53 Geo. 3, cap. 11, amended by 53 Geo. 3, cap. 2, and 55 Geo. 3, cap. 3, rendered permanent by 3 Geo. 4, cap. 119.

(1) This further duty is only charged with its amount, if and shall exceed the amount of the previous duties, in which case the excess is payable, 16 Geo. 4, cap. 114, sec. 11, but this is not likely to occur except with every high priced articles, it may therefore be considered as merely domfnal.

(2) This further duty will in every case exceed the previous duty, the excess will therefore be charged; the amount payable cannot however shewn by Table, as it will vary in every case according to the value of the article.

(3) Molasses if imported in a vessel not belonging to the U. Kingdom or to Quebec, the duty will be 7d stg, instead of 4d.

(4) This duty is drawn back if the half be shipped for the use of the fisheries in the lower parts of the Province.

(6) Upon such of these goods as are liable to the Provincial duty of 2½ per cent, that duty is payable under the Provincial law, but its amount is deducted from the payment made under the 6 Geo. 4, cap. 114.

(7) A tonnage duty of 4s sterling, per tun from the ships, and 10 per cent upon the amount of duties on the goods imported is chargeable by order in Council, under certain conditions which present only apply to the ships of the United States.

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
