



---

**THIRD.**—The purchasers to give in their names and places of abode, and (if required) to pay down immediately a deposit of £25. per cent. in part payment of the purchase-money.


**FOURTH.**—The lots to be absolutely cleared away, with all faults and errors of description, at the purchaser's expense, within **ONE DAY** after the sale.
