We have ordered liberal quantities from our usual careful growers and hope to be able to fill orders for Dutch and French stock by the middle of September and other bulbs in their season.

All orders received for stock not actually in hand are booked subject to arrival of our full supply, and owing to the constantly increasing cost of production, freights and other expenses, we are compelled to reserve the right to advance prices without notice.

SHIPPING

By our careful and thorough system of packing it is customary for our customers to receive their orders from us in perfect condition, but all shipments are made at purchaser's risk, our responsibility ceasing after we deliver the goods in good order to the transportation company.

PARCEL POST.—We will be pleased to send such items as can be mailed by Parcel Post if customers will remit for postage. **We do not deliver any goods free at Wholesale Prices.**

PRICES.—This list cancels all previous offers. The prices quoted in this list are net, and subject to no discounts. Articles offered in our Retail Catalogue and not offered in this list will be supplied to florists at retail prices less the following discounts, viz.

Vegetable and Flower Seeds $33\frac{1}{2}\%$. Small Tools and Insecticides 10% . Small Fruits 20% . All other plants not offered in this list $33\frac{1}{2}\%$.

No order for **plants or bulbs** amounting to less than \$1.00 will be filled and packed at wholesale prices. Orders received from the trade for Plants or Bulbs amounting to less than \$1.00 will be charged for at retail prices, less 10 per cent.

We would suggest the use of Dutch Miniature Hyacinths and Freesias to take their place.

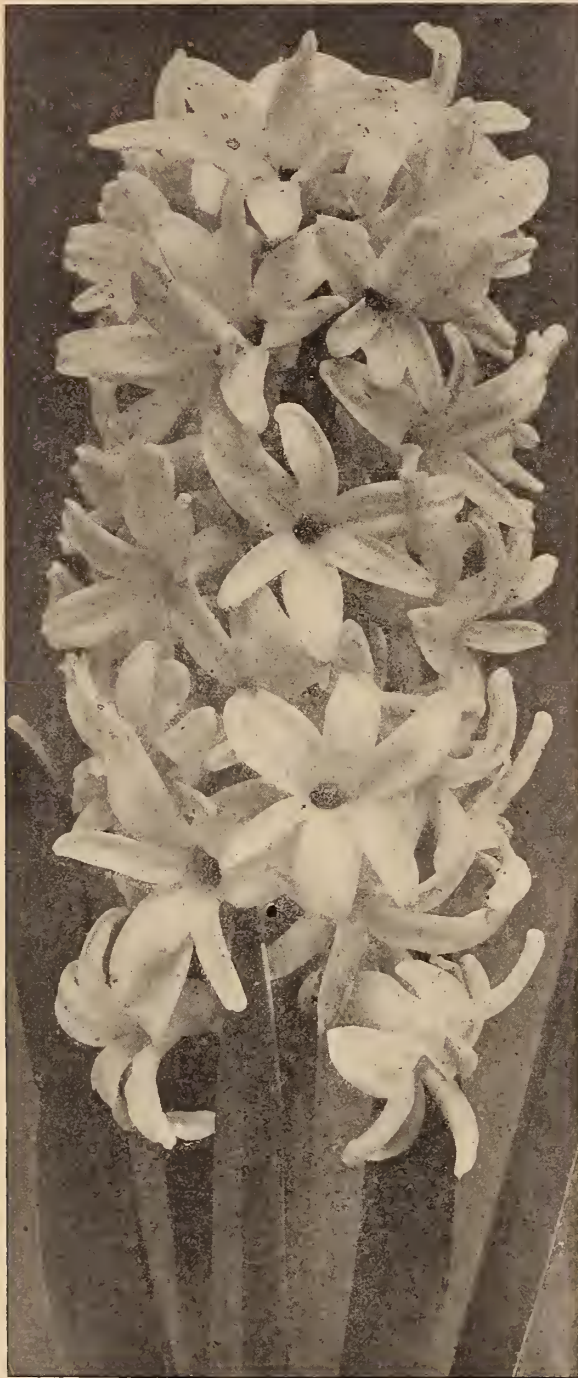
