Dept will pouch soonest, for info Mission, Foreign Mil Assistance coordinating Committee Document D-5/3 approved Sept 8, 1950, subj: B IC precedures and policies under Sec 408 (E) of PL 329 as amended. PL 329 is Fin Mil Assistance Act of 1949 which was amended by PL 621 of 1950.

Sec 408 (E), which provides for reimbursable mil assistance eligible nations, is obviously inapplicable some govts and is by text made applicable some nations, such as Nat, GTI and most OAR. Sec is applicable certain other nations found by Dept to be in gen area of China; and law requires determination applicability of Sec to still others. Unless mission has been or is hereafter informed by Dept will applicability of sec includes nation to govt of which accredited, applicability not to be assumed. Furthermore, even if nation eligible basis legal prerequisites, reimbursable aid may be precluded by supply requirements resulting present international situation.

Subj FMACC Document may be used by mission as basis answering inquiries informally or as basis eliminating erroneous or unjustified conclusions mission perceives being reached by govts to which accredited. Normal representations by govts should be, of course, brought to attention.

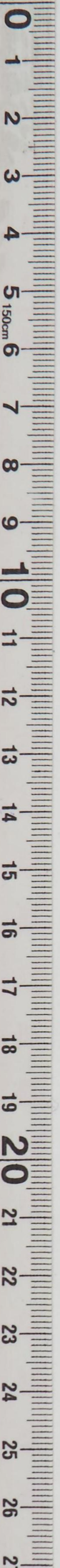

Subj: Transfer of Items to Meet Korean Needs

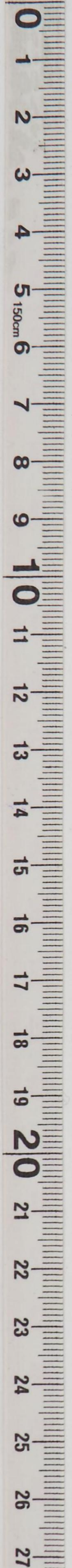
1. Msg W 83626, 2 Jun 50, directed certain items be packed and held ready for immediate shipment to Indo China and Indonesia. Instructions were contained ref serviceability standards on equipment to be furnished. DA was to be informed in total quantities of items which could be supplied.
2. Msg W 84186, 20 Jun 50, was follow-up on Msg W 83626 and requested advice on actual quantities frozen to meet requirement.
3. Upon direction of CINCFE, by msg EX 35800 GS, 24 Jun 50, 8th Army replied direct to DA listing items actually frozen and being held for shipment to Indo China and Indonesia.
4. Concerning above no instructions have been received to date concerning release of these items so that CINCFE can use same to apply against current Korean requirements. Inst Msg to DA requests advice as to whether items reported available and frozen for MDAF requirements can be committed to meet immediate Korean needs. DA is requested to advise at once.

MEMO FOR RECORD:

1. D/A msg W 83626, 2 June 50 advises CINCFE to pack and make ready for immediate shipment to Indo China and Indonesia certain military items which had previously been determined to be available from 8th Army stocks. Instructions contained in this msg prohibit actual shipment of the items until such time as shipping instructions were furnished from D/A.

2. Msg W 84307, 22 June 50 to CINCFE and other addressees directs immediate shipment of 21,000 carbines, 100 shotguns and 60,000 shotgun shells to Indonesia. All information needed to make this shipment such as requisition numbers, shipping designators, marking, etc. are contained therein. Instructions are also contained to the effect that at such time as cargo is outloaded, interested individuals will be informed of the name of ship, time of departure, and ETA of the shipment.

3. Since all of the items mentioned in W 84307 (Para 2 above) will be supplied from 8th Army stocks, instant msg to CG 8th Army directs immediate shipment and furnishes instructions concerning same. In the event shipment of items cannot be made in the total quantity requested, 8th Army is directed to notify CINCFE immediately of the shortages and reasons thereof.

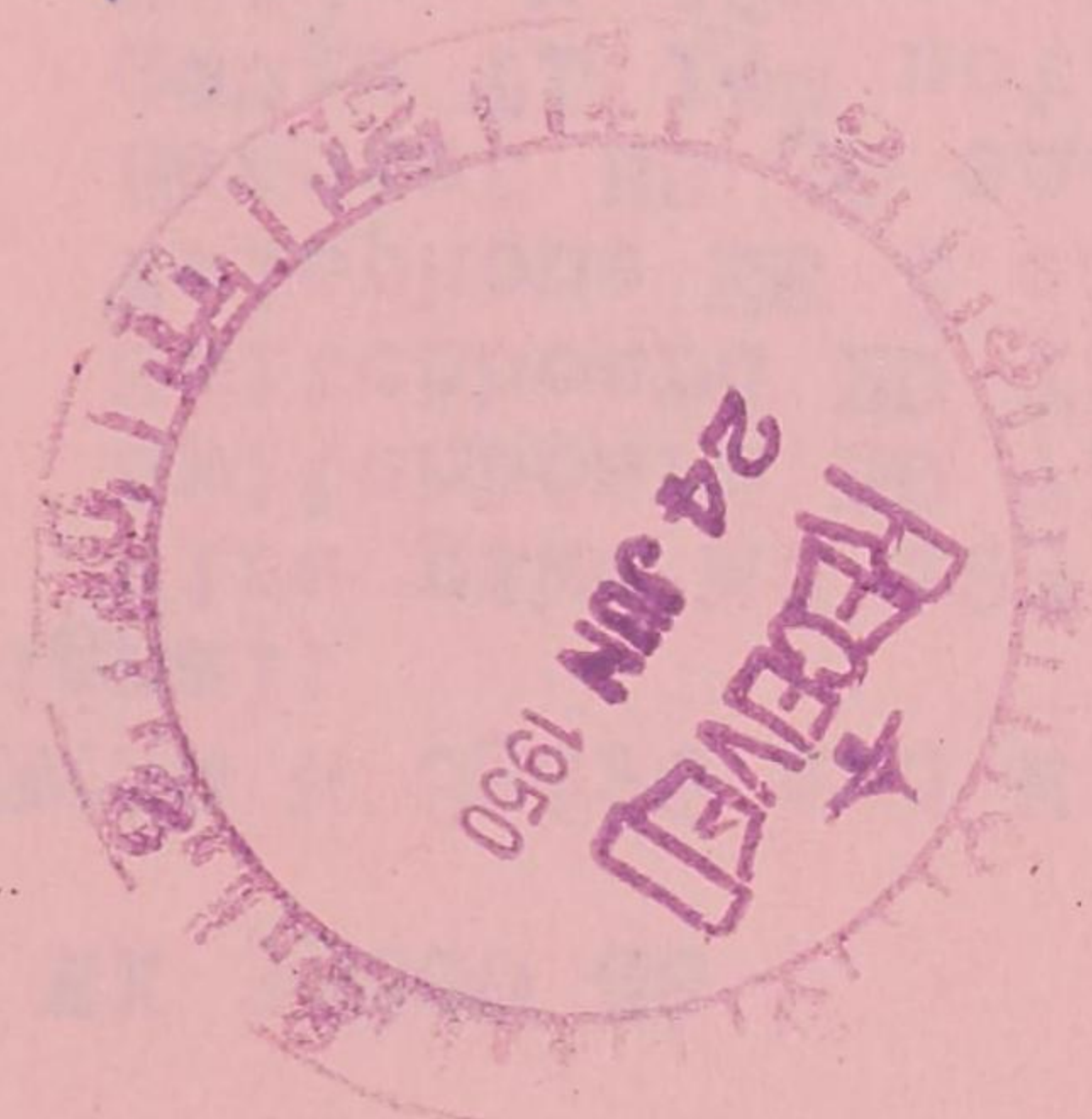

MEMO FOR RECORD:

1. By radio W 83626, 2 June 50, DA ordered various items to be packed and held ready for shipment on MDAP program.
2. Since most of items concerned were to be delivered by 8th Army, CINCFE ordered 8th Army to furnish all items and authorized replacements to come from MARBO and RYCOM.
3. Serviceability standards set by DA made it questionable whether or not 8th Army could furnish all items that had been earmarked for shipment. Advice concerning condition, cost of repair and rehabilitation and ability to furnish spare parts was requested by CINCFE message CX 56508, 6 June 50, so that DA message could be answered.
4. To date no reply has been received from 8th Army and DA has queried CINCFE when reply may be expected.
5. Since this information must be obtained from 8th Army for transmission to DA, 8th Army has been requested to answer DA direct by instant message, copy of which is to be forwarded to G-4, GHQ.

1. At the request of Dept of Army, a teleconference was held between GHQ and Dept of Army at 0800, 23 May 50 on the subject of msg W 82852, 12 May 50 (Tab A). Present at GHQ were representatives of G-4, the GHQ Technical Services, Eighth Army G-4, and Eighth Army Ord and Sig Sections. Representatives of G-4, Ord, Sig, QM, and FMA BR were present at Dept of Army level.

2. The teleconference was requested by D/A to discuss the availability of Army items from FEC excess stocks to meet commitments of MDAP and to explore the possibility of procurement of some non-military items from the Japanese economy for the Mutual Defense Assistance Program.

3. Based on information furnished by GHQ as to the quantitative availability of a large portion of the items requested in W 82852 (Tab A), Dept of Army furnished a partial breakdown of items and quantities to be shipped and named the recipient foreign countries as Phillipines, Korea, Indonesia, and Indo-China. Necessary information regarding shipping, standards of serviceability and funding was also furnished by Dept of Army.

4. The possibility of procuring from the Japanese economy, those non-military items required but not available from FEC excess stocks, was discussed briefly. Dept of Army was informed that procurement of such items could be integrated into present industrial program with delivery of some items being made within 60 to 90 days of notification of quantities desired and furnishing of specifications.

5. Dept of Army informed GHQ that after evaluation of information furnished, further instructions would be forwarded by radio message.

6. A copy of the complete teleconference is attached as Tab B for your information.

1. By msg W 82852, 12 May 50, to CINCFE, DA requested info as to whether certain quantities of specified Ord, Sig, Engr and QM items could be furnished from stocks excess to FEC operating requirements through FY 1953. Chief of Staff

1. Reference C/S query to G-4 on D/A radio W/82852, 12 May 50 (TAB A), "When can we start making reports? Do we have the information in GHQ or must we obtain from major commands?" the following information is furnished:

a. Part of the information now desired by D/A has already been furnished in answer to D/A previous request. See W 81513, 6 April 50 (TAB B) and CX 55945, 21 April 50 (TAB C) attached. Current availability of items listed in CX 55945 (TAB C) will be confirmed and D/A notified within a day or two.

b. Since GHQ does not maintain central stock records on all items of supply, it will be necessary to secure the requested information from major commands. Even though over-all availability within FEC is known on some of the items, lack of knowledge on serviceability of items and repair capabilities of commands makes it necessary to query major commands for information desired by D/A.

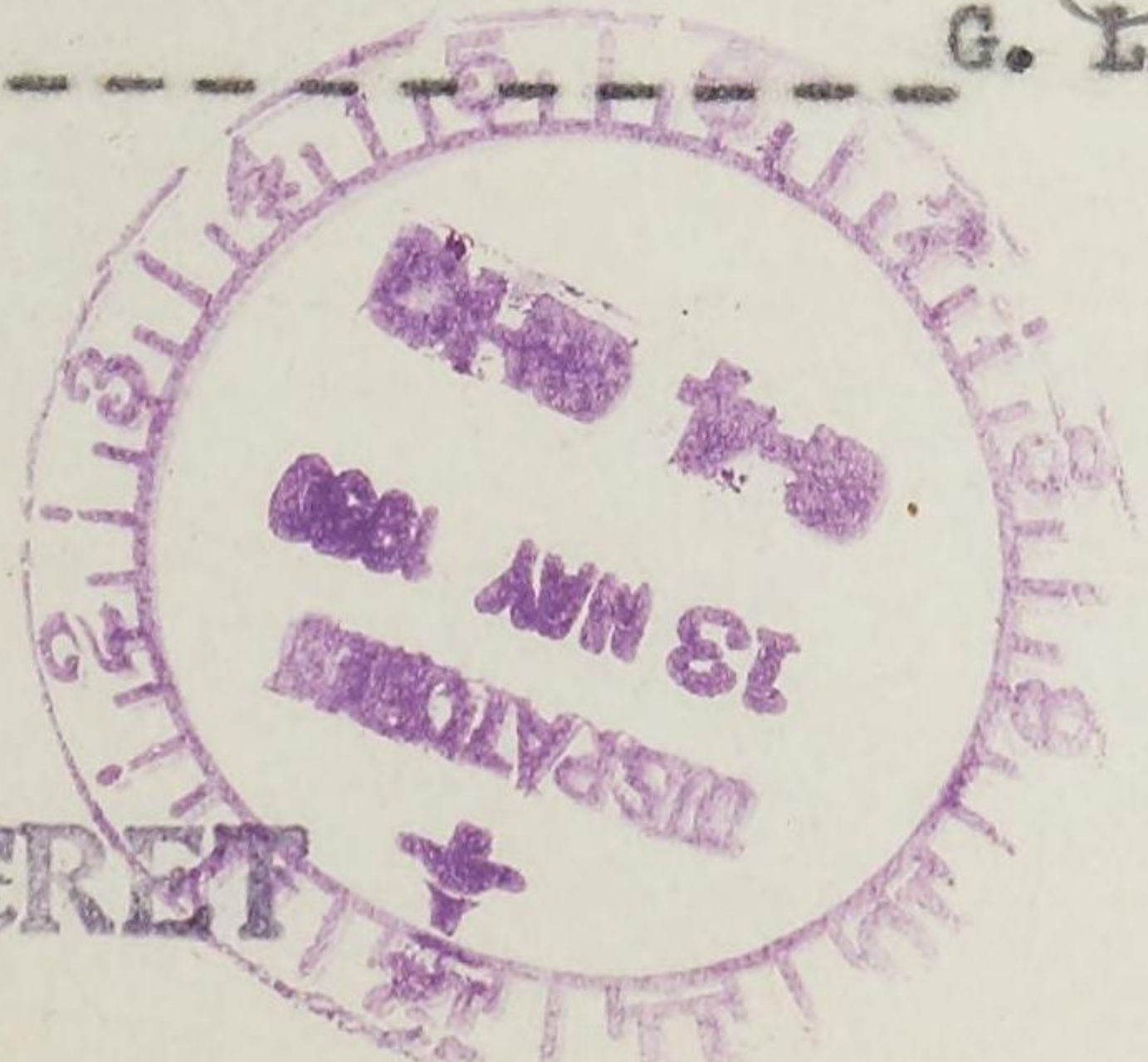
c. Based on past experience in correlating information of the type requested, a partial report on availability of some items (From Eighth Army) in addition to those previously reported (TAB C - availability of which will be confirmed) will require approximately one week. Additional information from other major commands will require a longer time.

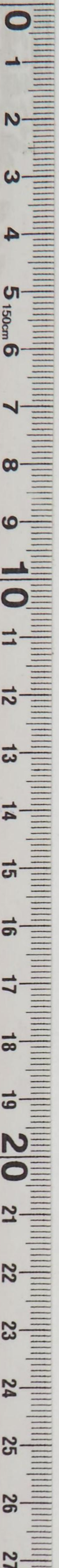

MEMO FOR RECORD:

1. DA msg W 81513, 6 Apr 50, requested information as to the availability of certain Sig, Ord and QM items for supply to a foreign aid program. As directed by this message, action was passed to CG Eighth Army.

2. Eighth Army radio E 35794 GS, 19 Apr 50, advised that all of the Sig items and part of the Ordnance supplies were available, but that none of the QM items could be furnished. The particular concern was the pronouncement that 20,000 carbines could be furnished after 215 days from order time. This matter was discussed with G-3 and JSPOG and the decision was to advise the DA that the 30 cal carbines and 45 cal submachine guns are available but are a part of the reserve being held under the theater emergency plan. In addition, this message advises DA of the other items which are available and indicates the length of time required by this hqs to supply serviceable items.
