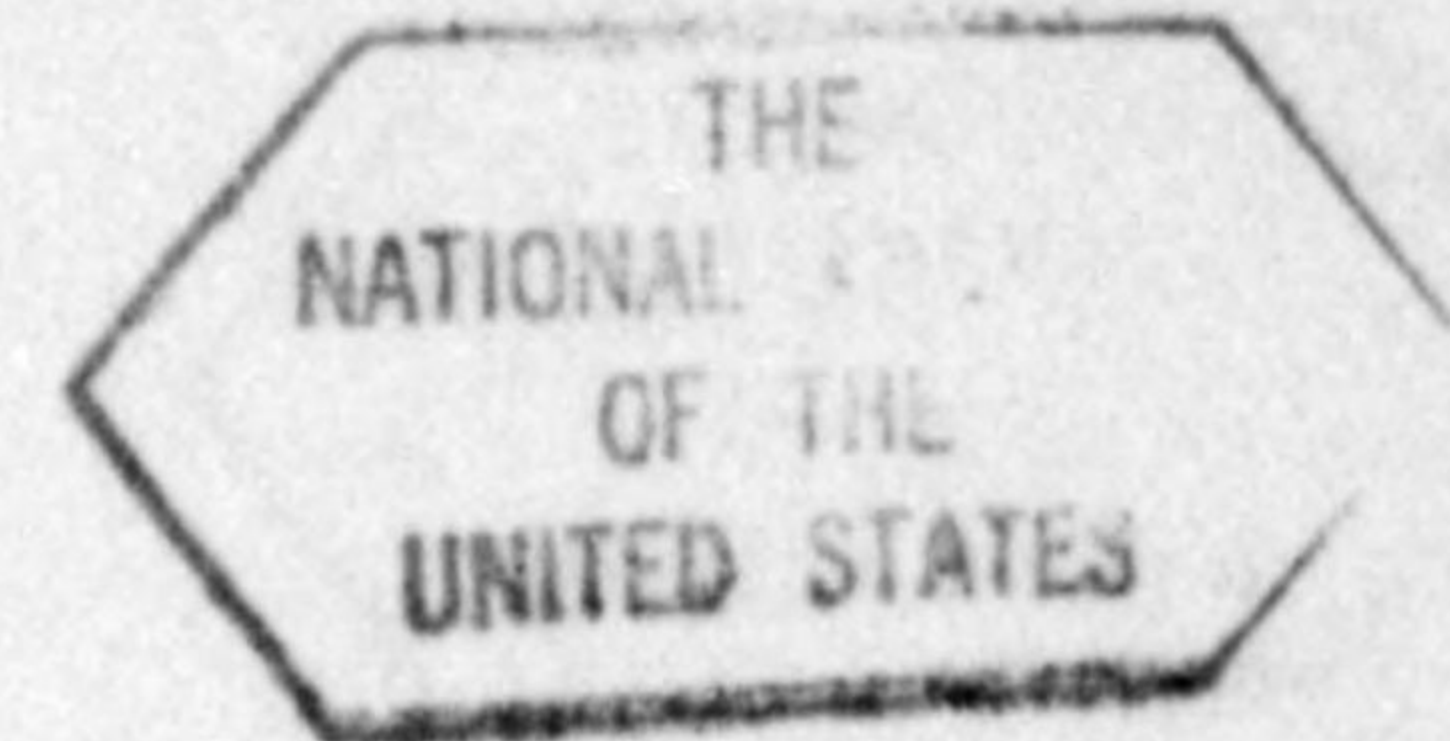

Dec. 19: Minamiazumi-gun, Dec. 20: Kitaazumi-gun

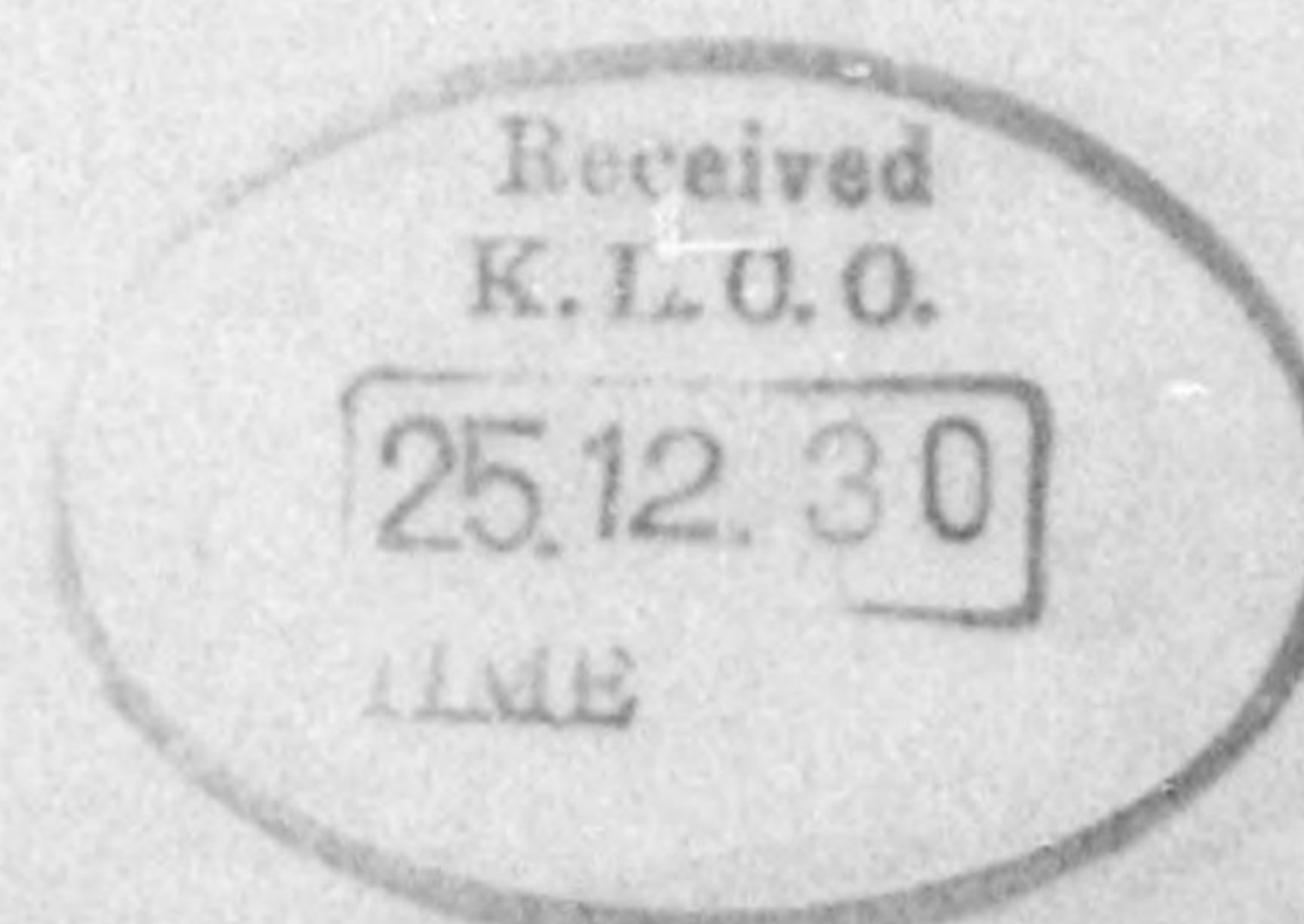
Dec. 25: Nishichikuma-gun.

(b) Holding of Conference of Farmers' Representatives Opposing to the Agricultural Commission Law.

This conference was held on Dec. 13 jointly sponsored by the Three Prefectures' Council of Agricultural Extension Agents, Land Commissioners and Agricultural Adjustment Commissioners, attended by these officials of 3 prefectures and presidents and vice-presidents of county branches of the said Council. They decided as follows:-

"We oppose to the Agricultural Commission Law, because the unification of 3 differently characterized commissions would bring a huge obstacle against the democratization and development of rural district, the said Law being only a series of elegant words based on an untrustworthy desk plan. Thus the land reform and agricultural extension works would be given a heavy blow by the Law."

The delegates petitioned the Agriculture Forestry Ministry, House of Councillors and House of Commons strongly objecting to the said Law as the voice of farmers in Nagano Prefecture.

(c) Holding of specialized committee-men's meeting of the Prefectural agricultural improvement committee.

It was held at the Agricultural Training Institute, Nagano city, on Dec. 13 to have consultations on the present status and future of the said Institute and Agricultural Experiment Station.

(d) Holding of Prefectural Agricultural Improvement Committee

It was held on Dec. 14 at Nagano city, where the reports were made on the change of the extension agents, qualifying test of the agents for 1950 fiscal year and the results of the Areal Agricultural Extension Agents' Consultative Conference. Deliberations were had on the more development of the agricultural extension works and training of the home demonstration agents.



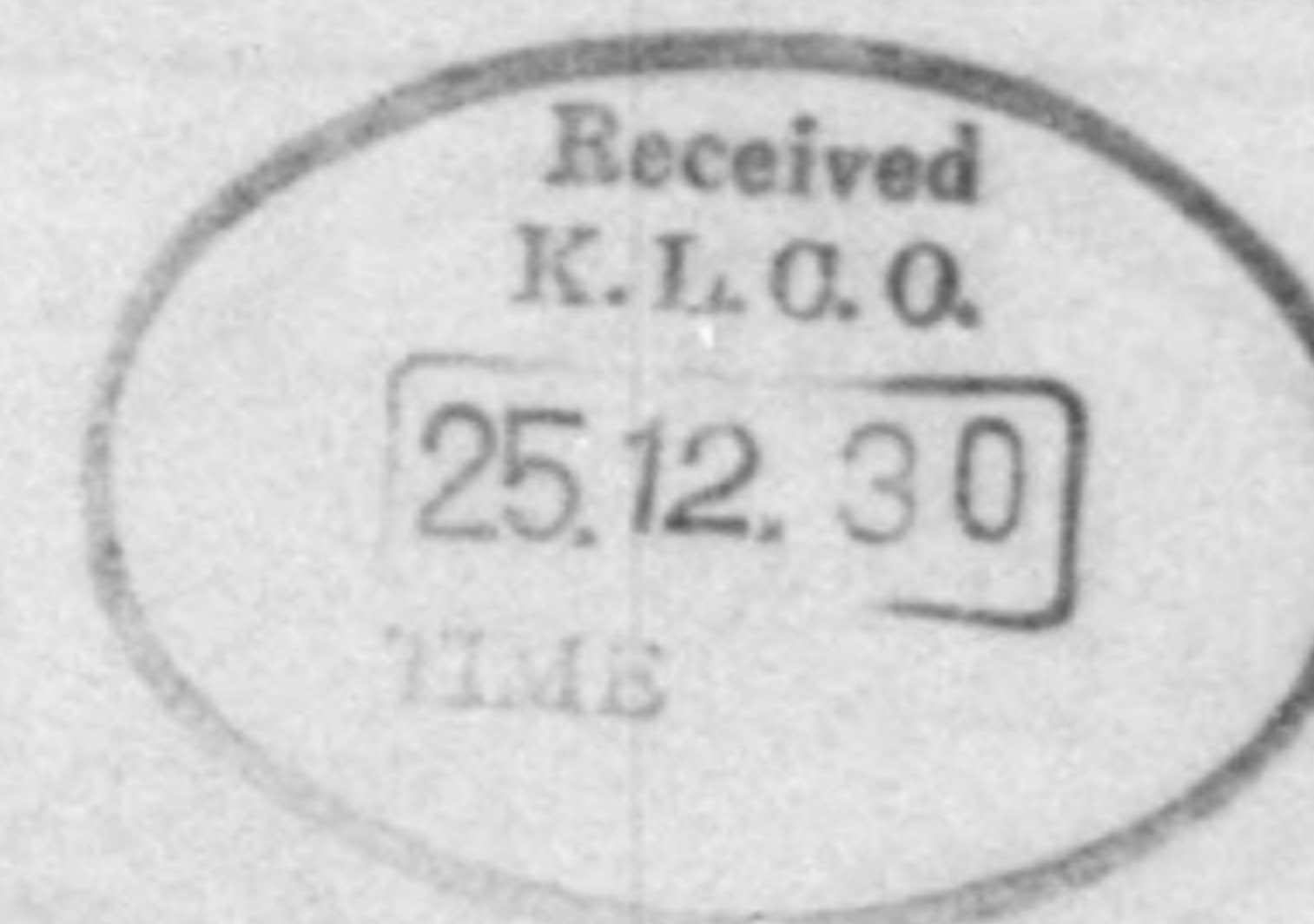

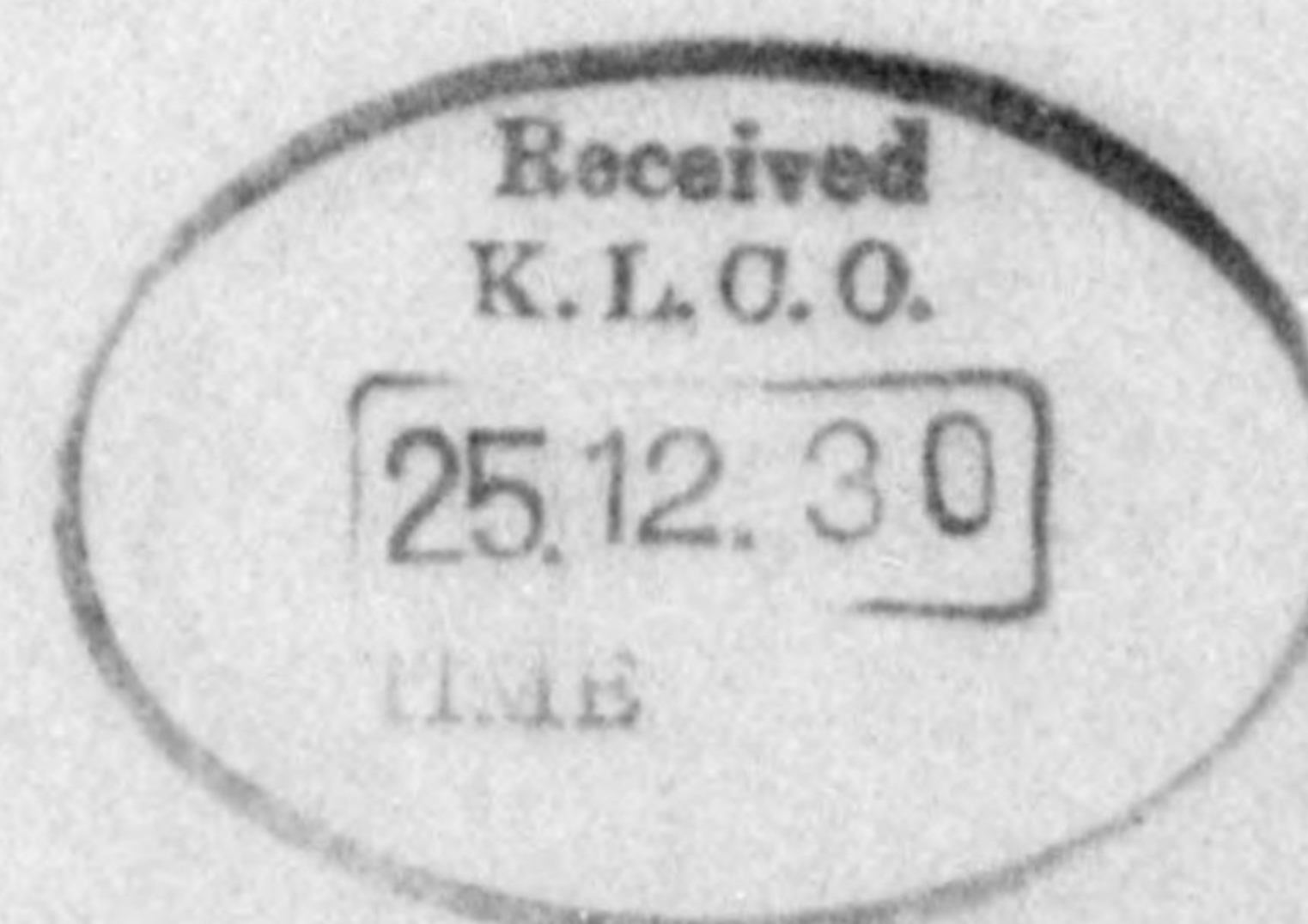
3. Points of petition:

As the land owner is absent, the petitioner wants
to buy it.

4. Results of survey:

a. The land was bought by the government as of
Dec. 2, 1948.

b. The petitioner was disqualified for the buyer
of the land as his land is only 6 se 8 bu. So
the land, after being bought by the government,
was sold to Unji Yamada, cultivator of land,
as of July 2, 1949, on the basis of Art.23,
Owner Farmer Establishment Special Measures Law
(exchange of ownership).




- c. It is true that the petitioner has been cultivating this land for last 20 years as stated in the petition.

5. Action taken:

The measure of the land commission of the village was cancelled on the ground of violation and unjustifiability of some extent regarding the handling of Art. 23, of the said Law. The land was decided to be rented to the petitioner as the national land.

No. of cases: 279

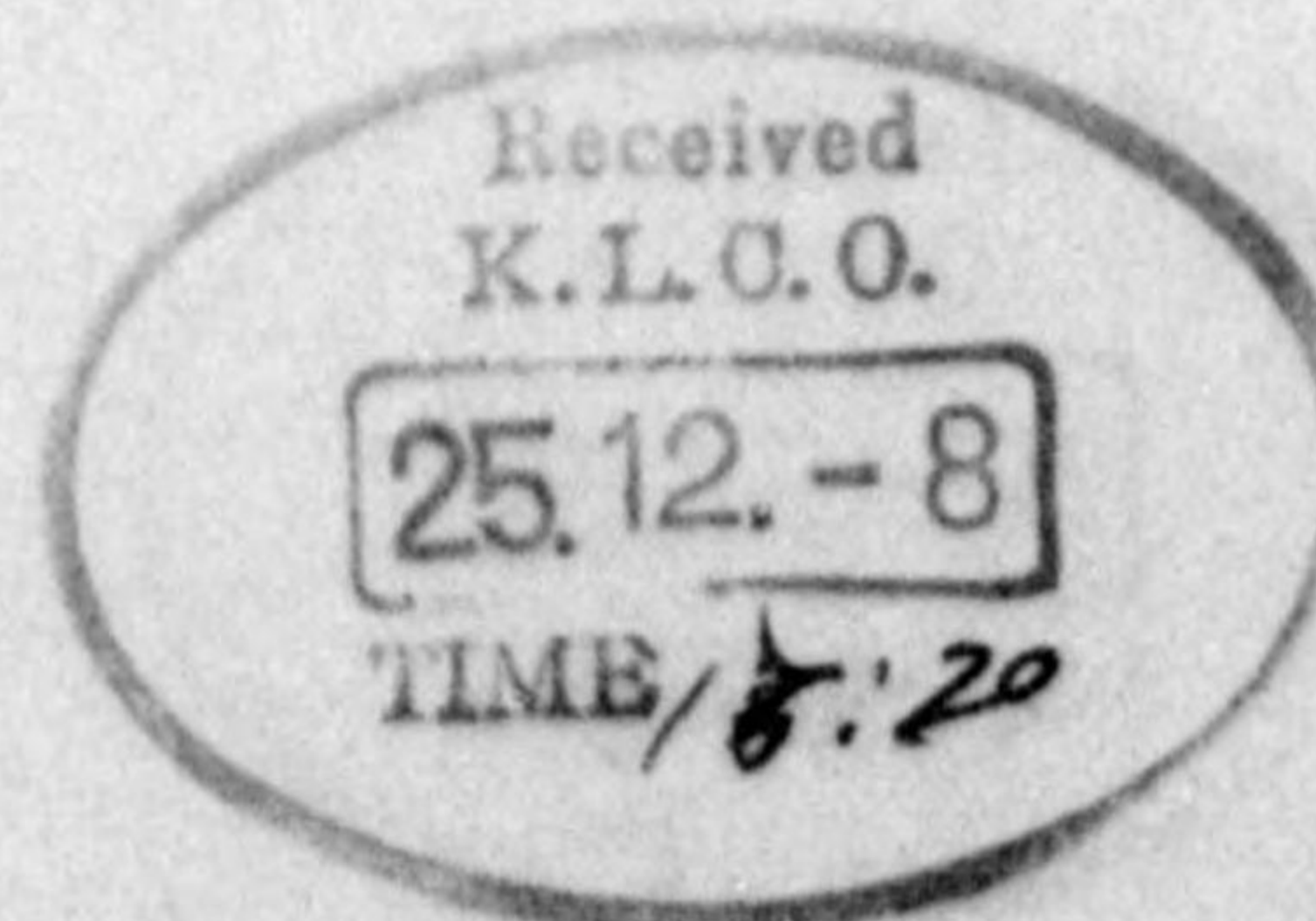

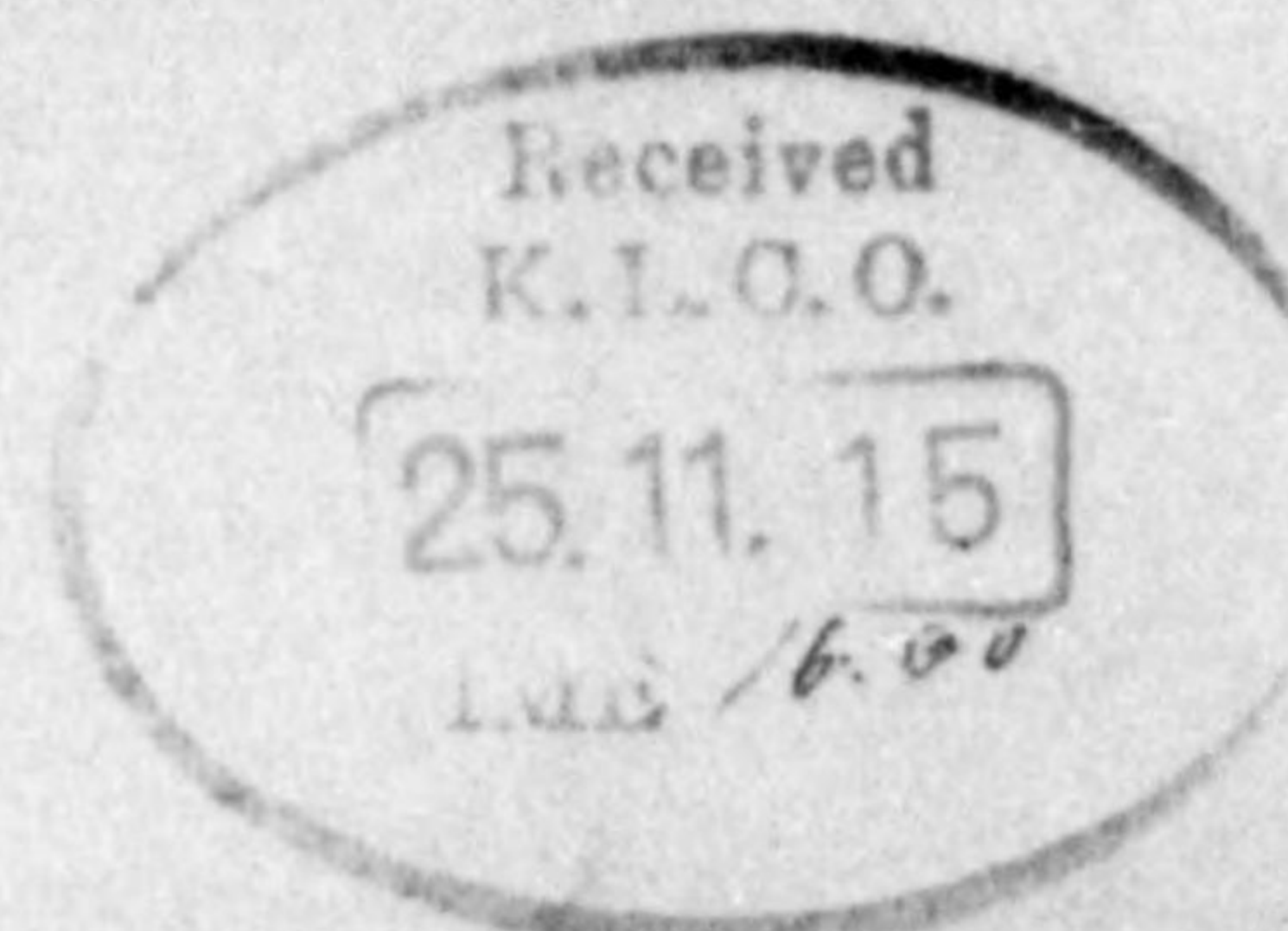
In compliance with your directive to investigate on the letter of appeal concerning land problem submitted to you on Aug. 18, 1950, by the representatives of the Kamikawade-mura Tenant-Farmers' Association Tazawa Branch, Higashichikuma-gun, Nagano Pref., we wish to report on the circumstances which we have investigated as follows.

1. In Tazawa village-block, the greater part of the tenant land is remained as ever being owned by the land-lords. (Letter to appeal):

In Tazawa Block, there are many petty non-absent land-owners, therefore, the greater part of the tenant land is remained as ever not being purchased through the Land Reform. In Tokujiro Block, on the contrary, a great portion of the tenant land had been owned by the land-owners living in other villages, and consequently it was purchased compulsorily by the states. It was never intentional that the bulk of the tenant land in Tazawa Block had not been compulsorily purchased.

2. It had been scheduled that 4 "cho" 4 "tan" 6 "se" 20 "tsubo" of paddy-field and 1 "cho" 7 "tan" 7 "se" 13 "tsubo" of dry-field out of the purchased land in Tokujiro Block would be resold to the farmers of Tazawa Block in exchange for the land-owners' land in Tazawa Block. But it is not resold yet. (Letter of appeal):

The Village Agricultural Land Committee scheduled so at first. The schedule was, however, not enforced owing to difference of fertility between the land of two village-blocks and other causes. 2 "cho" 4 "tan" out of the above land is



remained being owned by the state and the balance has been resold to the cultivating farmers in Tokujiro Block.

As the percentage of owner-farmer creation of Tazawa Block is lower than that of Tokujiro Block, the Prefectural government will guide the village Agricultural Land committee to form a land exchange program again in order to resell the remaining 2 "cho" 6 "tan" of land so that the percentages of owner-farmer creation of two village-blocks will be made equal.

3. 4 "se" 2 "tsubo" of paddy-field at No. 6486, Nakahanami, was resold to Jun Takahashi, a former member of village Agricultural Land committee. (Letter of appeal):

The Tenant-Farmers' Association complains of that the land was resold to a land-owner who had released his land. However, it is not illegal because he purchased the land which he had rented from the other land-owner.

4. Noboru Hanamura, a member of village agricultural land committee, transferred his right to purchase 1 "tan" 7 "tsubo" of paddy-field at No. 6437, Naka-hanami, out of the land which had right to be resold, to Mayumi Imamura who had no relation; and he purchased only 9 "se" 25 "tsubo" of paddy-field at No. 6286, Kami-hanami, for his own cultivation. (Letter of appeal):

The Tenant-Farmers Association complains that N. Hanamura, a member of village agricultural committee, transferred 1 "tan" 7 "tsubo" of paddy-field to M. Imamura who had no connection with the land in problem. The following circumstance was cleared up by our investigation. M. Imamura had cultivated 2 "tan" 9 "se" of land in Takibe-mura, a neighbouring village. By the Land Reform, however, this land was purchased by the state and was not resold to him because Takibe-mura was not his residing village. Then N. Hanamura, extending sympathy to M. Imamura, transferred his own right to purchase 1 "tan" 7 "tsubo" of paddy-field to M. Imamura and bought only the balance of land which was allocated to him. This is never against the law.

5. Otoyasu Fujiwara, chairman of village Agricultural Land committee, took away 2 "tan" of paddy-field from a tenant farmer in 1947 without an approval of the Prefectural Governor. (Letter of appeal):

The tenant farmer of the above case is Yasaichi Maruyama of Takibe-mura, a neighboring village. Y. Maruyama had cultivated 1 "cho" 8 "tan" of land while O. Fujiwara only

2 "tan" 5 "se". In 1944 Fujiwara had paid 1,300 yen of compensation to Maruyama after Maruyama's consent to return the land. In this case the Prefectural Governor's approval is not necessary.

6. Taketoshi Mochizuki, a former member of village agricultural land committee, took away 2 "tan" of paddy-field from Kikaku Masuzawa, a tenant farmer, and 1 "tan" of paddy-field from Yoshiyuki Masuzawa, a tenant farmer, without the approvals of Prefectural governor. (Letter of appeal):

It was cleared by our investigation that T. Mochizuki took away in 1947 the land from the tenant farmers without the approval of Prefectural governor. The tenant farmers, however, gave consent to him to return the land in problem because they newly rented other land in return. The Prefectural government will guide him to apply immediately for the approval of the governor.

As mentioned above, the problem is involved in the above Paragraph 2. The Prefectural government will guide and supervise the village agricultural committee to form and enforce the land exchange program.

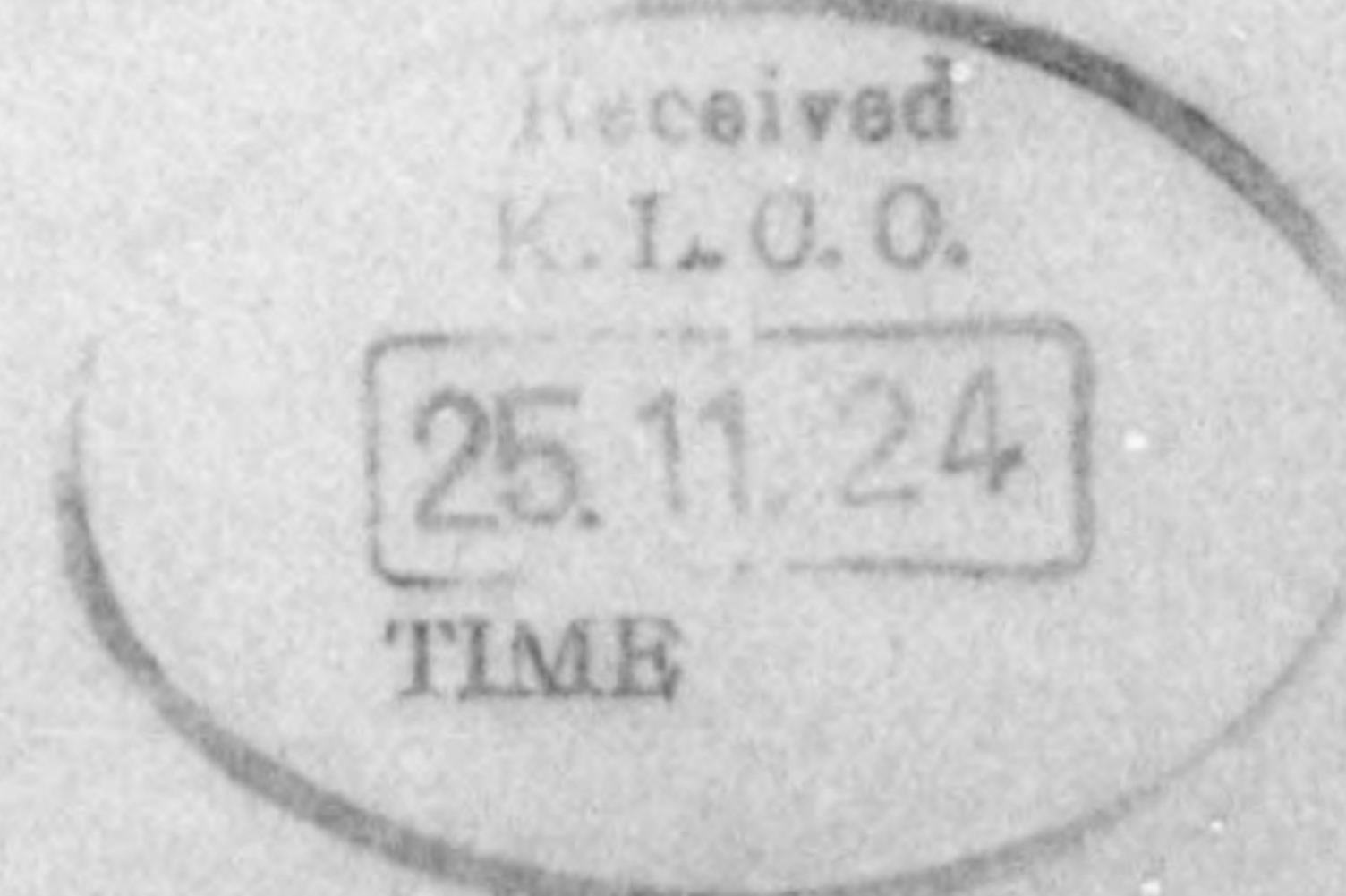

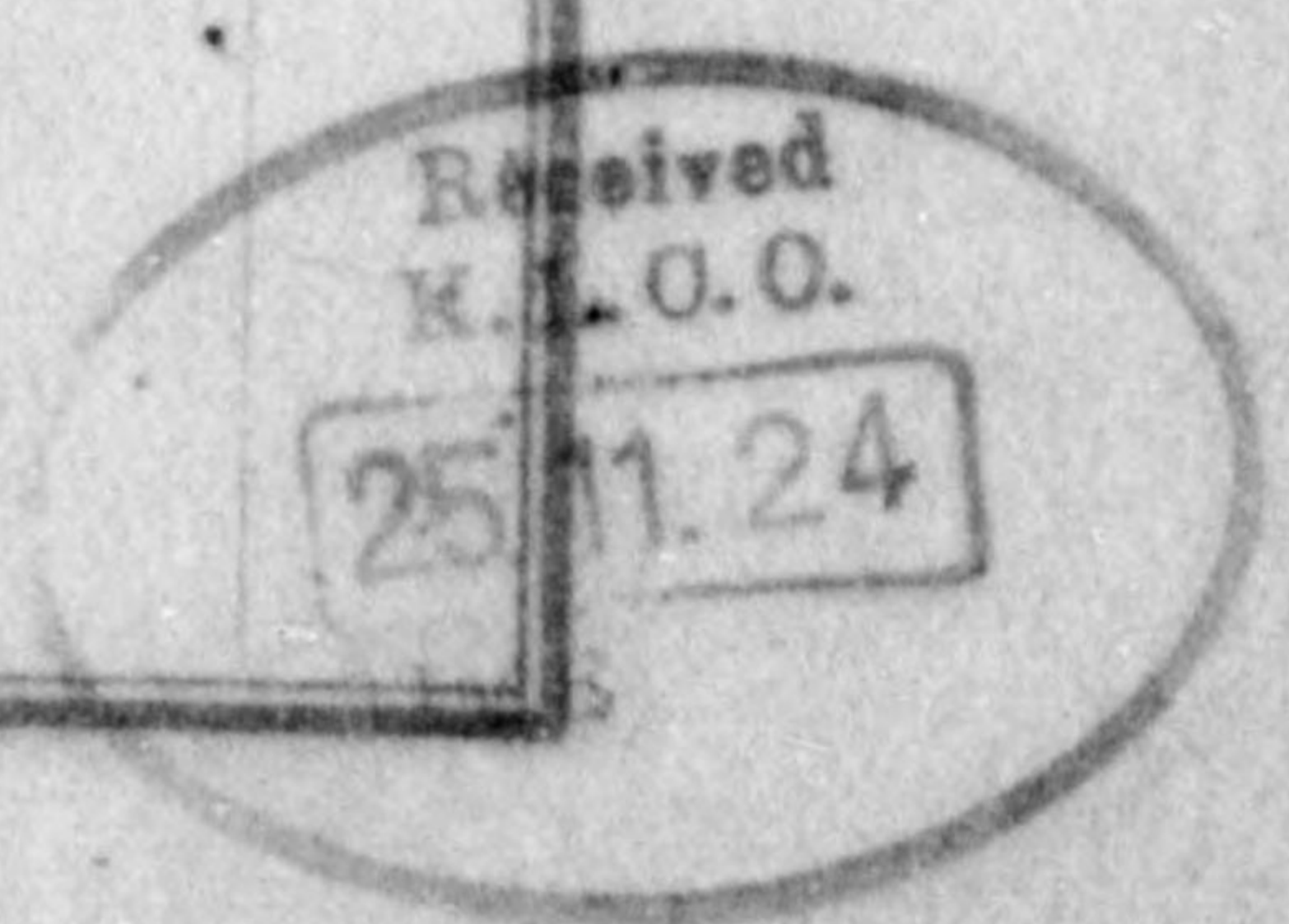

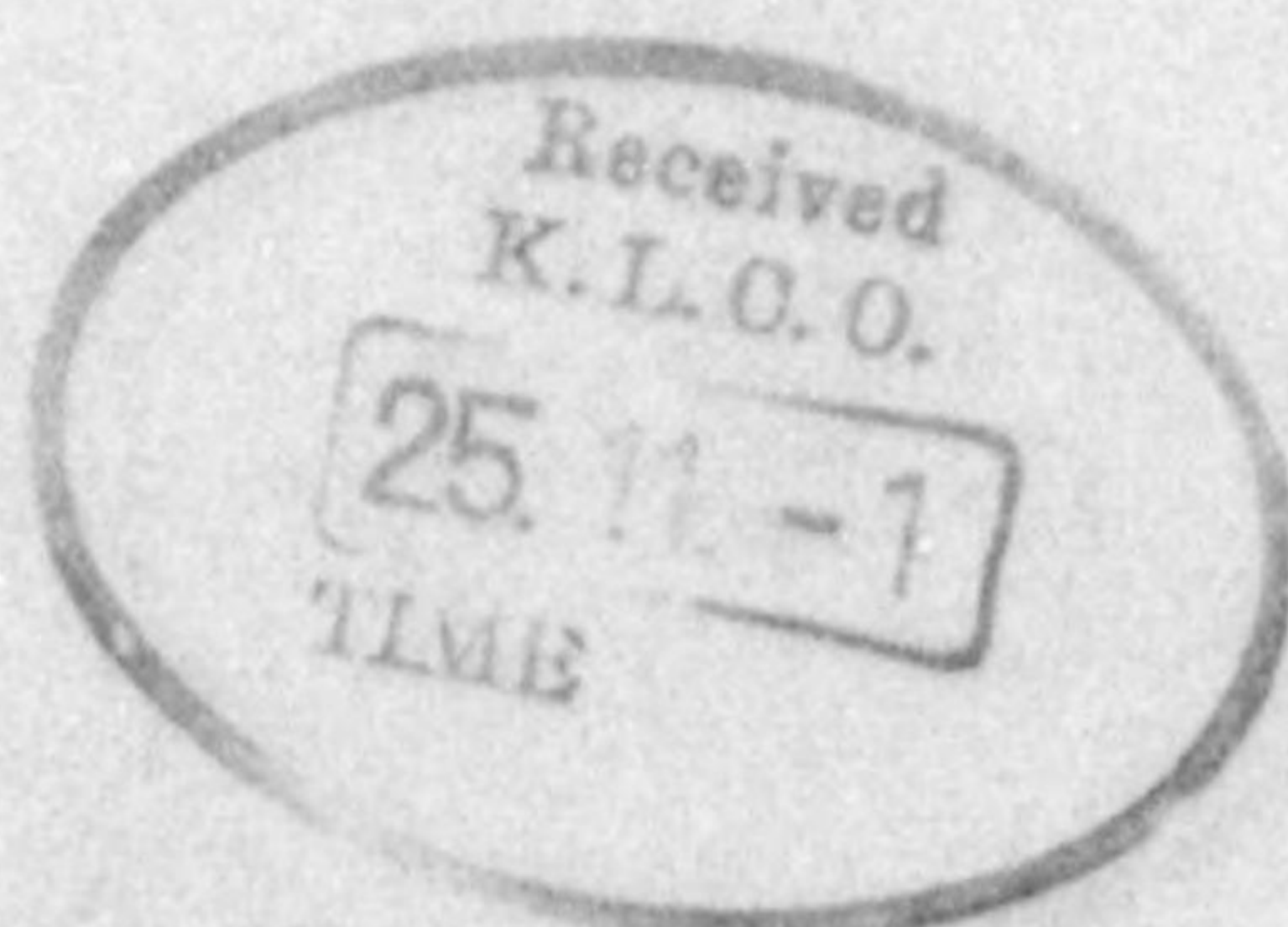
1. Effect of solid fertilizer for upland rural products.

Eighty-nine model upland fields, each with the area of 30 tsubo and for experimenting the effect of solid fertilizer to wheat and white potato, were established in this spring and the results of the experiment have been revealed quite excellent. They were informed to farmers through agricultural extension agents.

2. Horticultural Products Competitive Exhibition.

It was held for Oct. 4-6 at Nagano City for the improvement of the techniques of cultivating and processing horticultural products showing the exhibits of fruits, vegetables, flowers, seed-plants and processed items that had come from all over Nagano Prefecture. The number of the items exhibited was 800. It was quite effective for deepening the knowledge of the horticultural products of this prefecture.

3. A research is under way through the hands of the areal agricultural extension agents concerned for the actual state of the "wave-like cultivation of rice-plants", as 390 persons in 47 towns and villages in this prefecture are adopting this method.

- b) Oct. 9: Hokushin Bloc Prefectural Agricultural Extension Agents' Consultative Congress Special Committee was held to have consultations on the establishment of "Agricultural Commission" and the Committee decided that the Committee opposes to the establishment following the undermentioned reason.

"Regarding the establishment of Agricultural Commission to be formed by the unification of the existing Land Commission, Agricultural Adjustment Commission and Agricultural Improvement Commission, the conclusion was reached that such a commission would ignore the development of the agricultural improvement works if the works of the agricultural improvement commission which is a democratic assistance organ steadily doing the designated service works for farmers are to be done together with the works of the other commissions that include the ordering of compulsory works to farmers".

Immediately after the meeting the representatives went to Tokyo to petition the Head of Extension Department, Director of Agricultural Improvement Bureau and Agriculture-Forestry Minister, all of the same Ministry, and authorities of Natural Resources Section, GHQ, SCAP, against the establishment of the Agricultural Commission and large scale expansion of the agricultural extension works.

- c) The Prefectural and Areal Agricultural Extension Agents' Consultative Conference held on Oct. 18 discussed the issue of establishing the Agricultural Commission and made the resolution of the opposing to the establishment by means of the signatures of all the areal agricultural extension agents in the whole prefecture.
- d) Oct. 19, 20: The Prefectural Agricultural Improvement Committee was held at Iida City, where the works of the Hokushin Bloc Agricultural Extension Agents' Consultative Committee and the change of the agents were reported and the budget of the agricultural extension works of the specialized technicians for 1951 fiscal year was deliberated. Regarding the issue of establishing the Agricultural Commission, it was decided to push on strongly the line of opposition to the establishment which was adopted at the previous meeting at Matsumoto City on Sept. 9 and 10.

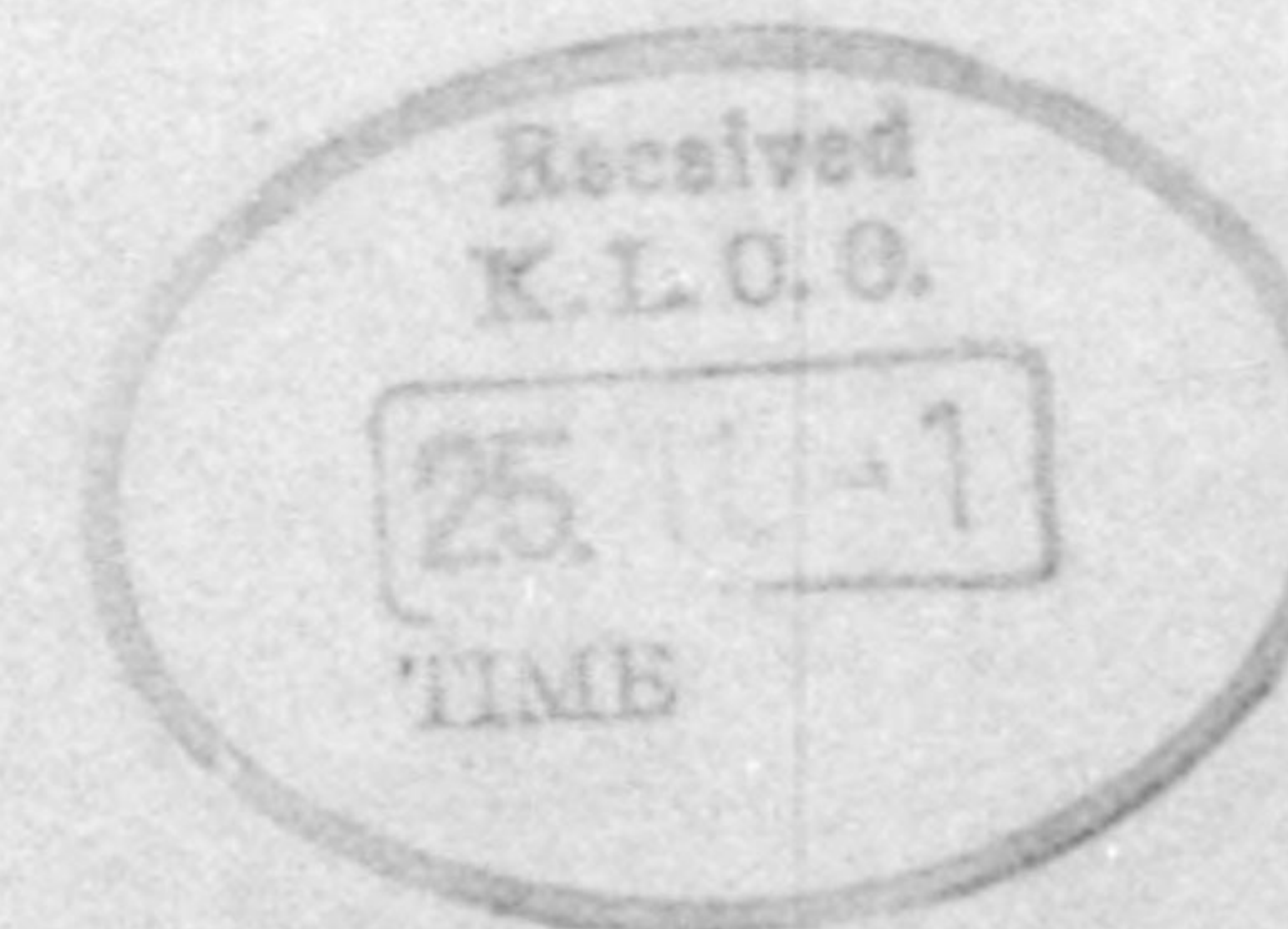

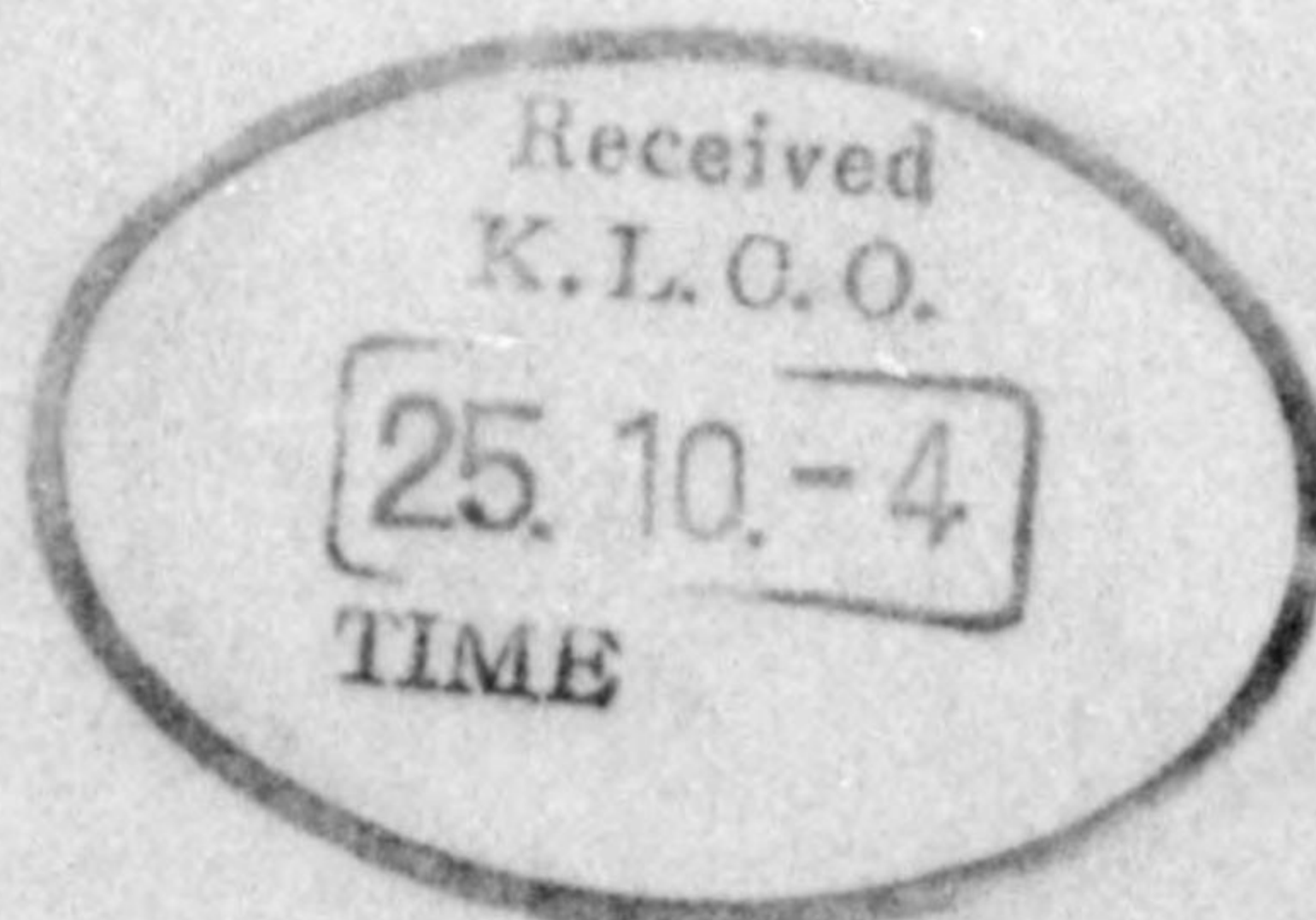

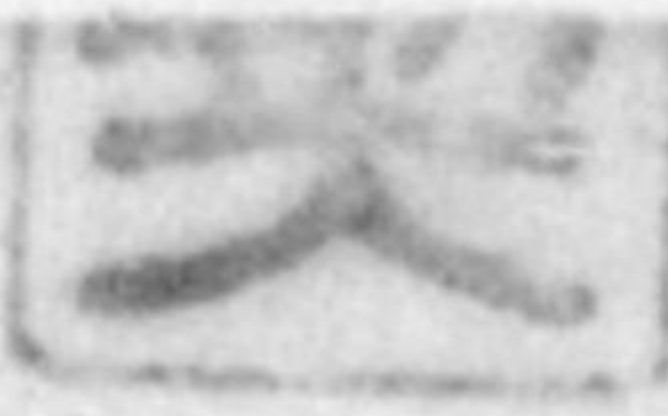

b) Sept. 10: The joint committee meeting of the Prefectural Agricultural Extension Agents and Gun Agricultural Extension Committee Chairman was held at Hongo-mura, Higashichikuma-gun to discuss about the Regulations Concerning Agricultural Committee and redistribution of administrative business. After the discussion, oppositions were raised respectively for the following reasons.

As to the amalgamation of Agricultural Extension Committee into Agricultural Committee, the agricultural extension work was naturally a service work for farmers having nothing to do with the allocation of food or rights to take stern measures concerning the delivery of food, so if these Committees of different nature are merged into one, misunderstanding will be incurred and consequently the agricultural extension work will be much hampered.

Concerning the re-distribution of administrative business, an opposition was raised that if the extension business is transferred to Municipal, town or village management, when the said business begins to start along the right lines, excellent extension agents will be liable to be governed by Municipal, town or village policies and as a result, agricultural extension will be prevented which will be fatal to the progress and development of Japan's agriculture.
