In compliance with the request for investigation on the above subject by a staff of your Natural Resources Division who came to our office on 16 October, we hereby submit the report as follows.

Calling the petitioner and persons concerned together at Kunimoto-mura Land Committee office on 31 Oct, 1950, we carried out an investigation into the matter and disposed it as follows.

1. Petitioner:

Yasusaburo Shiono
279 Hosoya, Kunimoto-mura, Kawachi-gun,
Tochigi Prefecture.

2. Other party

- a. Taichi Tamura, 652 Takaragi-hosoya,
Kunimoto-mura, Kawachi-gun, Tochigi Pref.
- b. Zenji Iwakami, 306 Takaragi-hosoya,
Kunimoto-mura, Kawachi-gun, Tochigi Pref.

3. Object concerned

Irrigation tunneled under the field 8.8 SE in acreage at 678-8 Takaragi Shimohosoya Kunimoto-mura, Kawachi-gun, Tochigi Pref.

4. The petitioner's opinion

Proper measures are hoped to be done by the other party enough to be cultivable of the said land, as the said irrigation has collapsed making the land uncultivable.

5. Actual circumstances

a. The tunneled irrigation in question had been built for admitting water into the paddy field downward under the cooperation of Hisayoshi Shiono, elder brother of the petitioner (the then owner of the land concerned) and Tasaku Tamura (father of Taichi Tamura, one of the other party) and Zenji Iwakami, about 25 years or so before. The land, afterwards, had been sold to Inosuke Konuma at Shiroyama-mura, Kawachi-gun, Tochigi Pref. by Hisayoshi Shiono, and was being tenanted by the petitioner. The land, on 2 October, 1949, was bought up by the state as a tenant-land owned by an absentee according to the Land Reform Program and then re-sold to the petitioner on the same day. However, around 5 KEN of the said land downwards of the tunnel (about 5 TSUBO of cultivation area) collapsed in 1948 making it uncultivable since then.

b. Outline of the tunnel

The said tunnel is 70 KEN long, 3 SHAKU wide and 4 SHAKU high. The petitioner is now cultivating the field of 17 KEN in length, which locates down part of the tunnel. As to the other parts, there is no fear in cultivation so far.

c. Influence likely to appear if the tunnel is filled.

This tunnel is at present providing water for 2 TAN of the paddy-field owned by Tasaku Tamura, and 1 TAN of the same owned by Zenji Iwakami, both other party. Supposing that the tunnel is filled with earth, not only the above-said paddy field, but around 1 CHO of the same downwards will have much trouble with scarce water and planting in these fields will be impossible.

6. Disposition

Through our every effort of conciliation, the trouble between the petitioner and the other party was settled under the following conditions.

- 1) Petitioner's having no opposition to utilization of the tunnel which is running under the land concerned.
- 2) Repairing the collapsed part of the tunnel by the other party enough to make the said land cultivable by the petitioner.

- 3) The petitioner will cooperate in the above construction work by offering his labor and others.
- 4) The expenses necessary for it shall be borne by the other party.
- 5) The construction work shall be finished by 31 December, 1950.
- 6) No ill-feeling caused by this trouble shall not be harbored by one another and the promise shall be fulfilled that each of them will cooperate with one another and strive in increasing food production.
- 7) Each copy of this memorandum shall be kept by the petitioner, two of the other party and Kunimoto-mura Land Committee.



In retrospecting one year of Home Demonstration Program
 By Miss ^{Yukiko} Yamamura, Tochigi H. D. Agent

February 1949

With a lofty ideal to be worthy of all the farming folk backing me up, I started this H. D. agent job at Utsunomiya Kencho but where and what to start with was the big problem.

I asked the Section and Division chiefs on the general plan of the Program and they said that they have planned my program in conjunction with the Social Education Section so go ahead along this line. At any rate my first job was to get acquainted, so February was spent going around the affiliated Government agencies and personnel in charge.

March, 1949

I was convinced that in order to diffuse this Program to the rural folk, I must first know the actual conditions of the farmers when I received my requests for cooking demonstrations of nutritious food. I had my start here. Miss Omori came by and gave me good pointers which helped me a great deal.

April - May, '49

Whenever I lectured and opened cooking demonstrations, I received repeated requests for encores and thus I was forced to work overtime and ruined my health for about 2 months. I took a complete rest for 2 months.

Page-2 -

July-Aug. 1949

When I returned, the Sections sadly needed a H.D. Agent and the requests for my lectures and demonstrations all piled up. Many farmers requested me during the off-crop season and even during the harvest season I had to hold many meetings.

Along about this time a movement was started to improve kitchens and we instituted a contest on best draft of the plan. I will point out the weak points of this contest:

1. As the contest called for 2 separate plans, one for complete reconversion and one for kitchen only, the drafts were confused and farmers lost interest. We should've given actual examples to work by
2. Bad idea to restrict the number of plans
3. No names were given of the examiners, so contestants didn't have confidence in us
4. The draft should've called for cross section view instead of elevation view

As we have no technicians on Dietetics, we had to concentrate on kitchen and home improvement and as this movement grew, it became too big for us to handle. I realized that this program as well as other programs will succeed only when we have the right 'personnel'.

As the program began to diffuse into the farmmost farmers, and as the sequence to its repeated conferences, the kitchen improvement movement began to take root and at the present there are 7 houses undergoing kitchen remodeling as a model home. I feel that my work is just beginning to take a definite shape.

Page-3-

In spite of the fact that the Social Education, Sanitation and Agr. Coop. Sections are constantly in touch with the rural folk, it is a serious problem to keep constant touch with them in this program which has just begun to bud. I believe this is the biggest headache of all the H. S. agents all over the nation

We would like to emphasize that the object of the Agricultural Extension Encouragement Law has begun to bear fruit in two years enforcement entirely through the adequate activities of the Agricultural Extension Committee and the frantic efforts of the Agricultural Farm Advisors.

At this time, it is reported that the National Government is planning to institute new agricultural committee system which would be consolidated from such organs as the Agricultural Land, Agricultural Readjustment and Agricultural Extension Committee under the slogan of carrying out consolidated administration of various improvement policies in terms of agriculture.

Our committee made detailed and thoroughgoing survey on the principles of the proposed agricultural committee system, finding they were quite ignorant of the factual situation of farming villages.

It goes without saying that the ideal of the agricultural extension activities is put either on effective employment of farming methods, increase of agricultural products, improvement of farmers livelihood, or readjustment of agricultural guidance agencies at this turning point. At a time when we are continuing our efforts effectively under the ideal to save farmers from their facing difficulties, to break bottlenecks of the agricultural extension activities and to steer positive movement in line with the objects, we hear of the consolidation program of the National Government, which is going to absorb existing committees into new



agricultural committee. It means to us that the new program disregards the factual situation of agricultural villages.

Under the circumstances, we would present our petition so that you might establish a definite policy of agricultural production invariably on the basis of the agricultural extention program.

Seeing the weather conditions during August, the average temperature was a little higher than the normal year, and as to the rainfall, we had heavy rains at the end of July, followed by those caused by the tropical low pressure at the beginning of August. The quantity of rain being over 100 to 200 miligram than in the common year, so that there caused flood disasters in each place during July, followed by heavy rains in succession. The damaged areas by floods were much enlarged as specified below:

Flooded field: 4,515 CHO

Over-flooded: 4,488 CHO

Field swept away: 63 CHO

Field buried: 330 CHO

Further on account of the heavy rains, rice blast and white powder-like disease of leaves appeared in many places and the damages are considered very great.

In other places received no damage, are generally good in their growth.

(2) Upland rice:

By the aforesaid successive heavy rains, the upland rice also has had damages, the areas of which, inclusive of other cereals, sweet potatoes and vegetables, are specified as follows.

Field flooded: 1,072 CHO

Field over-flooded: 4,421 CHO

Field washed away: 24 CHO

Field buried: 24 CHO

In other places where no damage received, the growing condition is generally satisfactory.

(3) Cereals:

As for the weather conditions during August were same as the above mentioned, and the soy-beans which were at the flowering stage during the heavy rainy season, the riping was greatly hindered, and the crop condition has become worse due to the damage by damp. And also the indian corn fallen down by Henry Typhoon at the end of July, could not recover for the sake of successive rains and damp disasters, and a large portion of them have been withered, inflicting a great influence on its crop.

(4) Sweet-potato:

The weather for potatoes since plantation has been favorably in general and good crop will be expected.

(5) Vegetables:

Dried goured shavings have been in an unfavorable condition, damaged by the heavy rain since the end of

July, but the other vegetables were generally in good condition. The plantation of Autumnal vegetables are satisfactory

1. Petition by Giichiro Hayakawa, Nagashihara, Akami-machi,
Aso-gun, Tochigi-ken.

A. Salient objective of his petition.

(1) The petitioner applied to the Akami-mura Agricultural LAND Commission for their purchase of the building area which the petitioner is loaning from Ryoichi Kameda, by virtue of the provision per 2nd item, 1st paragraph, article 15, Extraordinary Procedure Law for Establishment of Yeomen System, but the commission has not yet purchased it up.

(2) The petitioner was requested by Masakuni Hayakawa who is a tenant farmer of the neighboring land of which Ryoichi Kameda is the land owner to return him the vegetable manure heap point of about four tsubo, but must the petitioner return the heap point which the tenant has been loaning from the landowner these fifty-eight years?

B. Facts revealed from our investigation conducted on 7 September 1950.

(1) The building area involved in the petition covers 148.98 tsubo which is registered in the land registration ledger.

(2) The petitioner has been inheriting the rent right for the building area from his father up to date.

(3) As for the unit of the rent, it was brought to the Ashikaga Minor Law Court on 16 November 1949 for mediation, as the result of which they reached the compromise determining the yearly amount of rent to be ¥ 500 up to the end of 1950, while the rent for 1948 and thenceafterward would be determined between the landowner and the tenant.

(4) The building on the land in question belongs to the branch temple of the Tenri Sect (religious incorporation). Most part of the building is used as chapel and the petitioner live in a part of the building.

(5) As for the vegetable manure heap point, the petitioner recognized that he has no renting right.

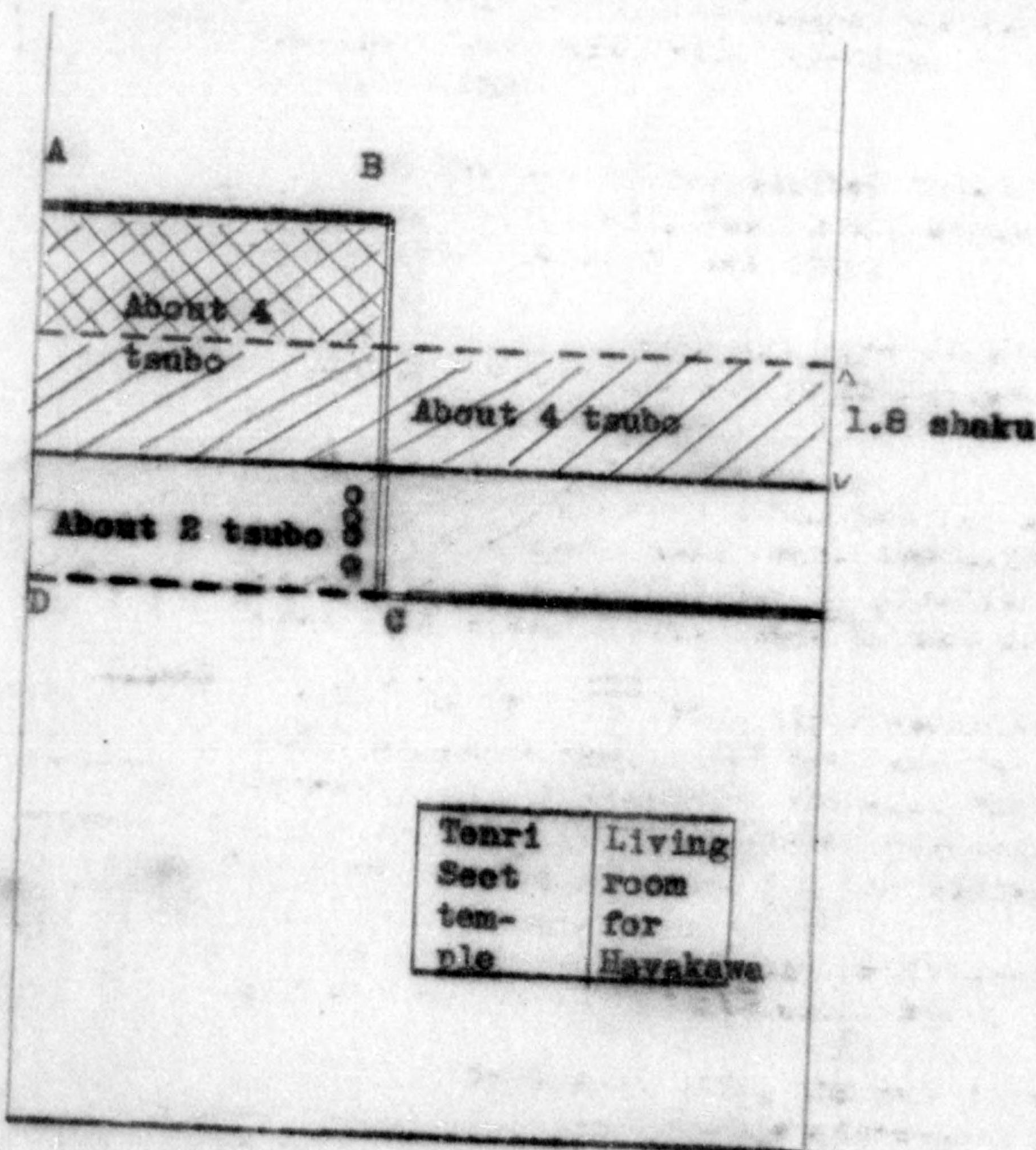
(6) The land which belonged to the landowner Ryoichi Kameda and which was cultivated by his tenant, the petitioner, was purchased up and already sold to the petitioner.

C. Disposal for his petition.

(1) The building on the land which the petitioner is

Loaning from Ryoichi Kameda belongs to the branch temple of Tenri sect, but does not belong to the petitioner. This does not authorize the agricultural land commission to purchase it up by virtue of 2nd item, 1st paragraph, article 15 of the Extraordinary Procedure Law for Establishment of Yeomen System. The above effect was explained to the petitioner to his understanding and agreement.

(2) As for the land which is used as the manure heap point, the petitioner has no right for rent. But in the light that the petitioner has been opened to use it without causing any trouble so far, we thought it proper to come to compromise between the petitioner and another tenant Masakuni Hayakawa for the neighboring land. We recommended our idea with resultant advent of the compromise which is illustrated as below.



Division of lands so far used by Giichiro and Masakuni.

2. Petition by Kuni Usui, living in Itaga-mura, Kamitsuga-gun. (permanent domicile: 888, Nakaizumi, Minami-Inukai-mura, Shimotsuga-gun, Tochigi-ken).

A. Salient objective of her petition.

(1) The Minami-Inukai-mura Agricultural Land Commission purchased her four lots of land (total area: 5 tan 25 bu) including the upland field covering one tan located at 1,792-2, Nakaizumi of the same village from their viewpoint that the land belongs to absentee owner. But the petitioner opposed it from the reason that the petitioner's daughter-in-law is living in the same village, Minami-Inukai-mura.

B. Facts revealed from our investigation conducted on 6 September 1950.

(1) The petitioner became the daughter-in-law of Shohachi Usui, 888, Nakaizumi Minami-Inukai-mura on 15 February 1933.

(2) The petitioner adopted Shichi, the fourth daughter of Gijuro Usui, 1633, Nakaizumi, Minami-Inukai-mura as her daughter-in-law on 5 June 1948.

(3) The petitioner was married with Ichiro Watanabe, Itaga-mura, Kamitsuga-gun on 20 January 1950 and lives with him in the same village.

(4) The petitioner submitted her application in January 1950 to the Minami-Inukai-mura Agricultural Land Commission, requesting to authorize her to give her agricultural land located in Minami-Inukai-mura to her adopted daughter.

(5) On 12 June 1950, the Minami-Inukai-mura Agricultural Land Commission designated her land in question as the tenement land belonging to the absentee land owner and agreed to put it up in their purchase program. Public notification for free reading was made for the matter.

(6) On 10 July 1950, the petitioner raised her opposition against the conduct of the commission.

(7) On 28 August 1950, the petitioner submitted her petition similar to that she addressed to KCAR to the Governor of Tochigi Prefecture. Then the Prefecture took the action which will be explained by following C.

C. Disposal for her petition.

Now that the matter is involved in her disagreement with the action taken by the agricultural land commission, the Prefecture directed the same commission to handle her disagreement promptly and legally on one hand, and recommended

the petitioner on the other to go through the channel where she should present her petition to the Prefectural Agricultural Land Commission, if she cannot agree with the determination of the village agricultural land commission.

3. Petition by Susumu Koshii, Utagawa, Chikazono-mura, Nasu-gun, Tochigi-ken.

A. Salient objective of the petition.

(1) The petitioner was the tenant of A for the dry field covering seven se. This land was sold by the agricultural land commission to above A who is not actually cultivating the land. The petitioner complains of the act and requests to handle it legally.

B. Facts revealed from our check which was conducted on 7 September 1950.

(1) The land involved in this case is dry field covering four tan which is out of 3 cho 9 tan 3 se 25 bu, located at 3-3, Shimo-Akase, Akase, Kaneda-mura, Nasu-gun, Tochigi-ken.

(2) The dry field in question belonged to Hiro Ando, Otawara-machi, Nasu-gun, but it was purchased up on 2 October 1947 from the reason that it ^{was} is the tenement land belonging to absentee land owner.

(3) The dry field covering four tan was cultivated at first by the petitioner's older brother Kiyonobu Koshii who loaned it from his landowner, but in the meantime a part of his tenement land was loaned again to the petitioner. It covers 4 se 16 bu.

(4) The Kaneda-mura Agricultural Land Commission is contemplating to sell 4 se 16 bu to the petitioner and 3 tan 5 se 14 bu to his older brother Kiyonobu Koshii, and for that purpose the commission completed their actual measuring and under way for necessary procedure.

C. Disposal for the matter.

(1) The purchase-up program of the Kaneda-mura, Agricultural Commission is admitted as legal and does not violate the right of the petitioner. Same effect will be notified to the petitioner.

(2) From the alleged reason that the petitioner has been on sick bed from cerebral haemorrhage since 1 September 1950 and his nerves are much tired, his son-in-law Moriji joined in our investigation.

4. Joint petition by Hiromatsu Morishima, 2,630, Hanawa, Mashiko-machi, Haga-gun, Tohigi-ken and three others.

A. Salient objective of the petition.

The petitioners reclaimed the forest covering 7 tan 2 se out of 6 tan 2 se 26 bu belonging to Kamejiro Kosuge, Hanawa, Mashiko-machi, Haga-gun, Tohigi-ken during the period March to April 1945 and they are growing the reclaimed land as upland field. In the above light the petitioners applied to the Mashiko-machi Agricultural Land Commission for purchasing their reclaimed land, but it has not yet been materialized.

B. Facts revealed from our check on 6 September 1950.

(1) The land in question was reclaimed by the Japanese Navy in March and April 1950, and the petitioners have been cultivating with agreement of the land owner after the end of the war.

(2) The petitioners applied three times through their written letter to the Mashiko-machi Agricultural Land Commission respectively on 18 November 1949, 20 May 1950 and 25 May 1950, requesting to purchase it up.

(3) The Mashiko-machi Agricultural Land Commission probed their applications, but no decision was reached in the meeting held on 10 June 1950.

C. Disposition for the petition.

(1) Inasmuch as the petitioners have not been paying any rent for the usage of the land, cultivation of which was agreed by the landowner, the case can be recognized as the tenement land which is based on the usage agreement. This comes to the category of tenement land to be regulated by 2nd paragraph, article 2, the Extraordinary Procedure Law for Establishment of Yeomen System.

(2) In the light that the landowner Kamejiro Kosuge has more land for tenancy which comes to the category of the law, if the Mashiko Agricultural Land Commission will not admit as illegal the purchase-up of the National Government which may conduct it by virtue of the provision of 8th item of article 5 of the Extraordinary Procedure Law for Establishment of Yeomen System, there will be no application to the provision of 4th paragraph, article 3 of the same law. This stands for the idea that the land would become the target for the purchase-up.

(3) In viewpoint that the Mashiko Agricultural Land Commission has been probing as to whether or not they apply it to the provision of 8th item of article 5 of the

Extraordinary Procedure Law for Establishment of Yeomen System, the Prefecture is taking necessary step so as it can direct the commission to make their immediate determination from their probing.

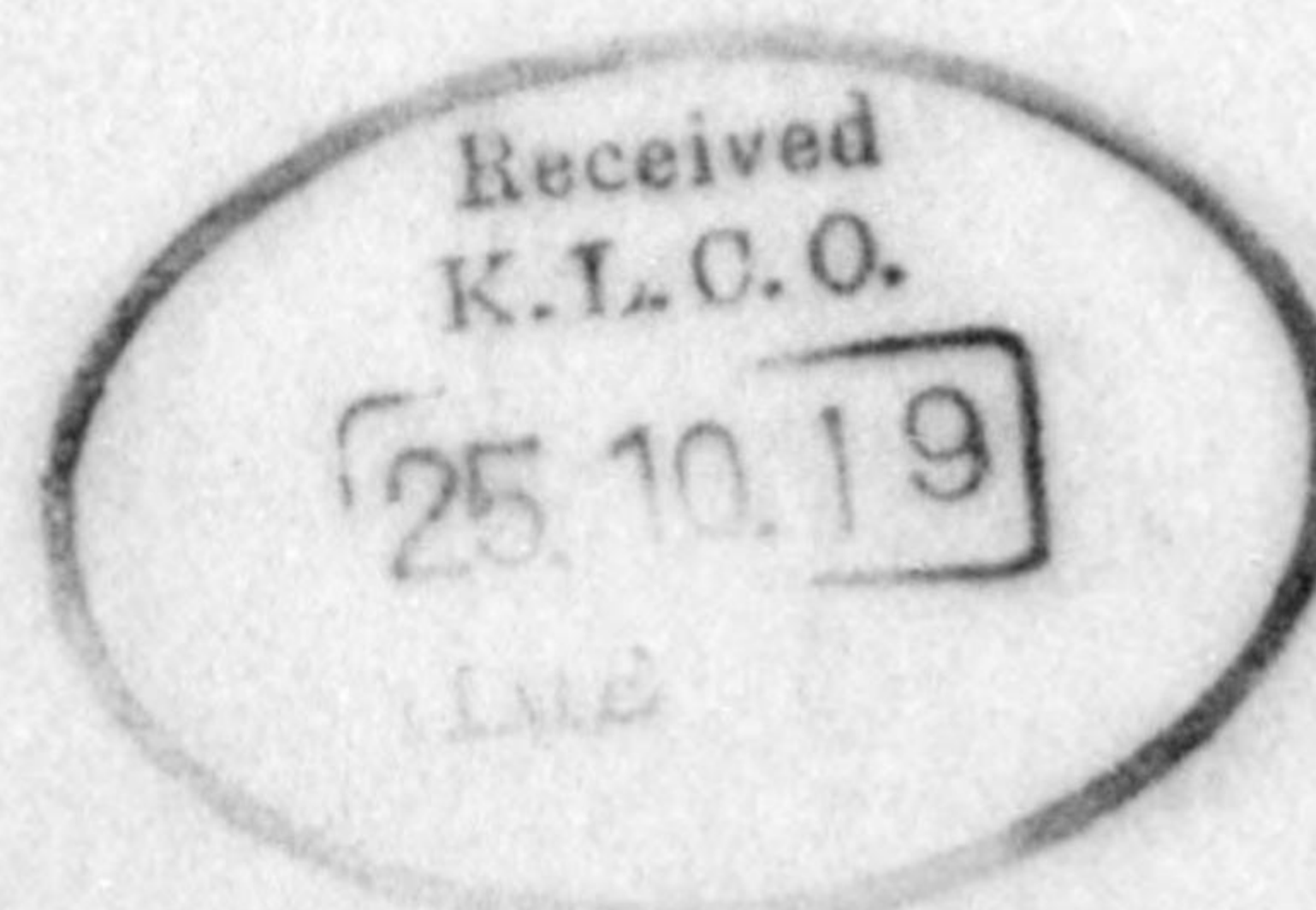

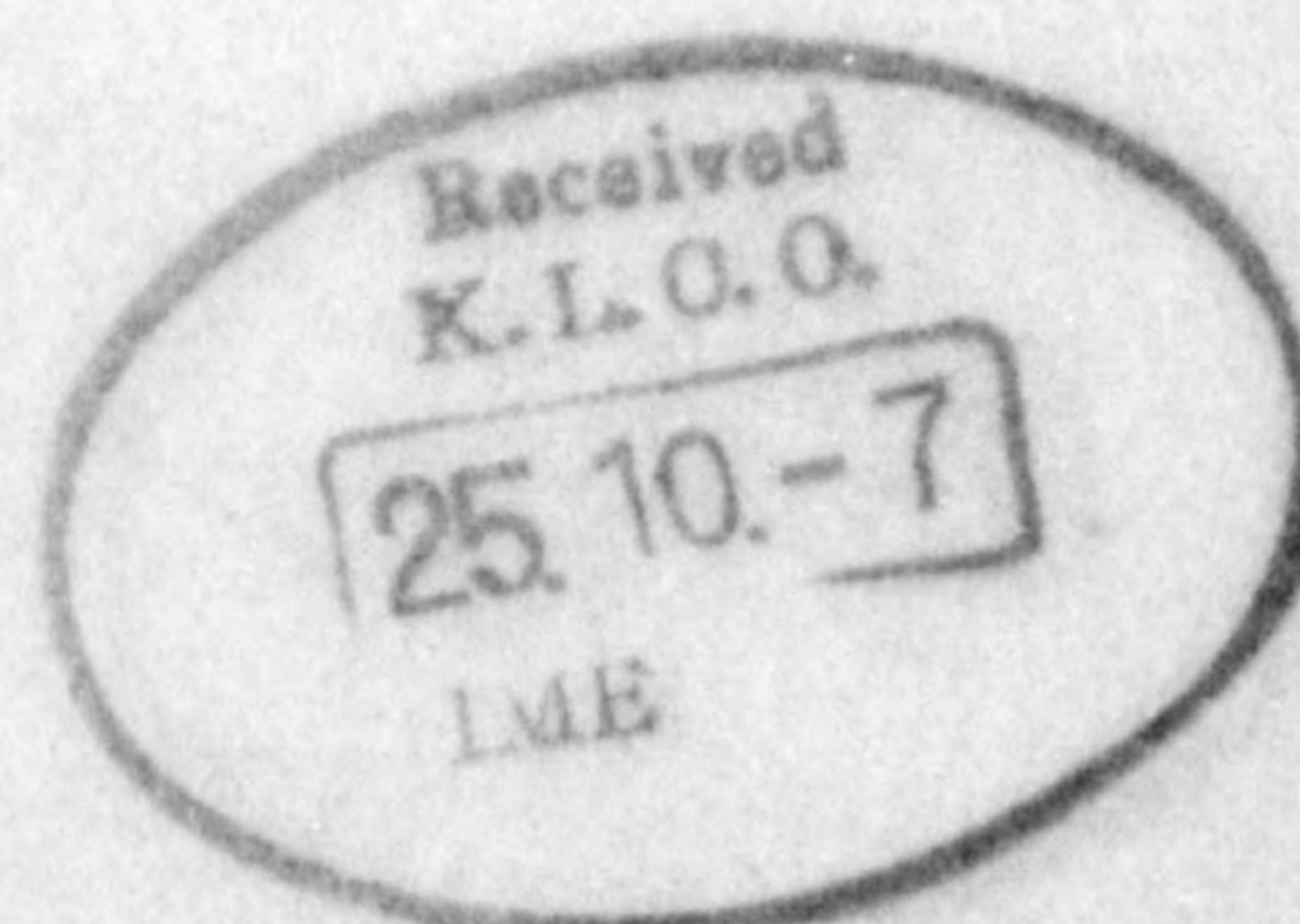

The crop conditions have turned for the better due to favorable weather of July, but Typhoon Helen with a heavy rainfall caused flood disaster in some areas on 27 July. The disasters are specified as follows.

Field swept away or buried: 56 CHO
Over-flooded field: 2,660 CHO
Flooded field: 3,395 CHO

By this, a heavy decrease in crop is estimated. Besides, the diseases such as rice blast, bacterium Oryzae Nakata, etc. appeared in many places and the damages are considered very great.

(2) Upland rice:

We have had fine weather almost successively in July and in some places there have been seen too much dryness of soil, which did not bring adverse influence on growing. Growing condition is satisfactory.

(3) Cereals:

The weather was favorable and growing was satisfactory in July. But on account of Typhoon Helen corn fell down in the main producing areas and anomala rufo-curprea attacked soy-beans. With other cereals, the condition is satisfactory.

(4) Vegetables:

Except the gourd of which crop condition is unsatisfactory, almost vegetables are satisfactory in crop condition. Taro crop condition is a little better than the average yield.

4. Crop harvested with average yields:

The crop estimation is now still difficult. But considering the present growing condition and the decrease in crop caused by flood disaster and diseases and insect damages, the harvest will be almost as equal as pre-planting quota:

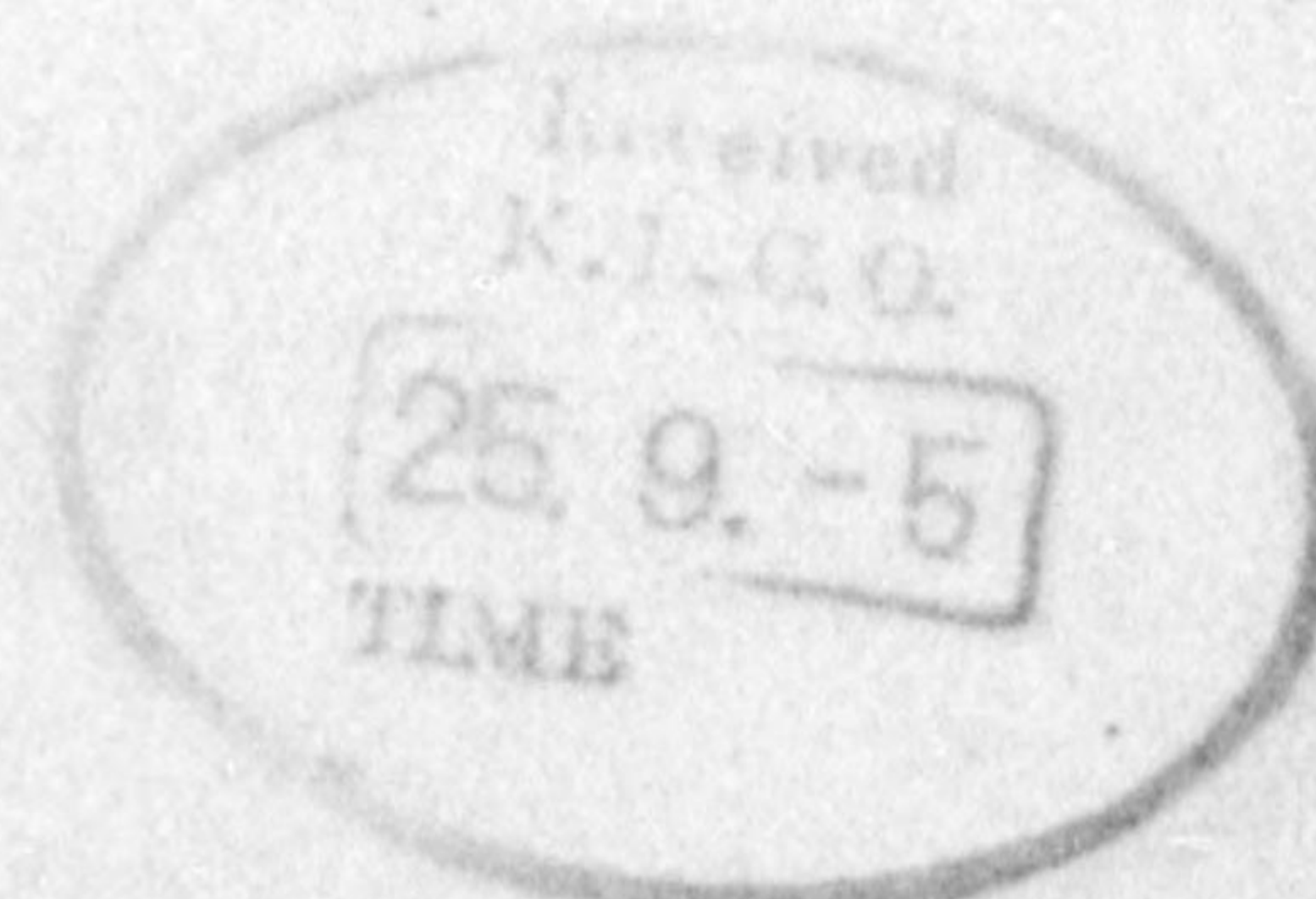
