Practical the entire barrack stable was burnt down, due to the accidental fire caused within the compound of the unit by his subordinates. The Garrison Commander must be held responsible.

The witness stated he lived in Tokyo. He identified Exhibit 2680 as his affidavit and verified it. * The affidavit stated that in November 1941 to August 1943 the witness was commander, 7th Independent Garrison Force at Chiamussu in northeast Manchuria with the duty of guarding the border in Sankiang. This Garrison Force was under the command of UMEZU. During the period UMEZU repeatedly stressed the importance of keeping peace with the Soviet and his attitude was well known throughout the Kwantung Army. It was understood by all personnel that UMEZU was especially selected after the Nomonhan Incident to insure peace. He held frequent conferences of Army Divisions and other unit commanders while the witness was in Manchukuo, at which he repeatedly instructed that they were not to cause or permit any trouble with the Soviet. * These instructions were given on every possible occasion.

TOGAWA conveyed UMEZU's attitude to the Soviet at one conference by saying that UMEZU, emphasizing the need for not causing trouble, has expressed a strong intention to severely punish and discharge anyone who takes a provocative move against the Soviet. Under UMEZU's instructions, the witness made every effort to impart this to his men and the plans were faithfully carried out. At no time during his service was there a border incident of importance.

The witness arrived in Chiamussu three months after the Kan-Toku-An had been put into effect, but he heard nothing special about it from his direct superior, TOGAWA, commander of the 10th Division, and did not notice anything out of the ordinary in condition or attitude of the troops which would indicate an expectation of fighting.

As troop commander the witness was quite concerned over the relaxation of the troops in view of the danger of a possible Soviet attack. His inspection of the border on arrival did not show any unusual signs. If attacked by the Soviet they were ready to fight to the end, but there were no indications of the Japanese initiating any move.

Guard duty was carried out under the Sankiang District border guard regulations, developed from UMEZU's border guard regulations to fit the conditions on the spot. Even if the

Soviet Union should illegally cross the border, the center of the Amur River, they were not to be fired on. Their movements were to be watched and stopped if they came to the Manchukuoan bank. The area which the witness guarded was very large in proportion to the number of men available. The Garrison had only peacetime strength of two infantry battalions * and one artillery battalion, and facilities were so poor even for defense that the witness suggested reinforcements whenever he had the opportunity to do so. The border he guarded was approximately 800 kilometers and his total strength was about 2500 men. He never got the reinforcements he requested.

He heard from TOGAWA by document and personally and frequently from him verbally. The witness had reported TOGAWA's speech.

The witness stated he did not know that UMEZU held the opinion that Japanese attitude toward the Neutrality Pact with the Soviet must change as soon as changes in relation between Germany and the Soviet took place.

In the summer and autumn of 1941 the witness was commander of the 13th Mixed Brigade in Central China. He did not hear of the Kan-Toku-En definitely from any particular person. He recollected that the plan was enforced around the end of July 1941. * The witness stated that he knew that in 1941 the discharge of soldiers who had served their term was stopped. He knew nothing about his predecessor and he had no connections himself with putting into effect of the Kan-Toku-En. He stated that he did not know anything about the fact that there was a plan drafted in the Kwantung Army for war against the Soviet in 1942, sanctioned by UMEZU.

Having first duly sworn an oath as on attached sheet and in accordance with the procedure followed in my country I hereby depose as follows.

I am YAMAMURA, Haruo, former Lieutenant-General in the Japanese Army. From November 1941 to August 1943 I was commander of the 7th Independent Garrison Force, stationed in Chiamussu, an important place in northeastern Manchuria. My duty was to guard the Soviet-Manchurian border in Sankiang. The 7th Independent Garrison Force was under the command of General UMEZU, commander-in-chief of the Kwantung Army.

During this period General UMEZU repeatedly stressed the importance of keeping peace with the USSR, with the result that his peaceful attitude towards the USSR was well known throughout the Kwantung Army. It was well understood by all officers and men that General UMEZU had been especially selected as Commander-in-Chief of the Kwantung Army after the Nomonhan

Incident for the purpose of insuring peace. He held frequent conferences of army commanders, division commanders and other unit commanders -- if I remember correctly, there were five or six army commanders conferences during the time I was in Manchoukuo -- at which he repeatedly instructed the commanders not to cause or permit any trouble with the Soviet Forces. Such instructions were also given on every other possible occasion. General TOGAWA conveyed General UMEZU's attitude toward the Soviet at one conference as follows: "Commander-in-Chief UMEZU, emphasizing the necessity of not causing any trouble with the Soviet, ^{has} expressed his strong intention to severely punish and discharge anyone who in any way takes a provocative move against the Soviet."

In accordance with General UMEZU's instructions, I made every effort to impart this will to my men, and General UMEZU's principles were faithfully carried out by officers and men. At no time during my service under the Kwantung Army was there a border incident of importance.

The time of my arrival in Chianussu (November 1941) was three months after the Kantokuen had been put into effect. However, I did not hear anything special about the Kantokuen from my direct superior officer, Lieutenant General TOGAWA, Jiro, commander of the 10th Division, and I did not notice any evidence of anything out of the ordinary in the condition or attitude of the troops, or such as would indicate any expectation of fighting. In fact, as a troop commander I was somewhat concerned over the state of relaxation of the troops, in view of the danger of any possible

Soviet attack. My inspections of the border upon my arrival did not disclose any unusual signs. If attacked by the USSR they were ready to fight to the end, as was their duty, but there was not the faintest indication of the Japanese side initiating any moves.

Guard duty by troops stationed along the border was carried out according to the "Sankiang District Border Guard Regulations", which were developed from the "Border Guard Regulations", first formulated and layed down by General UMEZU, to fit the conditions on the spot. Even if the Soviet Union should illegally cross the border (center of the current of the Amur River) they were strictly not to be fired at. The Soviet movements were to be watched and ascertained and stopped if they came to the Manchoukuoen bank of the river. Thus, utmost care was taken to avoid any fighting. Guards acting as pilots were stationed on river boats plying between Harbin and Peiho to ensure completely against these vessels trespassing into Soviet territory or territorial waters.

The area which I was responsible for guarding in Sankiang Province was very large in proportion to the number of men available for guard purposes. The 7th Independent Garrison Force had only the peacetime strength of two infantry battalions and one artillery battalion, and facilities were so poor even for carrying out defense duties that I suggested reinforcements whenever I had the opportunity to do so.
