We are endeavoring to supply our customers with varieties to meet the most exacting demands. This season we are offering a large number of varieties for the first time. Many of them not yet listed in any other catalog. This all necessitates a continual study of the world's markets.

We wish to thank all our friends for the business they have turned our way and we trust you can consistently refer us to your neighbors who might be interested in quality bulbs at fair prices.

OUR GUARANTEE

We guarantee every bulb we sell to be true to name, up to size, free from disease and Gladiolus Thrips. Should any error occur in filling an order we will gladly make adjustment if notified at blooming time. We cannot, however, assume any responsibility for results as weather conditions are beyond our control. Our stock has been inspected by the proper state authorities. We hold certificate No. 3396, a copy will be attached to each shipment.

DISCOUNTS

(For cash in full with order)

On orders from \$3.00 to \$10.00 you may deduct 10%. On orders from \$10.00 to \$25.00 you may deduct 15%. On orders from \$25.00 to \$100.00 you may deduct 20%.

OPTIONAL

If you so wish you may choose additional bulbs in place of cash discount up to same value. In case you do we will be liberal in filling your order. This very liberal discount is calculated to encourage larger orders, as some orders for less than \$3.00 cost us as much to assemble, label and pack as some orders amounting to \$25.00 or \$50.00, besides we believe anyone buying in large quantities is justly entitled to a better price. We want to be fair as far as we know how.

EXTRA

5% CASH DISCOUNT for all orders for \$5.00 or more mailed before Feb. 1, 1935, with remittance in full.

These discounts apply to everything listed in this catalog, but not to Wholesale List or Special Quotations.

REMITTANCE

Remittance in the form of Postal or Express Money Orders preferred, especially in amounts of less than \$5.00, for larger amounts good personal checks will be acceptable. Postage stamps not accepted. Minimum order \$1.00.

ORDERS with a deposit can be held until April 1st or later if necessary. Our Shipping Season generally ends May 1st.

TERMS

CASH with order to get the benefit of discounts. If not convenient to send full amount on orders over \$5.00, a deposit of 25% will hold early orders till shipping time, balance to be remitted before shipping, or sent C. O. D. A little money can be saved by remitting the balance by saving the C. O. D. fees. While not entitled to the Cash Discount on these orders, we will be liberal in overcount or extras in proportion to size of order.

EARLY ORDERS

There are many advantages in ordering early, as our stock is then complete and you can get just what you want. Some scarce varieties may be soon sold out, later on it is well to name a second choice, as we never substitute varieties without being instructed to do so. Most of our customers are agreeable to substitute sizes in same varieties of equal value. If unable to fill an order complete we make refund promptly. All stock offered subject to prior sale.

BULBLETS

As most everyone knows we have had extreme dry seasons for several years, consequently very small crop of bulblets (in some varieties none at all). For this reason we have no large quantity of any kind to offer, but every season some of our customers want a few bulblets to experiment with, so we are offering small lots in our retail list in order to save extra correspondence. We offer the cheaper kinds in packages (Pa. not counted), a liberal lot for the money, in higher priced kinds per 1. 10 or 100 half amount at half price, but no single item at less than \$0.10.

The success with the growing of bulblets is more uncertain than bulbs. Bulblets require plenty moisture to start them and should be planted early.

When you send us your bulb order, try and think of some friend or neighbor that you think would like to get our catalog, someone who is interested in growing fine Glads that might become a good customer. Send their names and addresses along with your order. Your co-operation will be appreciated and well rewarded.

SIZE OF BULBS

In common with most leading growers, we offer the bulbs in three sizes. Large means bulbs 1¼-inch and up. Medium, ¾ to 1¼-inch. Small, ¼ to ¾, averaging ½-inch. "Large" is the most dependable blooming size. "Medium," will produce good flowers, too, under normal weather conditions. "Small," is mainly for "growing on," but if planted early, in a good season, many of them will bloom and produce fine, large bulbs for next season's planting. In the "Larger Lot Offerings" we list the bulbs in the six standard sizes.

TRANSPORTATION

We prepay all shipping charges on all orders from this catalog for over \$1.00 that are fully paid for. Our choice of Express or Parcel Post as we deem safest. However, state your preference.


