1. Reference is made to letter from Tohoku Finance Bureau to this regional office, dated 19 February 1951, subject: "Application for Release from Reparations of Integrated Facilities Located at the Former 1st Naval Explosive Arsenal, Funaoaka (24-08)".

2. Based on technical inspection of the thirteen (13) integrated facilities by Mr. Charles C. Knoles, Senior Ammunition Inspector, Funaoaka Ammunition Depot, the majority of the facilities are not economically repairable. Accessories and equipment of the facilities which are stored elsewhere in the same area, are of scrap value only.

3. It is recommended that the thirteen integrated facilities and accessory equipment be released to the Japanese Government as melt-down scrap with the provision that all salvable components be retained.

2) The above two machines were severely war-damaged by bomb during the war, and primarily inventoried as class 3.

The accident took place on 2 May, 1947, when our workers were carrying the 01-45-147 machine by overhead crane to place it into the class 3 machinery storage area.

Suddenly the wire rope hanging it snapped, and the machine dropped and hit the lathe (01-45-557) stored there.



Subsequent damages caused as per list above, and we made Report on 15 May, 1947, through JIO, Nagoya to Headquarters, ANGT asking their permission to transfer these two machines into the category of class 4, as they have become quite worthless as class 3 machine. No instruction or permission received yet.

3) On 20 January, 1950 we made application to GHQ, SCAP for release of above two machines for melt-down purpose.

Mr. LeVan, the CPC member of GHQ, SCAP made the spot investigation on 28 April, 1950 and approved for melting-down these machineries.

However, to our regret, no official permit note issued yet.



These machineries were constructed and equipped by ourselves in our own plant when we started finishing on fuse parts by order of Osaka Arseual during the time when the recent war was well under way. They are mostly consisted of low precision inaccurate turret lathes, although we have expended pretty big expence in remodelling these machineries after the end of war, they were unfit for first grade machines at the time when our plant was placed under reparation. They are of secondary grade machines, absolutely inadequate to any purpose in future.

With a view to economizing cost of upkeep of reparation machineries, these machines may well be scrapped and replenished the need for scrap supply. Thus these otherwise wasted machineries can be dedicated in the interest of industrial reconstruction of Japan.

Under the belief above stated we hereby request for your reinvestigation and reconsideration of the matter.



2. Inclosure one (1) is an application submitted by the Kyushu Regional Construction Bureau requesting authorized use of two (2) rice boilers for Camp Fukuoka, National Police Reserve. In the initial rehabilitation of Camp Fukuoka, two (2) inoperative rice boilers were installed, which decreased efficiency of kitchen facilities. MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, Reparations Service Branch

SUBJECT: Inspection of Reparations Installations in the Kanto  
Region, 5-16 February 1951

1. As directed, inspections of reparations installations in Chiba, Kanagawa, and Tokyo Prefectures, during the period 5 to 16 February 1951, were conducted by the undersigned to check the following:

- a. Authorized and exempt status of equipment
- b. Maintenance and custodial status of equipment
- c. Possibility of consolidating equipment
- d. Scrap equipment
- e. Allocation of funds.

2. The purpose and, thereafter, the findings of inspections were made known to Mr. Jones or Mr. Mizukami, Kanto Civil Affairs Region officers.

3. Supplementary information is submitted as follows, and inspection check sheet for each plant is attached:

a. #19-03 (Air) Hiyoishi Seisakusho KK, Kawasaki Kojo, 5 Feb 51  
(Rep Insp C/S, Incl 1)

- (1) As recommended by the previous inspector, the guard force was reduced from 7 to 4 guards.
- (2) Consolidation of equipment to buildings 2 and 5, as recommended, was not carried out, as plant is presently moving machinery to those buildings for future operations.
- (3) Application for operation and authorized use of 35 items has cleared the Japanese Government and was forwarded to SCAP, 27 Dec 50. Plant will operate as a machine shop.
- (4) Maintenance and custody were good.
- (5) Scrapping of 75 items has been completed.

b. #39-23 (Air) Mitaka Kokukogyo KK, Mitaka Seisakusho,  
6 Feb 51 (Rep Insp C/S, Incl 2)

- (1) During the war the plant manufactured carburetors for aircraft and, thereafter, farm implements. Manufacture of farm implements proved unprofitable; therefore, plant suspended operations.
- (2) Plant has no authorized use or exempt status equipment and no scrap request.
- (3) Maintenance and custody were good.
- (4) Ten buildings contain reparations equipment within the main area. Two boiler rooms are located in the released area.

c. #39-155 (Prec Bg) Koyo Seiko KK, Tokyo Kojo, 6 Feb 51  
(Rep Insp C/S, Incl 3)

- (1) Forty-nine machine tools damaged by fire, 31 May 50, were repaired and are in good condition.
- (2) Nineteen items of testing equipment damaged by fire, 31 May 50, were forwarded to parent plant (Kokuba Koyo Seiko KK, Osaka) for repair. This equipment is to be returned 31 Mar 51. Removal from plant was undertaken without approval of JG or CAR.
- (3) This is an integrated facility presently producing precision needle roller bearings for sewing machines and automobiles.
- (4) Maintenance and custody were good.
- (5) Plant has no request for scrap.
- (6) No allocation of funds from the JG to this plant.

d. #39-41 (Air) Shinko Kikai Kogyo KK, Honsha Kojo, 6 Feb 51  
(Rep Insp C/S, Incl 4)

- (1) The Japanese Government allocation of funds for custodial purpose was reduced from 3 to 2 guards. The plant is supplying two additional custodial personnel.
- (2) This is a very small plant manufacturing printing machine parts with only eleven employees.
- (3) Plant has no scrap request.



(4) Maintenance and custody were satisfactory.

e. #19-07 (Air) Nikkoku Kogyo KK, Hiratsuka Kojo, 7 Feb 51 (Rep Insp C/S, Incl 5)

- (1) The plant is presently manufacturing truck and bus bodies, employing 625 people.
- (2) Forty-one items were transferred to this plant from plants coded 22-12 and 22-32 by authority of ESS.
- (3) The 204 items released as melt-down scrap have been destroyed.
- (4) The electric wiring in the woodworking shop is in poor condition. Recommend corrective action, as this condition constitutes a fire hazard.
- (5) The plant security and fire protection is satisfactory.

f. #19-09 (Air) Nippi Sangyo KK, Okamura Kojo, 9 Feb 51 (Rep Insp C/S, Incl 6)

- (1) Plant received authorized permission from ESS (24 Jul 50) to manufacture automotive parts, but to date no orders have been received. Present manufacture consists of metal furniture and fins for rockets.
- (2) Two items in authorized use were deleted from use, 2 Dec 50, leaving a balance of 64 items in authorized use. Nineteen were transferred to plant from the following: #19-20, 14 items; #19-32, 2 items; #19-33, 3 items.
- (3) Maintenance and custody were good. Fire-fighting station is within one-half mile of the plant. This plant has an excellent fire-fighting organization.
- (4) Plant has no scrap request.

g. #19-09a (Air) Kanazawa Kojo KK, Yokohama-shi, 9 Feb 51 (Rep Insp C/S, Incl 7)

- (1) The reparations equipment at this plant was formerly located at the Nihon Hikoki KK during the war. An organization of 120 employees of the above plant set up this present location to manufacture farm implements. Plant operated at a loss and, therefore, suspended production.



- (2) Maintenance and custody were good.
- (3) Plant security is adequate, and the Yatsu Fire Station is located within 40 meters.
- (4) Plant has no scrap request.

h. #19-10 and #19-11 (Air) Nisshin Kogyo KK, Tamagawa Kojo,  
13 Feb 51 (Rep Insp C/S, Incl 8)

- (1) Entire reparations equipment of #19-11 was transferred to sister plant coded #19-10 during Dec 50 by authority of ESS. This equipment consists of 59 OD 5/4 items and 35 evaluated items, all in dead storage. Document for transfer was not available. Four of the transferred items were later sent to the Maruwa plant.
- (2) Plant #19-10 is in operation manufacturing tricycles (power driven) with a complement of 210 employees.
- (3) Currently, there are 156 items in authorized use, of which 97 are OD 5/4 and 59 evaluated items.
- (4) Authority for release as melt-down scrap of 14 items was given plant 1 Nov 50. Inspection this date revealed that only 6 of 14 items were satisfactorily destroyed. Plant officials stated that 8 items (of the 14) were subsequently not desired for scrap. It is felt that this plant should be reminded that if they do not desire to scrap equipment, application for release should not have been submitted. Furthermore, disposition report has been directed within 90 days from date of authority. Recommend follow-up action by CAR for disposition of equipment.
- (5) Maintenance and custody were good.

1. #19-17 (Air) Tokyo Tankosho KK, Kawasaki Seizosho, 13 Feb 51  
(Rep Insp C/S, Incl 9)

- (1) Plant is presently manufacturing automotive parts. Allocation of custodial funds by the JG was discontinued in Aug 50.
- (2) One hundred and forty-six items released as melt-down scrap (11 Aug 50, 19 Sep 50, 16 Jan 51) have been satisfactorily scrapped.
- (3) One 40 hp electric motor (19-17-534) stolen 15 Oct 50 has not been located to date. Plant management will replace motor when available.



(4) Maintenance and custody were good.

j. #04-08 (Air) Tanaka Koku Kiki KK, Tsudanuma Kojo, 12 Feb 51  
(Rep Insp C/S, Incl 10)

- (1) One hundred and thirty-two items are in authorized use, of which 106 are used by Chiba Institute of Technology.
- (2) Transfer and authorized use of 53 items from Plant #39-51 to #04-08 is presently taking place by authority of WSS (letter dated 1 Nov 50, Incl 11).
- (3) Reparatons equipment in this plant is located in 7 buildings, of which 3 contain available equipment.
- (4) This company is presently engaged in the manufacture of automatic wrapping machines.
- (5) Plant has no scrap request.

k. #04-06 and #04-07 (Air) Nihon Kinzoku Sangyo KK, Tsudanuma Kojo, 13 Feb 51 (Rep Insp C/S, Incl 12)

- (1) Plant coded #04-06 was transferred to #04-07, Aug 48.
- (2) No items are in authorized use or exempt status at this plant.
- (3) The sum of ¥31,070 per month is allocated to this plant by the Japanese Government for three custodial personnel.
- (4) Maintenance and custody were satisfactory. Fire station is located within one mile.
