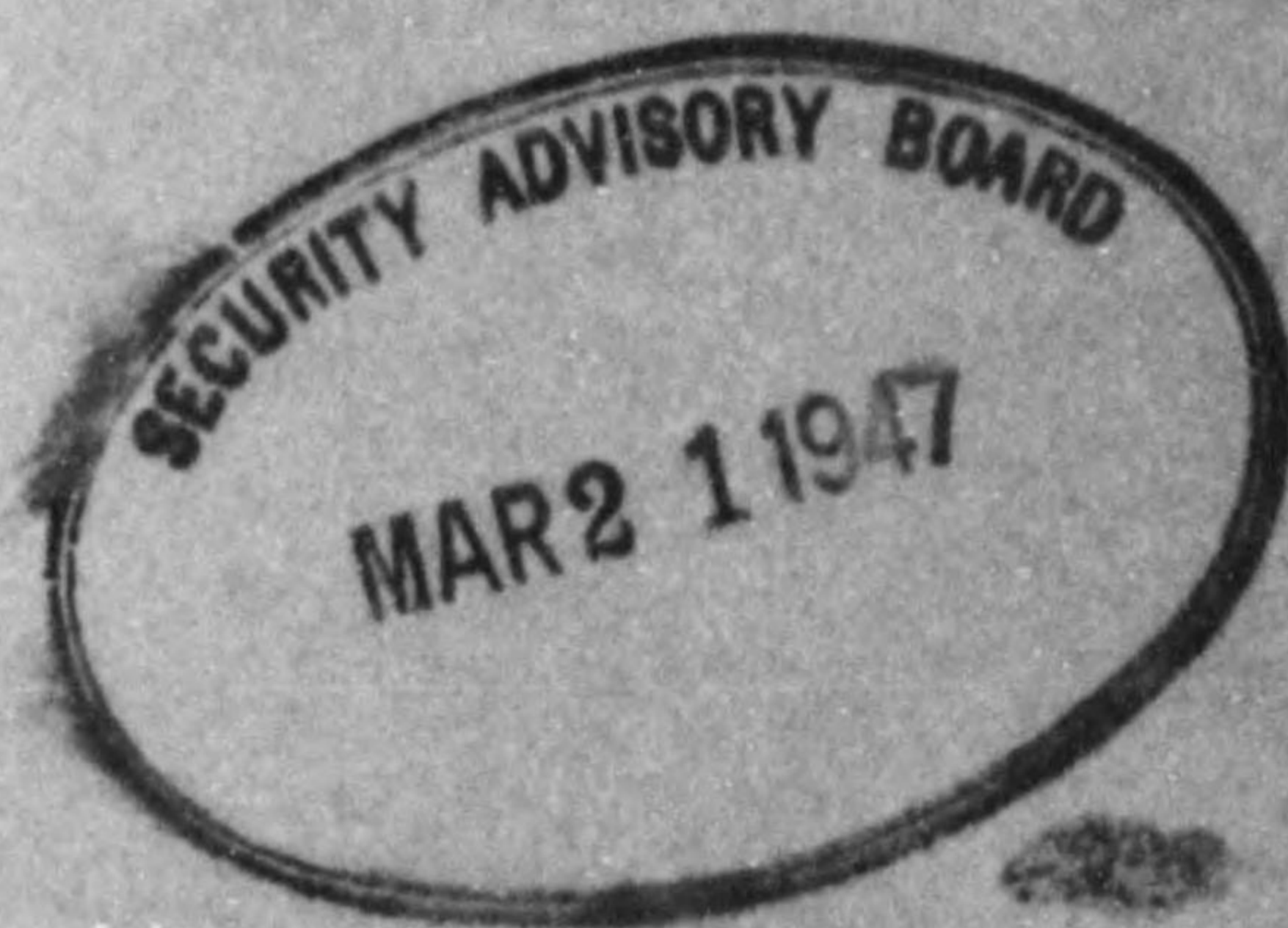

1. Three (3) showings of the State Department security film, at which the attendance of the Security Officers was permitted, have now been given in Room 474, Main State Building. In view of the fact that these showings were announced through the medium of the Security Advisory Board, the Secretary attended each of the showings and obtained the following attendance record:
