COVENANT OF THE STATE OF LOUISIANA.

WHEREAS a vacancy has been created in the office of Representative in the Congress of the United States of the third Congressional District of the State of Louisiana, comprised of the counties of Attakapas, Opelousas, Rapides, Natchitoches, Ouachita and Concordia; and where it is the duty of the Governor to cause an election to be held to fill said vacancy;

I, therefore, issue this my proclamation, directing an election to be held throughout said district on Monday, the 3rd day of March next, and on the two following days—notifying the electors thereof of the election aforesaid, commanding all Parish Judges, Sheriffs and other officers therein concerned, to hold an election on the days of election the usual places of holding elections of their respective counties, parishes and precincts and to use the same to be conducted, and due return thereof to be made, in the manner and within the time prescribed by law.

Given under my hand, and the seal of the State, at New Orleans, the 25th day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty four, and of the independence of the United States the fifty eight years.
