## PREFACE.

In the spring of 1899, Mr. Holgate published his "Winchester Long Rolls, 1653-1721," the first volume of a work for which he had been collecting materials since 1885. The text of a second volume, upon the same plan, was already in print at the time of his death; and it is by his request that I have undertaken to complete the book according to his intentions. The Long Rolls from 1723 to 1812, here reproduced in extenso from the originals, received the benefit of his own careful editing.

It will be noticed that, while the first volume ended with the Roll of 1721, the present begins with that of 1723 . The gap is due to the fact that the Roll of 1722 is one of those of which no copy has come to light, notwithstanding diligent inquiry during eighteen years. The earliest Roll as yet discovered is dated 1653. The years for which Rolls are still wanted are $1654-1667$ (inclusive), $1669,1671,1682,1687$, $1703,1705,1711,1715,1718$, and 1722 . One new discovery has been made since the first volume went to press-the missing Roll of 1689, an account and transcript of which will be found in Appendix II. Any information leading to the discovery of other missing Rolls would be most welcome.

The elaborate and exhaustive "Historical Introduction on the Development of Long Roll," prefixed by Mr. Holgate to the former volume, renders any lengthy introduction of mine superfluous. To that I would refer all inquirers who desire information upon matters of detail. With certain points which have since been raised I have dealt in some of the Appendices. It may, however, be advisable here briefly to recapitulate the sources from which Mr. Holgate obtained the Rolls which he examined and transcribed.

1. The Winchester College Collection, now in the Museum at the Quingentenary Buildings.

In this are combined the collections formerly owned or kept by the late Warden, the Rev. G. B. Lee, the late Sub-Warden, the Rev. G. W.

Heathcote, and the Bursar, Mr. T. F. Kirby. It thus includes Rolls of 1668, 1670, 1672 ( 2 copies), 1673 ( 2 copies), 1674 ( 2 copies), 1675 ( 2 copies), 1676 ( 2 copies), 1677 ( 3 copies), 1678 ( 2 copies), 1679, 1680, 1681, 1683, 1684, 1685, 1688-1702 (inclusive), 1704, 1706-1710 (inclusive), $1712,1714,1716,1717,1720$, and 1721 , and Rolls for every year from 1723 to 1812 (inclusive), with the exception of the eight years, $1727,1728,1733,1735,1738,1741,1742$, and 1748 . There are two copies for $1725,1736,1749,1774,1778,1779,1780,1781,1782,1785$, 1803, 1805, and 1806, and four copies for 1757.* It is to be hoped that success will crown Mr. H. J. Hardy's efforts to make this collection complete.
2. The New College Collection, in the custody, formerly of the late Dr. Sewell, and now of Dr. Spooner, as Warden of the College. Dr. Sewell lent to Mr. Holgate the Rolls of 1734, 1739-1792, and 17941799 (inclusive). The loan comprised two copies for the years 1744, $1758,1760,1762,1763,1765,1766,1768,1792$, and 1799.
3. The Blackstone Williams Collection, which was lent by Colonel Henry David Williams. This includes Rolls of 1727, 1740, 17471752, 1754-1764, 1766-1769, and 1771-1776 (inclusive), and 1778, with two copies for the years $1748,1749,1751,1754,1756,1757,1758$, $1763,1766,1767$ and 1772 , and three copies for 1773 and 1774.
4. Mr. Holgate's own collection comprises Rolls of 1719, 1720 , $1727,1729,1738,1760,1792,1793,1799,1800,1801,1802,1803$, 1807, 1808, 1810, 1816, 1820, 1824, 1825 (2 copies), 1835, 1837, 1841, 1843, 1844, 1846, 1851-1902 (inclusive). I have hopes that the earlier and more valuable portion of this collection, which, through the kindness of Mr. Holgate's sisters, is at present in my possession, will be allowed, upon the publication of this book, to form part of the Winchester College Collection, together with three Rolls of 1814, 1820, and 1824, which were recently given to me by Mr. J. C. Warner, of Winchester.
5. Rolls of $1728,1733,1735,1738,1745,1748,1759,1760,1768$, $1769,1787,1792,1799,1802,1803,1804,1807,1808,1810,1811$, and 1812, were lent by their respective owners to Mr. Holgate while engaged upon the first book, and in many cases again while engaged upon the present one. His Introduction to the former book, pp. lxxxv.-lxxxvii., contains some particulars about each of these Rolls and their ownership, with his own expression of thanks for the loan.

[^0]Further references to such of the above-mentioned Rolls as fall within the period covered by this book will often be found in Appendix I., which contains a short description of the Roll of each year from 1723 to 1812. The Roll which Mr. Holgate transcribed of 1784 is in the British Museum (Add. Ms., 29,535).

The text of the Rolls here printed was, as I have already said, wholly prepared and revised by Mr. Holgate himself. For the Index of Surnames which follows it I am indebted to Miss E. M. Samson, of 56 , Burlington Road, W. It was my privilege to be in constant communication with Mr. Holgate npon the subject of this book from the summer of 1900 , and in adding the Appendices I have been guided entirely by the plan of his own first volume, and by my knowledge of his expressed wishes and intentions. It should be borne in mind that the two books were only portions of a larger scheme which Mr. Holgate long had at heart and frequently mentioned in his Wykehamical works, the formation of a complete Register of Wykehamists, with proper biographical details. He regarded the publication of the Rolls as a step towards the realization of such a Register.

In addition to the Appendices, I have inserted three illustrations. One is a print of the College Arms, as they appear on Long Roll of 1723. This is taken from the original plate. Another is a reproduction, on a reduced scale, of the Arms which occur on Long Roll of 1724, and on all subsequent Long Rolls of the larger pattern, down to the year 1833, inclusive. It is reproduced from a photograph, taken from the Arms on a Roll of 1800, by Mr. Jacolette, of Harrington Road, S.W.

The third illustration, which forms the frontispiece, shows Mr. Holgate at work in his room at Salisbury Palace. The original photograph was a "snap-shot" taken by a friend, whose name I have not been able to discover. Should the book come into his hands, I trust that he will forgive the liberty I have taken in publishing his work. It was the only picture of Mr. Holgate which I could obtain, suitable for the purpose.

I must now record my grateful thanks to Mr. H. J. Hardy for the faeilities I have had in examining Long Rolls in the College Museum : to Dr. Spooner for the loan of Rolls in the New College Collection : to Mr. Theodore Kensington, for lending me his Roll of 1728 : to Mr. G. T. Warry, for procuring me the loan of Rolls of 1811 and 1812 : to Mr. T. F. Kirby, for the many opportunities he readily gave me of examining Registers and Records in his custody : and to the Fellows of

the College, for permitting the publication of the College Register, which will be found in Appendix VI.

I am indebted for much useful advice, information, and encouragement to Mr. W. H. B. Bird, Dr. F. G. Kenyon, Mr. G. W. Ricketts, Mr. H. W. B. Joseph, Mr. R. H. Moberly, and many other members of our Wykehamist Society, under whose auspices this book is published.

In conclusion, I must acknowledge my deep obligations to all the members of Mr. Holgate's family. Of the loss which they sustained through his early death it is difficult to speak. Their sorrow has been shared by all who had the privilege of knowing him ; and Wykehamists in particular will long cherish his memory with gratitude and affection.

## A SHORT MEMOIR OF MR. HOLGATE.

Clifford Wyndham Holgate was the only son, the second of three children, of Wyndham Holgate, of Knowles, Ardingly, Sussex, Barrister-at-law, H.M. Inspector of Poor Law Schools 1874-1896, and Ella Mary, second daughter of the late Rev. Henry Winckworth Simpson, Rector of Bexhill and Prebendary of Chichester. He was born on the 3rd January, 1859 ; and in 1869, when his family were living at Springfield House, Chelmsford, he became a pupil of the Rev. F. J. Manning, D.D., at the Trinity Church School, Springfield.

Thence, in September, 1872, he migrated to Winchester, where for the next five years he was a Commoner in the Rev. J. T. Bramston's Housc. He became a Prefect in the School and Head of his House, and was a member of the teams which represented Winchester in the competitions of 1875,1876 and 1877 for the Ashburton Shield at Wimbledon. In 1876 the Shield was won by Winchester, for the fourth time within six years.

Upon leaving School, Holgate went, in the autumn of 1877, to Brasenose College, Oxford, where he had for his tutor a brother Wykehamist, the Rev. John Wordsworth, afterwards Canon of Rochester, and now Bishop of Salisbury. The friendship which quickly sprang up between tutor and pupil eventually proved to be the main factor in the shaping of Holgate's career.

After taking his degrce in 1881, he began to read for the Bar in London, as a student of Lincoln's Inn, but two years later a serious illness rendered it necessary for him to travel abroad, and, in company with his elder sister, he visited Tasmania, New Zealand and Australia. There he spent much of his time in collecting particulars about the Colonial libraries, and on his return to England he embodied the results of this work in two pamphlets, published in 1886, "An Account of the Chief Libraries of Australia and Tasmania" and "An Account of the Chief Libraries of New Zealand." Contributions by "Wykehamist " to the "Adelaide Observer" of the 6th December, 1884, and the "St.

Helena Guardian " of the 4th June, 1885, show that he had 'already tried his hand as a writer. Throughout his life he was a frequent contributor of articles and letters to magazines and newspapers, and particularly to "The Guardian" and "The Salisbury and Winchester Journal." The papers he wrote for "The Wiltshire Archæological Magazine" include "A Proposed Bibliography of Wiltshire" (xxvi., 221) and "The Skull of the Poet Crabbe" (xxix., 3).

Holgate returned to England in July, 1885, the month in which the See of Salisbury fell vacant by the death of Dr. Moberly. The vacancy was filled by the appointment of Dr. Wordsworth, who at once invited Holgate to become his legal secretary. This offer, coming at a time when he was in a state of much uncertainty as to his prospects, was readily accepted; and, accordingly, after studying ecclesiastical law with Mr. Harry W. Lee and obtaining his call to the Bar, Holgate, in the summer of 1886 , took up his residence at Salisbury. And there he continued to reside for the next sixteen years, having his home for most of this time at the Bishop's Palace. In 1897 he was appointed Diocesan Registrar, but retained his post of secretary.

In 1902 he was promoted to the Chancellorship of the Diocese, succeeding another Wykehamist, the late Sir James Parker Deane ; and earlier in the same year he had been appointed by Archbishop Temple to the office of Actuary of the Lower House of Convocation for the Southern Province. The change of position led him to shift his headquarters from Salisbury to London. He was now in his forty-fourth year, and his friends were hoping that a career of useful work in a wider field was still before him. But he had scarcely settled in London before he was struck down by a painful and hopeless illness, which ended fatally on the 21st April, 1903. "Qualis sit cujusque fides, tribulatio probat." The gentleness and bravery with which he bore four months of continuous suffering showed the strength of his character and faith.

He died at Bexhill-on-Sea, and, at his own request, was buried in the Churchyard of St. Mark's, Bexhill, close to the Rectory House of his uncle, the Rev. James Harvey Simpson. He had many associations with the neighbourhood, and had recently printed, for private circulation, a "Memorial" of his maternal grandfather, who for thirty-six years was Rector of Bexhill.

Conspicuous amongst the qualities of character which endeared Holgate to his many friends were his absolute sincerity and unswerving loyalty. "Those jewels were paragon, without flaw, hair, ice, or cloud
in him." His life was one of strict self-denial and cheerful devotion to the interests of others; and the words, "In se severus, in amicos dulcis," to be inscribed npon the tablets to his memory in the Winchester College Cloisters and Salisbury Cathedral, give a most true description of the man.

Of the excellent way in which Holgate carried out his official duties at Salisbury the Bishop has written in the "Diocesan Gazette" of May, 1903, and the following passage is taken from his article :-
"He was like a son and a brother to me, absolutely at one with me in all good aims, intimate with all my official work and perfectly loyal, but always a frank critic and remembrancer, ready to put the other side and to think of all the various issues, which an extremely high sense of honour and a remarkable sensitiveness to the claims of friendship suggested to him. Few men have been so privileged in their fellowworkers as I have, and I should shrink from attempting to weigh one against another. But I can hardly imagine anyone doing the particular work which he had to do, as far as strength permitted, more perfectly and satisfactorily."

The above article, and another which appeared in "The Salisbury and Winchester Journal" of the 25th April, 1903, should be consulted by readers who desire to know more of Holgate's busy life at Salisbury, and of the active part he took in various organizations within and beyond the Diocese. A movement to commemorate his work on behalf of the Salisbury Choristers' School, by the foundation of an annual leaving prize for the boys, has been well supported. Here we must pass on to recall very briefly the special claims he has to be remembered at Winchester, where his chief interests, outside his professional work, were centred.

The "Wykehamical brotherhood" was with him no mere figure of speech; and not only was it his aim to foster relations with all whom he had known as schoolfellows, but he took delight in following up the career of every man who came to the School either before or after his own days there. Combining a keen interest in current events with a -strong taste for antiquarian research, he accumulated a vast knowledge about Wykehamists, both living and dead; and conceiving the idea that oue way of helping to knit the brotherhood together would be to compile a Register in which biographical details would be given of all members of the School from the foundation of the College onwards, he entered, with characteristic enthusiasm, upon the task of collecting materials for this "Ideal Register," as he used to call it. It may be

doubted whether he at any time expected to live to see the complete realization of this ideal. During the later years of his life he certainly did not; but he was a hard and zealous worker, and from time to time published books which he regarded as contributions towards its realization. And they are very substantial contributions, far more substantial, in fact, than his own modesty ever allowed him to think them. They are remarkable, also, for their accuracy, which was due to his horror of slip-shod work. The books here referred to are the following* :-

1. "Winchester Commoners. 1836-1890." Salisbury, Brown \& Co. : Winchester, J. Wells : London, Simpkin, Marshall \& Co. : 1891. He bequeathed to the College the copyright of this admirable Register, together with materials for a second edition to the end of 1900, and all Wykehamists will join in the Author's hope, expressed in his will, that " means may be found to continue the work."
2. "Winchester Commoners. 1800-1835." Salisbury, Brown \& Co. : Winchester, P. \& G. Wells : London, Simpkin, Marshall \& Co. : 1893. This is an index of the surnames on the Long Rolls, with an introduction and notes. His own annotated copy shows the pains he was taking to trace the identity and career of every Wykehamist.
3. "Winchester Long Rolls. 1653-1721." Winchester : P. \& G. Wells: 1899. This is the book of which the present volume is a continuation. The Introduction illustrates his power of arranging a mass of details.
4. "A Roll of Names and Addresses of Old Wykehamists." Winchester : P. \& G. Wells. In his Preface he suggested the formation of a Society, having as one of its objects that of publishing periodically a revised edition of the Roll. This suggestion was acted upon in 1902, when the "Wykehamist Society" was formed; and in July, 1903, the Society published a second edition, edited by the Secretary, Mr. G. W. Ricketts.
5. The present volume.

While these five books are Holgate's chief Wykehamical works, they by no means comprise the whole of his contribution to our knowledge of past members of the School. For nearly twenty years he kept in close touch with successive editors of "The Wykehamist," steadily supplying them with obituary notices and lists of honours and appointments, and occasionally sending articles which ought not to be forgotten. As "The Wykehamist," which is now in its ninth volume, has never

It was not only as a writer that Holgate showed his love of Winchester. No gathering of Wykehamists seemed complete without him. He was for many years a staunch friend of the College Mission at Landport, and a member of its Committee. The valuable collection of portraits in the Quingentenary Museum was due chiefly to his labours, and he enriched the Museum with many gifts, to which, at his request, his family has made large additions since his death, out of the store of books, pamphlets, and manuscripts he had industrionsly accumulated.

Though his life was short, the use which he made of his time enabled him to accomplish much, and his greatest work was the abiding influence for good which he has left in the hearts of his friends.

## APPENDIX I.

## Notes on Long Rolls, 1723-1812.

Mr. Holgate intended that there should be an Appendix, similar to the first Appendix in his "Winchester Long Rolls, 1653-1721," in which some account should be given of "any special foatures of interest connected with the actual manuscript Rolls printed for the first time in this book." He made some notes for this Appendix, which he contemplated would be short, because "this series of the Rolls presents fewer points of interest than the earlier one." He had, moreover, already dealt with many of these points at considerable length in the Introduction to his former book, and he probably did not propose that all the details there given should be repeated here.

In my attempt to carry out Mr. Holgate's intentions, I have made use of his notes, relying upon them entirely for descriptions of such Rolls as I have not been able to see for myself. I have, however, personally examined a large number of the Rolls which are here described, and particularly the Rolls in the Winchester College Muscum Collection, the Rolls in the New College Collection, and the Rolls in the Holgate Collection.

All the Rolls referred to in this Appendix may be presumed to be of vellum or parchment, with the exception of such as are expressly stated to be of paper. They may be presumed also to be of the larger type of Roll, which has the Classes arranged in two parallel columns, unless they are described as being of the smaller type, in which the Classes are arranged, one beneath the other, in a single column.

From a Roll in the Winchester College Museum Collection. 1723. It is of the smaller type, and measures $36 \frac{1}{4}$ by $2 \frac{7}{8}$ inches. The Arms are engraved from the plate which provides the illustration to this volume (at p. 1). The plate was described in the Introduction to the earlier series of Rolls, p. xx., and was used to supply the frontispiece to that book.

The Warden appears in gilt laid over green, the Sub-Warden in blue, and the Head Master in red. All the names are written in a beautiful, neat, engrossing hand, and the Roll has a cardboard case with marbled paper. In sixth book seven names are crossed through, and three of these are also marked with a cross. Another hand has written "Kinchin " against " Kintchin" in fourth book.

The seventh name on the roll ad Winton is that of Henry Winford Parker, whose surname does not appear in Mr. Kirby's Scholars. He was the Rev. Sir Henry Parker, D.D., Rector of Rotherfield Greys, Oxfordshire, who died in 1782 , and was succeeded as baronet by his brother, Vice-Admiral Sir Hyde Parker (Scholar, admitted 31st Aug., 1725).

Speed, sen., second in the School, was Samuel Speed, who became Second Master in 1740. Purnell, in the fifth place below him, became Warden of New College (1740), and would have become Warden of Winchester (1757), had not the Visitor, Bishop Hoadly, refused to admit him, and thus put an end to the practice, which Warden Nicholas began in 1679, of making the one Wardenship a stepping-stone to the other. "Goldwing," on the roll ad Winton, was Christopher Golding, who obtained the Wardenship denied to John Purnell.

There are twenty-nine Commoners and fifteen Choristers on the Roll, which was made up between 6th October, when William Winder (or Wynder) was admitted into College, and 2nd December, when Parker was admitted.

From a Roll in the College Museum Collection, measuring 1724. $32 \frac{1}{8}$ by $5 \frac{1}{8}$ inches. The date " 1724 " is written beneath the Arms, which are engraved from a copper plate, apparently used for the first time this year. The Arms on all the large pattern series of Rolls from 1724 to 1833 (inclusive) was produced from this plate, or from an exact copy of it. A full description of the design was given in the Introduction to the earlier series, p. xxi., and a reproduction of the Arms appears as an illustration to the present volume at p. 201.

The Roll, which is not by the same hand as that which wrote the Roll of 1723 , has the names of the boys in two columns, and each column is ruled to make three divisions, the Scholars being entered in the left-hand division, the Choristers in the right-hand, and the Commoners in the central. This seems to be the first instance in which the Commoners are placed in the centre of the column. Other instances are afforded by the Rolls of $1725,1726,1728$, and 1729 . In the space at the foot of the Roll there is a fine piece of penmanship, the drawing of a flying bird. The Roll has a black case.

The number of the Commoners on the Roll is thirty-five ; of the Choristers, sixteen, the full number for the first time on any known Roll since 1709. Of the boys on the roll ad Winton, only Sonthby, C.F., appears on the Roll as already admitted into College. The next four boys, Lydiatt, Russell, Loveling and Burgh, appear as Commoners. Southby and Lydiatt were admitted into College on 4th September, Russell on 8th October, Loveling on 9th November, and Burgh on 28th November.

Erratum (p. 4), read Fyler for Tyler.

From one of two Rolls in the College Museum Collection. 1725. The Roll selected for printing is of the smaller type, and measures $35 \frac{1}{8}$ by $2 \frac{7}{8}$ inches. It is in the same handwriting as the Roll of 1724 ; and is soiled at the foot, where it bears the marks of a nail. The Arms are as in 1723 , the date " 1725 " being written, half on one side of the pendent end of the garter, and half on the other.

The Roll was made up before 4th September, the day on which Joseph Smith, and Edwin Sandys, C.F., were admitted into College. The Commoners, of whom there are thirty-eight, are again in the centre of the column, which has three divisions, ruled as in 1724; but there is only one column. There are fourteen Choristers. The second Roll in the Museum is of the larger type, and measures 31 by 5 inches.

Dr. John Cobb, the Warden, and Dr. Thomas Cheyney, the Head Master, having died, their places are now filled by Dr. Joln Dobson (Scholar 1699), and Mr. John Burton (Scholar 1705), who was a Rugbeian before he became a Wykehamist. The boys who appear on the roll ad Winton as Warnbrough and Gresby are named Thomas Wansbrongh and Francis Gresley in the College Register of Admissions.

From a Roll, in a marbled case, in the College Museum 1726. Collection. It is of the larger type, measuring $28 \frac{6}{8}$ by $5_{4}^{\frac{1}{4}}$ inches, with the Arms as in 1724, and the date spread out beneath them. The writing is the same as in 1725 , and the names of the Commoners, of whom there are thirty-six, are again in the centre of the columns. There are only eleven Choristers.

The curious feature about this Roll is the name "Bromfield, C.F.," written in the margin of the roll ad Winton, in a handwriting different from that of the rest of the Roll, but apparently of the same date. The explanation is to be found in Mr. Kirby's "Annals," pp. 75, 76. George I. having nominated John Trenchard Bromfield for election, the Wardens of New College and Winchester delivered to the King a letter of remonstrance, which resulted in the abolition of nominations by the Crown. While the matter was being considered by the AttorneyGeneral, the roll for Winchester College was made up, and the Wardens, says Mr. Kirby, "under advice added Bromfield's name at the foot, 'quem nominamus sub hac conditione, ut admittatur in primum successionis locum postquam regiae litterae confirmatae fuerint.' It is scarcely necessary to add that Bromfield was not admitted." Here his name has been pat in the margiu, and he is described as Founder's Kin.

Wither's name was omitted by the scribe from the roll ad Winton, and was added by a contemporary hand. The fact of there being only sixty-nine Scholars on the Roll is probably due to the omission of Robert Meetkirke's name. He was admitted into College on 26th March, 1726. The Roll was made up after the admission of Dobson on 21 st September, and before that of Stokes on 8th October.

From a Roll in the Holgate Collection, which is of the 1727. smaller type, and measures $33 \frac{1}{8}$ by $2 \frac{1}{2}$ inches. The Blackstone Williams Collection also contains a Roll of 1727 , which is of the same type, but in another handwriting. The differences between the two Rolls show that the one selected for printing is of a slightly earlier date. It was apparently made up before 3rd September, the day on which John Ellis and Thomas Lydiatt, C.F., and Humphrey Wadcock, the first three boys on the roll ad Winton, were admitted into College.

In the Blackstone Williams Roll, which was made up later, (Francis) Lydiatt, C.F., is head of the School, Alcock having left it, and Lowth is in sixth book; (Henry) Burgh is a Commoner next below Cross, and "Lydiatt, jun." (Thomas Lydiatt, C.F.) is a Scholar in 2nd Chamber, next below Russell ; below Pitney there are two Commoners, Hulbert and Heywood, and below Rolle there are two more Commoners, Bowles, sen., and Whitehead, none of whom appears on the Holgate Roll as a member of the School; "Wadcock, sen." (Charles Wadcoek) is a Commoner, in fourth book, below "Smith, med."; "Ellis, sen." (John Ellis, C.F.) is a Scholar in 6th Chamber, in the same place in the School ; and "Wadcock, jun." (Humphrey Wadcock) is a Scholar in 1st Chamber between Withers and Savage. Although Henry Burgh has become a Commoner, his younger brother, Bertie Burgh, who was elected a Scholar in his stead, is not yet in the School. He was not admitted into College until 9th January, 1727.

The Chamber numbers of the following are different on the Blackstone Williams Roll, viz., Lowth, 3 ; Thomas, sen., 2 ; Loveling, 5 ; Chapman, 4 ; Beeston and Dobson, 7 ; Airay, 3 ; Russell, 2 ; Sandys, jun., 3 ; Gresley, 5 ; Clayton, 3 ; Stokes, 2 ; Bartholomew and Parker, jun., 1; Dowdeswell, 4; Wansbrough, 6; Peckham, 5 ; Heath, 6; Markham, 7 ; and Sandby, 3. Goring, jun., is in 4th Chamber in the Blackstone Williams Roll, and in 6th (misprinted 4th) in the Holgate Roll.

Both the Rolls have cardboard cases with marbled paper. The top end of the case for the Blackstone Williams Roll has "Sept. 10, 1727. Speed" written on it, which suggests that it was the property of Robert Speed, the Scholar who then stood second in the School.

This year a return is made to the practice of placing the Commoners on the right hand side of the column, instead of in the centre as in 1724,1725 , and 1726 , and that practice, though not followed in 1728 and 1729 , prevailed in and after 1730. On the Blackstone Williams Roll there are forty-six Commoners, and on the Holgate Roll forty-three. Neither Roll contains more than fourteen Choristers.

Lowth, the Scholar who is mentioned above, was Robert Lowth, the Founder's biographer, who became Bishop successively of St. David's, Oxford, and London. The eighth boy on the roll ad Winton was William Whitehead, the future Poet Laureate.

From a Roll belonging to Mr. Theodore Kensington
1728. (Scholar 1856), of Culver House, Winchester, and given to him by the Rev. William Henry Walter Bigg Wither (Scholar 1822). It is of the smaller type, measuring $34 \frac{1}{4}$ by $2 \frac{3}{4}$ inches, and the Arms, which have the date " 1728 " in red above the motto, are the same as in 1723. Gilt old English text is ased for the names of Dr. Dobson and Lord Brooke ; and the Head Master, the Chaplains, Sir Bouchier Wrey, the headings, the Chamber numbers, the additions of "C. F.," and the lines (where not in blue) are in red. The SubWarden and the Second Master are in blue; and so apparently were the Fellows, but their names are now so faint that they can only be guessed at, save for the "Dr." of Harris, and "Mr. Bowles." This is the earliest known Roll which bears the initials of "A. H."-in red, at the foot-and the writer has introduced, apparently for the first time, the names of the Oxford Electors, Warden Bigg in gilt, and the Posers in red.

There are fifty-seven Commoners, in the centre again ; and sixteen Choristers. The Roll was made up between 3rd October, when George Spiltimber was admitted into College, and 10th November, when Thomas Thornton was admitted.

The Roll is preserved in a six inch wood and cardboard case, covered black, which has a little old label with " 1728 " written on it. The wooden collar of the case is 2 inches long, and the cap $2 \frac{7}{8}$. Oue side of the collar is broken.

From a paper Roll, of the smaller type, in the Holgate 1729. Collection, with additions supplied by a parchment Roll in the College Museum Collection.
The paper Roll, when Mr. Holgate acquired it, had the end torn away from below Baker's name on the roll ad Oxon, and Martin's on the roll ad Winton; but the latter roll was continued to Silke's name in a fragment, separately preserved. This fragment has now been reattached, and some tears in the Roll have been skilfully mended, under the superintendence of Mr. Scargill-Bird, of the Public Record Office.

The paper is water-marked with vertical lines and the Royal Arms; and the Roll, which, so far as it now goes, measures 64 by $3 \frac{11}{16}$ inches, was formed by joining together five pieces of the paper, the first joint coming between the names of Bagster and Dobson, sen., and the last above the rolls ad Oxon and ad Winton, which are placed in paraltel columns. The Arms, stuck on at the head, have the character of an engraved book-plate. Wykcham's Arms appear in a garter, with the mitre above, and on each side a cornucopia, twisting round the garter and supporting two scrolls, the upper one with "Mancrs Makyth Man," and the lower with "Collegium B. Mariae prope Winton" upon it. The names of the Warden, the Sub-Warden, the Head Master, Sir Bouchier

Wrey, Lord Ossulstone, Mr. Tracey, and Lord Brooke, and the first two names both in the list of the Commoners in College and in the list of the Eleetors, are in a green which is probably either faded gold or a preparation for gold. Red ink is used for the Fellows, the Second Master, and the Chamber numbers, \&c., and blue for the Chaplains, the Organist, Mr. Greville, Mr. Powlett, sen., Mr. Powlett, jun., \&c.

The Commoners, for the last time, are in the centre. There are seventy-five of them, and fourteen Choristers. The Roll is peculiar in giving the names of all the six Electors, instead of only the three who attended from Oxford; and the introduction of a special list of the Commoners in College is noteworthy. This list was discontinued after 1733.

The Roll ( $35 \frac{1}{4}$ by $5 \frac{1}{4}$ inches) in the College Muscum has a marbled case. It is of the larger type, and bears the initials of "A. H." Gilt is used for the Warden, the Sub-Warden, the Head Master, Lords Ossulstone and Brooke, and the Oxford Electors ; red for the Fellows, the Second Master, the Chaplains and the Organist, the headings, the Chamber numbers, the additions of "C.F.," and the illustrious Commoners. Most of the lines are in blue, and there is a drawing of a head in profile under the scribe's initials.

This Roll was made up between the admissions into College of Joseph Trapp and Richard Head, who were respectively admitted on the 26 th September, 1729, and the 16th January, $17 \frac{29}{30}$; and it includes, in fifth book, senior part, the name of (Henry) Peckham, a Scholar who matriculated at Trinity College, Oxford, on the 16th December, 1729. It differs considerably from the Roll selected for printing, as regards the order of the boys' names. For instance, the names in fourth book, junior part, run thus :-Masters, C. F. : Head, jun. : Chaffin : Harbin: Ford : Gregory : L ${ }^{\text {d }}$ Brook : Horne : Hanham : Price, sen. : Price, jun. : Ridge, sen. : Eyre, sec. : Hudson : Awbrey, C. F.: Fitzherbert : Bertie: Mundy : Mills : Leeves, jun. : Griffith : Perfect : Vander : Craven, jun. : Hencoek, sen. Instead of "Secunda Classis," there is a "Secun. et Qua. Class." (with no junior part) which begins with Breton and Voakes and ends with Hencock, jun., and Bourne.

Dr. Burton, who was only M.A. when he became Head Master, took his degree of D.D. on the 3rd November, 1729. The Rolls are therefore of a later date; but must have been made up before the 2nd January, $17 \frac{2}{3} 9$, the day on which Warden Dobson died.

From a Roll ( $35 \frac{1}{4} \frac{1}{4}$ by $5 \frac{1}{4}$ inches) in the College Muscum 1730. Collection. It is an "A. H." Roll, with flourishing pen twists, and the drawing of a head in profile in a space in sixth book. Gilt is used for the date (" 1730 ") under the Arms, and for the Warden, the Sub-Warden, the Head Master, four of the Commoners in College, and the Electors ; and scarlet for the Fellows, the Second

Master, the Chaplains, the Organist, the Commoners in College (if not in gilt), the headings, Chamber numbers, and additions of "C. F."

Henry Bigg, D.D. (Scholar, 1704), appears as Warden, and his brother, Walter Bigg (Scholar, 1715), as Fellow, both for the first time. The list of Fellows on the Roll contains the name of "Mr. Palmer," but it has been struck through, and "Mr. Bowles" has been written in black ink above, to correct the scribe's error. Samuel Palmer died before the 29th July, 1730, when the Fellowship vacant through his death went to Walter Bigg; and the Roll was made up between the 28th August, when Thomas Milles, and the ten boys above him on the roll ad Winton, were admitted into College, and the 5th October, wheu Thomas Soane was admitted.

This year there were eighty-seven Commoners and fifteen Choristers. Hamblen, the senior Chorister, was a Prefect in fifth book.

From a Roll in a black case, in the College Museum Collec1731. tion. Gilt, scarlet, and blue are employed, and sketches and flourishes introduced, in the fashion usual in the "A. H." Rolls. In this Roll, and in those for 1732, 1733, and 1736, the numbers of the Scholars, Choristers, and Commoners are recorded at the foot. There were exactly one hundred Commoners in 1731, their number reaching three figures for the first time in the history of Long Rolls. The Roll was made up after the 4th September, 1731, when William Woodford, and the boys above him on the roll ad Winton, were admitted into College, and before the 26 th January, $173 \frac{1}{2}$, when John Rogers was admitted. The exact date of Thomas Monro's admission is not recorded in the Register.

From a Roll ( $37 \frac{1}{4}$ by $5 \frac{1}{4}$ inches) in the College Museum 1732. Collection. This year "A. H." has put the names of Wallop, sen., Tracy, Hawley, Wallop, sec., and Wallop, jun., into blue old English characters. The Roll was made up between the admissions of Benjamin Way ( 9 Sept.) and Charles Clarke (23 Oct.).

From a beautiful "A. H." Roll, which Mrs. Harbin, of 1733. Newton Surmaville, Somerset, lent to Mr. Holgate in 1892. His notes state that the Roll ( 38 by $2 \frac{3}{4}$ inches) is of the smaller type, and with the Arms as in 1723. Gilt, scarlet, and blue are used ; a head in profile is drawn beneath the word "Praefecti," and a swan in "Quarta Classis" (junior pars). The "A. H." clause is written on the back of the extreme end of the Roll, behind the rolls ad Oxon and ad Winton. This is the earliest year in which any known

Roll bears a date in full. The names of Fox, Ball, and Middleton, on the roll $a d$ Winton, are not in the Register of Admissions.

From a Roll ( $34 \frac{3}{4}$ by $5 \frac{1}{4}$ inches) in the New College Collec1734. tion. It is an elaborate "A. H." Roll, with plenty of sketches and flourishes. There are eleven names in gold, beginning with the Warden, and thirty-one in red, beginning with the Fellows. Of the lines drawn across the Roll, the first seven are in gold, the last three in red, and the other ten in blue. The perpendicular lines, the headings, the Chamber numbers, and the additions of "Praefecti" and "C. F." are in red, and so is the date under the Arms. The Roll selected for printing has no case, but another "A. H." Roll of 1734, in the College Museum Collection, has a case covered with marbled paper.

The number of the Commoners was one hundred and twenty-three, a number not reached again until 1804, when there were one hundred and thirty-two Commoners. We shall now see the number sinking, year by year, until in 1751 it is down to eight. There were fifteen Choristers, of whom Fitzherbert was a Prefect in fifth book.

From an "A. H." Roll, belonging to Mr. Nathaniel Bond, 1735. of Creech Grange, in the Isle of Purbeck, Dorset, which Mr. Holgate copied in 1890, and examined again in 1902. It is of the small type, measuring $38 \frac{1}{8}$ by $2 \frac{3}{4}$ inches, with the Arms as in 1723 , and has a cardboard case with coloured, flowered paper, $4 \frac{1}{4}$ inches long. The "parts" of the Classes are not named, but are indicated, as in the Roll of 1733 , by red dividing lines. The Warden, Sub-Warden, and Head Master are in gilt, with gilt lines between. Gilt lines also divide the Fellows from the Chaplains, and the Chaplains from the Sehool. Red is used for the date at the top, the Peers, the Chamber numbers, and the additions of "Praef." and "C. F." The names of the Pcers are engrossed, and the whole Roll is very neatly written. It has a head in profile in Sexta Classis. The names below Waterhouse on the roll ad Oxon, and below Beaver on the roll ad Winton, are written on the back of the Roll, as if the last inch of parchment had been bent back and the names continued. The above description is taken from Mr. Holgate's notes.

There were one hundred and three Commoners, twenty less than in 1734, and fourteen Choristers. Thomas Bond, fourteenth on the roll ad Winton, did not become "Prebendary of Winchester, 1788," as stated in Mr. Kirby's Scholars. He was a member of the Inner Temple, who died in 1773, and the Wykehamist who became Prebendary of Winchester in 1788 was Dr. Joseph Warton. Warton's name occurs one place above that of Bond.

Erratum (p. 35), for Bales read Bates.

From a Roll, in the College Museum Collection, which is ornamented somewhat after the style of "A. H.," but by a new hand. No gold is used, but all the names down to and including the name of the Organist are in scarlet, and so are the names of the New College Electors, and the twenty-five illustrious Commoners. The Arms of Bamfylde at the foot of the Roll are or, on a bend, gutes, three mullets, sable. There is no date on the Roll. A peculiarity is the use of the word "alumni," instead of the customary "pueri," both in the scarlet heading above sixth book, and in the numbers given at the foot. The number of the Commoners is there given as one hundred and eight, but the Roll itself records only one hundred and six. This Roll has a black case.

The College Museum Collection contains a second Roll of 1736, which was amongst the Rolls found by the late Warden, the Rev. Godfrey Bolles Lee, at his House, in 1899. (See Mr. Holgate's letter to The Wykehamist October, 1899, No. 362). It was in a black case, labelled 1775. This is an "A. H." Roll ( $355{ }^{5}$ by 5 inches), with the date in full, "Sept. 7th, 1736," beneath the Arms. It lacks the addition of "Pos." after Mr. Hervey's name in the list of Electors.

From a Roll ( 385 by 5 inches), in a black case, in the
173\%. College Museum Collection. It is an "A. H." Roll, and in his best style as regards the writing, the use of gold and scarlet, and the introduction of sketches and flourishes. It has the date in full under the Arms. There are three Founder's Kin on the roll ad Winton, Edward Trotman, C.F., being allowed to take the place of his brother, Fiennes Trotman (1734). There are ninety-seven Commoners. The fifteen Choristers have a Prefect, Hillyard, in fifth book, middle part.

From a Roll ( $37 \frac{7}{8}$ by $5 \frac{3}{16}$ inches), in the Holgate Collection,
1738. which "A. H." hasornamented with gilt and scarlet, and sketches and flourishes, in his usual manner. The Classes are arranged in two columns, the second beginning with "Quarta Classis"; and a red line runs down the centre of each column, to divide the Scholars on the left from the Commoners on the right, the names of the Choristers being written, more or less, on the line itself. This Roll has a case made of thin wood with cardboard outside, the top being of cardboard alone, and the whole covered with paper which has a raised flowerpattern in various colours. I shall henceforth use the term "flowered case " to denote a case with paper of this description.

In December, 1885, Mr. Holgate copied a Roll of 1738, which was lent to him by the late Rev. John Acton (Scholar 1836). This Roll, which Mr. Holgate described in The Wykehamist, February, 1886, No. 205, has Mr. Taggart's name spelt " Tagget"; the addition of "Praef."
after the name of Tryon, sell., is wanting, and there are a few other slight differences.

The number of the Commoners was seventy-four, a fall of twentythree since 1737. There were thirteen Choristers.

From a caseless "A. H." Roll ( $33 \frac{11}{16}$ by $5 \frac{1}{16}$ inches) in the
1739. New College Collection, which has the Classes, and the names in them, arranged as in 1738. There is an "A. H." Roll of the same date in the College Museum Collection. It is one of the Rolls found by Warden G. B. Lee in 1899, and has a black case.

The Commoners have fallen to fifty-eight, and there were only nine Choristers. This is the last year in which Christopher Eyre (Scholar 1683) appears on the Rolls as Second Master. As stated in the inscription to his memory in Winchester Cathedral, "Cessit e schola, Dec. 1739 : e vita, $9^{\circ}$ die Maii 1743, aet. 74." His successor was Samuel Speed (Scholar 1718).

Errata, pp. 46, 47. Read Catcott for Calcott, in accordance with the entry in the Register of Admissions, "Alexander Catcott de Civitate Bristol. Nat. 2 Nov. 1725. Adm. 8 Sep. 1739," which has the marginal note, "Rec. Sup. Ann., Coll. Wadham Scholaris."

From a black-cased Roll ( 38 by $5 \frac{1}{8}$ inches) in the College 1740. Museum Collection, one of the Rolls found by Warden G. B. Lee in 1899. There is another "A. H." Roll ( $36 \frac{1}{4}$ by $5 \frac{3}{16}$ inches), also dated "Sept. $2^{\text {d }} 1740$," in the New College Collection. It has a flowered case. A third Roll for 1740, in the Blackstone Williams Collection, is of the smaller type, and with the Arms as in 1723. This was also the work of "A. H.," who employed gold and scarlet, and introduced drawings, in his usual manner. The Roll is divided down the centre by a scarlet line; the Scholars are on the left, the Commoners on the right, and the Choristers against the line on the left.

There are forty-two Commoners, and only eight Choristers on the Roll. It was Warden Coxed's first year. Dr. Bigg died in August, 1740, and Dr. Coxed (Scholar 1710), who had been Warden of New College, succeeded him at Winchester. On the 2nd September, the date on the Roll, the Wardenship of New College was vacant, and the name of "Mr. Coker, Vice-Custos," appears at the head of the Oxford Electors.

From Rolls in the New College Collection.
1741-1746 (inclusive). They are "A. H." Rolls of the larger type, and all have flowered cases, except the Roll of 1744 , which is caseless. It seems sufficient to note merely the following points.
1741. The number of the Commoners was thirty-three; of the Choristers, fifteen. Thomas Morris, ninth on the roll ad Winton, did not go to Jesus College, Oxford, as stated in Scholars. He joined the 17th Foot. See Public Characters of 1806, pp. 322 et seq.
1742. The number of the Commoners was twenty-eight; of the Choristers, again fifteen.
1743. The number of the Commoners again stood at twenty-eight. There was the full number of sixteen Choristers, for the first time on any known Roll since 1728.

The College Museum Collection contains a Roll for this year, one of the Rolls found by Warden G. B. Lee in 1899. It is an "A. H." Roll, of the larger type, and is in a black case. It bears, under the Arms, the date in full, "Septr. $6^{\text {th }} 1743$."

1744 . There were thirty-two Commoners; and sixteen Choristers, of whom Chandler was in sixth book.

A second "A. H." Roll for this year, in the New College Collection, differs from that here printed by calling the lowest form "Quarta et Sec ${ }^{\text {a }}$ Classis," and not "Secun ${ }^{\text {a }}$ et Quarta Classis." It has "Tonyng" in fourth book, junior part, instead of "Tonyn," and "Reddey" on the roll ad Winton, instead of "Ready." An "A. H." Roll in the College Museum Collection has "Tonyn," "Reddy," and "Secun ${ }^{2}$ et Quarta Classis."
1745. There were thirty-three Commoners, and sixteen Choristers. The College Museum Collection has a Roll for this year, one of the Rolls found in 1899. In The Wykehamist, Nos. 203, 205 (Nov., 1885 ; Feb., 1886), Mr. Holgate described a Roll of 1745, which became the property of the Rev. Edward Hungerford Goddard (Commoner 1868), Rector of Clyffe Pypard, Wilts.
"Staker" and " Chaunler," on the Roll ad Winton, were respectively John Staker, admitted into College on 6th September, and John Chaunler, admitted on 28th October, 1745. Their names are misprinted in Mr. Kirby's Scholars.
1746. The Roll contains the names of twenty-seven Commoners, and fifteen Choristers. The College Museum Collection has a Roll for this year, one of those which were found in 1899.

From a Roll ( $39 \frac{3}{8}$ by 5 inches), with a flowered case, in the 174\%. New College Collection. It is the carliest of the series of Rolls which have the initials " J. S." at the foot. These initials appear regularly on the Rolls down to and including that for 1762 . They also appear on a Roll for 1766 in the College Museum Collection. Like his predecessor "A. H.," "J. S." utilized vacant spaces for the display of his penmanship, introducing birds, fishes, and twirligigs ; but the head in profile, a special feature of the work of "A. H.," no longer appears, and after 1750 the drawings on the Rolls I have seen become less frequent.

They cease, I believe, after 1757. The fish, and the promotion of the Second Master to the glory of gilt, may be regarded as traits which distinguish the best work of "J. S."

Besides the Roll selected for printing, there are two Rolls of 1747, one in the Blackstone Williams Collection, the other in the College Museum Collection. The Museum Roll differs from the other two by having, under the Arms, the date in full, "Septr 8, 1747." The Roll here printed has the year written on it thrice, under the Arms, at the foot, and in the body of a swan drawn beneath fourth book, junior part. It has the name of "Percival, C.F.," inked througl with a shaky pen. The three Rolls differ as regards the colours employed : for instance, in the New College Roll the Chaplains are in blue ; they are in yellow in the Roll at Winchester ; and in pink, according to Mr. Holgate's note, in the Blackstone Williams Roll. On the back of the last mentioned Roll there is a list, entitled "Nomina Sociorum Novi Collegii" (1748), and containing the names of 64 Fellows and 6 Probationers.

In 1747 the Roll contained twenty-two Commoners and ten Choristers. As regards the names on the roll ad Winton, "Bursland" appears as William Burland in the Register of Admissions, and "Shotter" does not appear in the Register. "Cooke," called "Cook" in the Register, and misprinted "Cock" in Scholars, was Dr. John Cooke, President of Corpus Christi College, Oxford, 1783-1823. James Eyre became Chief Baron of the Exchequer (1787) and Chief Justice of the Common Pleas (1793). The statement in Scholars that he went to Merton College is incorrect. He was a member of St. John's College, Oxford.

From Rolls, with flowered cases, in the 1748-1751 (inclusive). New College Collection. They are "J. S." Rolls, and, like all which follow, have the date in full. They are less ornate than the Roll of 1747, blue being no longer employed. Pink is used in the Rolls of 1748 and 1751, scarlet in those of 1749 and 1750 . Where pink is used, the Second Master gets only pink, but on the Rolls which have scarlet his name is in gilt. The following further points may be here noticed.

There are two Rolls of this year in the Blackstone Williams 1748. Collection ; and one of them, of which Mr. Holgate obtained a copy in 1886, omits the name of Hollist from fifth book, middle part. Mr. Holgate's notes about a Roll of 1748, lent to him in 1890 by Miss G. S. M. Glasse, of Chettle, Dorset, state that the Arms are touched with colour : there are no Chamber numbers : the Roll measures $34 \frac{3}{4}$ by $5 \frac{3}{8}$ inches, whereas that which is here printed measures $35 \frac{3}{8}$ by $5 \frac{3}{16}$ inches.

There were seventeen Commoners. "Chaunler," on the roll ad Winton, was James Chaunler (not Chaunter, as in Scholars). "Probyn" does not appear in the Register: Moore is entered above Nicholls in the

Register, but the entries state that Nieholls was admitted on 10 Sept., and Moore subsequently on 2 Dec. 1748.

The Roll here printed measures $37 \frac{1}{2}$ by 5 inches. The
1749. College Museum Collection has two "J. S." Rolls of 1749 , one in a black, and the other in a flowered case. There are also two Rolls in the Blackstone Williams Collection, and in 1886 Mr . Holgate obtained a copy of one of them.

There were fourteen Commoners. All the Rolls of this year seem to regard Price, in "Second and Fourth," as a Scholar (the seventieth), but none of them give him a Chamber number. The name, though it is on the roll ad Winton, is not in the Register of Admissions, nor does it occur in Long Roll of 1750. The second of the two Holloways in the roll ad Winton is not mentioned in the Register. John Hook, who is eighth on the same roll, matriculated at University College, Oxford, on 14 November, 1755 . The note to his name in Mr. Kirby's Scholars is incorrect, and ascribes to him the career of John Hooke, C.F., second on the roll ad Winton of 1753 , and first on the roll ad Oxon of 1756 , who was Head Master of Bedford School (1773-1810).

The Roll here printed measures $36 \frac{3}{4}$ by 5 inches. The 1750. College Museum Collection has a black-cased "J. S." Roll of this year, which, like that of 1749 , was found by Warden G. B. Lee in 1899. There were ten Commoners. As in 1748 and 1749, the Choristers reached their full number of sixteen.

The Blackstone Williams Collection has two Rolls of this 1751. year ; and the College Museum Collection has one, measuring $34 \frac{5}{8}$ by $5 \frac{1}{8}$ inches. The Commoners have dwindled down to eight. Fron this point their number begins to rise again until fiftyeight is reached in 1762. There were only twelve Choristers, and the Roll mentions only sixty-eight Scholars. Chandler, on the roll ad Winton, is not in the Register of Admissions.

From Rolls in the College Mnseum Collection. The 1752, 1753. Roll of 1752 has a flowered case, and the Roll of 1753, which is one of the Rolls found in 1899, has a black one.

The New College Collection has a Roll, in a flowered ease, for each of these years. That for 1752 has a flying bird drawn in a space below fifth book, junior part, and omits the name of Treakle, a Chorister in fifth book, middle part. The Roll of 1753 has some pink and black flourishes, and is without Chamber numbers. There is also a Roll of 1752 in the Blackstone Williams Collection which has the drarving of a bird below fifth book, junior part, and the name of "Bigg," with the date, "Feb. 3rd, 1753 ," written in below the bird. He was presumably Bigg, the Commoner on the Roll of 1753.

Of the above-mentioned Rolls, the College Museum Roll of 1752
alone has the Second Master's name in gilt. On the other Rolls he ranks in colour with the Fellows. None of the Rolls bears the initials of "J. S.," but the handwriting scems to be the same as that on the Rolls of 1751.

In 1752 there were ten Commoners, in 1753 eleven; in 1752 fifteen Cloristers, in 1753 twelve. There is no junior part to fourth book, or none marked, in the Roll of 1753 , which contains only fifty-six Scholars. The Roll of 1752 contains only sixty-four.

From a Roll in the New College Collection. It is a " J. S." 1754. Roll, in the same handwriting as the Rolls of 1753 . The Second Master's name is in gilt, pink being used for the Fellows, Chaplains and Organist. It is the earliest known Roll which gives the "Exhibitionarii" and the "Declamatores." They are not given in the "J. S." Roll of 1754 in the College Museum Collection, nor in either of the two Rolls of 1754 in the Blackstone Williams Collection. The number of the Commoners was thirteen ; of the Choristers, fifteen.

From a Roll in the New College Collection. Mr. Speed, in 1755. gilt, appears for the last time as Pædagogus. The College Museum Collection has a "J. S." Roll for this year, and so lias the Blackstone Williams Collection. The list of "Declamatores" includes "Fundatoris," who is not mentioned in the Roll of 1754 . There were twelve Commoners, sixteen Choristers, and apparently only sixty-six Scholars.

From a Roll in the College Museum Collection, the writing 1756. of which is faint. It was found by Warden G. B. Lee in 1899, and has a black case. There are two Rolls for this year in the Blackstone Williams Collection, and one in the New College Collection. Joseph Warton (Scholar 1735) appears for the first time as Pædagogus. He was, I believe, always considered worthy of having his name written in letters of gold-so long as gold continued to be used. There were twenty-three Commoners, an increase of eleven. The number of the Choristers was twelve. Only sixty-one Scholars are named on the Roll.

There are no less than six known Rolls of this year. The 175\%. College Museum Collection contains three, one of which was selected for printing ; the Blackstone Williams Collection contains two, and the New College Collection one. Two out of the three
in the College Museum were amongst the Rolls found by Warden G. B. Lee in 1899 , and these three may be readily distinguished by the size.

No. 1, that selected for printing, measures 42 by $5 \frac{3}{8}$ inches. It is a rubbed and worn Roll in a black case, and contains the sketch of a flying bird.

No. 2 measures 38 by $5 \frac{1}{8}$ inches. It is a clean Roll in a black case, and has the titles of the College Officers added by a contemporary hand : Bigg, Ollce; Peckham, Aulce; Geree, Scholce loco Fanshaw; Fanshaw, Scholce. There is a note at the end, " 66 Children ; 10 Chors.; 28 Comm ${ }^{\text {rs }}$; 11 Founder's Kin."

No. 3 measures 36 by $5 \frac{1}{4}$ inches, and contains a small sketch of a flying bird. It has a flowered case.

There is a new Warden, Dr. Coxed having died on 26th May, 1757. His successor, Mr. Christopher Golding (Scholar 1723), took the degree of D.C.L. on 13th April, 1758.

From one of two Rolls in the New College Collection. The
1758. Roll selected for printing has a flowered case, and measures 43 by 5 inches. It is stouter, as well as cleaner, than the second Roll, which is without a case and measures $36 \frac{3}{4}$ by 5 inches. This second Roll is distinguishable by its having the additions of "sen." and "jun." for the two Cropps (in fifth book, junior part), but not for the two Wyndhams, and also by "A.M." and "LL.B." being inserted, probably by another hand, under the names respectively of Purnell and Hayward, the Posers. Both Rolls are by "J.S.," and so is a third Roll for this year, measuring $37 \frac{1}{4}$ by $5 \frac{3}{8}$ inches, which is in the College Museum, and which has lost the cap of its flowered case. There are two further Rolls in the Blackstone Williams Collection. On all the Rolls the titles of the College Officers run " Pr. Scholæ," \&c., instead of "Scholæ Pr.," as in 1757,1759 , and subsequent years.

There are twenty-six Commoners; and sixteen Choristers, of whom Webb and Westcombe alone are above "Secunda et Quarta."

From a Roll ( $40 \frac{7}{8}$ by $5 \frac{1}{16}$ inches) in the New College Collec-
1759. tion. The College Museum contains a "J.S." Roll, which has notes added in a contemporary hand: T'ahourdin, "Ollæloco Dyer, sen.": Blachford, Olle Pr. "loco Tahourdin": Taunton, "Ollæ loco Blachford, Aulæ loco Russel ": Russell, "Aulæ loco Williams ": Oglander, "Scholæ loco Dyer ": and also after "Ad Portas, Blachford," "Oglander loeo Blachford." There is a third Roll in the Blackstone Williams Collection. A fourth Roll, which differs from the others by being of the smaller type, was described by Mr. Holgate in The Wykehamist, February, 1886 , No. 205. It was lent to him by the Rev.

Philip Williams (Scholar 1836), formerly Rector of Rewe, Devon, whose grandfather, Philip Williams, appears on the Roll as Prefect of Hall.

The number of the Commoners is thirty-eight. The sixteen Choristers have a Prefect in Webb.

There are tro Rolls of this year in the New College Collec1760. tion. The first ( $38 \frac{1}{4}$ by 5 inches), in a flowered case, has "Westcombe," not "Westcomb," in fifth book, senior part; and the second ( $36 \frac{3}{4}$ by 5 inches), without a case, has "Harris, sen.," twice, instead of "Harris, sen." and "Harris, jun." Neither of these Rolls has the date or the initials of " J. S." at the foot, but both have the date under the Arms. A Roll in the Blackstone Williams Collection, copied by Mr. Holgate in May, 1886, is not dated under the Arms, but has " 9 Sep. 1760 . J. S." at the foot. The College Museum Collection contains a " J. S." Roll in a flowered case which has lost its cap, but it lacks the Chamber numbers. The print is consequently not an exact reproduction of auy one of these four Rolls.

There is a fifth Roll in the Holgate Collection. It is a narrow paper Roll, of great length, measuring $68 \frac{1}{2}$ by $2 \frac{1}{2}$ to $2 \frac{5}{8}$ inches, with the date, simply " 1760 ," at the foot. When Mr. Holgate acquired it, it had been torn into two separate bits, the tear coming just below the heading "Secunda et Tertia Classis," as "Secunda et Quarta" is called on this paper Roll. The tro bits have lately been re-joined, under the superintendence of Mr. Scargill-Bird, of the Public Record Office. The Arms, pasted on at the top, are the same as those used in 1716, or similar. All the names-except those of the Commoners, and that of "Fundatoris, Berkeley" (which comes last)—are written in black ; and a black line runs down the whole length of the Roll, only so far from the left hand margin as to leave room for the Chamber numbers. The titles of the Warden, \&c., and of the College Officers, the names of Commoners, the additions of C. F. (but only to the end of fifth book, senior part), and the lines across the Roll, are in faded red. There is only one column, but the Commoners are placed towards the right hand side of it, as usual. After "Organista, Mr. Kent," come the "Clerici, Mr. Jourd, Mr. Mazlin, Mr. Collins." Not to mention variations of spelling, \&c., the Roll differs from that printed, by having the general heading "Praefecti" instead of "Sexta Classis," by omitting Lee and Harris, jun., from fifth book, senior part, and by giving Swanton, not as a Commoner, but as a Scholar (in 1st Chamber), which shows that the Roll was made up on or after 4th November, 1760, the day on which Francis Wickham Swanton was admitted into College. There are some changes in the order of the boys; for instance, Adams has sunk to the first place in fourth book, senior part, which lacks the names of Ingram and Whitby, jun. In the roll ad Oxon "super-ann." is set against the names of Russell and Dyer, and Prichard is omitted. Five
pieces of paper are joined together to form the Roll; the water marks are "G. R." beneath a crown in a circle with a diameter of $1 \frac{3}{4}$ inches, and also what seems like a crowned lion rampant, with a sword in the dexter paw, beneath the legend, "Pro Patria."

The note in Scholars against the name of James Worsley (1760) is incorrect. He was son of Sir Edward Worsley, of Gatcombe, and went to Trinity College, Oxford. Thomas Worsley (1762) and John Worsley (1765) were his brothers. James Worsley (1779) was son of Francis (1742).

From a Roll in the College Museum Collection, which has a 1761. flowered case and measures $38 \frac{3}{4}$ by $5 \frac{5}{8}$ inches. A Roll in the Blackstone Williams Collection, which Mr. Holgate copied in May, 1886, agrees in having "Exhibitiones," instead of the usual "Exhibitionarii," and so does a Roll ( $37 \frac{7}{8}$ by $5 \frac{3}{8}$ inches), with a flowered case, in the New College Collection. All three Rolls bear the initials of "J.S."

Two changes of a permanent nature may be noticed. In the heading which precedes the Classes, "Puerorum" is replaced by "Scholarium," and in the addition after the names of the Oxford Electors "Exā." or " Exām." is substituted for the older "P." or "Pos." This year there are no "C. F." on the roll ad Oxon. The number of the Commoners is fifty-three, as in 1760 . Westcomb is the only one of the twelve Choristers who is above "Secunda et Quarta." The Roll mentions only sixty-four Scholars.

From one of two Rolls in the New College Collection. The
1762. Roll selected for printing measures $40 \frac{5}{8}$ by 5 inches; it has no case, and its surface, particularly at the beginning of sixth book, is stained, probably as the result of former exposure to damp. The other Roll, which has a flowered case, measures $47{ }_{4}^{3}$ by 5 inches. It has " $\mathrm{D}^{\mathrm{d} "}$ " written in ink against the name of Mr. Scott, who died on 13th October, 1762, and the name of "Mr. Awbrey," Scott's successor as Fellow, is written below that of Mr. Purnell. In sixth book, "sped" is written after "Thorpe, Aulae Pr."; and "Williams, sen., C. F." and "Ashe, sen." are pencilled through. So is "Golding" in fifth book, senior part. Both Rolls bear the initials of "J. S." at the foot. There is also a "J. S." Roll for 1762 in the College Museum Collection, which has a flowered case without top or bottom, and which lacks the Chamber numbers. A fourth Roll, in the Blackstone Williams Collection, is described by Mr. Holgate as "rather faint and dirty in parts." None of the above Rolls mentions any "Exhibitionarii."

There were fifty-eight Commoners, and ten Choristers, "Westcomb, Cho. Pr." in sixth book, and the other nine at the bottom of the School. Only sixty-seven Scholurs apmen on the Roll.

From one of two Rolls for this year in the New College
1763. Collection. It has a flowered case, upon the red-tinted collar of which is written "Bliss 1763," and it was, I suppose, the property of Nathaniel Alsop Bliss, the Scholar then in sixth book. It seems to be in the same handwriting as the printed Roll of 1762, but does not bear the initials of "J. S." The second Roll, which has no ease, has suffered badly from former exposure to damp, and all the names of the boys to the end of fifth book have been re-written by a later hand. There is a third Roll ( 41 by $4 \frac{15}{15}$ inches), which is clean and clear, in the College Museum Collection. It has a flowered ease. There are also two Rolls in the Blackstone Williams Collection, which, according to Mr. Holgate's note, are in the same handwriting as that for 1762.

Again, there are no "Exhibitionarii." The first of the Oxford Electors is the Sub-Warden, Thomas Hayward, who next year appears as Warden of New College, having then succeeded John Purnell, who died on 11th January, 1764.

There were forty-nine Commoners, a decrease of nine, and only eight Choristers, of whom "Westeomb, Cho. Pr." was second in the School, and the rest at the bottom of it.

The third boy on the roll ad Winton was John Sanford, of West Monkton, Somerset, who was admitted into College, for the first time, on 3rd October, 1761. He resigned on 14th September, 1763, and stood for election as Founder's Kin. Failing to be so elected, he was nominated again for an ordinary Scholarship, " uno eligentium omnium concensu," and was re-admitted on 17th September, 1763. He resigned again on 2nd September, 1764, and being eleeted as Founder's Kin, was admitted for the third time on 8th September, 1764. These facts are reeorded in the Register of Admissions.

From a very clean Roll in the New College Collection, 1764. which measures $39 \frac{1}{4}$ by $4 \frac{7}{8}$ inches. It has a flowered ease. There is another Roll, with a flowered case, in the College Museum Collection, which measures $39 \frac{5}{8}$ by $4 \frac{7}{8}$ inches ; and a third Roll in the Blackstone Williams Collection, which is without Chamber numbers. In this third Roll, which Mr. Holgate copied in 1886, fourth book, middle part, is mis-described, being ealled "Quart. Clas. Junr. Pars." In collating the copy with the Roll at New College, he omitted to correet the description into "Quart. Clas. Med ${ }^{n}$. Pars," as it is on that Roll.

Warden Golding having died suddenly in Chamber Court on 25th Nov., 1763 , his successor, Warden Harry Lee, appears on the Roll of 1764 for the first time. The Exhibitioners re-appear, after two years' absence, and with a feature most unusual during the period covered by this book, their Christian names being given. There are forty Commoners, a decrease again of nine, and ten Choristers at the bottom of the School.

From one of two Rolls in the New College Collection. It 1765. has a flowered case, and measures $40 \frac{1}{4}$ by 5 inches. The second Roll, which is not so clean as the first, lacks the Chamber numbers, and, though fully dated under the Arms, has only " 1765 " at the foot. A third Roll of 1765 , with a flowered case, which is in the College Museum Collection, differs from that which was selected for printing, by having, in the roll ad Winton, "Lipseomb" instead of "Lipscombe," and the addition, after "Joliffe," of "Hutton" and "Purdue," written by a contemporary hand. On all three Rolls the first Oxford Elector is Sub-Warden Whitmore (Scholar 1749), and not Dr. Haymard, Warden of New College. There is a "Secunda Classis," into which all the fourteen Choristers are packed, as well as a "Sceunda et Quarta," an arrangement which seems to be peculiar to this year.

Burton, who appears for the last time as Head Master, resigned in May, 1766. Since his first appearance on the Roll in 1725, he had seen the number of the Commoners, which was then at thirty-cight, rise to one hundred and twenty-three in 1734, and sink to eight in 1751. The number this year was thirty-nine.

From one of two Rolls in the New College Collection. It 1766. has a flowered case, and measures $39 \frac{7}{8}$ by 5 inches. The writing is rather faint on the second Roll ( $34 \frac{1}{4}$ by 5 inches), which has no case. There are three other Rolls of this year. Two of them are in the Blackstone Williams Collection. The third ( $38 \frac{1}{2}$ by 5 inches) is in the College Museum Collection, and has the initials of "J. S." on cach side of the date, " 2 Sept. 1766 ," at the foot. It is in a flowered case, and follows the second of the Rolls at New College, and not the first, in spelling the name of the junior "C.F.," on the roll ad Winton, as "Awbrey."

There have been important changes since the Roll of 1765 was made up. Joseph Warton has become Head Master, and his former place of Second Master is now filled by Thomas Collins (Scholar 1744), whose golden name on the Roll outshines the red of the Fellows, the Chaplains, and the Organist. The number of the Commoners is forty-four, two less than that on Warton's last Roll for 1792. In the interval the number will steadily rise to one hundred and sixteen in 1778 , and then again fall. There are only eight Choristers.

From one of two Rolls in the New College Collection, which 1767. measures 44 by 5 inches, and has a flowered casc. The second Roll ( $37 \frac{5}{8}$ by $5 \frac{1}{8}$ inches) is caseless, and has the date under the roll ad Winton, and not at the foot. The additions of "sen." for Williams, sen., and Thistlethwayte, sen., apparently come from a third

Roll, in the Blackstone Williams Collection, which Mr. Holgate copied in April, 1886. A fourth Roll ( 30 by $4 \frac{5}{8}$ inches), in an imperfect marbled case, in the College Museum Collection, is done entirely by hand, the Arms being drawn with pen and ink. The names, in sixth book, of Jeans, Waring, Coker, Williams, Yalden, Huntingford, Huddesford, and Skinner are written in red ink, with "super" written (also in red) after each. The junior Examiner is called "Mr. Masters," and the last boy but one on the roll ad Winton is "Hind." At the foot of the Roll comes "J. Skinner fecit W. Collegii / 3 / Alumnus / 3." Perhaps the " 3 " and " 3 " are intended not for figures, but flourishes. On the back of the Roll there is a list of ten names, beginning with "Bingham obiit," "Taylor ad Ox. transmissus," and with "migravit" written after the other eight, viz., Gayton, Yalden, Ince, Bell, Oliver, Golding, Kennedy, Bowreman.

This year the number of the Commoners was fifty-nine, a rise of fifteen. There were nine Choristers.

Erratum, p. 110. Read "Barrow," not "Barron."

From one of two Rolls in the New College Collection. 1768. That selected for printing is the crumpled, stained Roll, which has no case, and measures 36 by 5 inches. The other, which has a flowered case and measures 41 by 5 inches, has "Smyth" for "Smythe, sen.," "Cummins" for "Cummins, sen.," the Chamber number of Lee, C.F., altered from 7 to 4, and the date, not at the foot, but after the roll ad Winton. There are four other Rolls of this year : one in the Blackstone Williams Collection ; one which Mr. Holgate borrowed in 1885 from the Rev. John Acton (Scholar 1836), and described in The Wykehamist, February, 1886, No. 205 ; one which he borrowed in 1889 from Mr. Frederick Ashe Bradburne, of Lyburn, Lyndhurst, Hants; and one, with a flowered case, in the College Museum Collection, which measures $41 \frac{1}{2}$ by 5 inches, and is in the style of "J. S.," but has not the initials.

There were sixty-eight Commoners. Of the nine Choristers, Whitcomb, sen., alone is above "Secunda et Quarta."

From a Roll in the possession of Mr. Nathaniel Bond, of 1769. Creech Grange, in the Isle of Purbeck, Dorset, which Mr. Holgate copied in 1893. He noted its measurements as $38 \frac{1}{2}$ by 5 inches. There are three other Rolls of 1769 : two with flowered cases, viz., one in the College Museum Collection, and the other in the New College Collection; and a third in the Blackstone Williams Collection, which was copied by Mr. Holgate in 1886. The Roll at New College measures $41 \frac{1}{4}$ by 5 inches. It supplies the Chamber numbers for

Busby, and Worsley, sen., which are missing in the Roll selected for printing, and has "Cummings," "Aubery," "Stevens," instead of "Cumming," "Aubrey," " Stevenes." The Roll in the College Museum has " 2 . Cotton" (in sixth book) scratched through, and "migravit ad Corp. Ox. Oct. 20 " added by a contemporary hand. Inside it there has been preserved a paper list of the School (to the bottom of fourth book, junior part) for "Sept. 1770," which agrees with the Long Roll of 1770, printed in this book, except that it omits most of the additions to the names and spells some of the names differently. This list is written on $J$. Whatman hand-made foolscap.

The number of the Commoners in 1769 was eighty-five, a rise of seventeen, and of the Choristers seven. The only Chorister above "Sec. et Quart." was Goddard, the future Head Master.

A note must be added about the ornamental paper which adorns, with a raised pattern of flowers, the case for this year's Roll in the New College Collection. Stamped upon this paper, at the bottom end of the case, is the name of the place at which it was made, "Augspurg" (Augsburg) in Bavaria.

From a Roll in the New College Collection, measuring 38
17\%0. by $4 \frac{1}{2}$ inches. It has a cut in it, through the bottom of Greenwood's name. There is another Roll, $43 \frac{5}{8}$ by $4 \frac{1}{2}$ inches, in the College Museum Collection. Each of the Rolls has a flowered case. This was the last year in which the Classes upon the Rolls were so arranged that sixth book, in the first column, had fifth book, senior part, running parallel with it, in the second. See the Introduction to "Long Rolls, 1653-1721," pp. xxxvii., xxxviii. The number of the Commoners was eighty-nine, of the Choristers only five, including Goddard.

From a caseless Roll ( 41 by $5 \frac{5}{8}$ inches) in the Ner College 17\%1. Collection. It is rather rubbed, and the writing in parts is faint. The Blackstone Williams Collection contain a Roll which Mr. Holgate, who copied it in May, 1886, describes as " worn and dirty, and with the Chamber numbers of many College men illegible." There is also a faded Roll, in a flowered case, in the College Muscum Collection.

In this year was begun the arrangement of the Classes upon the Roll which still exists; that is to say, parallel columns of equal length are provided for the names in a Class, and each Class in turn occupies the whole width of the Roll. The number of the Commoners was ninetythree. There were only five Choristers.

Mr. Holgate relied chiefly upon a Roll in the College
1772. Museum Collection, which omits the name of "Head," a Commoner in fourth book, senior part, and secondarily upon one of two Rolls in the Blackstone Williams Collection, which, when he copied it in 1886, was so faint in parts that he failed to decipher some of the names. He also consulted a Roll ( $37 \frac{7}{8}$ by 5 inches), in a flowered case, in the New College Collection. It lacks the Chamber numbers. There were ninety Commoners and eleven Choristers.

From a Roll in the College Museum Collection, the Chamber 1773. numbers for Chauvel and Chamberlayne, which are omitted in the Museum Roll, being supplied from other Rolls of this year. The New College Collection has one Roll (in a flowered case) which measures $40 \frac{1}{4}$ by 5 inches, and is rather stained and crumpled at its lower end; and the Blackstone Williams Collection has three, in one of which the Taylor in fifth book, senior part, is styled "Taylor jur," instead of "Taylor sec." In the Roll selected for printing, Cattell was misdescribed as "C. F.," but that addition has been struck out by a contemporary hand.

The number of the Commoners was ninety-seven, of the Choristers twelve. The seventeenth boy on the roll ad Winton was Charles Sandby, who was admitted into College on 2nd February, 1774. "Recessit sp. 14 Maij 1778."

Chiefly from a Roll ( 43 bs $4 \frac{3}{4}$ inches), with a flowered case, in 1774. the New College Collection. There are three Rolls of this year in the Blackstone Williams Collection, one of them being a beautiful clean Roll, of which Mr. Holgate made a copy in May, 1886. The second is much stained; and the ink of the third is fainter than that of the first. Mr. Holgate noted that these three Rolls were by the same hand, and that there were no differences between them. There are also two Rolls of this year in the College Museum Collection, in flowered cases. Both of these Rolls, as well as the three in the Blackstone Williams Collection, differ from the Roll at New College by giving "Cattle," instead of " Cattell," in fifth book, senior part, and "Lyss," instead of "Lys," in fifth book, junior part, and also by placing "Thurlow" after Trevelyan sen., and not after Bargus, in fourth book, middle part.

There were ninety-five Commoners, and twelve Choristers, including the last five boys in the School, whose names are printed in the wrong column, on p. 131.

From a Roll ( $43 \frac{7}{8}$ by $4 \frac{7}{8}$ inches), with a flowered case, in the 1775. New College Collection. There is a similar Roll, which Mr. Holgate copied in 1886, in the Blackstone Williams Collection. The College Museum Collection contains a Roll for this year, on stout hand-made paper, with all the names, from the Warden downwards, written in black. It is one of the Rolls found by Warden G. B. Lee in 1899, and has a case with grey-green marbled paper. The penmanship is fine and neat; and to mention some other features of this Roll (44 by $5 \frac{1}{2}$ inches), the Second Master has a whole line to himself; the names of the Classes are written out in full; the date appears only at the foot; and in dealing with the eight Smiths who were in the School together this September, the writer gives the third as "Smith 3tius," and the seventh as "Smith 7mus."

There were one hundred and two Commoners and twelve Choristers. Dr. Burton, the former Head Master, died on 24th January, 1774 ; and now the Exhibitions, hitherto called "Domini Fox," became " 1n. Fox et Burton," and are so called until 1780, when these particular Exhibitions cease for eighteen years to be mentioned in Long Roll.

From a Roll ( $41 \frac{5}{8}$ by $4 \frac{7}{8}$ inches), with a flowered case, in the
1776. New College Collection. A Roll in the Blackstone Williams Collection has "Weller," and not "Wellow," for the name of a boy in "Second and fourth ;" and so has a Roll ( $38 \frac{5}{8}$ by $4 \frac{7}{8}$ inches), with a flowered case, in the College Museum. The new feature on this year's Rolls is the introduction of three "Subpraeceptores" below the Second Master, causing the Organist's name to be shifted to the left to preserve the balance. The number of the Commoners was one hundred and nine ; of the Choristers ten.

From a Roll ( $42 \frac{1}{2}$ by $4 \frac{7}{8}$ inches), in the New College
177\%. Collection, which has a flowered case. It is rather dirty and crumpled at the foot. A Roll ( 40 by $4 \frac{7}{8}$ inches), with a flowered case, in the College Museum, supplies the Chamber numbers for Reynolds and Mabson, which are not given in the Roll selected for printing, and places Buller bolow Raper in fourth book, middle part. There are one hundred and nine Commoners, and twelve Choristers, of whom, as in 1776, only Arnold is above "Second and fourth."

From one of two Rolls ( 41 by 5 : and $41 \frac{1}{2}$ by 5 inches) 1778. in the College Museum Collection. The Roll selected for printing has a case with marbled paper which is marked "Young" at the top, and perhaps belonged to John Young, C.F.,
senior on the roll "ad Oxon," or to Robert Young (Scholar 1775), who was still in the School. The other Museum Roll, which has a flowered case, more correctly distinguishes the second of the three Grays in fourth book, senior part, by calling him "Gray sec."; and is followed in this respect by two other Rolls, one in the New College Collection, and the other in the Blackstone Williams Collection. The Roll at New College, which has a flowered case, omits " e Col. Nov.," against the names of the Subpreceptors ; and the Blackstone Williams Roll mis-describes fourth book, junior part, calling it " Quint Clas. Jun Pars." There are one hundred and sixteen Commoners, their highest number in Dr. Warton's days, and ten Choristers, nine of whom are at the bottom of the School.

From a Roll ( $40 \frac{1}{2}$ by $4 \frac{7}{8}$ inches), with a flowered case, in the 1779. New College Collection. The College Museum contains two Rolls ( 44 by 5 : and 39 by 5 inches), one in a flowered and the other in a black case. One of these was in the Collection found by Warden G. B. Lee in 1899. The number of the Commoners is one hundred and five, a decrease of eleven. Runwa is far separated from the rest of the twelve Choristers.

From a Roll ( $41 \frac{1}{4}$ by $5 \frac{1}{8}$ inches) in the New College Collec-
1780. tion. The handwriting is not the same as that of any previous year : it is neat, small, and clerkly. Dr. Warton has an unnecessary " $h$ " in his name, both in the Roll selected for printing and in one of two Rolls by the same writer, which are in the College Museum. The first Museum Roll has "Hopkins," one of the Exhibitioners, scratched through, and "Watson" written over, by a contemporary hand. The second omits the addition of "Scholæ Pr." after Gabel's name, and leaves the office of Prefect of School unassigned. All three

- Rolls have flowered cases, but the cases of the Museum Rolls have lost, one of them the top of the cap, and the other the entire cap. The number of the Commoners has fallen to seventy-seven. There are twelve Choristers.

Thomas Leir, the thirteenth boy on the roll ad Winton, renounced his rights, and was not admitted into College.

From a Roll ( $37 \frac{3}{8}$ by 47 inches) in the New College Collec1781. tion. It is by the same hand as the Rolls of 1780 , but differs from them as to the colour used for ornamentation, scarlet being used instead of the pink which is to be found, I believe, on all
the Rolls from 1771 to 1780 (both inelusive). Searlet was used again in 1782,1783 , and 1784. There are two Rolls of 1781 ( $38 \frac{1}{2}$ by $4 \frac{1}{2}$ : and $37 \frac{1}{2}$ by $4 \frac{5}{8}$ inches), both by the same writer, in the College Museum Collection. They have "Octi," not "Oets" in the date. All three Rolls have flowered eases. The School contained seventy-two Commoners, and thirteen Choristers, with Jenkins, as in 1780, far above the rest.

This is the year of the carliest known Short Roll, which will be described in Áppendix III.

From a Roll ( $38 \frac{1}{4}$ by 5 inches), with a flowered case, in the
1782. New College Collection. It has the date only at the foot. There are two Rolls in the College Museum Collection; and one of them, in a blue case, is a clean, bright Roll ( $38 \frac{1}{8}$ by 5 inches), whereas the Roll selected for printing is faint and diffieult, in parts, to read. This year the practice was begun of placing the Second Master's name in a line by itself. The Commoners have decreased from seventytwo to fifty-three. There are twelve Choristers at the bottom of the School. Peter Bluett, third on the roll ad Winton, is placed in the Register of Admissions above the two "C. F.," but the "C. F.," Bluett, and six other boys, were all admitted into College on the same day, 19 July, 1782.

From a Roll ( 37 by 5 inches), with the bottom corners cut
1783. off, in the College Museum Collection. It has a blue case, and so has a Roll of 1783 in the New College Collection. This year the impression from the "Arms-plate" is good, whereas for some years past it has been poor. It is poor again in 1784 , but excellent in 1785. The number of the Commoners was forty-three, a further decrease of ten. Of the twelve Choristers, Jenkins alone is above "Secunda et Quarta Classis."
"Gay," the last boy on the roll ad Winton, was (Sir) James Rivers (8th Bart., 1805), son of the Rev. Sir Peter Rivers, 6th Bart., Prebendary of Winchester, who assumed the name of Rivers-Gay. In the Register of Admissions the boy was entered as "Jacobus Rivers Gay," but the "Gay" was afterwards struck out. "Riehards," the fourteenth boy on the Roll, is not mentioned in Scholars, but the Register has the entry "Georgins Rieliards de par. Bradninch, com. Devon. Bapt. 21 Maii 1769. Adm. 23 Nov. bris 1783 ," with the marginal note, "recessit sp. 22 Aug ${ }^{\text {t1 }} 1785$."

Erratum (p. 159, roll ad Oxon), for Wills, read Wells.

From a paper Roll in the British Museum (Add. Mss., 1784. No. 29,535 ), the gift of the Rev. Mackenzie E. C. Walcott (Commoner, 1837). This Roll, which has a case of thin wood covered with marbled paper, was described by Mr. Holgate in The Wykehamist, February, 1886, No. 205. All the names, from the Warden downwards, are written in black ink, and the date is given only at the foot.

A parchment Roll ( $37 \frac{3}{8}$ by 5 inches), in a flowered case, in the New College Collection, has the date only under the Arms. The date is both there and at the foot in a parchment Roll, which has a green case with a blue cap, in the College Museum Collection. In these Rolls the lines, which for many years past have been coloured, are black.

William Stanley Goddard (Scholar, 1771) has become Second Master in the place of Thomas Collins. Collins, who became Canon of Chichester (Bursalis) in 1775, lived until 29 June, 1804 : "a name for ever dear to his contemporary Wickhamists," says The Gentleman's Magazine, in recording his death.

There were forty-nine Commoners, not counting Jenkins, the last boy in fifth book, senior part, who was a Chorister in 1783, and appears as such again in the above-mentioned parchment Rolls of 1784.

Erratum, p. 160, for Wool, read Wooll.

From one of two Rolls in the College Museum Collection. 1785. One has a blue case with a green cap, and the other is caseless. A third Roll ( $38 \frac{5}{8}$ by $5 \frac{1}{8}$ inches), in the New College Collection, has a flowered case. In this year a great change was made in the method of producing long Rolls, the whole "form" of the Roll being produced from an engraved plate, as stated by Mr. Holgate in his Introduction to the earlier series, p. xii. He there gave a full account of the change, and it is unnecessary to repeat it here. All the names, except the favoured few, which are still in gilt, are in black, and the Class headings are also in black, instead of being half in red and half in black in accordance with the practice followed in the preceding years. Henceforth the Rolls, however neat, lack the beauty of scarlet. This year there were fifty-four Commoners.

The Register of Admissions has the entry, "Feb. 1, 1786. Georgius Gauntlett juri successionis renunciavit."

From a Roll in the College Museum Collection, which has
1786. all the names in black. A Roll in the New College Collection has the Warden, Sub-Warden, Head Master, Second Master, and Oxford Electors in gilt, and gives the thirteenth name on the roll ad Winton as "Duell." Both Rolls have flowered cases, but the case of the Museum Roll has lost its cap. There were forty-seven Commoners.

From a Roll in the New College Collection, which has a 178\%. flowered case. There is a second Roll in the College Museum Collection, which has a green case. In April, 1886, Mr. Holgate made a copy of a third Roll, lent to him by the Rev. Henry John Gepp (Scholar, 1847), Vicar of Adderbury, Oxon ; and in October, 1895, he examined a fourth Roll, lent to him by Miss G. S. M. Glasse, of Chettle, Dorset. In the third Roll many of the Scholars have no Chamber numbers. In all four Rolls the names of the Warden, SubWarden, \&c., are in gilt, and the names of the boys in "Secunda et Quarta Classis" are arranged in three parallel columns. There were forty Commoners.

Erratum, p. 169, for Grenville, read Greville.

From a paper Roll in the College Museum Collection. It
1788. has a grey marbled case without a cap. There is no water mark on the paper. A few names are in gilt. There is a second Roll, on parchment, and with all the names in black, in the New College Collection. It has a flowered case.

Sturt, the ninth boy on the roll ad Winton, is not mentioned in Mr. Kirby's Scholars. But the Register of Admissions contains the entry, "Octr. 8. 1788. Ashley Sturt juri successionis renunciavit." The number of the Commoners was thirty-eight, the lowest number recorded on any Long Roll during Dr. Warton's Head Mastership.

From a Roll, in the College Museum Collection, which has a
1789. flowered case. The New College Collection also contains a

Roll in a flowered case. Neither Roll has any names in gilt.
In the Muscum Roll some alterations have been made by a contemporary hand ; e.g., in sixth book, "Sch. Pr." is added after "Richards"; "Aulæ Pr." is struck out after "Garnier"; after " Rivers, sen." "Scholæ Pr." is struck out and "Aulæ Pr." substituted ; in second and fourth book, the first name, "Smart," is struck out, and "Bruce"" substituted ; and in the list of Exhibitioners "Moore, e Coll. Univ." is struck out, and "Joliffe e Coll. Novo." substituted. The order of some of the names on the roll ad Winton differs from that in the Register of Admissions, which Mr. Kirby has reproduced in his Scholars.

From a paper Roll, in the College Museum Collection, which
1790. has a capless case with grey marbled paper. The New College Collection contains a parchment Roll in a flowered case. On these Ioolls, which have no names in gilt, the Choristers, in "Secunda et

Quarta Classis," are arranged in four columns. On the roll ad Winton, Gunning precedes Toll: but Toll was admitted on the 3rd, and Gunning afterwards on the 21st February, 1791.

On the death of Harry Lee, who died on the 18th November, 1789, George Isaac Huntingford (Scholar, 1762) became Warden. He became Bishop of Gloucester in 1802, and of Hereford in 1815, but continued to hold the Wardenship until his death on the 29th April, 1832. Like the late Warden, the Rev. G. B. Lee, he appeared as Warden on fortytwo Long Rolls. Long Roll 1790 contains the names of forty-one Commoners.

From a paper Roll in the College Museum Collection. The 1791. Roll has no case, and the paper is without any water mark. There is a parchment Roll in the New College Collection, which las a flowered case. There were forty-nine Commoners.

From a paper Roll in the Holgate Collection, which has two 1792. rents in the Arms. It is in a flowered case. The College Muscum Collection contains a paper Roll without a case ; and the New College Collection a parchment Roll with a flowered case, as well as a caseless paper Roll with the Arms torn off. The parchment Roll differs from the other three (which give only sixty-nine Scholars) by having (Henry) Atkins, a Scholar in third Chamber, at the head of the School. There were forty-six Commoners.

From a paper Roll in the Holgate Collection. It has no 1793. casc. The College Museum Collection contains a parchment Roll in a flowered case. This year two "Capellae Pr." appear on Long Roll for the first time. The existence of the office of prefect of Chapel is disclosed by no known Roll of earlier date, except the Roll of 1653 , which contains two "Praefecti Templi."

The extraordinary length of the roll ad Winton, which contains sixty-one names, was due to the expulsion of twenty-nine Scholars which followed the rebellion of April, 1793. Dr. Warton resigned the Head Mastership in July, and was succeeded by Goddard, whose place, as Second Master, was taken by Henry Dison Gabell (Scholar, 1779). The number of the Commoners this year was forty-one. It gradually rose during Goddard's time, until in 1808 it reached one hundred and thirtythree.

The College Register of Burials contains the entry "Bryanus Edwards, Mar. 14, 1794. Alumnus in domo et sub curâ praeceptoris sui

Custodis." The entry apparently does not refer to Edwards, the Commoner in fifth book, middle part, on Long Roll 1793, as his name occurs again on Long Roll 1794.

From a Roll in the College Museum Collection. The name 1794. of "Buffe," in fifth book, senior part, has been struck out, and "Cuffe" written above it, by a contemporary hand. In the Roll in the New College Collection "Buffe" remains uncorrected. Both Rolls have flowered cases.

There are no names on the roll ad Oxon, the expulsions in April, 1793, having left the School without a Scholar fit for election to New College. The names of "Ballard" and "Tahourdin" which appear in the roll ad Winton, are not in the Register of Admissions. There were fifty-two Commoners.

From a Roll in the New College Collection. There is also a 1795. Roll in the College Museum Collection. Both Rolls have flowered cases. The fact that Goddard took the degree of D.D. on 19 January, 1795 , is duly recorded by his new title. There were fifty-three Commoners.

From a Roll in the College Museum Collection. Its case 1796. has "Nurnber" stamped upon the gaudy flowered paper. Upon the bottom end of the case which contains the Roll in the New College Collection "In. Nur" is stamped. I suppose that the paper came from Nuremberg, Bavaria. The only difference between the two Rolls seems to be that the one gives "Ben" and the other "Benett" (mis-printed "Bennett") as the name of a Commoner in fifth book, junior part. There were seventy-five Commoners.

From a Roll in the College Museum Collection. There is 179\%. another Roll in the New College Collection. Both Rolls have flowered cases. Charles Williams, ninth on the roll ad Winton, was son of Philip Williams (Scholar, 1755: Fellow, 1769), and became Fellow of the College in 1819, in succession to his father, who resigned. He is liable to be confused with his namesake, Charles Williams, C.F., the Scholar on the roll ad Winton for 1800, who was son of Daniel Williams, C.F. (Scholar, 1763 : Fellow, 1781-8), and brother of David Williams, C.F. (Scholar, 1799: Second Master, 1810-24: Head Master, 1824-36: Warden of New College, 1840-60). The Roll contains eighty-two Commoners.

From a Roll in the College Museum Collection. There is also a Roll in the New College Collection, and both Rolls have flowered cases. There were eighty-nine Commoners.

From a paper Roll in the Holgate Collection. The paper 1799. bears no water mark. In the list of "Declamatores," Lipscomb (Ad Portas) and Odell (Fundutor.) are struck out, and Brereton and Shattleworth are substituted by a contemporary hand. In The Wykehamist for February, 1886, No. 205, Mr. Holgate decribed another paper Roll of 1799, which the Rev. John Acton (Scholar, 1836) lent him to copy. It has the names of Lipscomb and Odell left unaltered. The College Museum contains a parchment Roll in which the "Declamatores" are "Ad Portas, Lipscombe. Fundator., Yeomans. Eliz. et Jac., Odell." In the New College Collection there are two Rolls. The first is a parchment Roll, which gives the "Declamatores" as "Ad Portas, Lipscomb. Fundator., Odell. Eliz. et Jac., Yeomans." The second is a paper Roll in which Yeomans appears as Fundator., and Shattleworth as Eliz. et Jac., but their names have been substituted for other names which have been erased. Before the year 1863 the compiler of Long Roll used to give the names of the "Declamatores" prospectively; and the Rolls of 1799 seem to illustrate the fallibility of his forecast. See the note on this subject in "Long Rolls, 1653-1721," p. 206.

This year there were eighty-three Commoners. The name of (Robert) Loring, on the roll ad Winton is mis-printed, as Loving, in Scholars.

From a paper Roll in the Holgate Collection. There is a
1800. parchment Roll in the College Museum Collection which differs slightly, e.g., in having "Sarjent," not "Sargent," and "Hellyar," not " Helyer."

There were two boys named Hoskins or Hoskyns on the roll ad Winton, and both were admitted into College, though the name of only one (Thomas Hoskyns, admitted 7th April, 1801) occurs in Scholars. The Register of Admissions has the entry, "Henry Hoskyns de North Perrot, Somerset, Nat. April 21, 1790 ; adm. Maii 21, 1801," with the marginal note, "rec. sup. ann. July 16, 1808." This Henry Hoskyns, who went to Oriel College, Oxford, was Rector of North Perrott from 1814 until his death in 1876.

The note in Scholars to Charles Williams, C.F., who heads the roll ad Winton, confuses him with Charles Williams, Fellow of Winchester College. See supra, under the year 1797.

This year there were eighty-nine Commoners. It is the first year of the series of Rolls which have " Bower Scripsit, Ashby Sculpsit," at the foot. Bower apparently became writing master to the College on the
death of William Scardefield, who will be mentioned again in Appendix III. As to Bower, see Mr. Holgate's Introduction to Long Rolls, 1653-1721, p. xvi., and Wykehamica, pp. 174, 216, 464.

From a paper Roll in the Holgate Collection. Running 1801. down the left-hand margin of the paper, there is the upper part of a water mark which seems to have contained the words, "James Whatman Turkey Mill Kent."

This Roll, which measures $42 \frac{1}{8}$ by $5 \frac{5}{8}$ inches, supplied Mr. Holgate with the long-desired clue to the method by which Long Rolls of this period were produced, and which he fully described in his Introduction to the earlier series, p. xii. The Roll is broader than the paper Roll of 1800, which measures $39 \frac{1}{4}$ by $5 \frac{1}{8}$ inches; and its side margins, particularly the right-hand margin, clearly show the inset of the "Rollplate.", It is evident that there was a separate and narrower "Armsplate," and on this particular Roll the Roll-plate slightly overlaps the Arms-plate, and its inset runs through the motto.

The additions of "Co. Pr.," which were engraved on the Rollplate of 1799, were merely written in the Rolls of $1800-1803$ (inclusive). The Roll of 1804 has the first four of these additions engraved, and the rest in writing. They were all engraved on the Rollplates of 1805-1812 (inclusive). After 1799 the additions of "C.F." ceased to be engraved throughout the Roll. But on the Rolls of $1805-$ 1812 (inclusive) they were engraved whenever they occurred in sixth book. The practice of engraving the titles of College officers was still in force in 1812.

The number of the Commoners in 1801 was ninety-eight.

From a paper Roll in the Holgate Collection, which has a 1802. flowered case. In December, 1885, Mr. Holgate copied another paper Roll of this year, which was lent to him by Mrs. Yonge, of Puslinch, Devon. There is a parchment Roll in the College Museum Collection, which shows the inset of the Roll-plate down the righthand margin. It has a flowered case.

This year the number of the Commoners was one hundred and eight. The elevation of Warden Huntingford to the See of Gloucester is duly recorded on the Roll.

From a paper Roll in the Holgate Collection. There are 1803. two Rolls in the College Museum Collection, the one a paper Roll in a capless green case, and the other a parchment Roll in a flowered case. These differ from the Roll selected for printing, in that
they have the name of the Scholar in fourth book, junior part, written as "Pickard," and not "Picard." There were one hundred and twenty Commoners.

From a paper Roll, in the College Museum Collection. The
1804. case seems to be not contemporary, but more modern. In January, 1886, Mr. Holgate copied another paper Roll of 1804, belonging to the Rt. Hon. Sir Massey Lopes, 3rd Bart. (Commoner, 1832). In the "Roll-plate" for this year, the titles of the College officers, and the additions of "Co. Pr." for the first four Commoners, were engraved, evidently by mistake, in the second of the two columns reserved for sixth book ; and the scribe who wrote the School Roll accordingly began with that column, but did his best to rectify the mistake by placing a number against each name from " 1 . Smith" to "22. Baker, sen." There were one hundred and thirty-two Commoners.

From a paper Roll, kept in the lower half of a flowered case, 1805. in the College Museum Collection. In December, 1885, Mr.

Holgate copied a paper Roll of 1805, belonging to Mrs. Yonge, of Puslinch. It differs from that selected for printing by having Grace, not at the head of fifth book, but a "Co. Pr:" in sixth book between Beckley and Price, sen., and also by having "Brown, jun.," at the bottom of "Secunda Classis." A second Roll, in the College Masenm Collection, which has a flowered case, agrees in these points with the Yonge Roll.

As is stated in the Introduction to the earlier series, p. lxxx., this is the first Long Roll in which the Second Master is given the title of "Hostiarius," assigned to him by the Founder's Statutes. The name of the sixth boy on the roll ad Winton was Stephen Thomas Nason. It is misprinted in Scholars. Montgomery, the boy on the roll ad Winton next above (Edwin) Halhed, was apparently not admitted into College, and there is no reference to him in the College Register. There were one hundred and thirty-one Commoners.

From a paper Roll, in a capless marbled case, in the College 1806. Museum Collection. That Collection also has a parchment Roll, in a flowered case. In the paper Roll "Chamier, sen.," occurs twice in fifth book, junior part. In the parchment Roll the Chamier who comes next after Picard, C. F., is described as "Chamier, jun." The number of the Commoners was one hundred and thirty-three.

From a Roll in the Holgate Collection, which has a flowered 1807. case. In January, 1886, Mr. Holgate copied another paper Roll of 1807, belonging to Sir Massey Lopes. There is also a paper Roll in the College Maseum Collection, which has a capless flowered case. In the Holgate Roll "Chamier sen." occurs twiee in fifth book, middle part ; but in the other two Rolls the Chamier next before Picard, C.F., is called "Chamier 2dus." These two Rolls also differ from the Holgate Roll in a few details, e.g., by placing Spencer above Hewitt in fourth book, senior part. The number of the Commoners was one hundred and thirty-two.

From a paper Roll in the Holgate Collection, which has a 1808. flowered case. There is another paper Roll, in a flowered case, in the College Museum Collection ; and in 1886 Mr . Holgate obtained a copy of a parchment Roll, belonging to the Right Rev. George Ridding (Scholar, 1841), Bishop of Southwell. There were one hundred and thirty-three Commoners.

Erratum, p. 229, read "Lathem jun.," instead of "Latham, jun."

From a paper Roll in the College Museum Collection. It 1809. has a flowered case, battered and bottomless. The prefix of "Rev"," which is bestowed upon the Sub-Warden, seems to be the only noticeable feature. This innovation was not repeated in 1810. It was Dr. Goddard's last year as Head Master, and there were one hundred and thirty-two Commoners.

From a paper Roll in the Holgate Collection. It has a 1810. marbled case. In 1886 Mr . Holgate copied another paper Roll, belonging to Mr. George Deedes Warry, K.C., (Commoner, 1844), of Shapwick, Bridgwater. This second Roll lacks the words "Bower Scripsit" at the foot. The paper bears the water mark, "James Whatman Turkey Mill Kent." There is a third Roll, in a grey marbled case, in the College Museum Collection, which has "Worseley," not "Worsley," and "Cazelet," not "Cazalet," in fifth book, senior part.

This was the first year of Gabell's Head Mastership, aud there were one hundred and thirty-seven Commoners. Morres on the roll ad Winton was a Commoner, Robert Morres, who was buried in the College Cloisters on the 21st December, 1810. His death, which occurred before his turn for admission into College arrived, is mentioned in the Register of Admissions.

Errata, p. 235, read, "Austen, sen," for "Austin, sen."

From paper Rolls, in marbled cases, lent to Mr. Holgate 1811, 1812. by Mr. George Deedes Warry, K.C. Neither Roll records the name of either the writer or the engraver. The Roll of 1812 has the water mark, "Joseph Ruse Tovill Mill Maidstone 1803."

The College Museum Collection contains a Roll for each of these years. The Roll of 1811 has the additional names of Worsley, Scholar in third Chamber, between Torre and Jackson in sixth book, and of Crosbie, a Commoner, next below Wallace in fifth book, senior part. It also has "Seymour," not "Semour," in the roll ad Winton.

The Holgate Collection contains engraved "Roll-forms" of 1812 , which show that the engraver originally inserted, by mistake, the names of the Examiners of 1811. In the two complete Rolls of 1812, mentioned above, the Examiners' names are not engraved, but written over erasures.

In 1811 there were one hundred and thirty-eight Commoners, including Crosbie ; and in 1812 there were one hundred and thirty-four.

In bringing the series of Rolls, here published, to a conclusion at this point, Mr. Holgate was guided chiefly by the fact that a new method of producing Long Roll was introduced in 1813. In that year the whole body of the Roll was for the first time printed. The compositor ousted the scribe.

## Addendum.

The College Museum Collection now contains a fourth Roll 175\%. of this year, the recent gift of Mr. F. S. Pearson, LL.B., of Avon Lodge, Selly Park, Birmingham. It is a "J.S." Roll, of stiff parchment, ornamented with gilt and scarlet, and with two sketches, one of a bird and the other of a fish.

# APPENDIX II. 

Long RoLl, 1689.

Among the late Mr. Mackenzie Walcott's transcripts of the Rolls for 1668-1855, in the British Museum, there is a transcript of Long Roll 1689, or rather of such portions of the Roll as relate to the Scholars and Commoners in the School. Mr. Holgate, when he was gathering material for his "Winchester Long Rolls, 1653-1721," made a copy of this transcript, and as he was unable at the time to obtain any original Roll for 1689, he printed the copy in an Appendix to the book (p. 202).

The book had been published only a few weeks, when the late Warden, the Rev. G. B. Lee, discovered, in a cupboard at his house, an old bag, formerly the property of Warden Barter, which contained a collection of Long Rolls. Probably this collection, which included a Long Roll for 1689, had been lent by Warden Barter to Mr. Walcott, and when Mr. Walcott, after making his transcripts, returned the Rolls, the bag in which they had travelled was put away, with its contents, in the cupboard, and forgotten. The Rolls, thus brought to light again in 1899, now form part of the collection at the College Museum. Their recovery was communicated by Mr. Holgate to The Wykehamist in an article published in October, 1899 (No. 362).

I have made a transcript of the recovered Roll of 1689, and insert it here in accordance with Mr. Holgate's directions. Mr. Walcott's transcript was defective, the title, the " nomina magistrorum, choristarum et servorum," and the rolls "ad Winton " and "ad Oxon," being omitted. It also contained a few small errors which need not be specified.

The Roll, which is of thin parchment, measures $26 \frac{7}{8}$ by $4 \frac{1}{2}$ inches. The College Arms are absent. The names are arranged in three columns, and are written very neatly, with the exception of the sixteenth name on the roll ad Winton, which I failed to decipher. I have printed this name as "Bave," upon the information kindly supplied to me by Mr. H. W. B. Joseph, Fellow of New College, Oxford (Prefect of Hall, Sept., 1885). One of the original Indentures from which the roll ad Winton was extracted still exists in New College Library, and contains the following entry :-"Carolus Bave, natus in parochia Sancti Jacobi in civitate Bathoniæ in comitatu Somersett, ann. $12^{\mathrm{m}}$ ad festum Sancti Michaelis ult. preterit." There is a reference to these Indentures in the Introduction to "Long Rolls, 1653-1721," p. xlviii. Mr. Joseph informs me that the Indentures for 1652 and 1858 are missing, and that the latest Indenture is for the year 1861.

Loug Roll 1689 contains the names of sixty-eight Commoners. The roll ad Winton precedes the roll ad Oxon, an arrangement which also occurs in the Rolls, which Mr. Holgate printed, for 1716 and 1719. It is similar to the rolls ad Winton upon all the known Long Rolls of a date earlier than 1692, in that it does not give the names of the boys who had been already admitted into College when the Long Roll was prepared. See the Introduction to the earlier series, pp. xl., xli.

The Roll was made up between the admission into College of Lewis Beaumont and Grant Jones on 20th September, 1689, and the admission of William Bowles on 14th January, $16 \frac{89}{90}$.

## APPENDIX III.

Short Roll, 1781.

A brief description of this Short Roll, which is the earliest, or earliest extant, Roll of that kind, was given by Mr. Holgate in his article in The Wykehamist for October, 1899. He there expressed the hope that he might describe it more fully on another occasion, and I believe that it was his intention to insert the fuller description in this book. Certainly, the date of the Roll, and the method by which it was produced, make it a suitable subject for an Appendix.

Like all subsequent Short Rolls, this Roll of 1781 takes the form of a little book. But it is got up much better than the modern Rolls of the kind, having gilt edges and a beautiful engraving of the College Arms to face the title-page. It measures 5 by $3 \frac{3}{4}$ inches, and is therefore a little smaller than Short Roll of Cloister Time 1903, which measures $5 \frac{1}{8}$ by 4 inches. A Short Roll which I have of Short Half 1868, measures 5 by $3 \frac{1}{2}$ inches.

The book has a paper cover, the outer surface of which is marbled, and the cover contains fourteen leaves, of which the first and last are blank. All the other leaves are blank on one side and with printed matter on the other, the print being always on the recto side, except in the case of the second leaf, where the arms face the title. The arms are of the same pattern as those on Long Roll for 1781, but are printed from a plate of smaller size. The title, on the third leaf, runs as follows :-

The fourth leaf presents the names of the College Authorities from "Dr. Lee, Custos" to "Mr. Fussell, Organicus," arranged, as if upon a Long Roll, in a frame of lines, with further lines drawn across the page at appropriate points. This arrangement is continued upon the subsequent leares, throughout which the printed matter follows the manuscript of Long Roll 1781, down to the very date at the end, " $22^{\circ}$ Octobris $1781 . "$ Each class or " part" has a page to itself, except
for the fact that "Quarta Classis, media Pars," and "Quarta Classis, junior Pars," being both very short, are put together on the same page. The names in a class are placed in two columns, exactly as in Long Roll 1781, and the second column always begins on the Short Roll with the name with which it begins on the Long.

The method by which this Short Roll was produced is beyond all reasonable doubt. Mr. William Scardefield, who, when he died in 1800, had been for many years the College writing master, divided a Long Roll for 1781 into ten sections (or eleven, if the Arms be included), and directed the printer to reproduce the Roll in the form of a book, one section to each page. The only addition that was made was the title page, which I have already described.

Such was the history of this Short Roll ; and, if Short Roll 1781 ought to be regarded as the earliest Roll of the kind, such is the origin of all the convenient little Short Rolls which are now published, term after term; and the School owes a big debt of gratitude to Scarclefield for devising a form of Roll which is far easier to handle than the oldfashioned Long Roll. Yet in 1899, when Mr. Holgate brought his name to light, few Wykehamists had ever heard of Scardefield.

Scardefield's sudden death on the 12th April, 1800, won for him the following obituary notice in The Gentleman's Magazine, vol. lxx., p. 486 :
"Aged 51, Mr. William Scardefield, of Twyford, near Winchester. He set out, according to his usual custom, at 7 in the morning from Twyford, for Winchester college, where he had for many years officiated as writing-master. After finishing his business at the college he went, about 2 o'clock, to the King's Arms inn at Winchester, to meet a party of his friends who held a monthly dinner there. He had not been long in the room when one of the company asked Mr. S., who sat near the bell, to ring it. Mr. S., who, till that moment, was apparently in perfect health, rose from his chair, rang the bell, and instantly fell down dead."

The Twyford Parish Register contains, amongst the entries of burials, the brief entry under the year 1800, "April 16, William Scardefield" ; and the west wall of the Vestry in Twyford Church bears an oval tablet with the inscription, "In memory of Mr. William Scardefield of this Parish who died April 12 th 1800 aged 51 years." I regret my inability to give further information about him.

His Short Roll is preserved in a flat cardboard case, of the kind known as a drop case, open at the top, and with a thumb-hole in the centre of the top margins to facilitate the extraction of the book. The case, which measures 5 by 4 inches, is covered with ornamental paper, similar to that which was in vogue for Long Roll cases at the time when the drop case was made.

This Short Roll is now in the Winchester College Museum. It was formerly the property of Mr. William Liscombe Stonhouse (AssistantMaster, 1864-1883). Mr. Stonhouse gave it to Mr. H. T. Baker, Fellow of New College, Oxford (Winchester Scholar, 1889), who has given it to the Museum.

## APPENDIX IV.

## The Dates on Long Rolls.

Mr. Holgate dealt with this subject at considerable length in the Introduction to his "Long Rolls, 1653-1721," pp. xxii.-xxiv. After the publication of that book, he discovered that a fully dated Roll exists for each of the years 1736,1743 , and 1747, and that consequently there is a complete series of fully dated Rolls, beginning with the Roll of 1733. He also discovered that there are some errors in the table which he printed of the dates upon Long Rolls 1733-1898; and these crrors were pointed out in my letter to The Wykehamist, March, 1901, No. 379. The following is a revised list of the dates upon the Rolls from 1733 to 1780 (inclusive). Mr. Holgate's table should be consulted for the dates upon the later Rolls. (See the Introduction to his book, p. xxiii.)

An examination of the above list reveals the fact that in every jear from 1733 to 1767 (inclusive) the date upon the Roll was a Tuesday, and that in every year from 1768 to 1779 (inclusive) the date was a Monday. In 1780 the date was a Sunday. Since 1780 , by far the most frequent date put upon Long Roll has been the 22 nd October, and the days of the week have had little, if anything, to do with the fixing of the date. All have received some patronage, including Sunday, which was honoured both in 1846 (1st November) and in 1848 (1st October). The following notes upon the above list will explain, to some extent, why at one time Tuesday, and afterwards Monday, was formerly the favoured day.

The date written upon a Long Roll
1733-1767 (inclusive). during this period does not indicate the day upon which the Roll was made out or issued. It indicates the day which the scribe apparently regarded as the
opening day of the School year to which the Roll belonged. The date is always that of the Tuesday in "Election Week," the day upon which the Warden and Posers of New College, Oxford, were welcomed, "ad Portas," on their arrival at Winchester to take part in the annual election of Scholars, both ad Winton and ad Oxon.* The Long Roll, though dated as of the Tuesday in "Election Week," was in fact made up at a later date, when some of the successful candidates for election had been already admitted into College. These general statements may be illustrated by notes upon particular years.
1733. The last boy admitted into College under the roll ad Winton of 1732 was George Button, and he was admitted on 1st September, 1733. Long Roll is dated (Tuesday) 4th September, 1733, but shows that, at the time when it was actually made up, four boys on the roll ad Winton of 1733 had been already admitted into College. Of these four boys, Harry Lee, Robert Eddowes, and Robert Pye were admitted, according to the Register, on (Saturday) 8th September, and Robert Oldisworth on the 15 th. Consequently Long Roll must have been made up on or after 15th September. It was made up before 20th October, the day upon which Francis Piggot was admitted.

173\%. Timothy Brown, the last boy admitted under the roll ad Winton of 1736 , was admitted on 6th September, 1737. He was admitted on the Tuesday in "Election Week," and therefore only a few hours before the Roll of 1736 ceased to be operative. Long Roll 1737, though dated 6th September, was made up after (Friday) 9th September, when Edward Trotman, Richard Tomkins, and William James Noel were admitted under the new roll ad Winton, but before 17 th November, when William Fendall was admitted.
1742. Long Roll, though dated (Tuesday) 7th September, was made up after the admission of eight Scholars on the 10 th, and four more on 11th September, 1742. These twelve Scholars were admitted under the roll ad Winton of 1742 . Thomas Forester, the thirteenth boy, was not admitted until 10th January, 1743. He appears on Long Roll as a Commoner. It may be added that Humphry Brent Coopey, the last boy admitted under the Roll of 1742, was admitted on 3rd September, 1743.
1750. Of the sixteen boys on the roll ad Winton of 1750 , fourteen were admitted into College, twelve of them on the 7th, and the other two on the 13th September, 1750. They all appear as Scholars on Long Roll 1750, though it is dated (Tuesday) 4th September.
1761. Long Roll is dated (Tuesday) 29th September. The sixteen boys on the roll ad Winton of 1761 were admitted on 3rd October. They appear in Long Roll as Scholars.

* See Walcott's "William of Wykeham and his Colleges," p. 191; and Adams's "Wykehamica," p. 50. A manuscript note by Walcott in his own copy of his book states that the day for the arrival of the Warden of New College and the Posers was changed from Tuesday to Monday in 184-.

I now pass on to the period during which the date upon Long Roll was always a Monday.

During this period the date upon the
1768-1777 (inclusive). Roll is always two days later than the date upon which the senior boys on the new roll ad Winton were admitted into College. The admissions were made on the Saturday in "Election Week," and Long Roll was dated as of the following Monday. I take the first and last years of the period to illustrate the system.
1768. Fifteen newly elected Scholars were admitted on Saturday, 10th September. They duly appear as Scholars on Long Roll, which is dated 12th September. The sixteenth boy, William Glaspoole, was not admitted until the 20th October, and does not appear on Long Roll as a member of the School.

177\%. Six newly elected Scholars were admitted on Saturday, 16th August. Long Roll, which is dated 18 th August, includes them amongst the Scholars. Probably William Daveuport, the seventh boy on the roll ad Winton, who was admitted on the 3rd September, is the "Darenport" who appears on Long Roll as a Commoner.

In 1778, 1779, and 1780, "Election Week" fell in July, and the date of Long Roll is considerably later. I will deal with each year separately.

Five newly elected Scholars were admitted on (Friday)
1778. 24th July. Long Roll is dated (Monday) 31st August, but it was apparently made up at a later date, as it includes amongst the Scholars in the School George Wells, who was admitted into College on 3rd September, and Harry Bridger, who was admitted on 17 th September.

The last boy who was admitted under the roll ad Winton of 1779. 1778 was Charles Lovell Gould, admitted on 13th July, 1779. On 23rd July six boys were admitted under the roll ad Winton of 1779. A serenth, George Chaloner Ogle, was admitted on 21st August, and Long Roll is dated (Monday) the 23rd. But it was apparently made up later, as it includes amongst the Scholars in the School Thomas Hooper Morrison, who was admitted on 11th October, and James Worsley, who was admitted on 29th October.

George Frederick Nott was admitted under the roll of 1779 1780. on (Tuesday) 18th July, 1780. On (Friday) 21st July seven boys were admitted under the new roll. Before the 22 nd October, the date upou Long Roll, three more boys had been admitted, and Thomas Leir, the elerenth boy, had renounced his rights. He renounced on 20th October, and Codrington Edmund Carrington was admitted on 28th October. Carrington, however, appears on Long Roll as a Scholar in the School.

It is clear, from what has been stated, that the date upon a Long Roll was often not the date unon which the Roll was in fact compiled.

## APPENDIX V.

## The Election of Choristers as Scholars.

Mr. Holgate's statement in his Introduction to "Long Rolls 16553$1721, "$ p. xlv., that Choristers were from time to time placed on the roll ad Winton seems to be well founded. An examination of the names on the Rolls for $1688-1723$ has led me to suggest that, of the Seholars elected and admitted during those years, the following had been Choristers : -

Brett's is a particularly clear case. On Long Roll 1716, Brett, the Chorister, is in fifth book, one place below Bulkeley, a Commoner, and two above Townsend, a Scholar. On Long Roll 1717, Brett, the Seholar, is in sixth book between Bulkeley and Townsend. The inference of identity is irresistible.

The above list, it may be noticed, includes a future Bishop in George Lavington, who ruled the diocese of Exeter, 1747-62. It begins at the point where the Long Rolls first disclose, more or less, the positions which the Choristers held in the Sehool, Before 1688, the Rolls give their surnames, but not their forms, and consequently fail to supply an important clue for determining questions of identity. It seems likely, however, that the following Scholars were originally Choristers whose names occur in these early Rolls :-

Several of these Scholars were men of mark. Crowe became Public Orator at Oxford, and was the author of "Lewesdon Hill" (Dict. of Nat. Biog., xiii. 239). Keates became Head Master of Blundell's School at Tiverton, and was the father of Admiral Sir Richard Goodwin Keats (D.N.B., xxx. 288), who was also a Winchester Scholar (Adm. 2 Feb. 1769 : "recessit sponte," 25 Oct. 1770). Chandler was the traveller and antiquary (D.N.B., x. 40) who wrote William Waynflete's biography. Goddard was our own Head Master (1793-1809) and benefactor ; and Hopkins was College Chaplain (1802-1827). The lists of Exhibitionarii on the Rolls for 1780-4 show that Hopkins was of Corpus Christi College, Oxford, and not of Christ's College, Cambridge, as stated in Scholars.* Runwa, who seems to have taken or resumed the name of Jenkins about the time when he left the School, also went to Corpus, and in 1808 became D.D. He appears as Jenkins amongst the Exhibitionarii for 1784-7.

Hopkins was probably not the first Chorister who was afterwards College Chaplain. Patrick Box, one of the Chaplains on Long Rolls 1693-1710, was, no doubt, identical with Patrick Box, the Lay Clerk for 1678-1692, and was presumably Box, the Chorister on earlier Rolls.

I regard William Jenkins as the last Chorister who became a Scholar. It has been stated already (ante, p. 311) that the Jenkins who figures as a Commoner on the paper Long Roll of 1784, which Mr. Holgate selected for printing in this book, figures as a Chorister on two parchment Rolls of that year. These parchment Rolls are probably the more trustworthy, and in any case William Jenkins, the Scholar on Long Roll of 1785 , seems to be identical with Jenkins the Chorister on Long Roll of 1783 . He was not only the last Chorister who became a Scholar, but also apparently the last Chorister who obtained a place in

[^3]any class higher than "Secunda et Quarta," or "Secunda Classis" as the lowest School division was called in and after 1800. And here it may be mentioned that no Commoner is to be found in "Secunda et Quarta" after 1779, and no Scholar after 1774.

On account of the Rebellion, the roll ad Winton of 1793 contained no less than sixty-one names, but it seems that not one of them was the name of a Chorister. The ancient practice of nominating Choristers for Scholarships, which had the sanction of the Founder's Statutes, was then dead. Its death occurred at the very time when Long Rolls finally ceased to contain the name of any Chorister in any class above the lowest, and I imagine that there was some connection between the inability of the Choristers to rise in the School and their inability to obtain promotion into College. The steady growth of social distinctions during the course of the eighteenth century must have gradually lowered the position of boys, one of whose statutory duties was to wait upon the Scholars in Hall, and probably had much to do with their complete and permanent relegation into a separate form. The position of this form, at the bottom of the School, was sufficient to cut the boys off from the favourable notice of the Electors ; and the Chorister's office thus ceased to be compatible with aspirations for a Scholarship.

At this period, according to Mr. Kirby's Annals, p. 38, the Choristers were lodging out of College, not in a body together, but each of them with his own parents or friends in the neighbourhood. The system which collected them under one roof and gave them a separate establishment, formerly in College Street, and now in Kingsgate Street, is said to have been started in 1810.

Mr. A. F. Leach has recently shown,* as the result of his study of the early College "Hall Books," that, in the fifteenth and sixteenth centuries, it was the rule, rather than the exception, for a Winchester Chorister to be converted into a Scholar. And there are some grounds for suggesting that, at any rate in the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries, the benefits of such a conversion were often bestowed upon Choristers of the sister Foundation at Oxford.
"Valor Ecelesiasticus" (vol. ii., p. 264) contains a list of the sixteen boys who were Choristers at New College in or about February, 153 $3_{5}^{4}$, and of the names on this list six are Richard Lentall, William Smyth, Henry Alwey, Humphrey Marshall, Edmund Hargate, and Nicholas Smyth. The last two boys out of seventeen who were elected Winchester Scholars in 1534 were Henry Alway and William Smythe, who, being at the bottom of the Roll, were probably not admitted until some time in 1535; and the Register of Admissious under the Election of 1536 contains the names of Richard Lenthall, Humphrey Marshall, Edmund Hargatt and Nicholas Smyth. There can be no reasonable doubt that these boys were the New College Choristers.

[^4]Again, there is a list of the members of New College in or abont $156 \frac{4}{5}$, printed in the "Register of the University of Oxford" (Oxf. Hist. Soc.), vol. ii., pt. ii., p. 21. The sixteen names (Nos. 98-113), which I take to be those of the Choristers, include John Prime, Thomas Harryes and Humphrcy Fowler. These three names occur again amongst the Winchester Scholars elected in 1564, and John Prime came to Winchester from Holywell, Oxford, where his father traded as a butcher. Prime became a preacher and theological writer of some repute, and is noticed in the D.N.B., xlvi., 378.

Finally, Anthony Wood, the antiquary, who before his removal to Thame was at the School in which the New College Choristers were taught, tells us that he was in the same form there with Joseph Godwin (the son of an Oxford bookseller), who became Scholar at Winchester on 29th July, 1648, and was afterwards Fellow of New College. I may add that Wood describes him as "a curled shag-pate, squint-ey'd and purblind, and much deformed with the smal pox," in order to contrast him with the "handsome maid, living in Cat-street," who, out of love for him, poisoned herself with rats-bane ("Wood's Life and Times," Oxf. Hist. Soc., vol. i., p. 199).

Presumably the three Oxford Electors, the Warden of New College and the two Posers, from time to time nominated New College Choristers for Scholarships, while the interests of our own Choristers were generally forwarded by the three Winchester Electors, our Warden, Sub-Warden and Head Master.

Nicholas Lloyd, the historical compiler (D.N.B., xxxiii., 430), may be mentioned as an instance of a Winchester Chorister who became Scholar during the first half of the seventeenth century. He was the son of a Rector of Wonston, Hants, and was admitted into College on 5 th September, 1644. We know that he was a Chorister from his own statement (Wood's Athenae Oxon., by Bliss, iii. 1258, 1260).

It is a curious fact that the practice of nominating Choristers for Scholarships seems to have ceased about the time when Goddard, who started his Wykehamical career as a Chorister, was appointed Second Master. As a boy, he was placed on the roll ad Winton - twice, in 1769 and again in 1771, but on the first occasion he renounced his rights and prefcrred to remain Chorister. He was not the first boy who entertained this preference; for it appears from Long Roll 1755 that William Babey, the Chorister who became Scholar in 1754, went back within a year to his old position. Was poverty the cause ? There were certainly poor boys who found it hard or even impossible to comply with the custom of those dars which expected every Scholar to present the Head and Second Masters with gratuities amounting to ten guineas per annum, and some of these may have thought that it was better to resign their Scholarships than to disregard the custom, which had its origin in the fact that the Masters' stipends had grown utterly inadequate. My readers may recollect that the abolition of this custom, which squared ill with the College Statntes,
was due to the liberality of Goddard, who in his old age, provided at his own expense a fund, the income of which was substituted for the gratuities.

The story of the abolition of these gratuities is told in Mr. Kirby's Annals, pp. 402-3. The resolutions of the Oxford Electors, condemning the custom, which are there assigned to the year 1776, were really passed on 4th September, 1766, when the "Supervisors" who attended the Election with Dr. Hayward, Warden of New College, were Edward Whitmore and John Hooke. See Long Roll of 1766, ante, p. 108. Thereupon Warton and Collins, the newly appointed Head and Second Masters, appealed to the Visitor, who was " pleased to determine that the Resolutions of the Warden of New College and the Two Supervisors, are not grounded either upon the letter of the Statute, or upon the Intention of the Founder." So runs the Postscript to the Masters' pamphlet in defence of the custom, entitled "Rcmarks on some Proceedings at the Time of the Late Election at Winchester College : and the Case of the Masters of the School fairly stated. London: Printed for Robinson and Roberts, in Pater-noster Row. mdcclxvir."

There is a copy of this pamphlet in the Inner Temple Library. On p. 26 the writers state, "that those who are really poor and indigent present no gratuity: that there are some such always in the College: that they are never questioned concerning the omission : and that they are treated, in all respects, with the same care and attention as the rest. . . . . It is a well-known and notorious fact, that by much the greatest part of them are the sons of creditable or of wealthy families." It seems fair to assume that the Masters themselves made no invidions distinctions. Nevertheless, a sensitive Scholar who was too poor to comply with the custom must have felt very uncomfortable.

In Wooll's Life of Warton, p. 323, there is a letter from James Harris, father of the 1st Earl of Malmesbury, congratulating Warton on the success of his appeal. "I hope for the future the dignity, and I may add (tho' it be an odd word) the gentility of the School will still be maintained upon a parity with its two sisters; and this I say, being fully convinced we have charity-schools enough already, without sinking so respectable an institution as that of Winchester into that inferior and plebeian class." When the desire for gentility was in the ascendant, the practice of promoting Choristers could not be expected to thrive.

## APPENDIX VI.

## A College Register of Appointments.

The late Warden, the Rev. G. B. Lee, kept certain College Registers in a tin box at his house, and in 1902, when I obtained his permission to search the box, I found at the bottom one Register, a large portion of which is here reproduced. Mr. Holgate, upon hearing of the discovery, told me that he hoped to print at any rate some part of the Register in connection with this book.

The importance of this Register consists in the fact that it records the precise dates when the Head Masters, from Dr. Warton to Dr. Moberly, and the Second Masters, from Mr. Speed to Mr. Wickham, were admitted to their offices. It also records the names and dates of many of the Chaplains, and contains a large number of entries about various College officials and servants. By permission of the Fellows, I have been able to transcribe all the above-mentioned matter verbatim, for reproduction here.

The Register also contains entries of burials within the College from 1760 to 1864, and of baptisms from 1765 to 1861 . These entries are omitted, not as being less important, but because the College possesses earlier and later Registers of burials and baptisms, and I hope that, on some future occasion, all the College Registers of that class will be published together in one book. Moreover, the burials and baptisms, though many of them concern persons named in Long Rolls 1723 to 1812, seem to be, on the whole, less germane than the appointments to the subject-matter of the present book.

The discontinuance of the Register for the purpose of recording appointments was probably duc in some measure to the fact that when the practice of requiring an oath of fidelity before admission was abolished, the formalities of an appointment to a College office were much curtailed.

The Register has a brown leather cover, somewhat the worse for wear, and now contains forty-two leaves of parchment, of which the last twenty-three are entirely blank. A leaf measures $13 \frac{1}{2}$ by $8 \frac{5}{8}$ inches.

Some notes upon the College Arms, and upon Guillim's error in supposing that they were " Sable, three lilies, slipped, argent," will be found in Notes and Queries, 9th S. ix., 241, 330 ; x., $29,113,233,437$; xi., 332 . The explanation of the error, which was offered in The Wykehamist for November, 1898, No. 352, can scarcely be correct, as there is no foundation in fact for the theory, there advanced, that Magdalen College, Oxford, was originally called Winchester College. "Winchester College, Oxford," was formerly a popular name for "The College of St. Mary of Winchester in Oxford, commonly called New College."
xxii. et seq. As to the dates on Long Rolls, see ante, p. 327.
xxix. The references, here and elsewhere, to the Latin poem, which was formerly supposed to be the work of Christopher Johnson (elected Scholar in 1549), must now be taken subject to Mr. J. S. xxx., xxxiii. "Secunda et Quarta Classis" Fas used as the name of the Class next below "Quarta Classis" on Long Rolls of 1675 , 1676, 1677.
xxxiv. The term "Book." An early instance of this term occurs in Vulgaria Hormanni (1519), where is the phrase, "I am preposytor of my book $=$ duco classem." William Horman, the anthor, was elected Scholar at Winchester in 1468, and became Head Master of Eton in or about 1485.
xliii. The name of the senior boy on the roll ad Winton of 1703 was Richard Barker, C.F., not " Barber," as printed in Winchester Scholars.
In the Register of Admissions under the Election of 1711, the name of the seventh boy is Joseph Wheake, not "Wheable."
xliv., line 4. "Founder's Kin" were distinguished by the letters "C.F." on the Rolls of 1679 and subsequent years. They were also distinguished on a Roll of 1676, mentioned below.
xlv. As to the election of Choristers, see ante, p. 330.
xlvii. It should have been stated that Henry Deane, fifth on the roll ad Winton of 1686 , was nominated by the Bishop of Winchester.

lvii. The earliest "marble" in Seventh Chamber seems to be that of Calthorp Harvey, with the date " 1704."
lviii. "Eighth Chamber" is on the second floor, immediately over "Seventh" (sleeping Chamber), which is above "First." In Mr. Holgate's table of the Chambers and the number of their occupants there are two small errors. In the column relating to 1898 , for " 11 " in "Seventh" read " 10 ," and for " 9 " in "Twelfth" read " 10 ." On Long Roll of 1902 the numbers are :-Fourth, 7 ; Sixth, 11 ; Seventh, 10 ; Eighth, 8 ; Ninth, 8 ; Tenth, 8 ; Eleventh, 8 ; Twelfth, 10.
In 1903 "Fourth," on the ground floor, ceased to be used as a sleeping Chamber, and a new upstairs sleeping Chamber, over "Third," was provided. This is called, I believe, "Upstairs Third," or "Kemn's Chamber," being the room which Bishop Kenn is said to have occupied while Fellow of the College.

## Notes on the Long Rolls.

p. 171. Long Roll, 1674. A second Roll for this year was found at the Warden's House in 1899. It is a parchment Roll, measuring $26 \frac{1}{4}$ by 4 inches, in a ease of wood and cardboard with marbled paper. The following differences between this Roll and the Roll which Mr. Holgate printed may be noticed.

In the list of Scholars, the sisth boy in fifth book is called not "Morris," but "Norris." He was John Norris, poet and philosopher (The Wykehamist, May, 1894, No. 301 ; Dict. Nat. Biog., xli. 132). There are some differences in the order of the boys; also some varieties of spelling, e.g., "Stevans" for "Stephens," "Playdwell" for "Pleaydell," "Day" for "Dey."

There are only fourteen Choristers, Leverich being omitted; and there is no list of Ministri.

The number of the Commensales ex Collegio is the same (39); but the names of Martin, Sweeting, Wallop, sen., and Wallop, jun., are absent. The new names are Turner, Appleford, Phillips, Sheffield. The order of the boys is somewhat different, and a line is drawn after the first three, Lord Paulet, Windham, Napper, sen.

Only fifteen names are given in the roll ad Oxon, which ends with "Welsteed, Taylor, Roberts, Chute, \&c." The roll ad Winton omits the names of Petty, Strudwick, Kelsey, Hougham, and gives the thirteenth name as "Kenningmond."
p. 172. Long Roll, 1676. Another Roll for this year was also found in 1899. It is a parchment Roll ( $29 \frac{5}{8}$ by $3 \frac{5}{8}$ ) in a wood and cardboard case with marbled paper. The Arms are the Arms of the See of Winchester impaling Wykeham, encircled by the Garter, and with the mitre above; and on either side there is the bust and head of a floating angel with outstretehed arm. The Roll differs from that whieh Mr. Holgate printed by having no title, by giving the Chamber numbers of the Scholars, and by distinguishing the Founder's Kin as "Con. Fun." The list of Scholars omits Coward, but ineludes Walker, C.F.

The second column begins with "Mr. Noell," who is placed before the two "Com. in Coll." (Mr. Dudley and Mr. Stewkeley) and the list of thirty-nine "Com. ex Coll." This list omits Foster, sen., and Spenscer, but includes Tanner, who does not appear on any Roll printed by Mr. Holgate.
"Ryves" appears as "Reeves" both amongst the Commoners in " 2 da et $q^{\text {ta } " ~ a n d ~ o n ~ t h e ~ r o l l ~} a d$ Winton.
p. 176. Long Roll, 1684. This Roll contains two lists of Scholars. The first list gives only fifty-seven names, has no "Secunda et Quarta," and ignores all Scholars elected at the Election of 1684 (5th August), except Stone and Thomas. It also ignores Wyndham, Dowden, Collier, Killingworth, and Pearce; and it gives the name of Rodd in the place where that of Read probably ought to have appeared, and omitsRead'sname. The second list contains seventy Scholars, and has twenty-two of them in sixth book, instead of the usual eighteen. The names of Walker, C.F., Hackett, C.F., and Gosney, which are in the first list, do not occur in the second.
p. 186. Long Roll, 1716. The names of Bettesworth, Mead, and Burrell, though on the roll ad Winton, are not in the Register of Admissions.

Long Roll, 1717. Edward Shuckburg and Charles Potter, who head the roll ad Winton, are entered in the Register under the heading "Nomina Scolarium admissorum tempore Electionis Anno Dni 1717," whereas Rice Price, C.F., and the boys who come below him, have a separate heading, "Nomina Scholarium admissorum a tempore Electionis 1717 ad annum sequentem."
