

Body found about 10. A. M. Brookline July 9th 1859
at a Coroners Inquest held at the Town Hall
at 5 o'clock P. M.
upon the body of a woman found dead in
the piles of the Bridge across Charles River
near the Cambridge Port and Brookline Bridge
She had the appearance of a laboring person
apparently about 30-years old rather stout built
about 4' 10" in height dressed in a checked Muslin
delaine dress white underclothes almost new
gaiter boots white Cotton stockings
A portmonia was found upon her person
containing 16^{cts} in good money and a 25^{ct} piece & a
10^{ct} piece apparently counterfeit or or pewter
No clue could be obtained, the identity or
name of the individual
