PART II
NARRATIVE SUMMARY
OPERATIONS

1. Marshall Mountain. During the month of January the 1st Brigade, 5th Infantry Division (Mechanized) operated primarily from a series of fire support bases: Sharon (YD3449), Nancy (YD4439), Tombstone (YD3959), Anne (YD2940), and Wunder Beach (YD4639). The Bde operated extensively throughout the AO in close cooperation with the 1st ARVN Regiment, Popular and Regional forces. Emphasis was on small unit patrolling and search and clear operations. On 14 January at 1220H, A Troop, 4th Squadron, 12th Cavalry made contact with an estimated squad size enemy force. Small arms fire was exchanged and artillery fire and fixed wing air strikes were employed. Results of the contact: 4 NVA KIA and 2 AK-47's captured.

There were three significant cordon and search operations conducted in the AO. 1st Bn, 101st Inf (Mech) conducted a cordon of Bo Bang, Le Xuyen, and An Phach villages (vic YD3563) from 5-10 January. 1/61 conducted a second cordon from 12-16 January at Dao Tau (YD3956) in cooperation with the 2nd Bn, 1st ARVN Regt. The Third cordon was conducted by 1st Bn, 11th Inf in conjunction with the 101st Airborne Division's Operation Todd Forest.

On 15 January, the 1st Bde assumed operational control of the 1st Amtrac Bn. Amtracs continued to conduct operations in the vicinity of Cua Viet (YD3469), C-4 (YD3072) and Oceanview (YD2974). There was a mining incident on the Cua Viet River on 16 January at 0927H. An LCU travelling from Dong Ha struck an underwater mine causing the craft to sink. Casualties were 6 USN KIA, 3 USN WIA(E) and 3 USN MIA.

There were no major ground contacts in the Marshall Mountain AO during the month of January. Significantly, casualties for the month were primarily from enemy mines and surprise firing devices. There were 18 WIA from vehicle incidents and 21 WIA attributed to various surprise firing devices.

2. Kentucky. The Kentucky AO is under the operational control of Task Force Bravo. The 2d Bn, 3d Marines, 1st Amtrac Bn, and 3d Tank Bn operated under the control of TF Bravo.

E/2/3 operated from A-4 (YD1170) and C-2 Bridge, F/2/3 conducted pacification operations in the Mai Loc TAOR, G/2/3 operated from C-2, and H/2/3 (-) conducted operations with Regional Force units in Cam Lo (YD1259). On 14 January at 1700H F/2/3 engaged an estimated platoon size enemy force at YD 113502. The company used 81mm mortars, 90mm tank and small arms fire against the enemy. The contact resulted in 5 NVA KIA and 4 AK-47's captured.

3d Tank Bn operated throughout the AO. There were at least six incidents of tanks hitting mines during the month. On 23 January at 1130H a tank from B Co detonated a 40 lb mine resulting in one WIA(E) and heavy damage to suspension and fuel cells. The tank was evacuated to C-2.

On 18 January the 3d Bn, 4th Marines (-) (Rein) commenced a cordon and search operation with the 2nd ARVN Regiment in the Leatherneck Square area. The Marines maintained blocking positions along the northern boundary of Leatherneck Square while the ARVN Forces swept from A-1 (YD2673) and C-2 (YD1364). On 21 January at 0815H the 1st Co, 3dBn, 2nd ARVN Regiment made contact with an enemy squad size unit resulting in 1 NVA KIA and two SKS rifles captured (not carried on 3d Bn activity totals). When the cordon terminated on 26 January, 3/4 (-) returned to the operational control of 4th Marines and 1/3/4 commenced operations along the north bank of the Qua Viet River.

Although there were few significant enemy contacts, enemy emplaced mine or surprise firing devices caused two KIA, 20 WIA(E) and 1 WIA(I).

3. Scotland II. Under the operational control of Task Force Hotel at Vandegrift Combat Base (YD0048), the 4th Marine Regiment operated in the Scotland II AO. Combat operations were conducted from Fire Support Bases Neville (XD8257), Sandy (YD0156), Russell (XD9159), Sierra (XD9462), Mack (XD9661) and from Landing Zones Cougar, (XD8559), Mercury (XD8753), Shoup (XD8859), Sparrow (YD0564) and Marilyn (XD9761). Operations in the AO were generally company and platoon search and clear operations. Also extensive patrolling activity was conducted. On 3 January at 1035H a patrol from C/1/4 was cutting its way through the brush, when the point man detonated a surprise firing device resulting in 1 KIA and 1 WIA(E). Movement was seen and heard in the area and the patrol withdrew, firing M-79's, and M-60's and calling artillery and mortar fire. The patrol moved back through the area at the conclusion of the fire mission and found 4 NVAKIA, two killed by organic weapons of the patrol and two killed by supporting arms.

The Quang Tri Provisional Rifle Company operated from VCB and Ca Lu during the period of 2-12 January.

4. Dawson River. The 9th Marine Regiment under operational control of Task Force Hotel conducted operations in the Dawson River AO. 9th Marines conducted search and clear operations primarily from mutually supporting fire support bases and helicopter landing zones. The AO, being the largest of the four major AO's in the Third Marine Division AO, relied very heavily on heliborne operations for logistic support and mobility. Operations were effected on 10 January when a CH-46 developed engine trouble at 0434H, crashed, and wounded 5 Marines. Fire Support Bases Smith (XD7838), Snapper (XD8434), and Henderson (YD0041) were the principal operating bases.

On 2 January 1969 Operation Dawson River West commenced. It terminated on 12 January 1969. 9th Marine Regiment (-) (Rein), in close coordination with 2nd and 3rd Battalions, 2nd ARVN Regiment, operated from FSB Snapper in the Eastern sector of the AO. Enemy contacts were limited to small unit contacts and 1 mining incident. On 4 January at XD 820273 2/2 ARVN suffered 8 WIA(E) when 1 ARVN soldier detonated an anti-personnel mine. On 2 January at XD 712386 a patrol from H 2/9 ambushed 3 NVA and killed 2 enemy. The same day a gunship received ground fire at XD 768482. An airstrike was directed on the enemy position resulting in 1 secondary explosion and 1 NVA KIA.

Upon termination of Operation Dawson River West, the 2nd ARVN units returned to its own AO. The 9th Marines prepared for future operations vicinity VCB (YD0048)

5. Dewey Canyon. Operation Dewey Canyon commenced on 221800H January 1969 and is the southern most AO in the Third Division AO. 9th Marine Regiment (-) conducted the operation coordinated with the 1st and 2nd Battalions of 2nd ARVN Regiment.

Initially FSB's Sun Tavern (YD0532) and Shiloh (YT1026) were opened up in the northern part of Dewey Canyon. When elements of 9th Marines would reach the limit of fire support coverage new FSB's would be built. Terrain was typified by high mountain plateaus with dense double canopy vegetation. The prime target in the operation was a main supply route coming out of Laos and crossing into the upper A Shau Valley.

On 22 January 2nd Bn, 9th Marines conducted heliborne assaults into FSB Razor (YD1416) and LZ Riley (YD1020). On 25 January 3d Bn, 9th Marines ran a heliborne assault vicinity FSB Cunningham (YD1813). On 26 January an OP from M 3/9 at YD 190168 fired on 3 NVA moving up a trail. 1 enemy was killed, and his weapon, an M-47, was also captured. Later at YD 199169, M 3/9 received small arms fire from 2 NVA which resulted in 1 USMC KIA. The same day at 204100H M 3/9 made contact with 3 NVA. Small arms and automatic weapons fire were exchanged. Artillery was fired on escape routes. The casualties were 1 USMC KIA and 1 WIA(E). On 30 January 3/2 ARVN helilifted into FSB Lightning (YD2117) while 4/2 ARVN lifted into FSB Tornado (YD1831).

Enemy contact was light. However, significant sightings were made by aerial observers. Also observers were fired upon from the ground quite often. Enemy vehicular traffic on Route 922 was interdicted repeatedly with B-52 and T.O. air strikes.

COMMAND CHRONOLOGY

FIRE SUPPORT COORDINATION

1. Command Emphasis.

a. The coordination of air, artillery, and naval gunfire throughout the 3d Marine Division continued in accordance with established procedures.

b. The Supporting Arms Planning Section accomplished preliminary planning for a proposed employment of chemical irritant agents. Target areas were analyzed on the basis of recent intelligence and previous ordnance expenditures. A recommended target list was submitted as a starting point for subsequent planning.

c. The computerized target information program of the Fire Support Information Center was expanded to include a more detailed analysis of supporting arms distribution by geographic area and of supporting arms response to targets acquired by ground surveillance operations. The division area of concern was divided into five geographic areas for the purpose of analysis: North Vietnam, the DMZ north of the PMDL but south of its northern boundary, the DMZ south of its PMDL but north of its southern boundary, the Dual Blade area, and the remainder of the division AO not falling into the other four areas. Provisions were created in the program to give a more detailed description of supporting arms response to sensor and AN/TPS-25 acquired targets.

d. An FSCC was established at the 2nd ARVN Regiment command post. U.S. liaison personnel include Marine Air and naval gunfire and Army artillery representatives.

e. Additions to the target inventory continued as part of the Arc Light contingency plan.

b. Distribution of fires

(1) There were 2,080 observed missions (14%) and 12,311 unobserved missions (86%) fired by artillery and naval gunfire.

(2) A concentrated attack by fire employing air, artillery, and Arc Light Strikes was conducted in support of Operation Dewey Canyon. Air strikes, especially TPQ's, were the primary fire support agency used in target preparation. A comparison between the air ordnance expenditure in the Dewey Canyon area and that of the rest of the 3d Marine Division AO from 15 Jan 69 to 29 Jan 69 is as follows:

Thirty-five Arc Light strikes were requested in support of Operation Dewey Canyon, seven of which were struck. Thirty-seven aircraft dropped 875 tons of bombs. Bomb damage assessment by aerial observers was curtailed due to adverse weather.

1. Significant Events

a. During January fixed wing fighter and attack aircraft flew a total of 1,131 sorties and delivered 2,580 tons of ordnance in support of the Third Marine Division.

b. Helicopters flew 17,200 sorties in support of the Third Marine Division during January. They transported 36,766 passengers and helilifted 6,717 tons of cargo.

c. B-52 ARC LIGHT aircraft struck six (6) targets with 725 tons of ordnance in the Third Marine Division AO during this period.

CIVIL AFFAIRS/PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS1. Division Civil Affairs Activities

a. MedCaps/DentCaps. A total of 21,531 Vietnamese civilians were treated by 3d Marine Division units at MedCaps/DentCaps during January 1969 to include 2,921 that received treatment at the 3d Marine Division Memorial Children's Hospital (Dong Ha Facility).

b. Personal Response Program. A Personal Response Course was conducted on 27-28 January 1969 with 14 officers and 11 staff noncommissioned officers attending. A G-5 contact team made three visits to 3d Marine Division units in January for Personal Response instructions:

- (1) 16 Marines at 11th Engineer Battalion.
- (2) 80 Sailors at CEMU-301.
- (3) 230 Marines at 3d Motor Transport Battalion.

c. Distribution of Commodities. During January the following supplies were issued by G-5 to 3d Marine Division units for distribution in Civic Action Projects: 8,820 pounds of rice; 23,000 bars of soap; 6,700 school kits; 2 blacksmith kits; 2 masonry kits; 47 carpenter kits; 100 pounds of salt; 14 boxes of clothing; 14 P. T. kits and 58 cases of food. In addition the purchase of 15,000 toys for TET distribution was made.

2. Civic Action Projectsa. New Projects

(1) The 1st Brigade, 5th Infantry Division (M) has a project underway whereby personnel of the unit are supporting an orphanage located at the 1st ARVN Regimental Orphanage by giving personally to one of the orphans of their choice, 500 \$VN a month so that the children may continue to receive an education. This allows for more contact between the Vietnamese people and American servicemen which in turn should lead to a better understanding between the two groups.

(2) The 12th Marines received 160,000 \$VN in AIK Funds to repair the Bo De School and the Buddhist Meeting Hall in Dong Ha. An additional 400,000 \$VN in AIK Funds was used to purchase materials for a 3 room boarding students' addition to the Bo De High School.

(3) MCB-7 distributed 100 sheets of tin and 50 bags of cement for the construction of the new Buddhist Pagoda in Cam Lo Refugee Center for Buddhist refugees evacuated from the DMZ area 2 years ago.

(4) MCB-7 began several other projects in January. These include the construction of dispensaries in Dong Ha and Cam Lo, and the building of a school for dependents of the 2d ARVN Regiment in Dong Ha.

(6) The Bo Benn Refugee School in the Trieu Phong District was begun under the supervision of the District Senior Advisor.

(7) 4th CAG was given 75,000 \$VN in AIK Funds for civic action work in January.

e. Food Services. During the month of January 1969 the 3d Marine Division Food Service Program consisted of 42 operational messes supported by 416 personnel of CF 33. Of the total messes in operation, 26 are semi-permanent field messes housed in TFCO structures and the remaining 16 are temporary field messes. Subsistence support provided Army, Navy, and Marine Corps personnel of this command averaged 34,741 rations daily. Approximately 26% of the total rations fed daily were Meal, Combat, Individual and approximately 74% of the personnel were subsisted on the III MAF Menu. The III MAF Master Menu is based on MCO F10110.17, Chapter 4. The Marine Corps III MAF Master Menu utilizes both perishable and non-perishable components. The Meal, Combat, Individual is utilized only where operational requirements preclude serving the III MAF Master Menu.

f. Supply

(1) The overall supply support received by the 3d Marine Division was satisfactory, however, some items became or continued to be critical.

(2) Nitrogen has continued to be in short supply and oxygen and acetylene have been in short supply several times this month.

DIVISION ENGINEER

1. The 3d Marine Division received engineer support from a Division and Force Engineer Battalion and two Naval Construction Battalions during January. Maintenance and utilities support was also furnished by CMU-301 at Dong Ha, Quang Tri, Cua Viet, and Vandegrift Combat Base. Map coordinates below are taken from MAP: Vietnam, A&S Series L7014, Sheets 6442III, 6442II, and 6342I. Major engineer projects included:

a. Maintenance/Upgrading of Route #1. Upgrading of Route #1 continues to bring road up to MACV standards. Approximately 2½ miles of road now paved south from Dong Ha.

b. Maintenance of Route #561. Upgrading of Route #561 continues from Route #9 cutoff YD135583 to A-4 YD113701.

c. Bridges and Culverts. Completed 630 ft section of M-4 and M16 floating bridge at YD767220. This is a part of a larger 1140 ft span. Redecked bridge 1-5 YD275578. Installed 2 36" culverts with headwalls on 9th Marine road.

7. Duel Blade

In early January MACV approved the III MAF Duel Blade Plan. Accordingly a rough draft of the engineer annex has been prepared to concur with the III MAF Plan. Upon receipt of the final plan from III MAF further adjustments will be made as required. In its approval MACV stated the III MAF plan was to be effected within existing assets. As a result of this restriction in the approval a reassessment was made of the facilities requirements. Facilities have been programmed for the various sites and construction priorities and schedules for the CY69 construction season developed and forwarded to CG, XXIV Corps. Liaison with the 2nd ARVN Regt was established and their desires were forwarded to the CG, XXIV Corps.

In vertical construction, work was continued on the 4th increment of 10 bunkers for the Vandegrift Combat Base. Construction of a prototype of the 2nd generation steel arch bunker was started by the 11th Engr Bn at the Dong Ha Combat Base and it is anticipated to be completed by Mid Feb. The 11th Engr Bn was also tasked by III MAF to erect a 50' alum tower at A-1. Work will start early Feb. MCB-7 completed pouring end walls for approximately 150 bunkers. Due to space limitations of their precast yard, work has been suspended until some of the present stock is drawn by construction forces.

On 21 Jan MCB-7 completed widening bridge 9-7 while continuing construction of 9-12. 9-12 is expected to be completed 3 Feb. 11th Engr Bn continued to upgrade Route #561. Asphalt paving by MCB-7 on Route #1 between Dong Ha and Quang Tri was halted after approximately 2½ miles in order to prepare the remaining road surface. While this is being done MCB-7 started asphalt paving Route #9 west from Dong Ha and to date have paved approximately ½ mile.

There were no significant problems encountered during January.

PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

1. Personnel Administration

a. During the month of January 1969, 56 officers and 1909 enlisted personnel joined the Division. Personnel transferred by normal rotation included 42 officers and 1097 enlisted. Personnel transferred by service records due to MedEvacs were six officers and 266 enlisted.

b. A total of 31 Division Directives and nine Sub-Zone Coordinator Directives were published during the month.

c. The Division Personnel Section is now cutting orders on each individual transfer on PCS orders. This system saves each Battalion from duplicating and re-cutting orders on the Battalion level. Many man hours will be saved by this system.

d. Awards. Awards recommendations submitted to FMFPac were: eight Navy Cross Medals, 20 Silver Star Medals, seven Legion of Merit Medals, one Navy-Marine Corps Medal, 91 Bronze Star Medals, 21 Air Medals, 149 Navy Commendation Medals and 930 Navy Achievement Medals. The following awards were returned from FMFPac approved: six Silver Star Medals, three Legion of Merit Medals, one Navy-Marine Corps Medal, 67 Bronze Star Medals, one Air Medal, 61 Navy Commendation Medals and 121 Navy Achievement Medals. Additionally there were 234 Purple Heart Medals awarded.

e. Casualty. Casualties sustained during the month included 235 WIA, 25 KIA, two DOW, four NHD and 113 NHI.

f. Congressional Interest. During the month 136 cases were received, 135 cases completed, 35 cases pending and 23 cases readdressed to other commands.

g. Welfare Reports. Sixty seven welfare reports were completed and none are pending.

h. Discharges. During the month five Hardship Discharges were approved and two Hardship Discharges were forwarded to CMC for decision.

i. Administrative Assistance Team

(1) Approximately 120 hours of administrative assistance were rendered by the team to various units within the Division. Numerous units were contacted via land line to correct errors on the Personnel Accounting System during the month. Three battalions were inspected as part of the G-1 portion of the CG's inspection.

(2) During the period 2-5 January, a 32 hour Personnel Accounting Course was held at Division Headquarters for unit diary clerks

within the Division. The subject course consisted of a lecture, practical work problems and question and answer periods on personnel plates, unit diaries and Monthly Personnel Rosters (MPR's). With the class numbering 65 students trying to reach the 4.0 grading average set forth by originators, the outcome was outstanding. With the coming Management System (MMS), effective 1 March 1969 into WestPac Commands, the section is arranging classes in order to assist unit commanders and personnel concerned in the new system.

j. Reproduction. During the month of January the Reproduction Section received 516 job requests totaling 1,076,803 printed copies. During the same period the Reproduction Sub-Section at Dong Ha received 166 job requests totaling 360,368 printed copies. Three of five air conditioners are in a code X status.

k. Industrial Relations. The 3d Marine Division received authority to employ 750 civilians and 125 Kit Carson Scouts. At the present time there are 427 civilians and 111 Kit Carson Scouts employed. The IRO, Task Force Hotel Base Coordinator and the Senior American Advisor for Cam Lo District are making arrangements for hiring of 100 civilians to be used at Task Force Combat Base. Paperwork has been completed for the hiring of 20 civilians to work in the 4th and 9th Marines consolidated messhall, also the physicals have been completed on four nurses for the Childrens Hospital at Dong Ha. The payroll for Quang Tri during the month of January was 2,164,909 Piasters and 792,103 for Dong Ha. Expended from the AIC funds was 27,700 piasters.

2. Exchange Service

a. Sales for the month of January 1969 totaled \$554,505.35. The monthly inventory totaled \$1,294,899.97.

b. The main exchange building located at Sub Unit 2, Dong Ha, has been opened for business. Work is still progressing in certain areas of the store, but daily business is being conducted.

c. Work is still progressing on the main exchange building for Quang Tri Combat Base. This store is being built entirely by exchange personnel and construction has been slow due to this fact, however, it is anticipated that the store will be open for business prior to the 15th of February.

3. Information Services

a. The Information Services Office continued its coverage of the Division's activities. During the month of January 3,143 written Fleet Home Town news releases and 235 tape recorded Fleet Home Town radio interviews were prepared and forwarded to the Fleet Home Town News Center, Great Lakes, Illinois. In addition, a total of 70 news and feature articles supported by 40 photographs and 31 photo caption releases were also prepared and forwarded to CIB, III MAF for release and further dissemination. Total number of releases was 101.

b. The Division magazine was completed and arrived at Dong Ha January 26. A message was sent to all unit S-1 sections notifying them to pick up magazines at Division ISO in Dong Ha. As of this date, only four units failed to pick up their magazines. Work on the next Division magazine has started and some material has already been sent to the printer. Delivery of the next magazine is programmed for the end of March. Publication of a Division magazine will be accomplished on a quarterly basis from now on.

c. The Radio/TV section produced and forwarded to Headquarters Marine Corps, 19 tape recorded radio features. These features were also distributed to CIB, III MAF, Armed Forces Vietnam Network and the Far East Network.

d. Informational Services personnel provided support (Briefings, escorts, transportation and billeting) to 42 civilian news media representatives who visited the 3d Marine Division TAGR during January.

e. The ISO's Combat Artist produced and forwarded to CIB, III MAF, for transportation to Headquarters Marine Corps, 15 pieces of art including pen, pencil, and water color sketches as the Division's contribution to the Marine Corps Combat Art Program.

4. Special Services

a. The Gva Viet R&R Center began operations under the supervision of the Division Special Services Officer.

b. A Vietnamese Variety Show performed at the Quang Tri Combat Base Amphitheater before an audience of approximately 2,500 personnel. Gypsy Rose Lee's handshake tour brought audiences totaling about 3,000 personnel. Alse Woody Hayes, the Ohio State University football coach, showed films of the Rose Bowl game while on his handshake tour. The films were shown before audiences totaling approximately 3,000 personnel.

c. The entertaining group named the Heels, Toe and Soul, an all military five man show performed for audiences totaling about 1,500 personnel.

d. On the 27th of January, Division Special Services began showing free movies at the Quang Tri Amphitheater.

e. The following items, among many others (athletic equipment), were issued to Division Personnel: 35 Criti-Paks, 10,650 Writing Kits, 172 Game Kits, 4,400 Paperback Books and 492 Pre-recorded tapes were ordered.

f. The January Traffic Report from the MARS station at Dong Ha is as follows: Mag Orig - 73, Mag Sent - 527, Mag Recd - 480, P/P Orig - 751, P/P Recd - 1, P/P Pri - 12 and DA/By - 108.

2. ADMINISTRATION:

CDR W. B. McDUFFIE, MSC USN, Division Medical Administrative Officer, reported aboard for duty.

3. DISEASE AND PREVENTIVE MEDICINE:

a. There were a total of 130 confirmed cases of malaria for the division with a malaria incidence rate of 6.5/1000/month or 78/1000/year.

b. A total of 96 cases of venereal diseases were reported by the battalion aid stations for a total incidence rate of 4.5/1000/month or 54/1000/year. Breakdown revealed 86 cases of G.C., 7 cases of syphilis, and 5 cases of chancroid. There were also 39 cases of NSU.

c. There were 12 cases of animal bites reported to 3d Medical Battalion. Nine cases were placed under treatment. No animals were found rabid.

d. One case of immersion foot was seen by 3d Medical Battalion Triage.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The 3d Dental Company provides dental support throughout the TAOR of the 3d Marine Division to personnel of the Division. In addition, it provides dental prosthetic treatment and dental repair preventive maintenance services to Navy and Marine personnel of NSA, 1st MAW and MCB units in the TAOR. Assistance to Graves Registration is provided in identification of the dead. Company personnel provides support to the Marine Memorial Children's Hospital at "D" Medical facility, Deng Ha. Dental civic action support was provided to several 1st BDE of the 1st Mechanized-1st ARVN Regiment "County Fair" cordon-and-search operations during the month. Several significant new programs were initiated during the month. The first consisted of sending a team composed of 1 dental officer and one dental technician by helicopter to active forward Fire Support Bases to examine and treat potential dental medevac casualties. The team remained at each FSB for as much time as was found necessary to render required treatment before moving on to the next FSB. This program has proved to be extremely valuable from a morale standpoint as well as virtually eliminating dental medevacs from FSB's so visited. The second program consisted of sending the dental team on weekly visits to one or more of the 14 Combined Action Platoons of Combined Action Group Four operating in the 3d Division's TAOR. The team brought dental care to the Marine elements of the CAP's as well as the Regional Forces and Popular Forces troops and their families, a heretofore untreated segment of the military family. An oral surgeon with the Company, with the cooperation of the Navy MIHAP personnel at Quang Tri Provincial Hospital, established a weekly maxillo-facial tumor clinic at the hospital.


