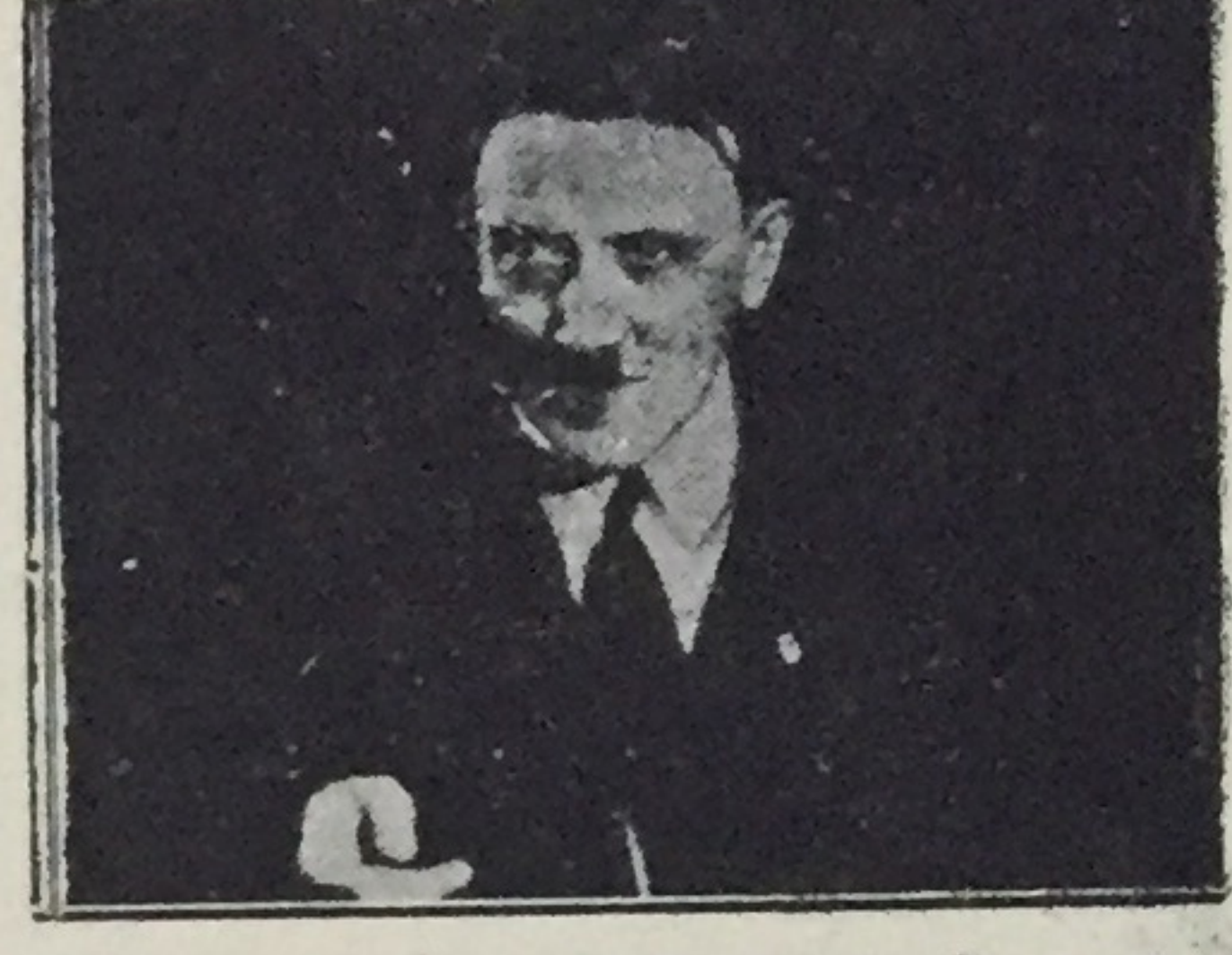


Adolf Hitler, A Modern Haman, Named Chancellor of The German Reich

Nazis' Chief Has Stood Solidly on Anti-Semitic Plank—Too Soon Yet To Tell What His Policy Will Be In Office

Adolf Hitler has lived to see his ambition realized, though the Chancellorship has not been handed to him without limitations. These limitations consist of associating with Hitler men having his personal confidence, such as Von Papen, Baron Konstantin von Neurath, Gen. Werner von Blomberg and Count Lutz Schwerin von Krosigk. Also, President Von Hindenburg has provided a check by putting in the new administration men of different political persuasions from Hitler, such as Dr. Hugenberg and Seldte. At the same time he agreed to Hitler's taking into the cabinet two of his trusted lieutenants, Goering and Frick.

Chancellor Hitler last night put through unanimous motions against all policies of suppression, economic adventures or financial experimentation. He adjured his fellow cabinet members "under no circumstances to disappoint the manifestation of faith and trust which today found spontaneous expression among the rank and file of the German people."

Later in a press conference the Chancellor, through Dr. Frick, the new interior minister, assured German and foreign correspondents that "the new government seeks to live in peace and friendship with all the world."

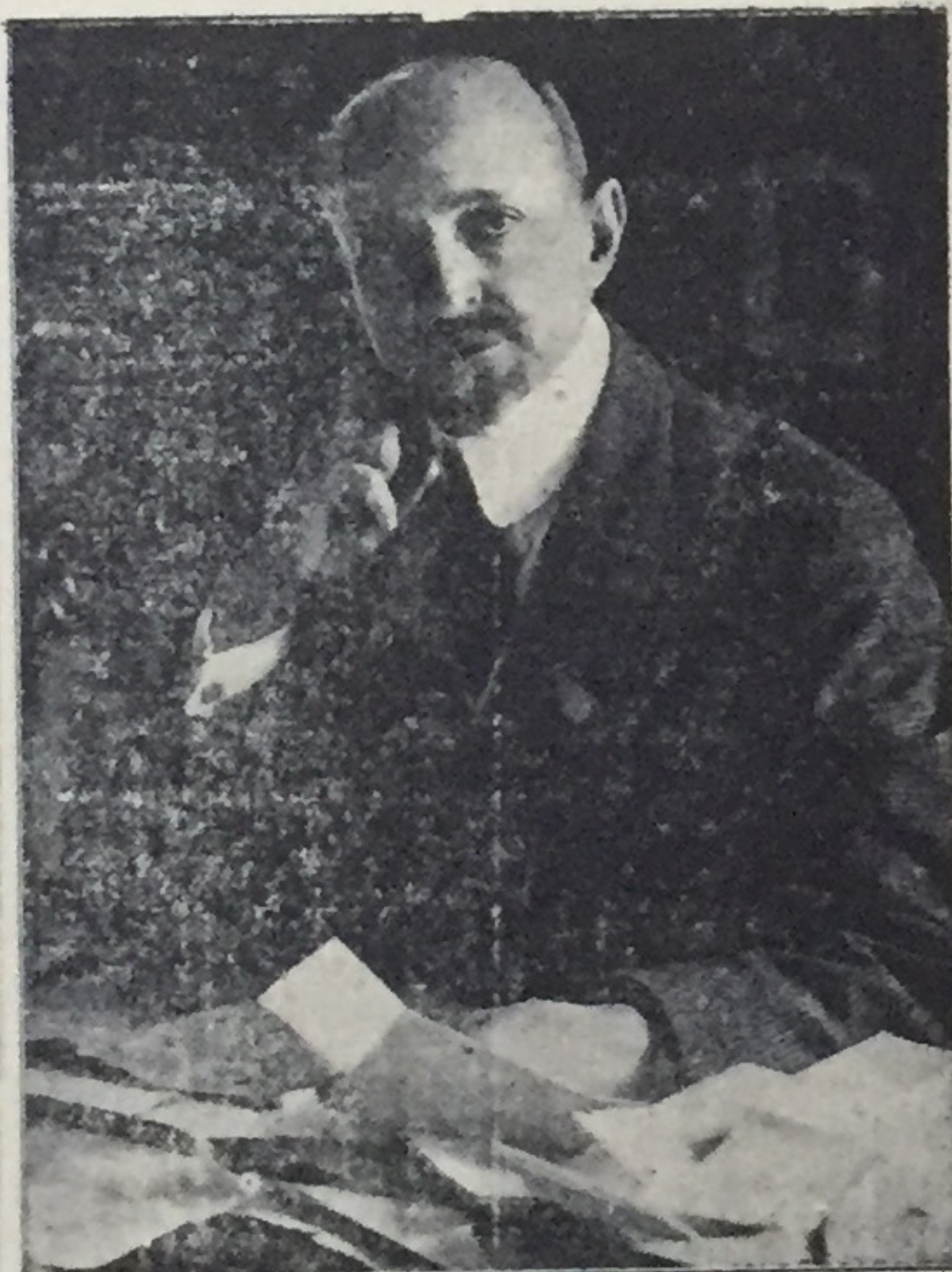
Charge Polytechnic Institute Seeks to Introduce Yellow Badge for Jewish Students

Authorities Deny They Have Issued Special Registration Cards With Yellow Badge for Jewish Students

Vienna, Jan. 31 (JTA)—The Polytechnic Institute of Vienna is charged by the "Arbeiter Zeitung" with seeking to introduce the yellow badge, symbol of compulsory ghetto days, for Jewish students. The paper alleges that the authorities of the Institute have introduced special registration cards with the yellow badge to identify Jewish students. Different certificates to differentiate the Aryan students will be issued, the paper further charges. The distinctive registration cards are being issued for the purpose of identifying the Aryan students in the event of renewed disturbances, the paper asserts.

The rector of the Polytechnic Institute denies the allegation. The rectorate explains that new registration cards are being issued for all students. It may be that quite accidentally the Jewish students received the first cards of the new series, the rectorate says. The Minister of Education also expresses doubts as to the correctness of the allegation, explaining that a special mark to distinguish Jewish students would be open infringement of equal rights guaranteed to all citizens of the country. The Jewish Community of Vienna is preparing to take vigorous action should the charges be authenticated.

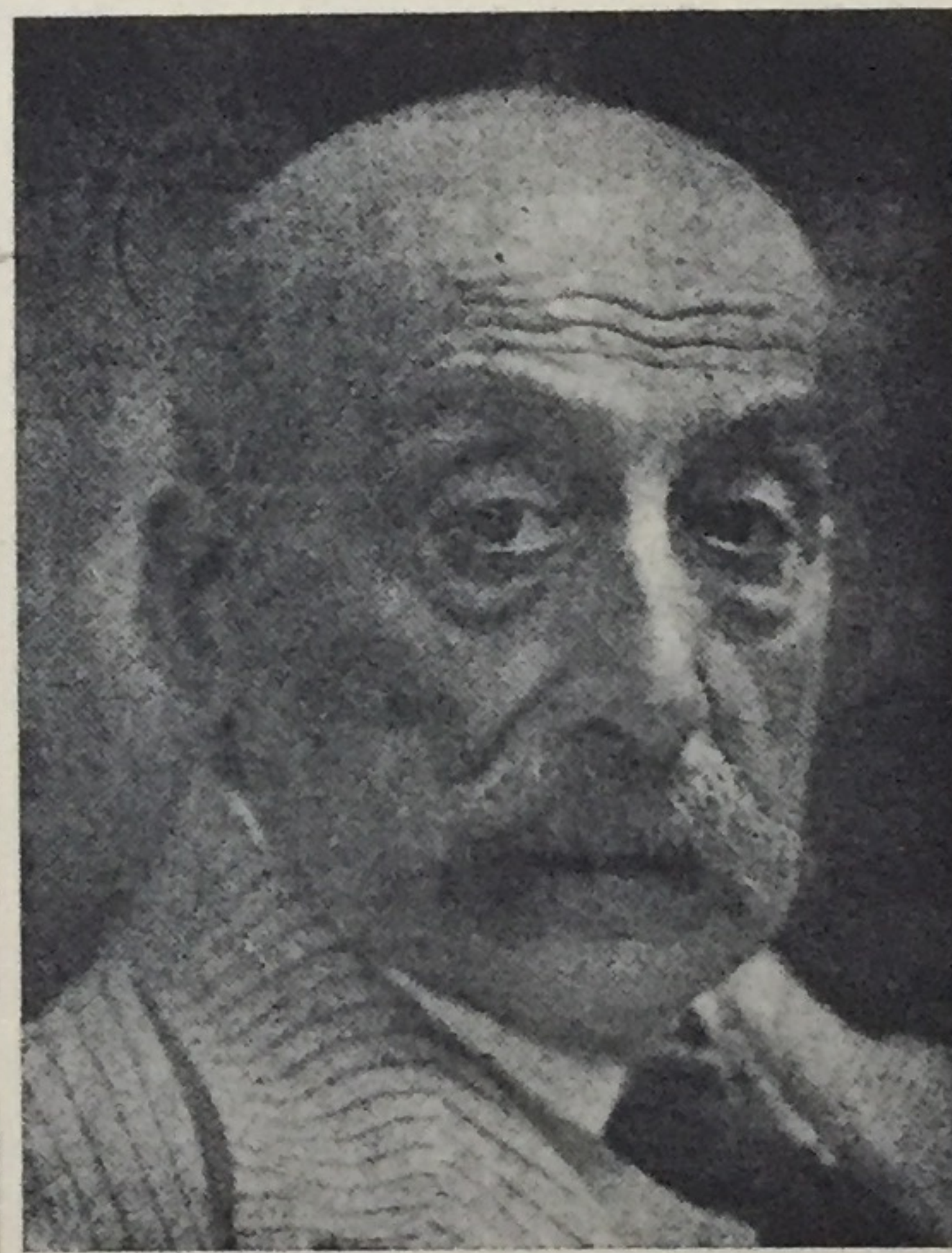
BOWS TO THE YOUNGER

Dean of German Painters Active at Eighty-Five

The internationally renowned German artist and honorary president of the Prussian Academy of Art was recently elected vice-chancellor of the Knights of the Order of Merit for Science and Art. Professor Liebermann, who is 85, is an outstanding exponent of German impressionism. Last year he resigned as president of the Prussian Academy of Art, a position which he had held for 16 years and to which he had been elected for life.

HITLER ECHOES

Captain Goering set forth his views regarding the attitude of the Nazis toward the Jews in an interview given to a representative of the "Gazetta del Popolo" of Tunis, last May.

At that time he made it clear that the Nazis would tolerate no equality rights for the Jews whom he charged with being a "disruptive and poisonous element which has brought harm to the German people."

Although he denied that the Nazis plan to murder the Jews, when they come into power, he emphasized that the Jews would be suffered to remain in the country as aliens only.

"The Jewish question is not fundamentally for us a theoretical question," he stated at the time. "Nazism defends itself against the Jews. It does not persecute them. We defend ourselves against Jewry, not against the Jewish religion. In the Third Regime, religious liberty will be complete for all confessions which do not conflict with the customs and moral feelings of the Germanic race."

Central Union Will Fight for Rights of Jews

Berlin, Jan. 31 (JTA)—The Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith issued a statement yesterday afternoon, expressing distrust in Adolph Hitler's Chancellorship, and expressing faith that President Paul von Hindenburg will prevent any infringement upon the constitutional rights of the Jews, and its own determination to defend the rights of the Jews.

The statement declared: "We naturally view with the greatest distrust a cabinet in which the Nazis occupy the weightiest positions. We await its acts. We look upon the President of the Reich as a pillar of peace in changing occurrences. We place our trust in his sense of justice and his fidelity to the constitution. We are convinced that none will dare to infringe upon our constitutional rights. Any attempt to the contrary will meet with our most determined position for the defense of our constitutional rights. Our slogan today is: 'We calmly wait.'"

Centre Party and Hitler Fail to Come to Terms

Berlin, Jan. 31 (JTA)—The dissolution of the Reichstag looms as imminent today as the Centre Party, on whose toleration of the Nazis the future of the present session of Parliament depends, has already had a rift with Hitler.

The new Chancellor received and refused the demand of the Centre Party that he offer guarantees that his will be a rule according to the constitution which will be upheld. As a result the Centre Party may refuse to support Herr Hitler in Parliament.

A boisterous reception was accorded Adolph Hitler, as he made his way from the Foreign Office after his appointment as Chancellor. Police were required to disperse the vast throngs which congregated in Wilhelmstrasse.

London Sees Democratic Government Doomed

London, Jan. 31 (JTA)—Doubt that Adolph Hitler will in any way secure the continuation of democratic government in Germany, now that he has attained power, is expressed by the London press.

The papers declare that there is no guarantee that Hitler will resign as Chancellor should his party fail to secure a Parliamentary majority in the event of new elections.

500,000 Nazis to Demonstrate in Vienna

Vienna, Jan. 31 (JTA)—The news of Adolph Hitler's victory in Germany spread quickly throughout Austria. Among the Jews, the news aroused considerable fear lest Hitler's triumph lead to a strengthening of Nazi rule in Austria.

Transjordan Gives Land To Dead Sea Company; for Commercial Use Only

Jerusalem, Jan. 31 (JTA)—The government of Transjordan has handed over to the Palestine Potash Company, which is exploiting the mineral deposits in the Dead Sea, a stretch of land bordering on the Dead Sea. It is stipulated, however, that the land is used for commercial purposes and not for Jewish colonization.

which the Jewish Agency has maintained until now, is no longer valid and an explanation is full in its order. The "Rundschau" holds that the cancellation of Emir Abdullah's land lease to a Jewish company proves that the expansion of Jewish colonization to include Transjordan requires a preliminary political understanding. On the other hand the opposition of the Palestine Arabs to the Transjordan land lease proves how baseless is their argument that the reason they oppose Zionist colonization in Palestine is the fact that Palestine is over-populated.

Berlin, Jan. 31 (JTA)—The "Rundschau", organ of the German Zionist Federation, calls upon the Jewish Agency Executive to render a comprehensive explanation of its part in the cancelled Transjordan land lease and the part played in this connection by the Palestine government.

Rules He'chal Barring of Student Who Objected To Military Training On Religious Grounds

Baltimore, Jan. 31 (JDB)—The action of the University of Maryland in barring a student who objected upon religious grounds to the compulsory military training constituted an illegal religious test, Judge Joseph N. Uman ruled in ordering the student reinstated.

His decision was handed down in a summary action brought against the university by Ernst H. Coak, one of two students dropped from the institution when they raised questions of conscience and religion against the required military drills.

Anti-Jewish Excesses Occur In Jassy; Iron Guardists Overpower Gendarmes

Bucharest, Jan. 31 (JTA)—Anti-Jewish disturbances occurred Sunday when Iron Guardists attacked a Jewish house after services held at the grave of the unknown soldier.

Led by the Archbishop the Iron Guardists attacked and demolished the home of a Jew, named Aronovitch, situated near the Nicolae Dabovici Church.

The home of Aronovitch was destroyed last night and a similar incident occurred in a Jewish residence in the vicinity of the church as described.

Gendarmes who attempted to intervene were overpowered by the anti-Semites.

Iron Guardist mass meetings took place in Carrowitz, Kishinev and Chisinau, but passed without incident. In Braila a fight with workers ensued, but Jews were not injured.

In Bucharest, a march to the grave of the unknown soldier took place without incident after the authorities permitted the Iron Guardists to place a wreath in the form of a cross, upon the grave.

Ridicule Morgenthau as U. S. Envoy to Germany

Warsaw, Jan. 31 (JTA)—Henry Morgenthau, former American Ambassador to Turkey, and former head of an American Government Commission to investigate anti-Semitism in Poland in 1918, is ridiculed by the anti-Semitic National Democratic organ, "Ilustrowany Kurjer Codzienny," in connection with the reports that he may be named American Ambassador to Germany.

The paper recalls his mission to Poland in 1918 and asks whether Mr. Morgenthau, if he becomes Ambassador, will investigate anti-Jewish persecutions of the Nazis in Germany on information supplied by Nazi Ministers.

Separate Electoral College For Jews to Be Maintained In Greek Elections

Tsaldaris Cabinet Which Fell Had Promised to Abolish This Practice — Jews Entitled to Two Seats

Salonica, Jan. 31 (JTA)—A separate Electoral College for the Jews will be retained in the new Parliamentary elections which take place on March 5, it became known, while proportional elections will apply to the remainder of the population.

Under the separate Electoral College, Jews are entitled to but two seats in Parliament.

The present decision blazes the hopes of the Jews that the discrimination which has been practiced in the past will be abolished. A promise to this effect was given by the Tsaldaris Ministry, but the

hard-lived existence of the Tsaldaris cabinet prevented it from enacting its pledge.

A motion to abolish the separate Electoral College was introduced in Parliament by Daniel Alhounf, Jewish deputy from Salonica, and was supported by seven non-Jewish deputies. The same day however, the cabinet of Premier Tsaldaris fell.

The Zionist parties are for the present showing no keen interest in the election campaign which opened Friday. Their attitude may probably depend on the Jewish candidates for election.
